Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 282.

BRAN AND POLLARD—SALES BY WHOLESALE AND RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 282.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 201 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“By wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of bran or pollard, a sale or supply to a person for the purpose of resale.

“By retail” means, in relation to any sale of bran or pollard, a sale to a person for the purpose of consumption or use.

“Metropolitan area” means all that area within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

“Mill-town area” means any area in which deliveries of bran or pollard were customarily made from a local mill to the purchaser's premises by the miller prior to the 17th September, 1948.

“Bushel” means, in relation to any sale of bran or pollard, 20 pounds in weight.

“Station” means a railway station of the Victorian Railways Commissioners.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale—Metropolitan Area.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by wholesale in the metropolitan area to be—

(a) where delivered free to purchaser's premises—the price specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order opposite to such area in the first column thereof:

(b) where delivered ex mill or free to the railway station siding most accessible to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in paragraph (a) of this clause, less 2s. 6d. per ton; or

(c) for other deliveries—the price specified in paragraph (a) of this clause, less the cost which would be incurred in transporting such bran or pollard to the purchaser's premises.

*Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale—Outside Metropolitan Area—
Other than Mill-town Areas.*

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by wholesale for delivery outside the metropolitan area, except where the purchaser's premises are within a mill-town area, to be—

- (a) where delivered to the railway station or siding most accessible to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order according to the railway station or siding to which such bran or pollard is so delivered; or
- (b) where delivered ex mill or on rail, but not free on rail, to railway station or siding most accessible to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in paragraph (a) of this clause less the freight which would be incurred in transporting such bran or pollard to such most accessible railway station or siding: Provided that—
 - (i) where such most accessible railway station or siding is on the Tatong line beyond Benalla or on the Whitfield line beyond Wangaratta, then in such case Benalla and Wangaratta respectively shall be deemed to be the most accessible railway station as aforesaid;
 - (ii) in the case of Portarlington, Dromana, Sorrento, and Flinders—free on board Geelong or Melbourne should be substituted for most accessible railway station or siding and railway station or siding as aforesaid.

*Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale—Outside Metropolitan Area—
Mill-town Areas.*

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by wholesale for delivery outside the metropolitan area in all cases where the purchaser's premises are within a mill-town area to be—

- (a) where delivered free to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order according to the railway station or siding to which those premises are most accessible;
- (b) where delivered ex mill or free to the railway station or siding most accessible to the purchaser's premises—the price specified in paragraph (a) of this clause, less 2s. 6d. per ton; or
- (c) for other deliveries—the price specified in paragraph (a) of this clause less the cost which would be incurred in transporting such bran or pollard to the purchaser's premises.

Maximum Prices—Deliveries Under Three Tons.

7. (1) The maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order are for deliveries of 3 long tons (6,720 lb.) or more.

(2) Where deliveries are made of less than 3 long tons (6,720 lb.) and the seller has incurred freight costs which have not been charged to the purchaser, then the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order shall in each case be increased by an amount by which the freight incurred is greater than the proportional amount of freight on a 3 long ton truck lot basis.

Maximum Price—Sales by Retail.

8. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by retail by millers to be—

- (a) for deliveries ex mill in lots of 1 bushel or more—2s. 7d. per bushel; or
- (b) for deliveries ex mill in lots of less than 1 bushel—2s. 7½d. per bushel.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard may be sold by retail by persons other than millers to be—

(a) in respect of sale in the metropolitan area or in the area comprised within a radius of 2 miles of any station or place specified in the First or Second Schedule to this Order—

(i) for deliveries to the purchaser's premises—

(aa) in bushel lots—3s. 0½d. per bushel, and

(bb) in bag lots—2s. 11d. per bushel;

(ii) for deliveries ex store—

(aa) in bushel lots—2s. 10½d. per bushel, and

(bb) in bag lots—2s. 10d. per bushel; and

(b) in respect of sales at any place outside the areas referred to in paragraph (a) of this sub-clause—the prices fixed by sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii) of the immediately preceding paragraph of this sub-clause, and, where the cost of transport of the bran or pollard in question from the nearest railway station or siding to the retailer's premises is shown separately on an invoice delivered to the retailer, plus such cost of transport.

(3) In respect of all sales by retail an additional amount of 2s. 6d. may be charged when the bag is sold with the bran or pollard.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which bran or pollard specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 283.
MILK—VICTORIA—COUNTRY AREAS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 283.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 247 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretation.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "By retail" or "by wholesale" means, in relation to any sale of milk, that such sale is a sale by retail or by wholesale, as the case may be, but is not a sale by semi-wholesale.
 - "By semi-wholesale" means, in relation to the sale of any milk—
 - (a) that such milk is sold by a retailer to a person to whom the retailer has, on the day of the sale, sold a quantity of milk (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale) exceeding 2 gallons; or
 - (b) is a sale to a person who conducts a shop where milk is sold separately from any milk round.
 - "Central Area" means the area specified in Part I. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Gippsland Area" means the area specified in Part II. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Mallee Area" means the area specified in Part III. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Melbourne Milk Board Area" means the area which at the date of this Order constituted the Metropolis as defined for the purposes of the Milk Board Acts.
 - "North-Central Area" means the area specified in Part IV. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "North-Eastern Area" means the area specified in Part V. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Northern Area" means the area specified in Part VI. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Treatment" includes the pasteurization, cooling, chilling, refrigerating of milk, and "treated" has a corresponding meaning.
 - "Western Area" means the area specified in Part VII. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
 - "Wimmera Area" means the area specified in Part VIII. of the Second Schedule to this Order.
- (2) For the purpose of this Order, where any post office or principal post office of any place is situated less than 3 miles from any boundary line of any area defined in this Order, then all places within 3 miles of that post office, or principal post office, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be within the area in which that post office, or principal post office, is situated.

Maximum Prices—Specified Areas.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold for delivery in any of the areas specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order to be—
 - (a) in respect of sales to retailers (excluding semi-wholesale sales)—
 - (i) where delivery is taken at the retailer's premises—the price specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite to such area; or
 - (ii) where delivery is taken at any other place—the price specified in sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph less the cost which would be incurred in transporting the milk to the retailer's premises;

(b) in respect of sales by retail—

- (i) where such milk is not sold in a sealed container—
 - (A) the price specified in the fourth column of that Schedule opposite such area; or
 - (B) the price paid or payable by the retail seller for such milk plus an amount computed at the rate of 1s. 10d. per gallon, plus any cost incurred in transporting that milk to his premises, whichever is the lesser; or
- (ii) where such milk is sold in a sealed container—the price specified in sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph, plus an amount computed at the rate of ½d. per quart.

Provided that the maximum price for milk supplied to persons having milk delivered to them regularly in retail quantities of one pint or more per day shall be computed on a weekly basis by multiplying the total quartage delivered during such week by the maximum price per quart fixed by the foregoing provisions of this sub-paragraph.

(c) in respect of sales by semi-wholesale—

- (i) where such milk is not sold in a sealed container—
 - (A) The price specified in the third column of that Schedule opposite such area; or
 - (B) The price paid or payable for such milk by the semi-wholesaler, plus an amount calculated at the rate of 1s. per gallon, whichever is the lesser; or
- (ii) where such milk is sold in a sealed container—the price specified in paragraph (i) of this paragraph, plus an amount computed at the rate of 3d. per gallon.

Maximum Prices—Treatment Depots.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold to any person (other than a retailer) for treatment in any area specified in the Schedules to this Order to be the maximum price for the sale of that milk to a retailer in that area less an amount computed at the rate of 1d. per gallon.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold to a retailer by any person who has purchased that milk and treated that milk in any area specified in the Schedules to this Order to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of that milk to a retailer in that area, plus an amount computed at the rate of 1½d. per gallon.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold in any area specified in the Schedules to this Order by any person to whom a notice is given in pursuance of this clause to be the price fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 284.

MILK—GEELONG AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 284.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 248 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“By retail” or “by wholesale” means, in relation to any sale of milk in the Geelong area, that such sale is a sale by retail or by wholesale, as the case may be, but is not a sale by semi-wholesale.

"By semi-wholesale" means, in relation to the sale of any milk in the Geelong area—

- (a) that such milk is sold by a retailer to a person to whom the retailer has, on the day of the sale, sold a quantity of milk (including that comprised in such first-mentioned sale) exceeding 2 gallons; or
- (b) is a sale to a person who conducts a shop where milk is sold separately from any milk round.

"Geelong area" means all that area of Victoria comprised in the Boroughs of Geelong, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and Queenscliff, and the Shires of Barrabool, Bellarine, Corio, and South Barwon.

"Treatment" includes the pasteurization, cooling, chilling, refrigerating of milk, and "treated" has a corresponding meaning.

(2) For the purpose of this Order, where any post office, or principal post office of any place, is situated less than 3 miles from any boundary line of the Geelong area, then all places within 3 miles of that post office or principal post office, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be within the area in which that post office or principal post office is situated.

Maximum Prices—Geelong Area.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which milk may be sold for delivery in the Geelong area, including any cost of delivery to the purchaser, to be—

- (a) in respect of sales by wholesale—2s. 9d. per gallon;
- (b) in respect of sales by semi-wholesale—
 - (i) loose—3s. 11d. per gallon,
 - (ii) in bottles—4s. 3d. per gallon;
- (c) in respect of sales by retail—

Provided that the maximum price for milk supplied to persons having milk delivered to them regularly in retail quantities of 1 pint or more per day shall be computed on a weekly basis by multiplying the total quartage delivered during such week by the maximum price per quart fixed by this paragraph.

Maximum Prices—Treatment Depots.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold to any person (other than a retailer) for treatment in the Geelong area to be the maximum price for the sale of that milk by wholesale in that area less an amount computed at the rate of 1d. per gallon.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold by wholesale by any person who has purchased that milk and treated that milk in the Geelong area to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of that milk by wholesale in that area plus an amount computed at the rate of 1½d. per gallon.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum prices at which milk may be sold in the Geelong area by any person to whom a notice in pursuance of this clause is given to be the prices fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 285.

PETROLEUM AND SHALE PRODUCTS—MOTOR SPIRIT.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 285.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 206 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Motor spirit” means a liquid petroleum or shale product normally marketed for use as fuel in internal combustion engines with spark ignition, excluding power kerosene, but including such motor spirit blended with distillate from coal products or with alcohol.

“Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

Maximum Price.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which motor spirit may be sold by retail to be—

(a) in the Metropolitan Area—Three shillings and three pence per gallon;

(b) outside the Metropolitan Area—the sum of the purchase price paid or payable to the wholesale seller plus Three pence three farthings per gallon. Provided that where the maximum price so calculated results in a price not exactly divisible by One halfpenny the maximum price may be determined at the nearest upward halfpenny.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which motor spirit specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Decontrol Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 286.

BUTTER: WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 286.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 3214, as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 3369, made under Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations, is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“No. 1 Area” means the area specified in Part 1 of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“No. 2 Area” means the area specified in Part 2 of the Second Schedule to this Order;

“No. 3 Area” means the area specified in Part 3 of the Second Schedule to this Order;

"bulk" means, in relation to the sale of any butter, that such butter is not sold in prints as defined in this paragraph;

"prints" means, in relation to the sale of any butter, that such butter is sold pre-wrapped in a package of 1 lb. or $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. in weight.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which butter may be sold for delivery in Victoria to be—

(a) in respect of sales by wholesale—

(i) for bulk sales—2s. 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per lb.,

(ii) for sales in prints—2s. 10 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per lb.;

(b) in respect of sales by retail—the price specified in the First Schedule to this Order.

Exhibition of Price List.

5. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail in Victoria any butter, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, and in such manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place, or places of business, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of that butter.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any butter, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order and which is specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause, may be sold in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
