PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MOORABBIN.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

where the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c. WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a

public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a road within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Moorabbin aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

CITY OF MOORABBIN .-- PUBLIC HIGHWAY.

Malane-street.

Commencing at a point on the north building line of Centre-road 7 feet west of the intersection of the alignments of the west building line of Malane-street and the north building line of Centre-road; thence north-easterly on a bearing of 45 deg. 35 min. for a distance of 9 ft. 10 in.; thence northerly on a bearing of 0 deg. 27½ min. for a distance of 97 ft. 5 in.; thence north-westerly on a bearing of 348 deg. 10 min. for a distance of 222 ft. 6 in.; thence northerly on a bearing of 1 deg. 24 min. for a distance of 50 feet; thence northerly on a bearing of 359 deg. 26 min. for a distance of 957 ft. 11 in.; thence easterly on a bearing of 89 deg. 47 min. for a distance of 50 feet; thence southerly on a bearing of 179 deg. 26 min. for a distance of 1,012 ft. 2 in.; thence south-easterly on a bearing of 188 deg. 10 min. for a distance of 213 ft. 1 in.; thence southerly on a bearing of 180 deg. 27½ min. for a distance of 103 feet; thence south-easterly on a bearing of 135 deg. 35 min. for a distance of 9 ft. 11 in.; thence westerly on a bearing of 270 deg. 42½ min. for a distance of 64 feet to the commencing point.

SHIRE OF WERRIBEE.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1944 and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act has been commenced by the Council of the Shire of Werribee (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which heaphy makes the following Interim Davidsoment which hereby makes the following Interim Development

- 1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.
- 2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works during the operation of this Order.
- 3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.
- 4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein shall, when directed by notice, in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responisble Authority may carry out all or any or such works and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section (3), of the Act.
- 5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.
- 6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Act 1944, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.







- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1951 (No. 4), shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 and any Regulations amending the same, and shall come into operation on publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. Clause 8 of the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1951 (No. 1), is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—- \cdot
 - "8. Regulation 59 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the insertion of the following sub-regulation immediately after sub-regulation (4):—
 - "(4) (A) Vitamin 'C'--
 - (a) The following fruit juices shall contain not less than the proportion of Vitamin C (ascorbic acid) as set out opposite the respective names of each fruit juice:—

Orange Juice: Not less than 11.5 milligrams per fluid ounce.

Lemon Juice: Not less than 10 milligrams per fluid ounce.

Grapefruit Juice: Not less than 8.5 milligrams per fluid ounce.

Orange and Grapefruit Juice: Not less than 10 milligrams per fluid ounce.

Tomato Juice: Not less than 5 milligrams per fluid ounce.

Blackcurrant Juice: Not less than 20 milligrams per fluid ounce.

(b) Labelling-

Every person who sells any package containing fruit juice mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall attach thereto a label on which shall be written in letters of not less than 8 points—

'Contains not less than (appropriate amount) mgms. Vitamin C (ascorbic acid) per fluid ounce. The daily minimum requirement of Vitamin C is 30 milligrams.'"

- 3. Clause 5 of the amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1951 (No. 1) is hereby repealed.
- 4. Regulation 78 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "78. No person shall prepare for sale any patent or proprietary medicine containing heroin or any preparation thereof."
- 5. Regulation 33 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the insertion, after sub-regulation 6, of the following new sub-regulation:—
 - "(6) (A) Flavoured Milk.

Flavoured milk is the product obtained by adding to milk a flavouring, with or without prescribed colouring. It shall contain not less than 3.5 parts per centum of milk fat and not less than 12 parts per centum of total solids.

Labelling: Every person who sells any flavoured milk shall attach to the receptacle containing the same a label bearing in letters of not less than 12 points the words 'Flavoured Milk' followed immediately by the name of the flavour."

 - "Surface" means any surface which is likely to come in contact with food.
- 4. No person shall use cadmium for plating the surface of any food appliance.
- 5. No person shall sell any food appliance of which any surface has been plated with cadmium.
- 6. No person shall keep or store any food for sale for human consumption in any container having a surface coated with cadmium.
- 7. The Council of every municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters and things as are necessary for such purposes.
- 8. Every person doing any act forbidden to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

Expenses of Chairmen.

5. Chairmen of Wages Boards, whilst necessarily travelling in the performance of their duties, shall be entitled to be paid travelling expenses on the scale and under the conditions prescribed by the Regulations under the *Public Service Act* 1928 for officers of the Public Service.

Fees and Expenses of Members.

6. Members of Wages Boards, other than Chairmen, shall be paid as follows:—

For each meeting of the Board at which the member attends, 15s.
