DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

I, Raymond Henry Beers, Secretary for Labour, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, hereby make and issue the following adjusted Determination of the Wages Board referred to hereunder showing adjusted rates and prices to operate from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in February, 1951.

FRUIT PACKING BOARD.

Clause 2 of the Determination made on the 12th December, 1950, and in force as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in December, 1950, shall be replaced by the following clause:—

* Provided that any improver engaged in packing fruit other than citrus fruit packing establishments shall be paid the adult weekly wage or piecework prices.

Proportion (in any Place).

One improver to every two or fraction of two workers receiving not less than the minimum wage.

NOTE.—The Board determines that no person shall be employed as an apprentice.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force, provided that to the weekly earnings of each pieceworker the sum of 8s. shall be added, provided that where less than 40 hours are worked in any week a proportionate amount shall be added in lieu of such sum.
