PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN THE GOULBURN RIVER, ETC., ABOVE ALEXANDRA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf do by this my Proclamation:—

- (a) Vary the Proclamation made the 28th day of June, 1928, and published in the Government Gazette of the 4th day of July, 1928, respecting prohibition of fishing, by deleting therefrom the whole of paragraph five (5);
- (b) Revoke the Proclamation made the 27th day of August, 1934, and published in the Government Gazette of the 29th day of August, 1934, respecting the alteration of the area closed to fishing at Eildon Weir;
- (c) Vary the Proclamation made the 1st day of September, 1937, and published in the Government Gazette of the 8th day of September, 1937, respecting prohibition of fishing in certain streams, by deleting therefrom all reference to the Acheron River;
- (d) Revoke the Proclamation made the 21st day of August, 1939, and published in the Government Gazette of the 23rd day of August, 1939, respecting prohibition of fishing in portion of the Goulburn River below the Eildon Weir;
- (e) Revoke the Proclamation made the 2nd day of September, 1947, and published in the Government Gazette of the 3rd day of September, 1947, respecting prohibition of fishing in Jerusalem Creek and tributaries during the whole of each year;

(f) Prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following waters during the period set opposite the names of such waters:-

AMENDMENT OF BUTCHERING AND/OR SMALL GOODS MAKING TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 1).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprentice-ship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Butchering Trades Apprenticeship Regulations."

2. The rescission of any Regulations by these Regulations shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or the liability of any person under such rescinded Regulations where such right accrued or such liability was incurred prior to the coming into operation of these Regulations. these Regulations.

Interpretation.

3. In these Regulations-

"Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.
"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by an appropriate in-dustrial authority or agreement, or by these Regu-lations, as the case may require.

"Probationer" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.

Application of Regulations.

4. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:--

Butchering.

Small Goods Making,
Butchering and Small Goods Making,
so far as they are carried on within the metropolitan dis-

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

5. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Acts.

Applicants may be Examined-Exemptions.

- 6. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination. examination-
 - (a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commis-sion, the equivalent thereof:—
 - (i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission
 - qualifications approved by the Commission.

 (ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a three years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

 (iii) The satisfactory completion of the Eighth Grade course of study of the Elementary Schools of the Education Department of Victoria, or its equivalent, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission.

by the Commission.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Acts, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trades.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or probationers shall be fifteen years, provided that for the period of one year from the 17th day of July, 1950, the minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or probationers shall be fourteen and a half years.

Term of Apprenticeship.

- 8. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be as follows:-
 - (a) In the case of persons entering the said trades under the age of seventeen years, a term of five years.
 - (b) In the case of persons entering the said trades at or above the age of seventeen years, a term of four years.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.—General Form.

9. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in each of the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof, shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) made under the Acts with the following additions thereto:—

Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

EMPLOYER'S COVENANTS.

At the end of paragraph (c) (i) the following proviso shall be added:

Provided that where he is temporarily unable to provide such work as will keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the approval of the Commission, employ the apprentice for such less time in any such week or month as may, on the application of the employer, be determined by the Commission, at wages proportionate to those which he is required, under the provisions of this paragraph, to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month.

After paragraph (c) (ii) the following shall be added:-

- (c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason
- apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.

 (c) (iv) In the event of the employer being unable owing to lack of orders, or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice, or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer, as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of the indentures for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indentures. dentures.

After paragraph (e) the following shall be added:-

- (f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools, or plant, other than wilful damage, or damage due to carelessness.
- (g) Provide the apprentice with all tools necessary for carrying out his work, excepting knives, steels, belt, and pouch.

Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenants.

After paragraph (b) the following shall be added:-

(c) At all times while in the employment of the em-ployer, conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

MUTUAL AGREEMENTS.

At the end of paragraph (3) the following provisos shall be added:

Provided further-

- (i) that where the apprentice is required under the provisions of the proviso to paragraph (c) (i) hereof to work for less time than full time in any ordinary working week or month, or (ii) that where the indentures of any apprentice are suspended for any period by the Commission—

the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall,

at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship, or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship the apprentice shall be paid for such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect to the last year of his apprenticeship.

After paragraph 9 the following shall be added:-

- 10. That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time prescribed to be paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the minimum rates of wages prescribed to be paid to journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the prescribed minimum rates of wages of the apprentice bear to the prescribed minimum rates of wages of the apprentice bear to the prescribed minimum rates of wages of such journeymen.
- 11. That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as hereinbefore provided, if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

Rates of Pay of Apprentices.

- 10. The minimum rates of pay to be paid to apprentices as wages in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows:
 - (a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years

1st year—at the rate of 46s. 0d. per week. 2nd year—at the rate of 61s. 0d. per week. 3rd year—at the rate of 90s. 6d. per week. 4th year—at the rate of 116s. 0d. per week. 5th year—at the rate of 151s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years-

1st year—at the rate of 53s. 6d. per week. 2nd year—at the rate of 76s. 0d. per week. 3rd year—at the rate of 116s. 0d. per week. 4th year—at the rate of 151s. 6d. per week.

Rates for Overtime Worked.

11. When an apprentice works under conditions for which, or at any time when, a journeyman employed at the aforesaid trades would be entitled to overtime or special rates for doing work under the same conditions, or at the same time, then such apprentice shall be paid by the employer for any such work at a rate or rates of wages which shall bear the same proportion to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such apprentice as the wages of such journeyman for such work would bear to the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such iourneyman. the prescribed minimum rate of wages of such journeyman.

Standard of Proficiency.

12. Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average of 75 per cent, of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year. such year.

Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

13. When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprentice-ship course he shall for the next succeeding year of his apprenticeship course be paid the sum of 2s, per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.

14. The number of apprentices or probationers who may be employed in any shop, or shop and factory combined, by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice or probationer to every three journeymen, or fraction of three journeymen, emplyed by such employer in such trades. For the purposes of this Regulation an employer working at the trades shall be deemed to be a journeyman and the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trades by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time.

Apprenticeship Course.—Classes for Instruction.

15. The classes for instruction in the subjects of the apprenticeship course for the said trades shall be as set out in the Second Schedule hereto, but any apprentice or

probationer who has the necessary qualifications may, subject to the approval of the Commission, be permitted to enter the classes prescribed for any year of the said course.

Standard of Education to be Attained by an Apprentice.

MILK-VICTORIA-COUNTRY AREAS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 180.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 36, as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 84 and 141, is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretation.

- 3. (1) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
 - "By retail" or "by wholesale" means, in relation to any sale of milk, that such sale is a sale by retail or by wholesale, as the case may be, but is not a sale by semi-wholesale.
 - "By semi-wholesale" means, in relation to the sale of any milk—
 - (a) that such milk is sold by a retailer to a person to whom the retailer has, on the day of the sale, sold a quantity of milk (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale) exceeding 2 gallons; or
 - (b) is a sale to a person who conducts a shop where milk is sold separately from any milk round.
 - "Central Area" means the area specified in Part I. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Gippsland Area" means the area specified in Part II. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Mallee Area" means the area specified in Part III. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Melbourne Milk Board Area" means the area which, at the date of this Order, constituted the Metropolis as defined for the purposes of the Milk Board Acts.
 - "North-Central Area" means the area specified in Part IV. of the Second Schedule to this Order.

"North-Eastern Area" means the area specified in Part V. of the Second Schedule to this Order.

- "Northern Area" means the area specified in Part VI. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
- "Treatment" includes the pasteurization, cooling, chilling, refrigerating of milk, and "treated" has a corresponding meaning.
- "Western Area" means the area specified in Part VII. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
- "Wimmera Area" means the area specified in Part VIII, of the Second Schedule to this Order.
- (2) For the purpose of this Order, where any post office or principal post office of any place is situated less than 3 miles from any boundary line of any area defined in this Order, then all places within 3 miles of that post office, or principal post office, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be within the area in which that post office, or principal post office, is situated.

Maximum Prices-Specified Areas.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold for delivery in any of the areas specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order to be—
 - (a) in respect of sales to retailers (excluding semi-wholesale sales):
 - '(i) where delivery is taken at the retailer's premises the price specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite to such area; or
 - (ii) where delivery is taken at any other place—the price specified in sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph less the cost which would be incurred in transporting the milk to the retailer's premises:
 - (b) in respect of sales by retail:
 - (i) where such milk is not sold in a sealed container-
 - (A) the price specified in the fourth column of that Schedule opposite such area; or
 - (B) the price paid or payable by the retail seller for such milk plus an amount computed at the rate of 1s. 6½d. per gallon, plus any cost incurred in transporting that milk to his premises, whichever is the lesser;

or

(ii) where such milk is sold in a sealed container the price specified in sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph, plus an amount computed at the rate of ³d. per quart.

Provided that the maximum price for milk supplied to persons having milk delivered to them regularly in retail quantities of one pint or more per day shall be computed on a weekly basis by multiplying the total quartage delivered during such week by the maximum price per-quart fixed by the foregoing provisions of this subparagraph.

(c) in respect of sales by semi-wholesale:

- (i) where such milk is not sold in a sealed container—
 - (A) the price specified in the third column of that Schedule opposite such area; or
 - (B) the price paid or payable for such milk by the semi-wholesaler plus an amount calculated at the rate of 9½d, per gallon, whichever is the lesser;

Maximum Prices-Treatment Depots.

- 5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold to any person (other than a retailer) for treatment in any area specified in the Schedules to this Order to be the maximum price for the sale of that milk to a retailer in that area less an amount computed at the rate of 1d. per gallon.
- 6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold to a retailer by any person who has purchased that milk and treated that milk in any area specified in the Schedules to this Order to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of that milk to a retailer in that area, plus an amount computed at the rate of 1d. per gallon.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold in any area specified in the Schedules to this Order by any person to whom a notice is given in pursuance of this clause to be the price fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 184.

SECOND-HAND BAGS AND SACKS.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

- This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 184.
 Revocation.
- 2. Prices Regulation Order No. 105, as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 164, made under the Prices Regulation Acts, is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

- 3. (1) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
 - "Cost of Transport" means, in relation to any sale of secondhand bags or sacks, the cost of transport (if any) incurred by the seller in transporting the goods from the point of delivery to his place of business and recorded on an invoice or docket delivered in relation thereto.
 - "Once Used" means, in relation to any sugar sack, wheat sack, barley sack, or rice sack, a sack which has been only once previously used as a container for sugar, wheat, barley, or rice, as the case may be, and has not been used for any other purpose.
 - "Point of Delivery" means, in relation to the sale of any second-hand bag or sack by any person, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such bag or sack to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased it.
 - "Second-hand Bag or Sack" means a bag or sack which has been used at least once for the purpose of containing goods.
 - "'A' Licensee" means a person who was, prior to the 7th day of February, 1946, the holder of an "A" licence, issued pursuant to the Control of Second-hand Jute Goods Order, dated 26th September, 1942, and published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette, dated 9th October, 1942.
 - "'B' Licensee" means a person who was, prior to the 7th day of February, 1946, the holder of a "B" licence, issued pursuant to the Control of Second-hand Jute Goods Order, dated 26th September, 1942, and published in the Commonwealth of Australia Gazette, dated 9th October, 1942.
- (2) Any bag or sack sold by any person other than an "A" licensee, which when reconditioned would conform to any of the descriptions of bags or sacks specified in the Schedule to this Order, shall for the purpose of this Order be deemed to be of that description at the time of such sale.

- 4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which any second-hand bag or sack of a description set out in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person to be the price specified in the second, third, or fourth columns of the said Schedule (as the case requires) according as the seller is an "A" licensee or a "B" licensee, or is a person not being either of such licensees.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything contained in the last preceding subclause, I fix and declare the maximum price at which any second-hand bag or sack of a description set out in the said Schedule and which has been purchased by the seller from a person who is an "A" licensee may be sold to be the sum of—
 - (i) the price paid or payable by the seller for that bag or sack or the maximum price specified in the fourth column of the said Schedule for the sale of that description of bag or sack by a person who is an "A" licensee, whichever is the lesser;
 - (ii) cost of transport; and
 - (iii) a margin at the rate of Six pence per dozen bags or sacks (as the case requires).

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any second-hand bags or sacks specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Delivery of Invoices.

- 6. Every person who sells second-hand bags or sacks shall deliver with those goods an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—
 - (a) Date of sale,
 - (b) name of purchaser,
 - (c) address of purchaser,
 - (d) quantity of bags or sacks sold,
 - (c) full description of bags or sacks sold,
 - (f) price at which those goods are sold.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 16 (HARDWARE).

NOTE.

A notice of appeal to the Industrial Appeals Court has been lodged against certain parts of the Determination.

Section 22 (2), Act 4874, provides that, when an appeal is made in accordance with that Act, the Determination or part thereof appealed against shall not come into operation until the Appeal has been dealt with by the Court.

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MEAL MONEY.

5. Where overtime, as in the preceding clause, is performed on any day in the week, an allowance of 3s. 6d. shall be made for meal money, and shall be paid on the day when such work is performed.

Sundays and Holidays.

6. Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day, and within the Metropolitan District Melbourne Cup Day and after 12 noon on Melbourne Show Day. If any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for for any of the abovenamed holidays the rate shall be payable for work done only on the day so substituted. All employees shall be entitled to the abovenamed holidays without deduction of pay.

TIME RATE.

- 7. Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 20 hours be paid—
 - (a) In any week in which two or more Public Holidays occur .. At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per
 - centum.

 At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-(b) In any other week ..

three and one-third per centum.
and for each hour worked beyond the 20 hours aforesaid shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

Provided that an employer may deduct payment for any day an employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike or through any breakdown of machinery or any stoppage of work by any other cause arising out of such strike and for which the employer cannot be held responsible. Provided further that any such time lost shall be counted as time worked in computing sick leave under this Determination.

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT. .

8. Except where the conduct of an employee justifies instant dismissal, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee, or one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited in lieu thereof.

9. All wages, overtime, &c., shall be paid not later than Thursday of each week.

NOTIOR TO WORK OVERTIME.

10. No employee shall be obliged to work overtime unless he has received at least 24 hours' notice of same.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RATION.

11. Where an employer owing to slackness of trade desires to ration his employees, he shall give seven days' notice to each employee of his intention to ration such employee.

Annual Leave.

12. The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946 (No. 5111), and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.

(In his or her own interests each employer of labour should obtain a copy of the above Act, which may be purchased from the Government Printer, Melbourne, at a cost of 1s., plus postage.)

- Sick Leave.

 13. (a) Any employee who, having had at least three months' service with the same employer, is absent from duty as a result of personal ill health or accident shall be entitled to sick pay as follows:—
 - (i) During the first year—3½ hours' ordinary pay for each complete month of service.

 (ii) During any subsequent year of service—40 hours' ordinary pay.

Provided that, in either case such employee produces or forwards within 43 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill health or accident necessitating such absence.

(b) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year such portion as is not taken shall, provided an employee remains in the service of the one employer, or any successor of such employer, be cumulative from year to year, the purposes of this sub-clause service prior to the 1st October, 1947, shall be disregarded.

MEAL INTERVALS.

14. One hour shall be given for a meal, between the hours of noon and 3 p.m.

Note - Section 117 (3) of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3977) provides that no person shall be employed in any shop more than five hours without an interval for a meal

BIOYCLE ALLOWANCE.

15. Where a bicycle is provided by an employee and is required to be used in connexion with his employer's business, an allowance of 6d. per day or part thereof for each day on which he is so required to use such bicycle, shall be paid by the employer.

GABMENT ALLOWANCE.

16. Any employee who is required to wear, when at work, a washable outer garment, dust coat, or overall shall be paid
28. 6d. per week in addition to the ordinary wage, unless the garment is both provided and laundered by the employer.

Reference.

17. On an employee being dismissed or leaving his employment he shall be entitled to a reference showing his period of service and qualifications.

TIME AND WAGES RECORDS.

18. Time and wages records showing the name of each employee, the hours worked each week by, and the wages and overtime paid to, each employee, shall be kept by his employer and completed weekly.

Such records shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Federation of Australia.

Provided that an inspection shall not be demanded unless the Secretary or other paid official of the Union suspects a breach of the Determination has been committed.

REST PERIOD.

19. A rest period of ten minutes each morning and afternoon shall be granted each employee, such periods are to be counted as time worked.

DEFINITIONS.

- 20. "Departmental manager" shall mean a person having the control of one or more salesmen, 21 years of age or over, notwithstanding he may be under the orders of a general manager.
- "Branch manager" shall mean and include a person for the time being entrusted with the control or superintendence of a shop or of a branch shop (the proprietor of which is trading under his own or a different name), notwithstanding such manager may be under the orders of a superior who does not devote the whole of his time to the management of the said shop or branch shop.
- "Outside salesman" shall mean an employee who for at least half the working hours in any week solicits or receives orders for goods while absent from the shop where he is employed, whether such goods are kept in stock or have to be procured in order to fulfil
- "Assembler" shall mean an employee 21 years of age or over who is engaged in assembling goods for order and despatch from salesmen's and/or travellers' lists or invoices.
