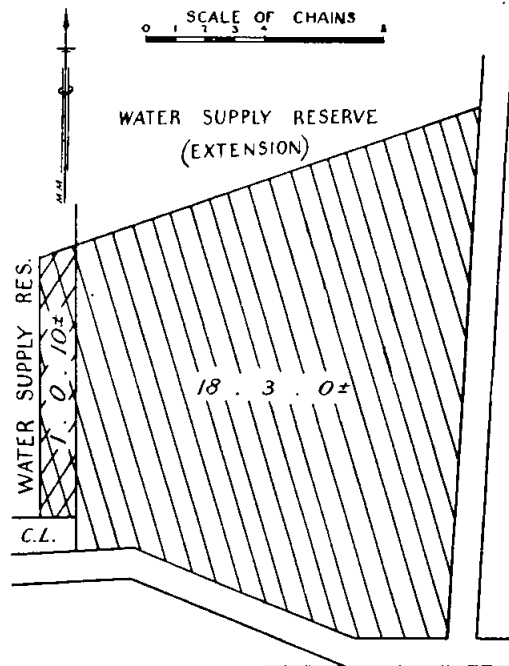

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PORTARLINGTON FORESHORE RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portions of the land permanently reserved for public purposes in the Town of Portarlington, as are indicated by red colour on plan marked P/26.4.50 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.6395, and known as the "Portarlington Foreshore Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding sixteen in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for entertainments, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six pence may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall light fires therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only in the place set apart for the purpose.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names, letters, or figures on the fences, trees, seats, or buildings in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein, nor remove any sand or soil from the Reserve.
5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion therefrom.
11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

12. Instrumental music is prohibited in the Reserve on Sundays between the hours of Three o'clock and Four o'clock in the afternoon, also between the hours of Seven o'clock and half-past Eight o'clock in the evening.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained herein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve and authorized officers of the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to the law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to or vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid doth hereby rescind the Schedule of Fees prescribed by the Regulations made on the 19th day of April, 1939, in respect of that portion of the reserve for a Public Park (excluding the area known as the "Sandringham Cricket Ground") in the Parishes of Moorabbin and Mordialloc as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked D.21/6/1917 attached to Lands Department Correspondence Rs.1116, and in the Municipality of Sandringham and known as the "Sandringham Beach Park" (hereinafter referred to as "the Park"), and in lieu thereof substitutes the following Schedule of Fees:—

SCHEDULE OF FEES.

On application for a permit as set out in clause 26—10s. Annually on the 1st day of January in each and every year during currency of permit—

- (a) Bathing boxes not exceeding 48 square feet in area—£1 per annum.
- (b) Boathouses used for private purposes only (area not to exceed 17 feet by 12 feet)—£2 per annum.
- (c) Boathouses used for commercial purposes—42s. per annum, plus £1 for each 100 square feet, or part thereof, in excess of 204 square feet.

- (d) Clubhouses—20s. per annum.
For transfer of permit—5s.
