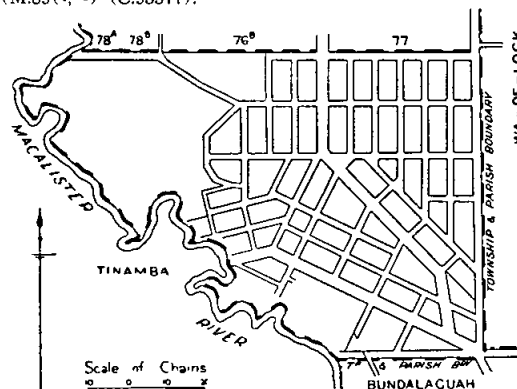

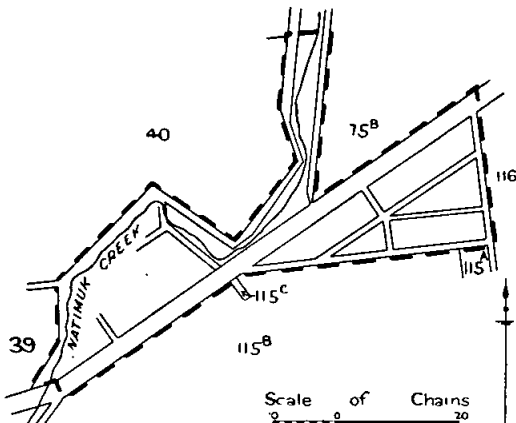

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF SUNSHINE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1946 (No. 5203), it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the day of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and also to fix and, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare the breadth of the carriageway or footways of any public highway: And whereas the Council of the City of Sunshine has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been acquired for a street, be so declared to be a public highway, and that the breadth of the carriageway and footways thereof be fixed and declared: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council in the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land so acquired for a street hereinafter described and situated within the City of Sunshine as aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, and do further fix and declare the breadth of the carriageway and footways thereof as hereinafter set out:—

All those pieces of land, being lots 34 and 63 on the plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles, and numbered 7229, and being the whole of the land described in certificate of title, volume 7462, folio 120, and extending westerly from Duke-street a distance of 260 feet to connect with the existing street known as Appleby-avenue:—

## The Nurses and Midwives Act 1950.

## REGULATIONS RELATING TO MENTAL NURSES.

THE Nurses Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Part I. of the *Nurses and Midwives Act 1950* and with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Mental Nurses Regulations 1952 and are divided into parts as follows:—

Part I.—Preliminary.

Part II.—Registration.

Part III.—Persons holding certificates of qualification entitling them to registration under sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Act.

Part IV.—Course of Study and Training and Examinations.

Part V.—Fees.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

## PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

3. (a) In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Act” means the *Nurses and Midwives Act 1950*.

“Board” means the Nurses Board constituted under the Nurses Acts.

“Register” means the Mental Nurses Register required to be kept under the Act.

“Registered Mental Nurse” means a person who holds under Part I. of the Act a certificate of registration as a mental nurse which is in force.

“Registrar” means the Registrar appointed by the Board pursuant to the provisions of the Nurses Acts.

(b) Words importing the feminine gender shall be deemed and taken to include males, words in the singular shall include the plural, and words in the plural shall include the singular.

## PART II.—REGISTRATION.

4. Every application made by a person for registration as a mental nurse under the Act shall be in accordance with or to the like effect of Form I. contained in the Schedule to these Regulations and shall be lodged with the Registrar at the office of the Board.

5. Every application shall be accompanied by—

(a) either—

(i) a certificate of qualification in mental nursing issued before the commencement of the Act by the Director of Mental Hygiene and referred to in sub-section (2) of section 5 of such Act; or

(ii) a certificate in mental nursing issued by the Director of Mental Hygiene or by the Mental Hygiene Authority pursuant to and in accordance with Regulation 21 of these Regulations;

(b) two certificates, in a form approved by the Board, signed by the persons making the same and stating that the applicant is a person of good character, and is a fit and proper person to be registered as a mental nurse under the Act;

(c) a certificate signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner registered in Victoria that the applicant is of sound health;

(d) (if required by the Board) a certificate or other document proving to the satisfaction of the Board the age of the applicant; and

(e) the fees prescribed for registration under the Act, and for the issue of a Certificate of Registration, namely, 12s. 6d.

6. At least one of the certificates referred to in paragraph (a) of the preceding Regulation shall be signed by a legally qualified medical practitioner registered in Victoria, or by a senior nurse of a mental hospital or institution.

7. Every certificate so referred to shall state the grounds for the statements therein contained that the applicant is of good character and is a fit and proper person to be so registered.

8. The Mental Nurses Register required to be kept under the Act shall be in the form contained in Form II. of the said Schedule.

9. Such Register shall contain all the particulars specified at the head of the several columns of the prescribed form of such register.

10. The Board shall grant to every person who is registered under the Act a certificate of registration in or to the like effect of Form III. contained in the said Schedule.

11. Where the Board is satisfied that any such certificate has been lost or destroyed it may issue a duplicate thereof to the person concerned and every duplicate so issued shall have endorsed thereon the words "Duplicate Certificate."

12. Every application made by a registered mental nurse for a renewal or restoration of a certificate of registration shall be in a form approved by the Board and shall be lodged with the Registrar at the office of the Board.

13. Every certificate of registration renewed by the Board, in any case where the application for renewal is lodged with the Registrar before the 31st day of January next ensuing after the expiration of the certificate concerned, shall have effect from the first day of such month of January, but in every other case the renewal shall take effect from the date of issue thereof.

14. The Board may by order cause to be removed from the Register the name of any registered mental nurse who fails to lodge with the Registrar an application for the renewal of her certificate of registration before the 31st day of the said month of January but, in any such case where upon application being made for a renewal thereof the certificate of registration is renewed by the Board under the Act and these Regulations, it shall annul such order of removal and restore the name of such person to the Register.

15. (a) Every such removal from the Register shall be effected by the Board causing the Registrar to enter therein, in the last prescribed column and opposite the name of the person concerned, the expression "Removed from the Register" together with the reason for and date of such removal.

(b) In every case where the Board annuls any order for the removal of the name of any person from the Register in accordance with the preceding Regulation, it shall cause the Registrar to enter therein, in the last prescribed column and opposite the name of the person concerned, the expression "Restored to the Register" together with the date of such restoration.

16. The Board may by order suspend from the privileges conferred by registration under the Act any registered mental nurse or cause to be removed from the Register the name of any registered mental nurse who in the opinion of the Board is guilty of any negligence or misconduct in the discharge of her duties as a mental nurse, or is guilty of any conduct unbecoming to a mental nurse.

17. The suspension of the registration of any person or the removal of the name of any person from the Register by order of the Board under the Act shall be made effective by the Board causing the Registrar to enter in the Register in the last prescribed column thereof opposite the name of the person concerned—

(a) in the case of suspension—the expression "suspended by the Board from the privileges conferred by registration under the Act" together with the reasons for the period of and date of such suspension; and

(b) in the case of removal from the Register—the expression "Removed from the Register" together with the reasons for the date of such removal.

18. In every case where the Board under the Act by order annuls such suspension or removal, such order shall be made effective by the Board causing the Registrar to enter in the Register in the last prescribed column thereof opposite the name of the person concerned the effect of any order so made and the date thereof.

19. Every mental nurse changing her address shall notify the Board of her new address.

**PART III.—PERSONS HOLDING CERTIFICATES OF QUALIFICATION ENTITLING THEM TO REGISTRATION UNDER SUB-SECTION (2) OF SECTION 5 OF THE ACT.**

20. Every person who is the holder of a certificate of qualification issued by the Director of Mental Hygiene before the commencement of the Act is entitled to be registered as a mental nurse and may at any time apply under and in accordance with the provisions of Part II. of these Regulations to be so registered.



PART IV.—COURSE OF STUDY AND TRAINING AND EXAMINATIONS.

21. (a) The course of study and training in relation to the nursing of mental patients to be prescribed pursuant to section 5 (1) of the Act shall be the course of training for the certificate of qualification in mental nursing issued by the Director of Mental Hygiene or following the commencement of the *Mental Hygiene Authority Act 1950*, by the Mental Hygiene Authority (as the case may be) and the examination qualifying a person for registration as a mental nurse to be prescribed under the provisions of that section shall be the final examination to qualify for such certificate.

(b) Any person who after the commencement of the Act and before the coming into operation of these Regulations obtained such certificate of qualification as a mental nurse shall be deemed to have passed the final examination in mental nursing prescribed by these Regulations.

(c) Any person who, before these Regulations came into operation, had completed any portion of the period of training for the certificate of qualification as a mental nurse shall be entitled to count the period of such training as a similar period of the prescribed course of study and training.

(d) The Director of Mental Hygiene or the Mental Hygiene Authority (as the case may be) shall issue a certificate of qualification in mental nursing to any person who completes the course of study and training prescribed under this part of the Regulations.

22. Every person who completes the prescribed course of study and training and who is the holder of a certificate of qualification as a mental nurse issued pursuant to this part of the Regulations may at any time and in accordance with the provisions of Part II. of the Regulations apply to be registered as a mental nurse.

**HIS** Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 487 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, hereby rescinds the Regulations relating to the granting of certificates of competency by the Municipal Auditors Board which were published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the 9th June, 1915, and in lieu thereof makes the following Regulations:—

- Examinations for certificates of competency as municipal auditor shall be held annually in the month of May, at such place or places and at such times as the Board may from time to time determine.
- The subjects of examination shall be:—
  - Auditing and Local Government Bookkeeping;
  - Law, embracing—
    - the Local Government Acts;
    - such other Acts, which confer powers or impose duties on the council of a municipality, as are from time to time prescribed by the Board.
- Any person who is the holder of a certificate issued by the Municipal Clerks Board shall be exempt from examination in the subject specified in paragraph (b) of clause 2.
- Every applicant shall, not less than twenty-one days before the examination, furnish documentary evidence as to character, date and place of birth and accountancy and auditing qualifications and experience.
- Permission to sit for any examination will be granted to an applicant who complies to the Board's satisfaction with the requirements of clause 4, and who—
  - holds a licence issued by the Companies Auditors Board; or
  - holds a certificate issued by the Municipal Clerks Board and has had at least four years' experience in dealing with accounts; or
  - holds such other accountancy and auditing qualifications and has had such experience as the Board deems sufficient.
- No person shall be eligible to receive a certificate of competency unless he is a natural-born or naturalized subject of Her Majesty and has attained the age of 21 years.
- The Board may require any applicant for a certificate to produce further evidence of good conduct and character and may refuse to grant a certificate of competency to any person if, in its opinion, his general conduct and character do not entitle him to receive such certificate.

8. The Board shall grant a certificate of competency to any person who has passed the prescribed examination, and who has complied to its satisfaction with the other requirements of these Regulations.

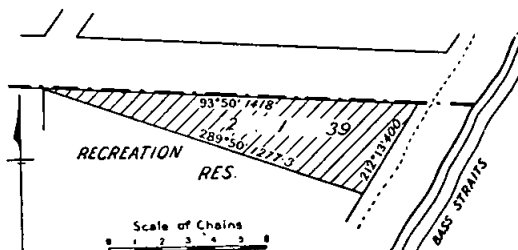

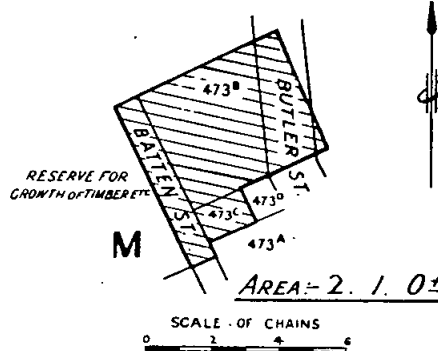
