*Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).*

DECLARING THAT POTATOES SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE POTATO MARKETING BOARD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

(a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation, or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and

(b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 13th day of August, 1946, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act, the Governor in Council declared potatoes to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 20th May, 1947, the Governor in Council appointed a Marketing Board in relation to potatoes and assigned to such Board the name of "The Potato Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on from and after the first day of November, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, all potatoes shall, subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, be divested from the producers of potatoes and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Potato Marketing Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any potatoes coming into existence within two (2) years from the first day of November, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Potato Marketing Board as the owner thereof, and to enable The Potato Marketing Board as owners

of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such potatoes shall, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, be delivered by the producers thereof to The Potato Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Potato Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulation made under the said Act.

## INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

**WHEREAS** by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1944-49 and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the City of Heidelberg (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

Any owner of any land who, after publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any such works and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act 1944-49, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7. *Schedule of Land Affected.*—Commencing at a point at the junction of Watts river aqueduct and the Plenty river, continuing along the southern and western boundaries of the aqueduct to its junction with Diamond Creek-road; and thence along the western boundary of Diamond Creek-road in a southerly direction to the junction with the Plenty river; thence along the northern and eastern side of the Plenty river to the commencement point at the junction with the Watts river aqueduct.

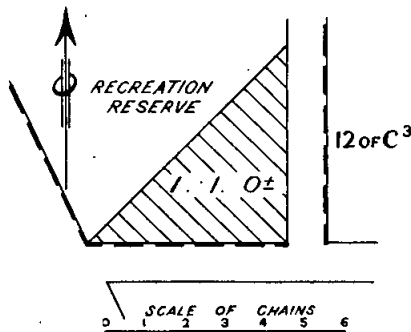

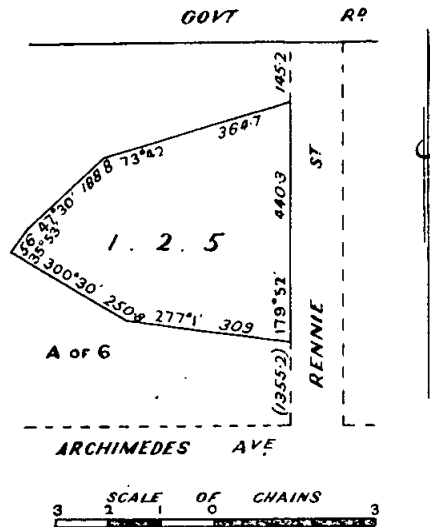

MULTIPLE-EARTHED NEUTRAL SYSTEMS OF DISTRIBUTION.—EXTENSION OF TIME FOR PERFORMANCE OF WORK BY THE STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, made the 14th day of November, 1950, the Governor in Council further postponed the date upon which, under Orders in Council made the 30th day of September, 1940, the requirements of paragraphs (2) (a) (insofar as it prescribes that no neutral conductor shall be smaller than 7/044"), (2) (b), (2) (c), (2) (e), (3) and (4) of clause (xiii) of Regulation 2 of the Electricity Supply and Construction Regulations were to be complied with by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria throughout the areas referred to in the respective Orders in Council aforesaid, that is to say, within each and every area in which three-phase alternating current electricity is for the time being supplied by it at a pressure of 230/400 volts from any distribution system, and within each and every area in which single-phase alternating current electricity is for the time being supplied by it at any pressure not exceeding 230/460 volts: And whereas the Commission is not able to carry out the said requirements by the 30th day of September, 1951, the date of postponement prescribed in the above Order in Council first referred to, on account of shortage of labour and materials: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby further postpone the date upon which the requirements of the paragraphs aforesaid are to be complied with, from the 30th day of September, 1951, to the 30th day of September, 1952.

And the Honorable Keith Dodgshun, His Majesty's Minister in Charge of Electrical Undertakings for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ORDER FOR VARIATION OF SPECIFICATION FOR  
SCHEME OF PRIVATE STREET CONSTRUCTION.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government (Private Streets Construction) Act 1947*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1949*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, being satisfied that, owing to shortages in supplies of materials, the works provided for in the scheme adopted by the Council of the City of Melbourne for the construction of Howard's-lane, being a private street within the municipal district of the said city, cannot be satisfactorily executed in accordance with the specifications, maps, plans, sections, and elevations in the scheme, doth by this Order, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, authorize the Council of the City of Melbourne to execute the works with the following variation of the said specifications, viz.:—

Clauses 17 to 36 inclusive shall be deleted and replaced by the following clauses:—

17. *Water*.—Only fresh clean water from water mains shall be used for mixing concrete, mortar, or grout. The contractor shall make all necessary arrangements for the supply of water.

18. *Cement Mortar*.—The cement mortar shall be composed of one (1) part of approved cement and two (2) parts of sand, and shall be mixed as required and used fresh.

For brickwork and for rendering the mortar shall consist of a one to three (1:3) mixture. No cement mortar shall be placed subsequent to its initial set.

## WORKS TO BE PERFORMED.

19. *Excavation*.—The excavations indicated on the sections, with any further excavations which may be necessary for the lane foundation, kerbing, channelling, drainage, footpath formation, or for the execution of any other part of the works shall be done as directed. All surplus material from the excavation shall be carted away by the contractor and disposed of by him. All pitchers, cubes, &c., taken up and not required for re-use will remain the property of the City Council, but the contractor shall cart same to Arden-street Storeyard and there stack in such position as directed.

*Roadway*.—The contractor shall excavate the earth to form the new lane beds as required; the last 3 inches at least in depth shall be left for excavation by manual labour. Where filling is required it shall be of ashes well rolled and rammed to approval. Proper templates and profiles of the cross-section of the road shall be made and set for guidance of the workmen at such intervals as the City Engineer may direct. All soft places, particularly over mains and cables or where mains and cables have been, shall be excavated and filled in with approved materials.

The total cost of this work, together with that specified in clauses 20-22 (inclusive) shall be included in the item in the Schedule marked "Excavation."

The formation shall be thoroughly rolled to the approval of the City Engineer, and covered with ashes. The ashes shall be saturated with water and rolled to approval. The thickness of ashes after consolidation shall in no case be less than three (3) inches. The contractor shall form the ash bed for the width of the lane as shown on the drawing.

The contractor shall protect all fencing, buildings, poles, mains, services, and paved surfaces from damage by subsidence or otherwise, and in all cases where the ground is of an unstable character, or where the City Engineer considers it necessary, the trenches, excavations, and headings shall be suitably timbered from top to bottom, as the contractor will be held responsible for any accident, subsidence, or damage caused by defective or insufficient

timbering, careless workmanship, or any other cause whatever. The total cost of this work shall be included in the item in the Schedule marked "Excavation."

20. *Rolling*.—The whole of the rolling shall be done with an approved power-driven roller weighing not less than five (5) tons. The contractor may hire a motor roller from the City Council at the rate of Thirteen shillings and sixpence (13s. 6d.) per working hour.

21. *Gas and Water Services*.—Any gas or water services which require alteration shall be raised or lowered by the contractor as part of this contract; the pipes shall be lowered to a depth of nine (9) inches below the bottom of the foundation and the contractor will be responsible for any damage that may occur. The contractor shall give notice to the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works or the Gas and Fuel Corporation of Victoria immediately on finding that any water or gas services require altering or lowering.

22. *Covers*.—All valve boxes and manhole and other covers shall be raised or lowered to the finished level of the new road surface by the contractor.

The total cost of these works (clauses 20 to 22 inclusive) shall be included in the item in Schedule marked "Excavation."

23. *Mains and Cables*.—Any sewerage main, electric light, power, telephone, or telegraph mains or cables requiring alteration will be altered by the City Council without cost to the contractor. The contractor shall afford every facility to the authorities carrying out such alterations, and shall have no claim for any delay, loss, or inconvenience which may occur through the necessity of such alterations. The contractor, under instructions from the City Engineer, shall cart away the spoil from the trenches and fill them in with approved material, which shall be rammed and rolled to approval. The contractor will be allowed at the rate of Six shillings (6s.) per cubic yard of excavation measured in the solid to cover the whole cost of such work.

The contractor shall exercise strict care in excavating over or near mains and cables; he shall shore up and protect all mains and cables which may be encountered and shall pay all costs incurred through neglect or failure of such precautions.

24. *Templates*.—The contractor shall provide satisfactory templates to enable the City Engineer to check over the correctness of the levels and cambers of the formation, ash bed, and concrete construction.

25. *Pitchers*.—(a) The pitching where shown coloured blue on the drawing shall be constructed with new pitchers. The pitchers shall be laid with open joints at least  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch wide at the top surfaces on two (2) inches deep of concrete the whole shall be well rammed with fifty-six (56) pounds pavior's rammer to a regular and even surface, and shall finish to levels and grades shown on the drawing. After the pitchers have been well and properly rammed, the joints around the pitchers shall be raked out for the full depth of the pitchers and thoroughly grouted with concrete grout composed of one (1) part of cement (94 lb. of cement being taken as 1 cubic foot) and six (6) parts by volume of fine and coarse aggregates, the relative proportions of which shall be fixed by the City Engineer after a sieve analysis of the materials approved by the City Engineer for use by the Contractor. The concrete will approximate a 1:2:4 mix. The respective grades of fine and coarse materials shall be stacked in separate heaps, and the necessary proportions measured separately for each batch. The method of gauging the aggregate shall be subject to the approval of the City Engineer.

The concrete shall be placed and well rammed into the joints, using a special rammer consisting of a mild-steel plate attached to a suitable handle.

The surfaces of the concrete joints shall be broomed and all loose concrete cleaned off the pitchers. The concrete in the joints shall finish flush with the surface level of the pitchers.

The total cost of the work specified in this clause shall be included in the item in the Schedule marked "Pitchers (a) Cart, lay and grout."

(b) The pitchers coloured green on the drawing shall be lifted and reset and shall be grouted for the full depth with sand flushed with water and well broomed in.

The cost of this work shall be included in the item in the Schedule marked "Pitchers (b) Lift and reset."

(c) In the area coloured sepia on the drawing pitchers selected by the City Engineer shall be set on the prepared ash bed with open longitudinal and transverse joints at

least one-half inch ( $\frac{1}{2}$  inch) wide at the top surfaces. The pitcher's shall be well rammed with an approved pavior's rammer weighing not less than 56 lb. The joints shall be filled as hereinafter specified.

26. *Concrete Grout.*—The concrete grout shall be composed of one (1) part of cement (94 lb. of cement being taken as 1 cubic foot) and six (6) parts by volume of fine and coarse aggregates, the relative proportions of which shall be fixed by the City Engineer after a sieve analysis of the materials approved by the City Engineer for use by the contractor.

The concrete will approximate 1 : 2 : 4 mix.

The respective grades of fine and coarse materials shall be stacked in separate heaps and the necessary proportions measured separately for each batch. The method of gauging the aggregates shall be subject to the approval of the City Engineer.

No concrete shall be either mixed or placed except in the presence of the City Engineer or his representative.

27. *Mixing Concrete Grout.*—An approved mechanical batch mixer shall be used. The aggregates and cement shall be first mixed dry, then, after the addition of water, mixing shall be carried on until the concrete is of even colour and consistency throughout. Each batch shall be mixed for at least one and a half minutes at a speed of sixteen revolutions per minute after all materials are in the mixer. The mixer must be completely discharged before being recharged.

The water supply tank shall be provided with proper gauges and controls so that the volume of water may be regulated to ensure the specified consistency and be discharged automatically into the mixing drum.

28. *Consistency.*—The consistency of the concrete shall be determined by means of a slump test; the slump shall not exceed three inches (3 inches). A slump can being in the form of a frustrum of a cone having a top diameter of four (4) inches, a base diameter of eight (8) inches, and a height of twelve (12) inches, shall be placed on its base and filled with concrete, which shall be tamped until all voids are filled and a slight film of mortar appears on the surface. The slump can shall then be removed slowly and the vertical settlement or "slump" of the concrete noted.

29. *Placing Concrete Grout.*—The concrete shall be conveyed from the mixer to its position in the work as rapidly as possible. The concrete shall be placed and tamped within one-half hour from the time that it leaves the mixer.

Immediately before placing the concrete the ash bed between the joints in the pitchers shall be sprinkled by means of a hose attached to a water main, with as much water as will be absorbed.

The concrete shall be deposited on iron plates of sufficient area, adjacent to the point of placing, and using shovels it shall be turned over on the iron plates at least once before being placed in position. The concrete shall be placed in the joints by dumping from the shovels accomplished by the workmen turning the shovels completely over in their hands. The concrete shall be well rammed to the joints using a special rammer consisting of a mild-steel plate attached to a suitable handle.

The surface of the concrete joints shall be finished off to one inch (1 inch) from the surface of the pitchers and all loose concrete shall be cleaned off the surface of the pitchers.

The total cost of these works shall be included in the item in the Schedule marked "Pitchers (c) Cart, lay and grout."

30. *Hot Mix Asphalt Surface.*—The fine-graded stone-filled sheet asphalt shall be laid to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch consolidated thickness and shall consist of the following proportions per batch mix:—

Bitumen .. .. .	64 lb.
Filler .. .. .	72 lb.
Sand .. .. .	440 lb.
Screenings passing— $\frac{1}{4}$ inch retained 10 mesh ..	156 lb.
Screenings passing— $\frac{1}{4}$ inch retained $\frac{1}{2}$ inch mesh ..	68 lb.
Total ..	800 lb.

This work will be done by the Council during the currency of the contract at no cost to the contractor.

31. *Fences.*—Any fences broken or disturbed by the contractor during the execution of these works shall be made good by him; new material similar to existing shall be supplied by him if so directed.

32. *Time of Completion.*—The whole of the work of this contract shall be completed to the entire satisfaction of the City Engineer within three (3) months from the date of acceptance of tender. See clause 8 of the General Conditions of Contract attached.

33. *Maintenance.*—The contractor shall maintain the work of this contract for a period of one (1) month after completion of work. Ten per centum (10%) of the contract amount will be retained until the City Engineer has certified, in writing, that the contractor has satisfactorily maintained the whole of the works of this contract. See Conditions of Contract attached.

34. *Insurance of Workmen.*—The contractor at his own expense shall insure and keep insured with some insurance office to be approved by the City Council, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld, all workmen and others from time to time employed by him or any sub-contractor in or about or in connexion with the work against accident, injury, or death, or any other liability to such persons, either at common law or under any Act for the time being in force relating to workers' compensation or employers' liability under which the City Council might be liable and before employing any labour on the work the contractor, if so required by the City Council, shall lodge with the City Council the policies of insurance, and shall furnish the premium receipts and such other documentary evidence as may be demanded by the City Council from time to time in proof of the existence and continuity of such insurance until the work is completed and handed over, or until the said workmen shall no longer be engaged on the work.

If the contractor fail to insure or fail to maintain the said policies in force, the City Council may effect the insurance and deduct the amount of the premiums paid in respect thereof from any moneys that may be or may become payable to the contractor.

35. *Sales Tax.*—Sales tax must be excluded from the tender price as the materials, being for use and not for sale by the City Council, are exempt from tax. The City Engineer will issue the necessary Sales Tax Exemption Certificates.

36. *Tender.*—When submitting his tender the contractor is required to state—

- (a) The bulk sum for which he is prepared to carry out the whole of the work complete in every detail.
- (b) His price for each separate item in accordance with the Schedule given below.

## MOTOR OMNIBUS ACT 1928 (No. 3742).

FURTHER AMENDMENT OF THE METROPOLITAN  
MOTOR OMNIBUS REGULATIONS.

**HIS** Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), doth by this Order further amend, as set out hereunder, the Metropolitan Motor Omnibus Regulations, i.e., from clause (g) delete "Routes and Fares—Routes, sections and fares must be exhibited inside each motor omnibus in a conspicuous place approved by the Licensing Authority" and insert a new clause (L), as follows:—

"(L) *Routes, Fares, and Tickets.*

There shall be exhibited in each motor omnibus in a manner and in a conspicuous place therein to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority a notice or notices setting out particulars of the route, sections, fares, and time-tables, and in type not smaller than a quarter of an inch, that on boarding the vehicle passengers must tender the legal fare to the driver, who is required to issue immediately the appropriate ticket, that the ticket must be shown on demand or another fare paid, that failure to do so may involve a penalty up to £20, and that damaged or defaced tickets will not be accepted.

On boarding any motor omnibus, every passenger shall immediately tender, or the person in charge of such passenger shall immediately tender, to the driver the fare legally demandable for the journey intended to be travelled by such passenger and all fares shall be paid in cash (provided that where and as specified prepaid tickets may be accepted as cash). Every such driver upon receiving any fare shall at once, and whilst the motor omnibus is stationary, deliver to such passenger or person a separate and distinct ticket for each fare paid.

Every such ticket shall be issued from a machine approved by the Governor in Council, and shall show such particulars as will enable the section in which the passenger boarded the motor omnibus to be determined, and the amount of fare paid, and shall be consecutively numbered, and all such particulars shall be printed on the face of the ticket, together with notifications thereon to the effect that the ticket must be shown on demand or another fare paid and that the ticket is not transferable.

Each roll ticket shall be detached from its roll immediately before issue and in the presence of the person to whom it is to be issued.

Any advertising on such ticket shall appear on the back of the ticket and subject to the foregoing, the text, illustrations, and lay-out of every advertisement on any ticket shall be as approved by the Licensing Authority.

Every passenger shall upon demand by the driver, or any officer of the Licensing Authority, or any inspector authorized by the Governor in Council as a Ticket Inspector for the purposes of the relevant portions of these Regulations so far as the said Regulations relate to 'routes and fares' exhibit and/or deliver his ticket or otherwise pay to the driver the fare legally demandable for the journey.

No passenger shall tender to the driver in respect of his fare, or as evidence that his fare has been paid, any ticket that is rolled up, defaced, or illegible, or in such condition that it cannot be easily read at sight, or that has been divided, or from which any parts have been cut or taken off; no such ticket will be accepted, and the passenger tendering any such ticket will be deemed not to have paid his fare, and shall upon demand pay to the driver the fare legally demandable for the journey then being travelled and in respect of which such ticket has been produced as aforesaid.

A ticket once issued shall not be issued again, and no passenger shall tender to the driver as evidence that he has paid his fare any ticket other than the ticket issued to him for the journey then being travelled.

Each driver of a motor omnibus shall at the commencement of his daily tour of duty be issued a journal on which he shall forthwith enter the route number, the date, the time of commencement of such tour of duty, and the serial number of the first ticket or tickets to be issued by him. Each driver shall on completion of each single trip, whether such trip be over the whole or only a part of the route, record on the journal the serial number of the next ticket or tickets to be issued and at the termination of his tour of duty complete the journal, by entering thereon the serial number of the next ticket or tickets to be issued, and the number of tickets issued and the total amount received during that tour of duty.

Such journal shall then be signed by the driver and handed by him to the licensed operator of the route or to some responsible person acting with full authority on such operator's behalf.

Such operator or responsible person shall retain the journals for a period of not less than two years and shall in respect of each calendar month furnish to the Licensing Authority within seven days after the last day of such calendar month a complete summary showing the route number, the calendar month (and the year thereof) in respect of which the summary is furnished, the number of tickets issued, and the revenue received therefrom during the calendar month.

And such journals and summaries shall in each case be in such form as is approved by the Governor in Council.

Further, any officer of the Licensing Authority and any person authorized by the Governor in Council to be a Ticket Inspector shall have the right to inspect, at any reasonable time, and in the presence of the licensed operator of the route, or some responsible person acting with full authority on such operator's behalf, all summaries and all other records in respect of ticket purchases, ticket stocks, ticket issues, ticket sales, and ticket returns.

All reports furnished by Ticket Inspectors shall be prepared in duplicate and the duplicate thereof shall be forwarded forthwith by the Inspector to the Licensing Authority.

No infant travelling free, and no child travelling at half fare, shall occupy a seat in any motor omnibus whilst any adult passenger is unable to obtain seating accommodation on such omnibus.

For the purposes of these Regulations the Governor in Council doth hereby approve of the 'T.I.M.' machines ('Major' and 'Minor'), the 'Ultimate' machine, and the 'Setright,' 'Roll Ticket,' and 'Inserted Ticket' machines, for use as ticket-issuing machines."

*Penalties.* Delete—

"Any person plying for hire with any motor omnibus and the owner of such motor omnibus permitted or concerned in plying for hire therewith, who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations, shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and not less than One pound",

and in place thereof insert—

"Any person plying for hire with any licensed motor omnibus, the owner of such motor omnibus permitted or concerned in plying for hire therewith, any passenger, any person in charge of a passenger, and any driver of a motor omnibus, who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the relevant provisions of these Regulations, shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and not less than One pound".

*Licensing Authority.*—Pursuant to the provisions of section 15 (1) (c) of the said Act (No. 3742), the Governor in Council by this Order confers upon the Licensing Authority full power and authority for the carrying into effect by the said Licensing Authority of the foregoing provisions of this Order.

And the Honorable Percy Thomas Byrnes, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

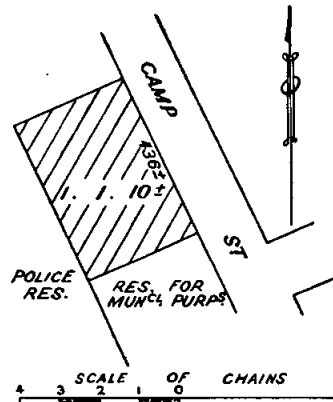

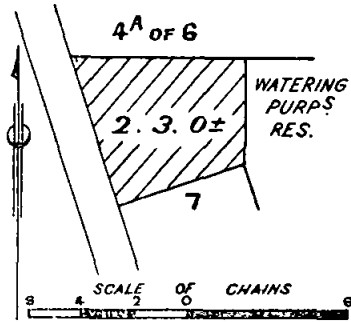

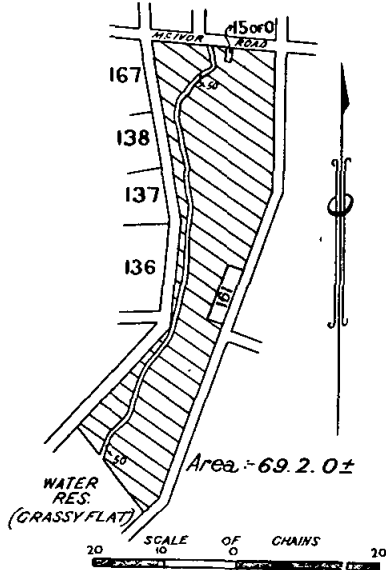
