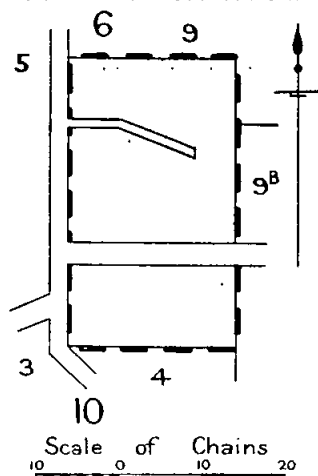

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

By-law No. 63.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1951.

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which Trust has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of the Water Acts (hereinafter referred to as the Trust), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make this By-law for such urban district for determining the rate to be paid in respect of the several lands and tenements to be supplied with water for domestic purposes, and directs as follows:—

1. The said Hamilton Waterworks Trust doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Hamilton Waterworks Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any land on which there is a building be less than Fifteen shillings; and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1951, and shall be payable on the 1st day of April, 1951, at the office of the said Trust.

2. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

3. Except where water is supplied by special agreement, and except as provided by By-law No. 30 of the Trust—

(a) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(b) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 10,000 gallons.

4. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

5. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purposes shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the rates and charges aforesaid, and each of them. And in the absence of such appointment, the secretary and/or rate collector of the Trust shall be deemed to have been appointed for the purpose aforesaid, and every one of them.

SUNBURY WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1951.

THE Sunbury Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes on lands and tenements liable to be rated in the Sunbury Urban District.

On lands and tenements a rate of One shilling and nine pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding Twenty pounds, and One shilling and six pence in the pound of the annual valuation exceeding Twenty pounds.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied on the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1951, and shall be payable on the 1st day of April, 1951, at the office of the said Trust.

The charges for water supplied by measure in any year to any property rated by the Trust are hereby fixed as follows:—

- (a) Up to and including 24,000 gallons, One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons.
- (b) Up to and including 200,000 gallons, the same charge up to and including 24,000 gallons, and One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity over 24,000 gallons.
- (c) Exceeding 200,000 gallons, the same charges as fixed above up to and including 200,000 gallons, and Six pence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity exceeding that figure.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, on the scale of charges hereinbefore mentioned, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

WERRIBEE SHIRE COUNCIL WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1951.

THE Werribee Shire Council, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Eighteen pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Werribee Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year ending on the 30th day of September, 1951, and shall be payable on the 10th day of April, 1951, at the office of the said local governing body, Shire Hall, Werribee.

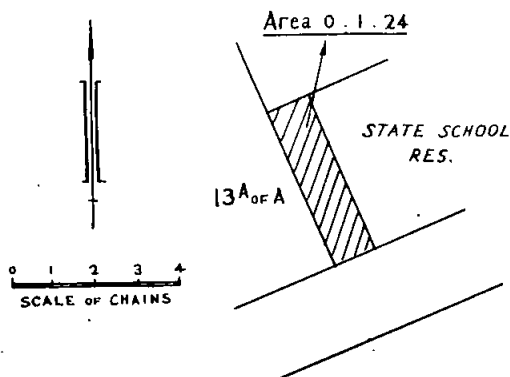

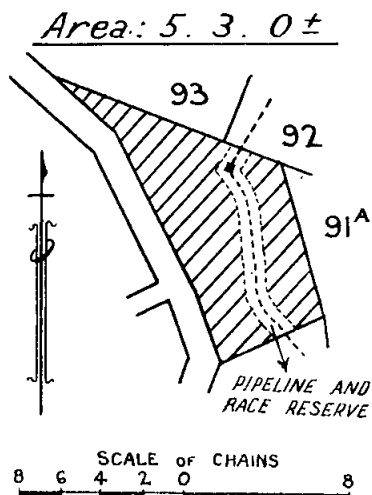

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE PRIVATE HOSPITAL
REGULATIONS 1931.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Amending Private Hospital Regulations 1951" and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. Regulation 3 of the Private Hospital Regulations 1931 is hereby amended—

(a) by inserting the following paragraph immediately after the interpretation of "Approved":—

"Chronic Case" means a person who is suffering from a chronic illness and who needs attendance and care and only occasional medical treatment.

(b) by inserting the following paragraph immediately after the interpretation of "Commission":—

"Convalescent case" means a person who is recovering from an illness injury surgical operation or child-birth and requires attendance and care and only occasional medical or surgical treatment.

(c) by inserting the following paragraph immediately after the interpretation of "Secretary":—

"Senile case" means a person who by reason of age and infirmity requires attendance and care and only occasional medical or surgical treatment.

(d) by adding a new sub-regulation as follows:—

(2) The following shall be prescribed classes of cases for the purposes of Division 2 of Part VIII. of the *Health Act 1928*, namely:—

- (a) Medical cases
- (b) Surgical cases
- (c) Maternity cases
- (d) Infectious cases
- (e) Chronic cases
- (f) Convalescent cases

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WARATAH BAY AND WALKERVILLE FORESHORE RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved land in the Parish of Waratah as is indicated by red colour on plan marked "W"/12.12.50 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.6547 and known as the "Waratah Bay and Walkerville Foreshore Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall bathe from the Reserve unless decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.

3. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements.

4. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-gun, pea-rifle, or take, displace, or remove any bird's nest or nest of any animal in or from the Reserve.

5. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move, or displace any trees, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

6. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone, or other substance, or play football, cricket, hockey, rounders, golf, or any other game with a hard or semi-hard ball on the Reserve, except in portions set apart for the purpose.

7. No person shall stick or affix, place or cause to be placed any advertisement, bill, notice, or placard on any fence, rock, cliff, tree, latrine, seat, improvement, or building in or around the Reserve, and the Committee or its duly authorized officer may remove any such advertisement, bill, notice, or placard affixed, stuck, or attached in contravention to these Regulations.

8. No person shall, on the Reserve—

- (a) light a fire or burn any material, except with the consent of the Committee or in the places set apart for the purpose by the Committee or its duly appointed officer;
- (b) break glass of any kind or leave or deposit any matter or thing injurious to persons;
- (c) deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin, can, orange peel, waste paper, garbage, or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.

9. No person shall erect any bathing box, boatshed, or other building or construction on the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such conditions and terms as may be imposed by the Committee and to the payment to such Committee of the fees prescribed by it. Any person who is granted permission to erect a bathing box or boatshed shall not transfer nor sublet such bathing box or boatshed to another person without first obtaining approval, in writing, from and paying the transfer fee to the Committee.

10. No person shall moor, use, place, or leave any boat on the Reserve without the permission of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

11. No person shall erect any tent, booth, or other such structure, nor offer for sale or hire any article within the Reserve or within any structure thereon without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person shall reside in any bathing box, boathouse, or any other structure erected on the Reserve, nor shall any person use any such structure for the purpose of storing furniture or goods other than boats, winches, or boat and fishing gear.

13. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal of any building, structure, or erection which has been placed, erected, or established on the Reserve—(a) without its consent, or (b) which has not been kept properly painted, or (c) which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained, or (d) upon which the occupancy has not been renewed, or (e) for any other reason it may deem good and sufficient, and no person shall neglect or refuse to remove any such building, structure, or erection from the Reserve within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent, by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring him to remove such building, structure, or erection.

14. In the event of any such refusal or neglect as mentioned in Regulation 13 hereof continuing for more than fourteen (14) days after the receipt of the said notice, the Committee may remove such building, structure, or erection without prejudice to any proceedings which might be taken against such person for so refusing to comply with these Regulations.

15. The owner or driver of any vehicle shall park such vehicle in such place and manner as directed by the duly appointed officer of the Committee.

16. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purpose of a camping area, and may fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and use of any such area.

17. No person shall camp on or use as a camp any portion of the Reserve, except such portion or portions thereof as are specially set apart by the Committee for the purpose and then only in such place or places as directed by its duly authorized officer.

18. No person shall camp on or use a camping area or any camping lounge or convenience appurtenant to a camping area, except during the period covered by a permission, in writing, of the Committee or its authorized officer, and on the payment of such fees as are fixed by the Committee, and any such permission may be granted subject to conditions deemed reasonable by the Committee.

19. Any person entering a structure, tent, or shelter or parking a caravan in any camping area shall abide by such directions as may be given by the Committee or its duly appointed officer.

20. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee, or its authorized officer, to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent, or shelter, or who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary, and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter, or garbage from the site.

21. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person for use of a camping area may be cancelled or withdrawn by such Committee or its authorized officer, and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance shall be refunded, and the Committee or its authorized officer at its or his discretion may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund a sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clear up and put in order the site vacated.

22. All persons using any conveniences provided on the Reserve by the Committee shall on demand pay a fee which shall from time to time be indicated.

23. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of such Committee or any officer thereof or any member of the Police Force or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission.

24. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless such dog is and continues to be controlled by a chain, cord, or leash, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

25. The Committee may from time to time fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and using any facilities provided by it on the Reserve for bathing and/or bathers.

26. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

27. No person, except workmen employed on the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs, or grass.

28. No person shall play or perform in any band of music or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon, or address of any kind, sing any sacred or secular song, enter into any public discussion, or hold or take part in any public assemblage on the Reserve, except with the consent of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

(7) The amount payable in respect of overtime worked by an officer during a fortnightly pay period shall not exceed the difference between the amount of salary payable to such officer for a full period of ordinary duty during such fortnightly pay period and an amount calculated in accordance with the following formula:—

$$1150 \text{ £1,050} + \text{current cost of living adjustment} \times \frac{14}{1}$$

and after sub-regulation (9) the following sub-regulations are inserted:—

"(10) Actual fortnightly salary shall be determined, as follows:—

Clause 1 defines the meaning of the terms, Council, Driver, Motor Car, and vehicle as used in the By-law.

Clause 2 provides that no driver of a motor car or other vehicle shall at any time between the hours of Two o'clock and Five o'clock in the forenoon of any day leave such motor car or other vehicle standing unattended in any street, road, or part thereof specified in the Schedule hereto: Provided however that this clause shall not apply to the driver of a vehicle of any class for which stands or standing places have been fixed or appointed by the Council while such driver is plying for hire on any such stand or standing place.

Clause 3 provides that the person next driving or taking charge of any vehicle shall until the contrary is proved be deemed to be the driver of such vehicle within the meaning of this By-law.

Clause 4 provides that the owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicle left standing unattended between the hours hereinbefore set forth in any street, road, or part thereof specified in the said Schedule hereto shall when requested by any officer of the Council or member of the Police Force give to such officer or member of the Police Force information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control), who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle, which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or vehicle so standing in contravention of this By-law.

Clause 5 provides that every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

The Schedule to the By-law sets out the streets, roads, or part or parts thereof to which the provisions of the By-law apply.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, numbered 144, for regulating the driving of cattle within the municipal district of the City of Footscray.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, By-law No. 123 and clauses 55 and 57 of By-law No. 83 are hereby repealed.
2. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, the following clauses shall be included in By-law No. 83:—

55. No person shall drive or cause to be driven into, through, or within the City any cattle including horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, and goats, intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria to any other part, on any day from Monday to Sunday inclusive, except between the hours of Two o'clock in the morning and Seven o'clock in the morning. Penalty, 20s. per head of cattle so driven.

57. Every drover droving or assisting in the droving of cattle, sheep, or pigs into or through or within the City shall, when traversing any portion of Geelong-road, in the said City, which is divided by plantations into three sections, confine such droving of such cattle, sheep, or pigs to the centre roadway.

(ii) The owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road shall give information to a member of the Police Force or officer of the Council controlling traffic with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or vehicle so standing in contravention of any By-law.

(b) By inserting in sub-clause (i) of clause 53 after the words “and not otherwise” the words “and such streets and public places or parts thereof respectively as are set forth in the First Schedule to this By-law are hereby appointed standing places for motor cars.”

(c) By inserting in sub-clause (2) of clause 53 the words “and six pence” after the words “one shilling.”

(d) In sub-clause (3) of clause 53 for the words and figures “from 8.30 a.m.” there shall be substituted the words and figures “from 7.30 a.m.”

(e) By inserting in the First Schedule to this By-law, after the last paragraph thereof relating to Sloss-street and ending with the words “of Sturt-street”, the following additional paragraphs:—

Riverside-avenue (Queen's Square).—All that area in portion of that street, known as Queen's Square, enclosed by lines commencing from a point in the roadway in line with the eastern building line of Queen's Bridge-street distant 78 feet north of the south-east corner of the intersection of Riverside-avenue and Queen's Bridge-street; thence by a line going north-east parallel to and distant 35 feet from the south kerb of Riverside-avenue for a distance of 270 feet; thence by a line running north-westerly for a distance of 50 feet to a point distant 35 feet from the kerb at the south side of the railway viaduct; thence south-westerly parallel to and distant 35 feet from the said kerb to a line on the production of the building line of Queen's Bridge-street; thence southerly along the said line to the point of commencement.
