The Fisheries Acts.

ALTERATION OF THE REGULATIONS RESPECTING
LONG LINES IN WESTERN PORT BAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Fisheries Act* 1928 (No. 3683) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Proclamations to provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing may be carried on, and may prescribe any matters or things which are authorized or required to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the afore-mentioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Proclamation so made may be varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid provisions of the *Fisheries Act* 1928, do by this my Proclamation:—

1. Revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-eighth day of November, 1950, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the sixth day of December, 1950, respecting long lines in Western Port Bay.

2. Prohibit in the waters of Western Port Bay within or inside an imaginary line running from Shoreham to the Nobbies and an imaginary line running west north-west and east south-east through the flashing southern light of the inner passage, situated approximately 1,000 yards, 60 degrees from the head of Newhaven Jetty or of any river or creek flowing into such bay at any time during the period from the first day of November in each year to the thirty-first day of March next following, inclusive, any person having in his possession any long line in or upon the said waters or within 200 yards thereof, or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Using or assisting in the use of a long line or the method of fishing known as "long lining";
- (b) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat with a long line on board, or attached thereto, on to any of the said waters; permitting a long

line to be on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing a long line to be in or upon such waters or within 200 yards thereof;

- (c) using any fishing line, whether fixed or unfixed, having attached thereto more than three hooks or using or having in possession or control more than six such lines in or on the said waters;
- and further prohibit during the period in any year from the first day of April to the thirty-first day of October (both days inclusive) any person having in his possession more than one long line in or upon the said waters, or within 200 yards thereof, or a long line having attached thereto more than 1,000 hooks, or doing any or all of the following things:—

- (a) Using or assisting in the use of more than one long line or a long line with more than 1,000 hooks attached thereto;
- (b) permitting more than one long line or a long line with more than 1,000 hooks attached to be on or attached to any boat on such waters;
- (c) taking or assisting in the taking of a boat having thereon, or attached thereto, more than one long line or a long line with more than 1,000 hooks attached on to the said waters; or allowing such a boat to be on the said waters;
- (d) using or assisting in the use of a long line, or moving a boat with a long line on board, attached thereto, or in tow from any mooring, anchorage, wharf, or jetty during the period between noon on any Saturday and midnight on the following Sunday, or using any fishing line, whether fixed or unfixed, having attached thereto more than three hooks or using or having in possession or control more than six such lines during such period.



WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act* 1944, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the twenty-first day of November, 1951, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

Those portions of the Twenty-third Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Benalla and Wangaratta, and the Shires of Benalla, Rutherglen, Wangaratta, and Yarrawonga.

Town and Country Planning Act 1944.

CITY OF FITZROY.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the municipality of Fitzroy (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority") which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3), of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7. Schedule of Land Affected.—The City of Fitzroy, bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria-parade due south of the centre of Nicholson-street; thence north by a line passing through the centre of Nicholson-street to the southern boundary of the municipal district of Brunswick; thence east by the said southern boundary of the said municipal district to the Merri Creek; thence south-easterly by the Merri Creek to a bridge south of High-street, in the City of Northcote; thence south-westerly by a line passing through the centre of a Government road to the centre of the Heidelberg-

road; thence south-westerly by a line passing through the centre of the Heidelberg-road to a point due north of the centre of Smith-street; thence south by a line passing through the centre of Smith-street to Victoria-parade before mentioned; and thence west by a line passing through the centre of Victoria-parade to the commencing point.

Rating By-law for the Year Ending 30th September, 1952.

For one ½-in. service: £2 per acre, minimum £1.
For two ½-in. services: £3 per acre, minimum £1 10s.
For one ¾-in. service: £3 per acre, minimum £1 10s.
For two ¾-in. services: £4 per acre, minimum £2.

The charges for water supplied by measure or agreement shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.





For electricity supplied for purposes other than lighting—

For any amount per month up to 100 units—8d. per unit.

For each unit over 100 units per month but not exceeding 300 units—6d. per unit.

For each unit over 300 units per month—5d. per unit.

Where, however, the quantity supplied is determined quarterly, the units specified for a monthly reading may be multiplied by three.

SECTION 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of 7s. 6d. per month, irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF OXLEY AND ANNEXATION TO THE SHIRE OF BENALLA.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district and annex same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day or days specified in the Order, or, if no day is so specified, as from the day of such publication:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order sever from the municipal district of the Shire of Oxley the area hereinafter described, and doth annex the portion so severed to the municipal district of the Shire of Benalla, and doth re-describe the boundaries of the municipal districts of the Shires of Oxley and Benalla and the subdivisions thereof in the manner hereinafter set forth, such descriptions to be in-lieu of those published in the *Government Gazette* of the 26th May, 1948 (Shire of Oxley) and 1st November, 1948 (Shire of Benalla):—





A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1946* and numbered 315 to amend By-law No. 250.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and by every other Act and power enabling it in that behalf order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 250 intitled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII. Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and numbered 250 to amend and consolidate the By-laws with reference to street traffic and for suppressing nuisances" and any by-laws amending the same.

2. The Second Schedule to By-law No. 250 shall be amended by omitting the areas mentioned as set forth in the Schedule hereto from Part 1 of the said Second Schedule and adding the said areas to Part 2 of the said Second Schedule.

3. The fee for parking a motor car in any of the parking areas set out in the Schedule hereto during the prescribed hours or period of time or any part thereof on any prescribed day shall be One shilling and six pence.

4. Clause 47 of By-law No. 250 is hereby amended—

(a) by inserting immediately after the figures and words "568 feet 6 inches" in sub-clause (1) (a) the word "north-easterly."
