### DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

- † SUBJECT TO:—(a) A maximum deduction as for two meals a day being made where an employee commences work at 9 s.m. or later and finishes at 4 p.m. or earlier on the same day or where he or she commences for the day between 1 p.m. and 4 p.m.; and (b) a maximum deduction as for one meals day being made where an employee commences work at or after 4 p.m., the minimum wage shall (except in the case of an apprentice, an improver, a midday waitress, a midday kitchenmaid or pantrymaid, or a casual employee) be, where the employer—
  - (i) provides meals-
    - (a) for each substantial meal 1s. 3d. per meal less,
    - (b) for each meal other than a substantial meal, 9d. per meal less.
  - (ii) boards and lodges the employee, 27s. 6d. per week less.

Notwithstanding any condition in this clause no deduction for meals shall be made for a public holiday when the employee is not required to work on such public holiday.

Under the provisions of Section 7 of the Factories and Shops Act 1936 (No. 4461) every employer of any employee in any restaurant is required to keep a time-book in the prescribed form wherein each employee shall enter daily a correct record of the hours worked. Any employer or employee who commits a breach of this section is liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

†Subject to—(a) A maximum deduction as for two meals a day being made where an employee commences work at 9 a.m. or later and finishes at 4 p.m. or earlier on the same day, or he or she commences work for the day between 1 p.m. and 4 p.m.; and (b) A maximum deduction as for one meal a day being made where an employee commences work for the day at or after 4 p.m., the minimum wage shall (except in the cases of barmaids or of employees working for an employer who carries on the business of a Restaurant, Dining Room, Eating House, or Cafeteria in connexion with a Departmental Store or Emporium, and of an apprentice, an improver, a midday waitress, a midday kitchenmaid or pantrymaid, or a casual employee, working in other places) be, where the supplemental store or employees working in other places) be, where the supplemental store or employees. employer-

- (i) provides meals-

(a) for each substantial meal, 1s. 3d. per meal less,
(b) for each meal other than a substantial meal, 9d. per meal less.
(ii) boards and lodges the employee, 27s. 6d. per week less.

Notwithstanding any condition in this clause no deduction for meals shall be made for a public holiday when the employee is not required to work on such public holiday.

Clauses, other than clauses 2, 36 and 52, of the said Determination shall remain in force.

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
