AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by section 51 of the Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 (No. 3736) it is enacted that on the recommendation of the Minister any portion of the State of Victoria may be proclaimed a Milk Area by the Governor in Council: And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is also enacted that the said Act shall have effect as regards any milk area other than the Metropolitan Milk Area and the Milk Areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Castlemaine, and Port Fairy, on such day after the constitution thereof as is fixed by the Governor in Council: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Honorable George Colin Moss, Minister of Agriculture, do by this my Proclamation declare the Municipal District of the City of Warrnambool together with the whole of the premises of each and every dairy or dairy farm outside such Municipal District wherever situated from which milk is sold within such Municipal District shall constitute a milk area to be called the Warrnambool Milk Area: And I do further declare that the first day of January, 1952, shall be the day on which the Act and all Regulations and Orders now in force or which may from time to time be made under the said Act, shall come into operation and be of full force undeffect in such Milk Area.

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944 it is enacted that the Governor in Council, after consultation by the Chief Secretary of Victoria with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette proclaim any period as the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may proclaim different summer periods in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing on the nineteenth day of December, 1951, and ending on the thirty-first day of March next following, to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

The First Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Ballaarat, and the Borough of Sebastopol, and those portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Ballarat and Buninyong not included in the Fifteenth Fire Control Region.

the Fourth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Portland, and the Shires of Glenelg, Portland and Wannon;

the Fifth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Cities of Hamilton and Warrnambool, the Boroughs of Korolt and Port Fairy, and the Shires of Belfast, Dundas, Minhamite, Mortlake, Mount Rouse and Warrnambool;

the Sixth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Town of Colac, and the Shires of Colac, Hampden, Heytesbury and Otway;

the Eighth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Borough of Wonthaggi, and the Shires of Bass, Berwick, Cranbourne, Flinders, Frankston and Hastings, Mornington and Phillip Island; also French Island;

Ninth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Buln Buln, Korumburra, Mirboo, Narracan, Warragul and Woorayl;

Tenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the City of Sale, and the Shires of Avon, Alberton, Maffra, Morwell, Rosedale, South Gippsland and Traralgon;

the Thirteenth Fire Control Region, comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Fern Tree Gully,







Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road or other works, and if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3 of the Acts. Acts.
- 5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.
- 6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Developmental Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.
- 7. BY-LAW NO 55 (WATER SUPPLY).

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (here-inafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any way enabling the Board in that behalf, doth make the By-law following:—

- 1. By-law No. 51, duly passed by the Board on the 12th day of December, 1950, and gazetted on the 19th day of December, 1950, and By-law No. 54, duly passed by the Board on the 4th day of December, 1951, and gazetted on the 7th day of December, 1951, are and each of them is hereby repealed as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law.
 - 2. In this By-law-

"The Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board

- for the time being.
 "The Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board ne Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board for the time being or the Acting Secretary of the Board for the time being, and shall also mean and include any other Officer or person appointed by the Board for the purpose of exercising the powers of the Secretary under this By-law.
- 3. If, in the opinion of the Chairman or in his absence of the Secretary, it is necessary to reduce the consumption of water supplied by the Board, the Chairman or the Secretary (as the case may be) may at any time and from time to time declare—
 - (a) any period not exceeding 24 hours in duration to be a period of restricted use of water; or
 - (b) any period not exceeding 72 hours in duration to be a period of limited use of water.

- 4. If in his opinion it is still necessary to reduce the consumption of water, the Chairman, or in his absence the Secretary, may-
 - (a) during a period declared to be a period of limited use of water, terminate such period and declare the period commencing from the time of such termination to be a period of restricted use of
 - (b) during any period declared to be a period of restricted use of water or a period of limited use of water, declare any immediately ensuing period to be a period of restricted use of water or a period of limited use of water.

5. Any declaration made pursuant to clause 3 or clause 4 hereof shall be published either by broadcast from a broadcasting station in the metropolis, as defined in the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, or in a newspaper circulating in the said metropolis.

6. Save as hereinafter provided, no person shall, during any period declared to be a period of restricted use of water or a period of limited use of water, use or cause or permit to be used for the watering of any garden, lawn, or vegetation, or of any ground used or adapted for use in connexion with any sport, game or other form of recreation, water supplied directly or indirectly by the Board: Provided however that—

(a) during any period declared to be a period of

- (a) during any period declared to be a period of restricted use of water, water supplied by the Board may be used for such watering if the watering be carried out by means of a watering can or other similar container held in the hand;

 (b) during any period declared to be a period of

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "RIVERSIDE RECREATION

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Dooen temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council dated 31st July, 1951, together with that portion of the permanent reserve along the Wimmera river abutting such land, both of which areas are together known as the "Riverside Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
 - 2. No person shall-
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct;
 - (b) bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- Management Irst obtained.

 12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
- 13. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 14. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.
- 15. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.
- 16. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the
- 17. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his work and duty.
- 18. No assemblies for concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, shall take place in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 19. No person, other than the players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, bowls, croquet, hockey, or golf), and other than any competitor and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any play ground or oval during the course of such games and sports.
- 20. The Committee shall have power to let any portion 20. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations
- 21. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings and six pence for each vehicle.
- 22. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.
- 23. No organized sport shall be played in the Reserve on Sundays without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 24. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
- 25. The Committee of Management shall not be held responsible for any accident arising from the use of any entrance constructed by it to provide ingress, egress and regress with respect to the Reserve.
