## Prices Regulation Acts.

## PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 287.

## SALES TAX—INCLUSION IN RETAIL PRICES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Decontrol Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 287.
2. Notwithstanding the provisions of any Prices Regulation Order or Notice in Writing issued prior to or subsequent to the making of this Order, I hereby fix and declare that, where in any Prices Regulation Order or Notice in Writing the maximum retail price at which any goods may be sold is fixed by reference to the cost thereof to the seller, in calculating such maximum price—
  - (a) such cost shall not for the purpose of calculating any percentage or profit margin thereon include sales tax at a rate greater than 8½ per centum; and
  - (b) where sales tax at a rate greater than 8½ per centum is payable, the amount of such tax in excess of 8½ per centum may be added to the retail selling price calculated in accordance with the relevant Order or Notice in Writing but without the addition of any profit margin or percentage margin.

## Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935.

REPORT BY THE CONSUMERS COMMITTEE TO THE HONORABLE THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 15 OF THE MARKETING OF PRIMARY PRODUCTS ACT 1935.

AT a Meeting of the Consumers Committee, held on the 28th August, 1951, the following Resolution was carried:—

“That, in accordance with section 15 (2) of the Marketing of Primary Products Act No. 4337, this Committee desires to report its concern at recent shortages in the supply of potatoes for consumers. This Committee has been in close contact with the Potato Marketing Board and is of the opinion that the effect of the operations of that Board has not been the cause of these recent shortages. This Committee understands that one of the reasons for shortages is due to the fact that producers do not know what they will receive for their potatoes when they reach maturity. This Committee is of the opinion, therefore, that the Prices Decontrol Commissioner should indicate immediately the maximum price likely to be fixed for the next season's crop, with a view to encouraging maximum planting, and assuring supplies for local consumption. This Committee understands that a survey of production costs recently made by a Cost Production Committee has now been completed and is of the opinion that the findings of that committee should be made public without delay.”

In carrying this Resolution, members of the Consumers Committee were perturbed at the recurring shortages of potatoes and are of the opinion that, unless effective action is taken, the supply will become less and less, with the resultant hardship to housewives.

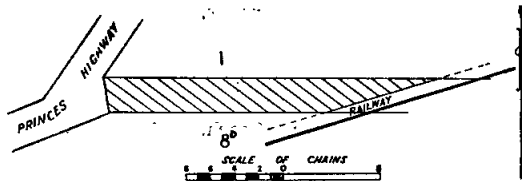

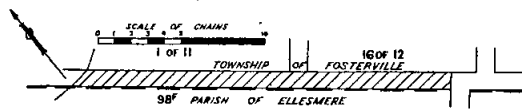

## A CLERKS (MEAT WORKS) BOARD TO BE APPOINTED AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE COMMERCIAL CLERKS BOARD.

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

(1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed as clerks, in meat works where killing is done, at work connected directly with the slaughtering of animals for export as meat or with the processing of the carcasses of such animals or the products therefrom.

(2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as

representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed as clerks, in meat works where killing is done, at work connected directly with the slaughtering of animals for export as meat or with the processing of the carcasses of such animals or the products therefrom.

Also, that such Wages Board may in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Clerks (Meat Works) Board, and that the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

(3) For the purpose of adjusting the powers which the said Clerks (Meat Works) Board and the Commercial Clerks Board may lawfully exercise, deprive the Commercial Clerks Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed as clerks, in meat works where killing is done, at work connected directly with the slaughtering of animals for export as meat or with the processing of the carcasses of such animals or the products therefrom, and confer such power exclusively on the Clerks (Meat Works) Board.

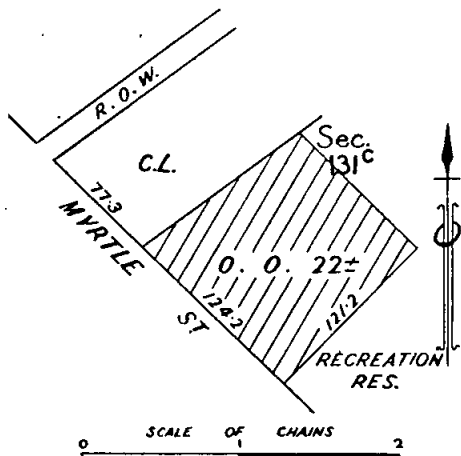

##### NOTICE OF MAKING OF BY-LAW No. 133.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the City of Ballaarat has made and passed By-law No. 133, being a By-law made under Part VII., Division 1, of the Local Government Act 1946, and any Act amending the same, and under Section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1928, for regulating traffic and processions, for carrying out purposes provided for in the 15th Schedule to the Local Government Act 1946, for keeping order in the carriage-ways and for preventing the obstruction thereof, and for prohibiting or minimizing noises in public highways, for suppressing nuisances, and for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars and for vehicles other than motor cars, and prescribing the conditions on which, and the days and hours during which, and the period of time for which all, or any, of such standing places may be occupied by motor cars and vehicles, and for regulating the use of any such standing places, and prohibiting the leaving, whether unattended or not, of motor cars or other vehicles standing on any street or road or part thereof specified in the By-law, and for the purpose of amending or repealing By-laws and Regulations or parts thereof, dealing with the regulation of traffic and for other purposes dealt with in the By-law.

The Governor in Council has approved such portions of the By-law as require such approval.

The By-law is to have force and effect throughout the municipality, save as may be provided in the By-law, and it shall come into operation on the day after the day of publication thereof, or of publication of notice of the making thereof in the Government Gazette of the State of Victoria. The By-law repeals the whole of By-law 114, clauses 58 and 65 of By-law 90, clause 2, By-law 47, Town of Ballaarat East, clause 10 of By-law 120. It contains definitions of words and phrases used therein. It forbids interference with Council notices in streets. It forbids the placing of notices or signs in streets by unauthorized persons. It requires persons apparently in control of motor cars or vehicles left standing in streets to give information to police or officers of Council as to driver of such car or vehicle. It forbids the repairing or dismantling of cars in parking areas or public places. It forbids the placing of hand-bills and advertisements in cars and limits length and width of loads carried upon vehicles in streets. It prescribes conditions as to the holding of street processions, and contains provisions prohibiting or minimizing noises in streets, or within hearing of persons upon streets and footways. It provides for All Day Parking Areas and Limited Parking Areas for motor cars and Stands or Standing Places for trucks and other vehicles. It defines the hours during which parking areas and standing places shall be available for parking. It contains special provisions in regard to parking areas and standing places in front of the Saleyards of Dalgety and Company Limited, in Doveton-street north and Dawson-street north, and in front of the Saleyards of Crawford Dowling Proprietary Limited, in Doveton-street south. It appoints standing places for cars or trucks with trailers. It appoints standing places for motor omnibuses licensed by the Transport Regulation Board, and for motor omnibuses licensed by the Council. It appoints Bus Stops, standing places for furniture vans, and hire cars licensed as hackney carriages and pick-up points for such hire cars. It provides a penalty for contravention by wilful act or default.
