DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

Where less than 40 hours is worked in any 1 by any piece-worker, a proportionate amount of such sum of 24s. shall be added in lieu thereof.
