Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 220.

SEED POTATOES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 220.

Definitions.

2. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears:—
 - “Approved Seed Potatoes” means potatoes approved as suitable for seed by a duly authorized officer of the State Department of Agriculture;
 - “Certified Seed Potatoes” means potatoes accepted by a duly authorized officer of the State Department of Agriculture as certified seed potatoes;
 - “By wholesale” means and refers to a sale of seed potatoes in lots of one bag or more;
 - “Ton” means a long ton of 2,240 lb. or a quantity of fifteen bags of seed potatoes each containing not less than 149 lb. weight;
 - “Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;
 - “Point of Delivery” means in relation to the sale of seed potatoes, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such seed potatoes to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased them.

Sales by Growers.

3. I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by growers to be—
 - (1) In respect of approved seed potatoes—
 - (a) at the point of production—£25 per ton;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production—£25 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.
 - (2) In respect of certified seed potatoes—
 - (a) at the point of production—£28 per ton;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production—£28 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.

(3) In respect of seed potatoes other than certified or approved seed potatoes—

- (a) at the point of production—£24 per ton;
- (b) at places other than the point of production—£24 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.

Sales by Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by wholesale to be—

- (1) In respect of approved seed potatoes—
 - (a) where the seller delivers the approved seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market—£27 12s. 6d. per ton;
 - (b) where the seller delivers the approved seed potatoes into the buyer's shop—£28 5s. per ton.
- (2) In respect of certified seed potatoes—
 - (a) where the seller delivers the certified seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market—£30 12s. 6d. per ton;
 - (b) where the seller delivers the certified seed potatoes into the buyer's shop—£31 5s. per ton.
- (3) In respect of seed potatoes other than certified or approved seed potatoes—
 - (a) where the seller delivers the seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market—£25 12s. 6d. per ton;
 - (b) where the seller delivers the seed potatoes into the buyer's shop—£26 5s. per ton.

Sales by Retail.

5. (1) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which seed potatoes may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be—

	lb.
(a) In respect of approved seed potatoes	4½d.
(b) In respect of certified seed potatoes	5d.
(c) In respect of seed potatoes	4d.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which seed potatoes may be sold by retail outside the Metropolitan Area to be the prices fixed in the foregoing provisions of this Order for such sales in the Metropolitan Area, plus the charges properly incurred in transporting such seed potatoes from the point of purchase by the retailer to such retailer's shop or place of business, but in no case shall such maximum prices exceed the following—

(a) In respect of approved seed potatoes	5d.
(b) In respect of certified seed potatoes	5½d.
(c) In respect of seed potatoes	4½d.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

6. (1) Every person who has for sale by retail any seed potatoes, the maximum prices of which are fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach to or display with those seed potatoes a ticket or label setting forth his selling prices therefor.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any seed potatoes shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those seed potatoes and so as to be properly associated with such seed potatoes.

Delivery of Invoices.

7. Any person who sells by wholesale any seed potatoes shall deliver with such seed potatoes an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name and address of seller;
- (ii) Name and address of purchaser;
- (iii) The date of sale;
- (iv) The point of delivery to the purchaser, the weight of the seed potatoes sold, number of bags, and price per unit of such seed potatoes; and
- (v) Total price of such seed potatoes.

Records.

8. Any person other than a grower who sells any seed potatoes shall keep and preserve any invoice or docket received by him in relation to such seed potatoes and shall keep a record in respect of the purchase of such seed potatoes showing:—

- (i) The name and address of supplier;
- (ii) The date of the invoice or docket received by him in relation to such seed potatoes;
- (iii) The quantity purchased and the price thereof;
- (iv) The point of delivery; and
- (v) Transport costs properly attributable to the transport of such seed potatoes from the point of delivery to his place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes grown in Victoria and specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold for delivery in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by notice by the Commissioner in writing to such person.

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 221.

POTATOES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 221.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 208 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - “Potato Marketing Board” means the Potato Marketing Board constituted under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* of the State of Victoria;
 - “Primary Wholesaler” in relation to the sale of potatoes, means a person who purchases potatoes for the purpose of re-sale to another wholesaler whose normal business is to sell potatoes by wholesale;
 - “Secondary Wholesaler” in relation to the sale of potatoes, means a person who purchases potatoes from a primary wholesaler for the purpose of resale;
 - “Ton” means a long ton of 2,240 lb. or a quantity of fifteen bags of potatoes each containing not less than 149 lb. weight;
 - “By Wholesale” means and refers to a sale of potatoes in lots of one bag or more;
 - “lb.” means pound avoirdupois or pounds avoirdupois as the case requires;
 - “Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;
 - “Point of delivery” means in relation to the sale of potatoes, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such potatoes to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased them.

Sales by the Potato Marketing Board.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by the Potato Marketing Board to be as follows:—

- (a) At any point of production in Victoria—£24 per ton, less cost of transport from point of production to Cowper-street, Melbourne; or

- (b) At any place other than a point of production in Victoria—£24 per ton, less the cost of transport properly incurred from the point of production to Cowper-street railway siding, plus the cost of transport properly incurred from the point of production to the point of delivery.

Sales by Wholesale other than by the Potato Marketing Board.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by wholesale by any person other than the Potato Marketing Board to be—

- (a) at the point of production—£12 per ton; or
 (b) at places other than the point of production—£12 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by wholesale by persons who have purchased such potatoes from the Potato Marketing Board, to be as follows:—

(1) For sales in the Metropolitan Area—

- (a) By primary wholesaler Cowper-street—£24 per ton;
 (b) By secondary wholesaler—
 (i) Where the seller delivers the potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market—£25 12s. 6d. per ton.
 (ii) Where the seller delivers the potatoes into the buyer's shop—£26 5s. per ton.

(2) For sales outside the Metropolitan Area—

- (a) where such potatoes have been purchased in the Metropolitan Area the sum of the following:—
 (i) Purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £24 per ton, whichever is the lesser;
 (ii) cost of rail transport from Cowper-street Railway Siding to the railway station or siding, nearest the purchaser's premises or place of business;
 (iii) a margin—
 (A) where the seller delivers the potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business, of £1 12s. 6d. per ton; or
 (B) where the seller delivers the potatoes into the buyer's shop, of £2 5s. per ton.

(b) where such potatoes have been purchased outside the Metropolitan Area, the sum of the following:—

- (i) an amount calculated at a rate of £24 per ton less the usual cost of transporting such potatoes by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises to Cowper-street Railway Siding, plus the usual cost of transporting such potatoes by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises to the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises or place of business;
 (ii) a margin—
 (A) where the seller delivers the potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business, of £1 12s. 6d. per ton; or
 (B) where the seller delivers the potatoes into the buyer's shop, of £2 5s. per ton.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

7. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be fourpence per lb.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which potatoes may be sold by retail outside the Metropolitan Area to be the price fixed in the foregoing provisions of this Order for such sale in the Metropolitan Area, plus the charges properly incurred in transporting such potatoes from the point of delivery to the retailer to such retailer's shop or place of business, but in no case shall such maximum price exceed fourpence halfpenny per lb.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

8. (1) Any person who sells or has for sale by retail potatoes, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall attach to or display with those potatoes a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any potatoes shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those potatoes and so as to be properly associated with such potatoes.

Delivery of Invoices.

9. Any person who sells by wholesale potatoes shall deliver with such potatoes an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (i) name and address of seller;
- (ii) name and address of purchaser;
- (iii) date of sale;
- (iv) the point of delivery to the purchaser, the weight of the potatoes sold, number of bags and price per unit of such potatoes; and.
- (v) total price of such potatoes.

Records.

10. Any person who sells any potatoes shall keep and preserve any invoice or docket received by him in relation to such potatoes and shall keep a record in respect of the purchase of such potatoes showing—

- (i) the name and address of supplier;
- (ii) the date of the invoice or docket received by him in relation to such potatoes;
- (iii) the quantity purchased and the price thereof;
- (iv) the point of delivery; and
- (v) transport costs properly attributable to the transport of such potatoes from the point of delivery to his place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any potatoes specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 222.

BREAD—METROPOLITAN AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, Thomas Gerard Gleeson, Acting Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 222.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 202 hereby is revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears:—
 - “Bread” includes white, brown, wholemeal, barley, rye, or Vienna bread; whether or not containing fat or malt or sugar or milk or any product or by-product of malt or sugar or milk and whether or not made in accordance with the requirements of the *Bakers and Millers Act 1928* and whether in the form of loaves or of rolls;
 - “Starch Reduced Bread” means starch reduced bread known and sold under the following trade descriptions or brands:—
 - “Borina,” “Bon Era,” “Broadway,” “Cenera,” “Ceralia,” “Conway,” “Denera,” “Dieteen,” “Glyx,” “Golden Rayceri,” “Maltine,” “New Era,” “New Way,” “New Process,” “Nucera,” “Nutrena,” “Nutty Loaf,” “Nu Vitera,” “Oslo,” “Peerless,” “Procera,” “Progress,” “Promax,” “Provena,” “Provita,” “Rath’s Milk Loaf,” “Reform,” “Semola,” “Sta-fresh,” “Tricerum,” “Vita Loaf,” “Vitin”;
 - “Metropolitan Area” means the municipalities of Box Hill, Brighton, Brunswick, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Coburg, Collingwood, Dandenong, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Kew, Malvern, Melbourne, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Northcote, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, Sandringham, South Melbourne, St. Kilda, Williamstown;
 - “By Wholesale” includes, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale by a retailer to a person to whom that retailer has, on the day of sale, sold a quantity of bread (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale), totalling not less than 12 lb. of bread, and, for the purposes of this definition, Vienna bread and Rye bread shall be reckoned as 2 lb. for every 24-oz. loaf and bread rolls as weighing 2 oz. each.

Maximum Prices—Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by wholesale in the metropolitan area to be the price specified in that Schedule.

Maximum Prices—Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by any person by retail in the metropolitan area to be the price specified in that Schedule, provided—

that where 1-lb. loaves of bread are sold to the same purchaser at the same time to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two 1-lb. loaves shall, for the purpose of this Order, be deemed to be a 2-lb. loaf.

Fixation of Maximum Price by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bread specified in a Notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold in the metropolitan area by any person to whom such Notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 223.

BOVINE HIDES AND SKINS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, Thomas Gerard Gleeson, Acting Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 223.

Application.

2. This Order shall apply to bovine hides and skins produced in Victoria or Tasmania.

Definition and Interpretations.

3. (1) "Meatworks" means an establishment at which stock is slaughtered and treated principally for export.

(2) The grades, classifications, terms, and descriptions appearing in the Schedule to this Order are those customarily used by persons trading in bovine hides and skins.

(3) Wherever the words and figures "Tare 4 per cent." appear in the Schedule to this Order in relation to any hides or skins, before calculating in respect of any such hides or skins the maximum permissible selling price fixed in relation thereto under this Order, the total weight of the lot of hides or skins the subject of the sale shall be reduced by 4 per cent.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price in pence per pound at which any grade, class, type or weight of bovine hide or skin or lot thereof specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold or offered for sale by any person to be the price in pence per pound specified therein.

Delivery of Invoices.

5. Any person who sells any bovine hides or skins of a grade, class, type or weight specified in the Schedule to this Order shall deliver with such bovine hides or skins an invoice or docket in relation thereto containing the following particulars:—

- (i) name and address of the seller;
- (ii) name and address of the purchaser;
- (iii) date of sale;
- (iv) lot number or sale list number;
- (v) description, in terms of the relevant description in the Schedule to this Order, of the grade, class, type, or weight of the bovine hides or skins sold;
- (vi) price per pound of the hides or skins sold;
- (vii) total weight of the hides or skins sold;
- (viii) total price of the hides or skins sold;
- (ix) terms and conditions of sale;

and shall keep and preserve a duplicate or copy of such invoice or docket.

Exhibition of Price List.

6. Every person who sells or has for sale any bovine hides or skins shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth his maximum selling price per pound in relation to each grade, class, type or weight of bovine hides or skins, that is to say by exhibiting a copy of the Schedule to this Order.

Price Tickets.

7. Every person who sells or has for sale any bovine hides or skins shall exhibit in relation to each lot of such hides or skins displayed by him anywhere upon his place or places of business a separate price card—

- (i) describing such lot in terms of the relevant description or descriptions in the Schedule to this Order for that grade, class, type or weight of hides or skins comprised in such lot; and
- (ii) specifying the maximum selling price in pence per pound of such lot, so as to properly associate such description and such price per pound with the bovine hides or skins to which that description and that price apply.

Auction Sales of Bovine Hides or Skins.

8. I hereby permit a sale by auction of any bovine hides or skins only insofar as the terms and conditions appearing in paragraphs 9 to 12 inclusive of this Order are complied with.

Catalogue.

9. (i) Any person who proposes to conduct any auction sale of any bovine hides or skins shall, except insofar as the exemption is granted by Notice in Writing by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner to that person, prepare and deliver to the Prices Decontrol Commissioner a complete catalogue of the bovine hides and skins to be offered for sale at such auction.

(ii) The catalogue referred to shall be delivered to the Prices Decontrol Commissioner not less than 24 hours prior to the time of the auction.

(iii) Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph (i) hereof such catalogue shall describe the bovine hides and skins to be offered at such auction in terms of the relevant description of the grade, class, type or weight in the Schedule to this Order applicable to those hides or skins and specify any identifying number to be used for the purpose of such auction and a proposed selling price per pound not exceeding the maximum selling price per pound in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 4 of this Order.

Records.

10. All persons who sell any bovine hides or skins by auction or otherwise shall keep a complete record of—
 (a) the names and addresses of the owner or owners of those bovine hides or skins;
 (b) the names and addresses of the purchasers of those bovine hides or skins;
 (c) the prices per pound at which those bovine hides or skins were sold—
 and shall preserve that record until its destruction is authorized by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner.

Bidding.

11. No bid of a price in excess of the maximum fixed in accordance with this Order shall be acknowledged by the auctioneer.

Announcement.

12. Immediately prior to the commencement of any auction the auctioneer, in addition to any other announcement which he is required by law to make, shall announce that no bid will be accepted of prices in excess of the maximum price fixed in accordance with this Order.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

13. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bovine hides and skins specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by Notice in Writing to that person.

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 224.

BOVINE HIDES AND SKINS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, Thomas Gerard Gleeson, Acting Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 224.

Application.

2. This Order shall apply only to bovine hides and skins produced in States other than Victoria or Tasmania.

Definition and Interpretations.

3. In this Order unless the contrary intention appears—

“meatworks” means an establishment at which stock is slaughtered and treated principally for export;
the grades, classifications, terms, and descriptions appearing in this Order are those customarily used by persons trading in bovine hides and skins;
whenever the word and figures “Tare 4 per cent.” appear in this Order in relation to any hides or skins, before calculating in respect of any such hides or skins the maximum permissible selling price fixed in relation thereto under this Order, the total weight of the hides or skins sold shall be reduced by 4 per cent.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price in pence per pound at which any grade, class, type or weight of bovine hides or skins or lot thereof specified in the Schedules to this Order may be sold or offered for sale by any person to be—

- (a) in respect of bovine hides and skins produced in New South Wales the price in pence per pound specified in the First Schedule to this Order;
- (b) in respect of bovine hides and skins produced in South Australia the price in pence per pound specified in the Second Schedule to this Order;
- (c) in respect of bovine hides and skins produced in Queensland the price in pence per pound specified in the Third Schedule to this Order;
- (d) in respect of bovine hides and skins produced in Western Australia the price in pence per pound specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

Delivery of Invoices.

5. Any person who sells any bovine hides or skins of a grade, class, type or weight specified in the Schedules to this Order shall deliver with such bovine hides or skins an invoice or docket in relation thereto containing the following particulars:—

- (i) name and address of the seller;
- (ii) name and address of the purchaser;
- (iii) date of sale;
- (iv) lot number or sale list number;
- (v) description, in the terms of the relevant description in the Schedules to this Order, of the grade, class, type, or weight of the bovine hides or skins sold;
- (vi) price per pound;
- (vii) total weight;
- (viii) total price;
- (ix) terms and conditions of sale;

and shall keep and preserve a duplicate or copy of such invoice or docket.

Exhibition of Price List.

6. Every person who sells or has for sale any bovine hides or skins shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth his maximum selling price per pound in relation to each grade, class, type or weight of bovine hides or skins, that is to say by exhibiting a copy of the Schedule to this Order.

Price Tickets.

7. Every person who sells or has for sale any bovine hides or skins shall exhibit in relation to each lot of such hides or skins displayed by him anywhere upon his place or places of business a separate price card—

- (i) describing such lot in terms of the relevant description in the Schedules to this Order for that grade, class, type or weight of hides or skins comprised in such lot; and
- (ii) specifying the maximum selling price in pence per pound of such lot—

so as to properly associate such description and such price per pound with the bovine hides or skins to which that description and that price applies.

Auction Sales of Bovine Hides or Skins.

8. I hereby permit a sale by auction of any bovine hides or skins only insofar as the terms and conditions appearing in paragraphs 9 to 12 inclusive of this Order are complied with.

Catalogue.

9. (i) Any person who proposes to conduct any auction sale of any bovine hides or skins shall, except insofar as exemption is granted by Notice in Writing by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner to that person, prepare and deliver to the Prices Decontrol Commissioner a complete catalogue of the bovine hides and skins to be offered for sale at such auction.

(ii) The catalogue referred to shall be delivered to the Prices Decontrol Commissioner not less than 24 hours prior to the time of the auction.

(iii) Subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph (i) hereof such catalogue shall describe the bovine hides and skins to be offered at such auction in terms of the relevant description of the grade, class, type or weight in the Schedule to this Order applicable to those hides or skins and specify any identifying number to be used for the purpose of such auction and a proposed selling price per pound not exceeding the maximum selling price per pound fixed in accordance with this Order.

Records.

10. Any person who sells any bovine hides or skins by auction or otherwise shall keep a complete record of—

- (a) the names and addresses of the owner or owners of those bovine hides or skins;
- (b) the names and addresses of the purchasers of those bovine hides or skins;
- (c) the price per pound at which those bovine hides or skins were sold—

and shall preserve that record until its destruction is authorized by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner.

Bidding.

11. No bid of a price in excess of the maximum fixed in accordance with this Order shall be acknowledged by the auctioneer.

Announcements.

12. Immediately prior to the commencement of any auction the auctioneer, in addition to any other announcement which he is required by law to make, shall announce that no bid will be accepted of a price in excess of the maximum price fixed in accordance with this Order.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

13. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bovine hides and skins specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by Notice in Writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 225.

BREAD—SALES OUTSIDE METROPOLITAN AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, Thomas Gerard Gleeson, Acting Prices Decentral Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 225.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 203 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Bread” includes white, brown, wholemeal, barley, rye, or Vienna bread, whether or not containing fat or malt or sugar or milk or any product or by-product of malt or sugar or milk and whether or not made in accordance with the requirements of the *Bakers and Millers Act 1928* and whether in the form of loaves or of rolls;

“Starch Reduced Bread” means starch reduced bread known and sold under the following trade descriptions or brands:—
 “Borina,” “Bon Era,” “Broadway,” “Cenera,” “Ceralia,” “Conway,” “Denera,” “Dieteen,” “Glyx,” “Golden Rayceri,” “Maltine,” “New Era,” “New Way,” “New Process,” “Nucera,” “Nutrena,” “Nutty Loaf,” “Nu Vitera,” “Oslo,” “Peerless,” “Procera,” “Progress,” “Promax,” “Provena,” “Provita,” “Rath’s Milk Loaf,” “Reform,” “Semola,” “Sta-fresh,” “Tricerum,” “Vita Loaf,” “Vitin”;

“By Wholesale” includes, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale by a retailer to a person to whom that retailer has, on the day of the sale, sold a quantity of bread (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale) totalling not less than 12 lb. of bread; and for the purposes of this definition Vienna bread shall be reckoned as 2 lb. for every 24-oz. loaf and bread rolls as weighing 2 oz. each;

“Booked Sale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, that such sale is not a cash sale as defined in this clause;

“Cash Sale” means, in relation to any sale of bread, a sale where payment is made by the purchaser for the bread within 30 days of the date of delivery of that bread;

“Metropolitan Area” means the municipalities of Box Hill, Brighton, Brunswick, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Coburg, Collingwood, Dandenong, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Kew, Malvern, Melbourne, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Northcote, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, Sandringham, South Melbourne, St. Kilda, and Williamstown.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread may be sold outside the Metropolitan Area to be—

(a) in respect of sales by wholesale—

(i) for a cash sale—the price specified in the Schedule to this Order;

(ii) for a booked sale—the price so specified plus—

(aa) in the case of 1-lb. loaves— $\frac{1}{4}$ d.;

(bb) in the case of 2-lb. loaves— $\frac{1}{2}$ d.;

(b) in respect of sale by retail—

(i) for a cash sale—the price specified in the Schedule to this Order;

(ii) for a booked sale—the price so specified plus—

(aa) in the case of 1-lb. loaves— $\frac{1}{4}$ d.;

(bb) in the case of 2-lb. loaves— $\frac{1}{2}$ d.;

provided that, in respect of sales by retail where 1-lb. loaves of bread are sold to the same purchaser at the same time to the extent that the total number sold is two or a multiple of two, two 1-lb. loaves shall, for the purposes of this Order, be deemed to be a 2-lb. loaf.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bread specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold in Victoria outside the Metropolitan Area by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
