Factories and Shops Acts.

SHOPS BOARD No. 23 (ELECTRICAL AND DETERMINATION OF THE RADIO GOODS).

Note.—This Determination applies to the following parts of Victoris, namely:—The Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and the Order in Council thereunder extending such Metropolitan District, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Warrnambool, and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

On the 18th May, 1932, the Shops Board No. 18 (Miscellaneous Shops) was deprived of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the business of a seller of—

(a) Electrical goods;

(b) Wireless (radio) sets, parts, or accessories;
and such power was conferred exclusively on the Shops Board No. 23 (Electrical and Radio Goods).

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons amployed in the hydrogen of a rate." rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the business of a seller of—

(a) Electrical goods;

(b) Wireless (radio) sets, parts, or accessories "—

has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That as from the 1st March, 1951, clause 7 of the Determination of this Board published in Government Gazette No. 8 of the 3rd January, 1951, shall be amended to read:—

## SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS.

7. Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, 9th May, 1951, 13th November, 1951, after 12 noon on Melbourne Show Day (Metropolitan District only,) Melbourne Cup Day (Metropolitan District only), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day. If any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, this rate shall be payable for work done only on the day so substituted.

All employees, provided their services are not required, shall be entitled to the above-named holidays without deduction of pay.
