Country Fire Authority Acts.

CREATION OF A NEW URBAN FIRE DISTRICT IN THE
EIGHTEENTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council
issued on the twentieth day of February, 1945, and
published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-first
day of February, 1945, for the purposes of the *Country
Fire Authority Act 1944*, certain parts of the country
area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions;
and certain parts of such fire control regions were pro-
claimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if
any) of each such fire control region (being the area not
included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be
a rural fire district:

And whereas by section sixteen of the *Country Fire
Authority Act 1944* it is (amongst other things) enacted
that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after
consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire
Authority, by Proclamation published in the *Government
Gazette*, create any new urban fire district and amend or
alter the boundaries of any rural fire district within any
fire control region:

And whereas the Governor in Council has from time to
time by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette*
made certain variations in respect of rural and urban fire
districts:

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted
a report recommending that a certain part of the
Eighteenth Fire Control Region should be created a new
urban fire district, and such part is set forth and described
in the Schedule hereto:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria,
in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice
of the Executive Council of the said State, after con-

sideration of the said report of the Country Fire Authority,
and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country
Fire Authority Acts, do by this my Proclamation—

- (a) create as a new urban fire district that part of
the Eighteenth Fire Control Region which is set
forth and described in the Schedule hereto;
- (b) alter the boundaries of the rural fire district
within the said Eighteenth Fire Control Region
by the excision of the part of such region which
is set forth and described as aforesaid.

SCHEDULE.

Part of Eighteenth Fire Control Region referred to.

That part of the Eighteenth Fire Control Region, being
the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Mildura
lying within the boundaries described hereunder, that is
to say:—

Parish of Mildura, County of Millewa: Commencing
at the northern angle of allotment 1, section 36, block F;
thence south-easterly by Fourteenth-street to the eastern
angle of allotment 10 of section 81, block F; thence
south-westerly by Ginguam-avenue to the southern angle
of allotment 20 of section 88; thence north-westerly by
Sixteenth-street to the western angle of allotment 10 of
section 45; thence north-easterly by Cowra-avenue to the
point of commencement.

AMENDMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION OF A MEAT
AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation extend the Metropolitan Meat Area by the addition thereto of the area described hereunder, that is to say:—

All that land bounded by a line commencing at a point on the Arthur's Creek being Crown allotment boundary between Crown allotment 34c and 34q; thence proceeding due east by the northern boundaries of Crown allotments 34q, section B, 6A, 6, 146, 145, 144, 143, 142, 140, 139, 138, 137, 117, 114, 110, 111, section C, the northern boundary of the Township of Kingston; thence by the northern boundaries of Crown allotments 77, 76, 75, 73, 72, and 71, section D, all in the Parish of Greensborough; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the Parish of Greensborough to Watson's Creek; and thence by the boundary of Watson's Creek to the Yarra River; thence westerly and northerly by the Shire boundary to the starting point.

Town and Country Planning Acts.

CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Camberwell (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority") having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Acts hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works during the operation of this Order.

3. Any applications for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Acts.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or building for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the Planning Scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

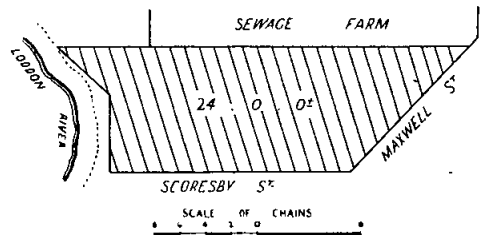
