DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

Females and unapprenticed male juniors may be employed on piece-work subject to clause 17 hereof. The wages of male juniors in receipt of 20s. per week or more shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage in terms of clause 24 hereof, such adjustments to be made to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded. The wages of females shall be calculated to the nearest 6d., any broken part of 6d. in the result not exceeding 3d. to be disregarded.

Clauses, other than clauses 2 and 3, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
