VICTORIAN MINING ACCIDENT RELIEF FUND (WINDING UP) ACT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the thirteenth year of the reign of His Present Majesty, King George VI., intituled the Victorian Mining Accident Relief Fund (Winding Up) Act 1949 (No. 5408), it is amongst other things enacted that on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette, the Fund shall be abolished, the Trustees shall go out of office and Division seven of Part III. of the principal Act shall be repealed:

Now, therefore, I, Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation fix Monday the twenty-fifth day of September, 1950, as the day on which the Victorian Mining Accident Relief Fund shall be abolished, the Trustees of the Fund shall go out of office and Division seven of Part III. of the Mines Act 1928 shall be repealed.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty, and in the fourteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.
