FUNGUS AND DISEASE DECLARED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred upon me by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928* (No. 3797), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare to be a Fungus within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928* (No. 3797) the Fungus hereunder named: And I further declare every abnormal condition of or in any plant, or of or in the product or part of any of the same, whether consisting of the presence of or caused by or due to the operations, development, growth, or decay of the Fungus hereunder named, shall be a disease within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928*:—

Onion Smut (*Urocystis cepulae*, Frost).

AMENDMENT OF THE SIXTH SCHEDULE TO POISONS ACT 1928  
(No. 3748), AS AMENDED BY ACT NO. 3918.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency General Sir Reginald Alexander Dallas Brooks, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section 38 of the *Poisons Act 1928*; as amended by section 5 of Act No. 3918, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with

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the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, add the names of the following substances and preparations to paragraph (2) of the Sixth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928*, as amended by Act No. 3918:—

1. Di-Isopropyl Fluorophosphonate, whether described as D.F.P. or any other name.

2. Diethazine Hydrochloride (beta-diethylamino-ethyl-N-penthiazine hydrochloride), whether described as Diparcol or any other name.

3. Trihexyphenidyl (3-(1-piperidyl)-1-phenyl-1-cyclohexyl-1-propanol hydrochloride), whether described as Artane or any other name,

and declare the Division 2 of the *Poisons Act 1928*, as amended by Act No. 3918 shall apply to the substances and preparations named in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations included in the said paragraph (2).

(No. 3748).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency General Sir Reginald Alexander Dallas Brooks, K.C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by section 4 of the *Poisons Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy

Board of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation amend the Second Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928*, as follows, that is to say:—

Add the following articles to the list of Poisons shown in the second Part:—

“p-ethoxy phenyl urea, whether known as Dulcin, Sucrol, Sukrettin or any other name and preparations and admixtures thereof.”

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "AIREY'S INLET CAMPING RESERVES."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portions of the land near Airey's Inlet, in the Parish of Angahook, temporarily reserved for public purposes, as are indicated by red colour on plan marked "A" over 19.9.49, attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.5369, and known as the "Airey's Inlet Camping Reserves," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserves."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, marram grass, or flowers in the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except with the written consent of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall in any way injure any of the buildings, fences, or seats in the Reserves, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserves.
5. No person shall put or graze in the Reserves any cattle, goats, or pigs, horses, sheep, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.
6. Any dog considered by the Committee of Management to be a menace to the public on the Reserves, or to bathers, must be led on a leash, or removed from the Reserves.
7. No person shall camp, nor erect any tent or other structure on any portions of the Reserves, except those specially set apart for the purpose, and then only after obtaining a permit, subject to such fees and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.
8. No person shall erect any bathing box or boat-house of any kind on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee of Management, consistent with these Regulations; but no person shall cause to be used, or use, any bathing box, boat-house, or shed for residential purposes.
9. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserves, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.
10. No person shall bet publicly on any part of the Reserves, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserves.
11. No persons shall carry or discharge firearms in the Reserves.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding £10, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
13. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserves, unless by consent of the Committee of Management.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person

who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 82, for—

- (a) Prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of any such residential area the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses or public amusements as are specified herein.
- (b) Amending By-laws Nos. 68, 71, and 79, now in force in the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1946, and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

#### OPERATION.

This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-laws Nos. 68, 71, and 79, and shall apply and have operation throughout the municipal district of the City of Camberwell, and shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

(1) In addition to the areas prescribed in the Third Schedule of By-law 68 and By-laws 71 and 79, the whole of the municipality, with the exception of the areas pre-

scribed as residential areas in the Third Schedule of By-law 68, and in By-laws 71 and 79, is hereby prescribed as a residential area.

(2) Notwithstanding anything herein contained, any person may in any part of the municipality hereby prescribed as a residential area, use any land or erect or adapt for use any building for the purposes of any trade, industry, business, or public amusement of a class usually carried on in a shop as defined by the *Factories and Shops Act* 1928, a shop and dwelling, combined office or public building, but save as aforesaid the use of any land or the erection or adaptation for use of any building within such residential area, hereby prescribed for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses or public amusement is hereby prohibited.

(3) Nothing in this By-law shall preclude—

- (a) the continuance of the use of any land or building for the purposes for which the land or building was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law; or
- (b) the enlargement, rebuilding or extension of any building, and the continuance of the use of the building as so enlarged, rebuilt or extended for the purposes for which it was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, so long as the building as so enlarged, rebuilt or extended does not extend beyond—
  - (i) the premises on which the building was situated immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law; and
  - (ii) any adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership, and might lawfully have been used for the same purposes.

##### Fowl-houses.

IN pursuance of the power contained in the *Health Act* 1928, section 80, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it on that behalf, the Council of the City of Fitzroy, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with, into execution within its jurisdiction makes the following By-law, that is to say:—

Fowl-houses shall—

- (a) Have a height not exceeding 8 feet and a total superficial area not exceeding 100 square feet;
- (b) be distant not less than 75 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has frontage;
- (c) be distant not less than 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet;
- (d) be distant not less than 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
- (e) be distant not less than 40 feet from any dwelling, whether on the same or adjoining land;
- (f) be covered and roofed with a material approved by the Building Surveyor;
- (g) be floored in concrete or other impermeable material to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor.

Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such offence, and to a penalty of not less than Five shillings for each day during which such offence shall be committed or continued.

#### SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS.

##### By-LAW No. 49.

A By-law of the Shire of Broadmeadows, numbered 49, made under section 80, clauses (j) and (k) of the *Health Act 1928*, for the purpose of the regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds) in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health or dangerous, and of fixing, subject to Part IV. of the *Health Act*, the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadmeadows order as follows:—

1. No person shall, except with the written consent of the Council, keep or permit to be kept, more than two dogs upon any premises within the Shire of Broadmeadows, or if two dogs or more are kept upon any such premises by any other person or persons, any dog, unless the said dog or dogs is or are confined within an enclosure approved by the Council in writing.

2. The Council may, in its absolute discretion, refuse to approve of any enclosure upon any premises within the Shire of Broadmeadows if—

- the said enclosure is situated within 25 feet of any dwelling-house;
- the said enclosure is not sufficiently secure to prevent the escape of dogs therefrom;
- having regard to the character of the neighbourhood the Council is of opinion that the keeping of more than two dogs upon the said premises would be offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

3. The Council may give written consent pursuant to paragraph 1 hereof, if, having regard to the character of the neighbourhood of any premises, the Council is of opinion that the keeping of more than two dogs upon the said premises otherwise than within an enclosure, would not be offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.

4. In respect of any enclosure approved by the Council pursuant to paragraph 1 hereof, the Council may, in its absolute discretion, if, having regard to the character of

the neighbourhood of the premises upon which the said enclosure is situated, it is of opinion that the keeping of dogs in numbers within the said enclosure would be offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous, determine and cause to be stated upon the said approval in writing, the maximum number of dogs which may be kept within the said enclosure, and it shall be an offence for any person to keep or permit to be kept more than the said number of dogs within the said enclosure.

5. Any receipt or certified copy thereof given by the Council pursuant to the provisions of the *Dog Act 1928*, shall not be deemed a sufficient consent or approval in writing, within the meaning of this By-law.

6. Proof that any person is the occupier of any premises where a dog is usually kept or harboured or permitted to live or remain, shall be prima facie evidence that such person keeps the said dog upon the said premises, provided that where there are more occupiers than one in any premises let in several apartments or lodgings or otherwise, the occupier of that particular part of such premises in which any dog is kept or harboured or permitted to live or remain, shall be deemed to keep such dog upon such premises.

7. In this By-law "dog" means any dog over the age of three months; "premises" means premises as defined in the *Health Act 1928*.

8. By-law No. 34 of the Shire of Broadmeadows is hereby repealed.

9. This By-law shall come into operation on its being published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Broadmeadows.
