DETERMINATION OF THE INDUSTRIAL APPEALS COURT.

IN THE INDUSTRIAL APPEALS COURT:

IN THE MATTER of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928-1941*,

AND

IN THE MATTER of a Determination made by the Watchmen's Board on the 11th day of August, 1950,

AND

IN THE MATTER of an Appeal against certain provisions of the said Determination.

Before the Industrial Appeals Court (Judge Gamble, S. M. Gilmour, Esq., and J. V. Stout, Esq.).

Monday the 11th day of September, 1950.

Having heard the above-mentioned Appeal, this Court Doth make the following Determination, namely:—

- (i) That the Appeal, in respect of all those portions of the said Determination which purport to prescribe 40 hours as the period to constitute an ordinary working week, be dismissed;
- (ii) That each rate (excluding war-time loading) prescribed by Clause 2 of the said Determination be reduced by the sum of 12s 4d.;
- (iii) That each rate prescribed by Clause 3 (a) of the said Determination be reduced by the sum of 4½d.;
- (iv) That this Determination of the Industrial Appeals Court be operative as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 11th day of September, 1950.
