Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE LAW CLERKS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board, which since the 15th July, 1931, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed in his practice, by a barrister and solicitor, but not including:—

(a) an articled cierk;
(b) a barrister or solicitior serving not more than one year for the purpose of gaining experience;
(c) a law student, i.e., a person employed as a clerk (other than an articled clerk) engaged in the course of study prescribed for those intending to qualify for admission as barristers and solicitors;
(d) a typist or stenographer,"

has made the following Determination, namely:-

1. That on the 14th March, 1951, clause 8 of the Determination published in Government Gazette No. 63 of the 25th January, 1951, shall be amended to read:—

SPECIAL RATE FOR SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS.

- 8. (a) Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, the day following New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Easter Tuesday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, 9th May, 1951, 13th Novamber, 1951, Show Day, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, but if any other day be substituted by local custom or by Act of Parliament or Proclamation for any of the holidays specified herein, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
 - (b) No deduction shall be made from the wages of employees granted leave for the holidays mentioned in sub-clause (a) hereof.
