PORTS OF VICTORIA—REPEAL AND SUBSTITUTION
OF PORT RULE.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1928* (19 Geo. V. No. 3723), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation issued in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the government and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such Regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby repeal Port Rule 117B respecting the navigation of oil tankers through the South Channel Dredged Cut, which rule was made by Proclamation dated the 25th day of September, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette*, No. 279, of the 27th September, 1939, and do substitute the following rule in its stead, that is to say:—

NAVIGATION OF OIL TANKERS THROUGH PORT PHILLIP HEADS AND THE SOUTH CHANNEL DREDGED CUT.

117B. To avoid the risk of collision and danger due to the necessity for passing close to oil tankers in confined waters, masters of vessels shall not attempt the navigation of Port Phillip Heads nor the South Channel Dredged Cut, where the navigable width is only 650 feet between Buoys Nos. 10 and 11, whilst an oil tanker is passing through.

To aid in the observance of this Regulation, and as an indication to an oncoming vessel that an oil tanker is about to enter either of the channels mentioned, the precautions represented by the following signals must be strictly adhered to, that is to say:—

Inwards over the Ingoing Stream by Day or by Night.—An oil tanker, inward bound, by day or by night, provided the signals representing an ingoing stream are showing at Point Lonsdale, shall, before

shaping course for the fairway, signal Point Lonsdale to the effect that she is ready to proceed, whereupon the officer on duty at that station shall, when all traffic likely to be met with has cleared the Heads, immediately hoist the General Commonwealth "Port Closed" or "Channel Blocked" signal, viz., by day a green cone between two red balls; by night, a green light between two red lights shown in a vertical line; whereupon the entrance fairway will become temporarily closed to all traffic.

On these signals being observed, the tanker will hoist similar signals where they can be best seen and may not be confused with the ordinary regulation signals carried by oil tankers, and proceed inwards. On passing through and shaping course for the South Channel, the "Port Closed" signals from the oil tanker and Point Lonsdale will be hauled down and the entrance fairway will be opened again to all traffic.

Inwards over the Outgoing Stream by Day or by Night.—No tanker inward bound whilst the outgoing stream signals are being shown shall shape a course for the fairway until all traffic in sight from the Signal Station and likely to be met with has cleared the Heads, which clearance will be indicated by the immediate hoisting of the "Port Closed" signal at Point Lonsdale, whereupon the entrance fairway will become closed to all traffic, and the tanker, after hoisting a similar signal, may proceed inwards whilst, at the same time observing the directions already given herein covering a passage during the course of the ingoing stream.

On arrival at No. 4 Light Buoy by day or by night, the oil tanker shall again show the "Port Closed" signal, when the Dredged Cut will become closed to traffic. On clearing the Dredged Cut to the eastward at No. 13 Buoy, the closed channel signal shall be lowered or extinguished, whereupon the channel will be open again to all traffic.

Navigation of Oil Tankers Outward Bound.—The owner, agent, or master of any oil tanker drawing less than 29 feet, which it is intended to send to sea by day or by night, shall notify the Port Officer, Ports and Harbors Branch, Department of Public Works, Melbourne, as early as possible of the anticipated time of arrival of the tanker at the Heads.

To ensure a clear passage through the Dredged Cut, the tanker shall show the "Port Closed" signal from when abreast of the Hovell Pile Light until clear of No. 9 Buoy at the western end of the Dredged Cut, when the signal is to be hauled down and the channel opened again to all traffic.

Passage of the Heads Outwards over the Ingoing Stream by Day or by Night.—Whilst the signals for the ingoing stream are being shown, an oil tanker shall not proceed beyond Observatory Point nor hoist the "Port Closed" signal until such signal is first hoisted at Point Lonsdale, as an indication also that shipping traffic sighted is unlikely to be met with during the passage through of the tanker.

During the display of outgoing stream signals, the tanker shall first communicate by signal to Point Lonsdale Signal Station, and the officer in charge thereof shall hoist the "Port Closed" signal as early as safety demands for the outgoing passage of the tanker, which, in turn, will lower her signals immediately on clearing the Heads.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

BY-LAWS made by Gas and Fuel Corporation of Victoria, pursuant to and in exercise of the power conferred by sections 30 and 45 of Act No. 5507.

1. In these By-laws, where the context admits—

"Act" means the *Gas and Fuel Corporation Act 1950*.
 "Board" means the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

"Fund" means the Gas and Fuel Corporation of Victoria Superannuation Fund.

Words importing the singular include the plural and vice versa.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine gender.

2. The Fund, known as the "Gas and Fuel Corporation Superannuation Fund," established on the sixteenth day of February, 1951, by Resolution of the Board shall be governed by these By-laws and, subject to and in accordance with these By-laws shall be regulated by the provisions of a trust deed dated the fourteenth day of June, 1951, made between the Corporation of the one part and Roy James McArthur, Roland Cameron Evans, Raymond Carl Schafer, Robinson Charles O'Donnell, and Neville Melrose Simons of the other part.

3. On the appointed day the under-mentioned funds and all investments, assets, and property thereof shall be merged and consolidated in the Fund, namely:—

- (i) the Metropolitan Gas Company's Staff Superannuation Fund, and
- (ii) the Brighton Gas Company Limited Staff Superannuation Fund, and
- (iii) the Metropolitan Gas Company's Retiring Allowance Fund for Female Employees.

4. On and from the appointed day the following provisions shall have effect:—

(1) All contributors to—

- (i) the Metropolitan Gas Company's Staff Superannuation Fund, or
 - (ii) the Brighton Gas Company Limited Staff Superannuation Fund, or
 - (iii) the Metropolitan Gas Company's Retiring Allowance Fund for Female Employees—
- who transfer to the employment of the Corporation on the appointed day shall by force of this By-law become contributors to the Fund in the Class applicable to each of them respectively, and in lieu of their former rights, interests, and obligations shall succeed to the rights, interests, and obligations conferred and imposed on them respectively in and under the Fund.

(2) No contributor, who is so transferred to the employment of the Corporation shall, in any event, enjoy any lesser right or interest or be subjected to any greater obligation than he would have enjoyed or been subjected to had he retained his former rights, interests, and obligations: Provided that nothing herein contained or implied shall prevent any such contributor from voluntarily accepting or undertaking any other rights, interests, or obligations.

(3) All benefits to which any former contributor or his dependants are or would but for the consolidation or merger effected hereby be entitled under—

- (i) the Metropolitan Gas Company's Staff Superannuation Fund, or
- (ii) the Brighton Gas Company Limited Staff Superannuation Fund, or
- (iii) the Metropolitan Gas Company's Retiring Allowance Fund for Female Employees—

shall henceforth be paid out of the Fund.

(4) The trustees or administrators of any Fund merged and consolidated with the Fund shall be discharged from their respective offices, and all powers and discretions vested in or exercisable by them or any of them shall be vested in and exercisable by the administrators of the Fund.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW No. 52.

2. In paragraph (b) of clause 9 of By-law No. 41, as amended by By-law No. 47, for the expression "10s. per hour or part thereof" there shall be substituted the expression "19s. 2d. per hour or part thereof during which a tester and labourer shall be engaged, and 10s. per hour, or part thereof, during which a tester or inspector shall be engaged."

3. Clause 3 of By-law No. 47 is hereby repealed.

4. Upon the coming into operation of this By-law the fees for testing and for stamping or marking each of the articles, materials, or things set forth in the Schedule to

By-law No. 41, as amended by clause 2 of By-law No. 47, shall be increased by an amount equal to 75 per centum of the fee prescribed by the said By-law No. 41 as so amended.

5. By-law No. 41, as amended by By-law No. 47 and as further amended by this By-law, is hereby ratified and affirmed.

Town and Country Planning Act 1944.

SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

THAT whereas by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme, in accordance with the said Act, has been commenced by the Council of the Shire of Broadmeadows (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all lands referred to in this Schedule, and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land, is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use land, or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7. Schedule of land affected.—All that area of land comprising the Parish of Yuroke, and that portion of the Parish of Wollert situated within the Shire of Broadmeadows.

A By-law of the City of Ballaarat, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 131, for the purpose of preventing and extinguishing fires and for suppressing nuisances, and for carrying out the purposes provided for in Part VII., 15th Schedule, of the *Local Government Act 1946*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Ballaarat orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Firewood" means wood suitable for use as fuel and includes saplings, re-shoots, and refuse wood generally, and parts of trees suitable for use as props or supports.

"Premises" includes land whether built upon or not.

"Stack" shall include pile, stand, store, or keep.

2 Every person, who shall in, upon, or about any place or premises within the City of Ballaarat stack or cause or permit to be stacked firewood, shall comply with the following requirements:—

(a) No firewood shall be so stacked as to prevent or impede in case of fire access to or exit from the place or premises where it is stacked or access to or exit from any adjoining place or premises.

(b) Firewood when stacked on end shall be so stacked that the vertical height of the stack shall not at any point be more than 8 feet above the level of the ground upon which it is stacked.

(c) Firewood when stacked horizontally shall be so stacked that the vertical height of the stack shall not at any point be more than 13 feet above the level of the ground on which it is stacked.

(d) No firewood shall be stacked upon the roof of any buildings or other construction,

3. No person shall deposit or keep or cause or permit to be deposited or kept rubbish of a combustible nature in any place or premises unless such rubbish is kept in bins or otherwise protected against sparks.

4. In the case of premises used as hotels, boarding-houses, or private residences, the quantity of firewood stacked at any one time shall not exceed 20 tons in volume, based on 50 cubic feet to the ton, and no stack shall exceed 8 feet in height.

5. (a) If any person by wilful act or default contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law, he shall be guilty of an offence against the By-law and liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

(b) Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

7. By-law 119 is hereby repealed.
