AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL REFORM ACT 1950.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is provided by Part II. of the Legislative Council Reform Act 1950 that the boundaries of the electoral provinces for the Legislative Council shall be re-defined in manner provided therein:

And whereas it is provided by section fifteen of the aforesaid Act that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the Government Cazette declare the boundaries of the electoral provinces and that on from and after a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette, which day is in the said Act referred to as "the appointed day"—

the electoral provinces as so re-defined shall be the electoral provinces for the Legislative Council for the purposes of The Constitution Act Amendment Acts; and the boundaries so declared shall be substituted for those provided for in and shall take effect as if enacted in the Third Schedule to The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1928; and any reference in The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1928 or in any other Act to the said Third Schedule so far as such reference relates to provinces shall be deemed and taken to refer to the said Proclamation:

And whereas the electoral provinces have been so redefined and the boundaries thereof have been so declared:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Legislative Council Reform Act 1950, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday, the first day of November, 1951, as "the appointed day" for the purposes of the said Legislative Council Reform Act 1950.



MUNICIPAL BUILDING SURVEYORS BOARD.

REGULATIONS FOR ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION AS MUNICIPAL BUILDING SURVEYOR.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Local Government Acts, the Municipal Building Surveyors Board, appointed under the said Acts, hereby rescinds the Regulations published in the Victoria Government Gazette, No. 773, dated 13th September, 1950, and in lieu thereof makes the following Regulations relating to the issue of Certificates of Qualification as Municipal Building Surveyor:—

Part I.—Certificate after Complete Examination.

Clause 1.-The Board will grant a Certificate of Qualification to any applicant who has been granted permission to sit for the Board's examination, and who passes in the following subjects thereat:-

- (a) Building Construction, Parts I., II., and III.-
- three papers.

 (b) Mechanics and Strength of Materials—two papers.

 (c) "Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor"—one paper.

Clause 2.—(a) Every applicant shall forward to the Board before the 10th August in the year in which he desires to present himself for examination, an application in writing for permission to sit for such examination, accompanied by

ompanied by—

(1) Documentary evidence of having passed the School Intermediate Examination of the University of Melbourne, together with the subjects of Mathematics, Part 1, and Mathematics, Part 2, of the School Leaving Examination of that University; the Intermediate Technical Certificate of the Education Department of Victoria, together with the technical school subjects of Mathematics 1a, 18, and 1c; or such examination as may in the Board's opinion be equivalent thereto, provided that, in the case of a candidate over thirty-five (35) years of age, the Board may otherwise satisfy itself as to his having reached an adequate standard of education.

(2) A statement giving details of the technical study completed, and showing also the nature and extent of the work on which he has been engaged.

(b) The Board will grant to any applicant who complies to its satisfaction with the requirements of the foregoing sub-clause permission to sit for the examination for which application has been made.

Part II.—Certificate after Partial Examination.

Clause 3.-The Board will grant a Certificate of Qualification to any applicant who holds-

- (a) a degree of architecture granted by the University of Melbourne, or some other university which has at least equal status, on passing the Board's examination in "Powers and Duties of a Muni-cipal Building Surveyor";
- (b) a Diploma of Architecture granted by a university, or by a technical school recognized by the Education Department of Victoria, on passing the Board's examination in "Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor";
- (c) a Diploma of Building granted by a technical school recognized by the Education Department of Victoria, on passing the Board's examination in "Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor";
- Surveyor;

 (d) a certificate of corporate membership of the Royal Institute of British Architects, the Royal Australian Institute of Architects, Royal Victorian Institute of Architects, or a certificate of registration granted by the Architects Registration Board of Victoria, on passing the Board's examination in "Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor";

 (c) a degree of civil angineering granted by the Ini-
- (e) a degree of civil engineering granted by the University of Melbourne, or some other university which has at least equal status, on passing the Board's examination in "Building Construction, Parts I., II., and III.," and "Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor";
- (f) a Certificate of Qualification as municipal engineer Certificate of Qualification as municipal engineer granted by the Municipal Engineers Board of Victoria, the examining committee appointed under the Local Government Act of New South Wales, or the Local Authorities Act of Queensland, on passing the Board's examination in "Building Construction, Parts I., II., and III.," and "Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor";
- (g) a certificate of corporate membership of the Institution of Engineers, Australia, Institution of Civil Engineers, London, or a Diploma of Civil Engineering granted by a technical school recognized by the Education Department of Victoria, on passing the Board's examination in "Building Construction, Parts I., II., and III.," and "Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor";
- (h) examination qualifications which, in the opinion of the Board, are equivalent to any of those required under sub-clauses (a) to (g) inclusive, on passing the Board's examination in "Powers and Duties of a Municipal Building Surveyor," and in such other subjects as the Board may determine.

Part III.-Certificate Without Examination.

Clause 4.—The Board will grant a Certificate of Qualification to any person who-

- (a) on the eighteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, held the office or carried out the duties of building surveyor in any municipal district, and who proves at any time to the satisfaction of the Board that he has for a period of five years at least held the office or carried out the duties of building surveyor in any municipality or municipalities in Victoria, including the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong: or the City of Geelong; or
- (b) produces documentary evidence of having passed examinations of a technical school recognized by the Education Department of Victoria, which examinations were based on a like syllabus to that prescribed in clause 1 of these Regulations, and were of a standard to the satisfaction of the Board.

$Part\ IV.--Examinations.$

Clause 5.—An examination of candidates for Certificates of Qualification shall be held in Melbourne on such days and at such times as the Board may from time to time appoint.

Clause 6.—Every candidate must be in attendance at the examination punctually at the time appointed.

No candidate will be permitted to leave the examination room before the expiration of a period of half an hour after the time of commencement of the examination, and no person shall, without the approval of the supervisor, enter the room after the expiration of such period.

Clause 7.-Every candidate should provide himself with a book of logarithms, plotting scales, parallel ruler, tee and set square, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for drawing and computing. He will be permitted paper) for drawing and computing. He will be permitted to bring into and use in the examination room such books and charts as the Board may from time to time prescribe, but every such book or chart shall be free from notes and other markings and shall not contain any loose sheets or any additions to the printed text. The supervisor may refuse to permit the use of any book which, in his opinion, does not conform to the requirements of this clause.

Clause 8.—No candidate shall communicate with or receive assistance from any other candidate during the examination.

Clause 9 .--- A maximum of four hours shall be allowed for each paper in the examination, and on the expiration of the period determined candidates shall immediately hand in their answers to the supervisor.

Clause 10 .-- A candidate shall be credited with every subject in which he passes at any examination of the

Every policy (other than a policy providing an indemnity to an employer whose employees are engaged in mining operations) issued at the foregoing rates, or such rates as from time to time are fixed by the Commissioner, shall provide an indemnity to the employer in respect of his liability under the Act and any other Act of the State of Victoria in force at the commencement of the indemnity and at common law, as between employer and employee, including all costs and expenses incurred by or with the consent of the Commissioner in connexion with any claim for such compensation.
- 3. For clause 17 of the said Regulations, there shall be substituted the . following clause:-
 - "17. Any employer whose wages roll in respect of workers' employed by him exceeds £3,000 per annum may be allowed the following reduction and further reduction of premium on any policy in respect of such 'workers':—
 - (a) Reduction to be applied to the premium; to be operative on the effecting or renewal of the policy; and to be calculated according to the following scale (that is to

Wages Roll per Annum.	Reduction in Premium.
(i) Exceeding £3,000 but not exceeding £4,000	
(ii) Exceeding £4,000 but not exceeding £5,000	7½ per centum
(iii) Exceeding £5,000	10 per centum

(b) Further reduction to be applied to the premium as reduced by the operation of paragraph (a) of this clause; to be operative at the expiry of each policy period; and to be calculated according to the following scale (that is to say):-

Claims Ratio for Previous Policy Period.	Reduction in Premium.
(i) Exceeding 40 per centum but not exceeding 50 per centum of the net premium	10 per centum of the net premium
(ii) Exceeding 30 per centum but not exceeding 40 per centum of the net premium	15 per centum of the net premium
(iii) Exceeding 20 per centum but not exceeding 30 per centum of the net premium	20 per centum of the net premium
(iv) Not exceeding 20 per centum of the net premium	25 per centum of the net premium

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Motor Car Acts, Regulations were made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-second day of August, 1950, and published in the Government Gazette of the twenty-third day of August, 1950:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the said Regulations should be amended as hereinafter described:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Motor Car Acts and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth hereby amend as follows the said Regulations (that is to say):—

- 1. For clause 2 of the said Regulations there shall be substituted the following clause:—
 - "2. In these Regulations-
 - (a) 'Speed limit sign' means a sign which is erected by the Country Roads Board so as to face on-coming traffic and so as to be clearly visible to such traffic, and which consists of a disc—
 - (i) not less than twenty-two inches in diameter;
 - (ii) having a black border not less than one and one-quarter inches wide and a yellow back-ground with '25' in black numerals not less than nine and one-half inches high; and
 - (iii) so treated or of such a nature that when between sunset and sunrise light is projected on such disc by a head lamp of a motor car approaching such sign along the traffic way which such sign is facing such light is reflected in such a manner that the numerals on such disc are clearly visible to the driver of such motor car.


A diagram of the said sign is marked 'A' in the Second Schedule hereto.

- (b) 'De-restriction sign' means a sign which is erected by the Country Roads Board so as to face on-coming traffic and so as to be clearly visible to such traffic, and which consists of a disc—
 - (i) not less than twenty-two inches in diameter;
 - (ii) having a white background with a diagonal black bar not less than four and one-quarter inches wide rising at an angle of forty-five degrees from left to right; and
 - (iii) so treated or of such a nature that when between sunset and sunrise light is projected on such disc by a head lamp of a motor car approaching such sign along the traffic way which such sign is facing such light is reflected in such a manner that the diagonal bar on such disc is indicated to the driver of such motor car.

THE BIRCHIP ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER No. 237-1941.—AMENDMENT TO TARIFF.

WHEREAS on the 31st day of October, 1938, the Birchip Electric Supply Company Limited (hereinafter called "the undertakers") was granted an Order in Council, under the *Electric Light and Power Act* 1928, cited as the Birchip Electric Lighting Order No. 237-1941, authorizing the undertakers to supply electricity within an area comprising all that land contained within a circle having the post office at Birchip as its centre and a radius of 1 mile, for a period of fifteen years, commencing on the eighth day of March, 1941: And whereas by Orders dated 6th May, 1947, and 11th July, 1950, the Governor in Council did approve of amendments to vary the maximum charges which may be charged by the undertakers for electricity supplied: And whereas the undertakers have made application to further vary the charges which may be charged: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council

thereof, acting pursuant to the provisions of section 13 of the *Electric Light and Power Act* 1928, doth hereby vary the maximum charges which may be charged for electricity supplied as set forth in the Fourth Schedule annexed to the said Order and amended by Orders dated 6th May, 1947, and 11th July, 1950, respectively, by substituting the following sections for those set forth, that is to say:—

Section 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For electricity supplied for lighting purposes— For any amount—1s. 6d. per unit.

For electricity supplied for purposes other than lighting—

For any amount—10d, per unit.

Section 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 7s. 6d. per month irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

And the foregoing amendment shall be effective as from the date on which the Governor in Council approves of such amendment.

And the Honorable Keith Dodgshun, His Majesty's Minister in Charge of Electrical Undertakings for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Commencing at a point on the line of the west channel kerb of Burke-road and 9 ft. 10½ in. east from the point of intersection of the west building line of Burke-road and the northern building line of Camberwell-road; thence northerly along the line of the west channel kerb of Burke-road for a distance of 234 feet; thence easterly for a distance of 12 ft. 4 in.; thence southerly along a line parallel with and 12 ft. 4 in.

from the west channel kerb of Burke-road for a distance of 234 feet; thence westerly to the commencing point.

3. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of successive convictions in respect of successive similar offences against this By-law to a further penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for each such offence. for each such offence.
