Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c. &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 5, 6, and 7, of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

DECLARING THAT ONIONS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE ONION MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) Provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 9th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared onions to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 26th March, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to onions and assigned to such Board the name of "The Onion Marketing Board": Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, all onions shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* be divested from the producers of onions and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any onions coming into existence within two (2) years from the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable The Onion Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such onions shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Onion Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as the Onion Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

DECLARING THAT CHICORY SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CHICORY MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) Provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 24th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared chicory to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 7th April, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to chicory and assigned to such Board the name of "The Chicory Marketing Board": Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, all chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* be divested from the producers of chicory and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any chicory coming into existence within two (2) years from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-two, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable The Chicory Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Chicory Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Chicory Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

Victorian Inland Meat Authority Act 1942 (No. 4927).
CONSTITUTION OF AN INLAND MEAT DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Victorian Inland Meat Authority Act 1942*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Victorian Inland Meat Authority may by Proclamation constitute any area in an inland part of Victoria an inland meat district: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Victorian Inland Meat Authority, do by this my Proclamation hereby constitute the area comprising that portion of Victoria within the Latrobe Valley Sub-region, Yallourn Town Area, Moe Township Area, Morwell Township Area, Traralgon Township Area, Yinnar Town Area, Township of Tyers and Yallourn North Township Area as defined in the Schedule to the Latrobe Valley Sub-regional Planning Scheme, 1949, under Town and Country Planning Acts approved by the Governor in Council on the 24th day of July, 1951, an inland meat district, such area being in an inland part of Victoria as defined by the said Act.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900(2) of the *Local Government Act 1946*, provides, inter alia, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town), extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the operation of the said Regulations was extended to parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye by Orders in Council published in the *Government Gazettes* of the 21st November, 1945 (Marong), the 25th June, 1947 (Strathfieldsaye), and the 21st December, 1949 (Marong):

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Rodney has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal district of such municipality, the Councils of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to further parts of the municipal districts of such municipalities, and the Council of the Shire of Waranga has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal district of such municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX of the *Local Government Act 1946* to the municipal district of the Shire of Rodney and those parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong, Strathfieldsaye and Waranga described hereunder:—

Shire of Marong.

All that piece of land bounded by a line commencing at the southern corner of allotment 34q of section 18 in the Parish of Sandhurst, and proceeding generally northerly along the western boundary of the Parish of Sandhurst to the Borough of Eaglehawk boundary; thence generally south-easterly along the Borough of Eaglehawk boundary

to the boundary of the City of Bendigo; thence generally southerly along the City of Bendigo boundary to the north-western corner of the Township of Kangaroo Flat; thence generally southerly along the western boundary of the Township of Kangaroo Flat to the Bonemills-road at the western corner of allotment 13 of section 18; thence south-westerly to the western corner of allotment 15A; thence by a line southerly to the north-east corner of allotment 34M; thence south-westerly to the north-west corner of allotment 34J; thence southerly to the south-west corner of allotment 89b, section 18, in the Parish of Sandhurst; thence generally south-westerly along the southern boundary of the Parish of Sandhurst to the commencing point.

Shire of Waranga.

Firstly: All that piece of land situated in the Parish of Moora, comprising the Township of Rushworth and beyond, commencing at the north-east corner of allotment 6, section C; thence by a line forming the northern boundary of a timber reserve bearing east to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Moora; thence northerly by a line forming the eastern boundary of the said Parish of Moora to the south-east corner of allotment 97D; thence by a line forming the southern boundary of allotment 97D bearing north 89 deg. 57 min., west 1,959 links to the south-west corner of allotment 97D; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the south-eastern corner of allotment 47H; thence by the southern boundary of allotment 47H bearing south 89 deg. 58 min., west 1,535 links to the eastern boundary of the Rushworth-Stanhope Railway; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the said Railway to the northern boundary of the Township of Rushworth; thence following the township boundary to the north-west corner of the said township; thence by lines forming the south-western and western boundaries of the Township of Rushworth, the north-eastern corner of allotment 6, section C., being the point of commencement.

Secondly: The whole of the Government Township of Murchison, Parish of Murchison, and in addition all that piece of land commencing at the south-west corner of allotment 9, Parish of Murchison, County of Rodney; thence by a line forming the western boundaries of allotments 9 and 10, bearing north 9 deg. 15 min., east 2,500 links; thence by a line bearing south 80 deg. 45 min. east, being the northern boundary of allotment 10, to the western bank of the Goulburn river; thence following the said western bank southerly to the north-east corner of the township boundary; thence by a line forming the southern boundary of allotment 9, bearing north 80 deg. 45 min. west to the point of commencement.

Thirdly: All that piece of land in the Parish of Girgarre, County of Rodney, commencing at the south-western corner of allotment 20c, section E; thence bounded by a line bearing north 89 deg. 59 min. east, to the eastern boundary of allotment 22, section E; thence along the eastern boundary of the said allotment 22, bearing north 22 deg. 45 min. east, to the north-eastern corner of the said allotment 22; thence along the southern boundary of allotments 21A, the recreation reserve 24A and 25B, to the south-eastern corner of allotment 24B, section E; thence by the south-western and southern boundaries of allotment 25 to the south-eastern corner of the said allotment 25; thence by lines bearing north 0 deg. 4 min., west 1,655 links to the Midland Highway; thence by a line bearing south 80 deg. 13 min., west 1,322.2 links; thence by the south-western boundary of allotment 24, section B., bearing north 22 deg. 20 min., west 64.5 links, north 47 deg. 51 min., west 1,564 links; thence by the southern boundary of allotment 21, section B, bearing north 89 deg. 38 min., west 2,508.5 links; thence by a line bearing north 0 deg. 2 min., west 1,800 links, and south 89 deg. 58 min., west to meet the Stanhope-Girgarre Main Road; thence commencing from a point on the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 76, distant north 0 deg. 2 min., west 600 links from the south-eastern corner of the said Crown allotment; thence bounded by lines bearing south 89 deg. 58 min., west 2,935 links, south 0 deg. 2 min., east 600 links to the south-west corner of the said allotment 76, bearing south-easterly across allotment 89 to the north-eastern corner of allotment 95, section D; thence by the eastern boundary of the said allotment 95 bearing south 0 deg. 1 min., east 2,841.5 links to the Midland Highway; thence by a line running south-easterly across allotment 3, section E, to the south-western corner of allotment 20c, section E, being the point of commencement.

Fourthly: All that piece of land situate in the Parish of Colbinabbin, County of Rodney, commencing at the south-east corner of allotment 14, section C; thence by a line forming the eastern boundary of the said allotment, bearing north 4 deg. 25 min., west 1,806 links; thence by a line bearing north 89 deg. 50 min., west to the western boundary of allotment 14, section C; thence by a line forming the western boundary of the said allotment 14,

bearing south to the southern boundary of a Government road; thence by a line forming the northern boundary of allotment 16, section C., bearing north 79 deg. 19 min., east to the north-west corner of allotment 17, section C; thence by a line forming the western boundary of allotment 17, section C, bearing south 0 deg. 2½ min., east 800 links; thence by a line bearing south 89 deg. 50 min., east to a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 17, section C; thence by a line bearing north 0 deg. 13 min., east 840.5 links to the point of commencement.

Fifthly: All that piece of land in the Parish of Noorilim, County of Rodney, commencing at the north-western corner of allotment 15, section Y; thence bounded by a line forming the northern boundary of allotments 15, 15A, 15B, and continuing easterly through the Water Reserve to the western bank of the Goulburn river; thence generally southerly along the western bank of the Goulburn river to a point opposite the southern boundary of allotment 9, section Y; thence along the southern boundary of the said allotment, bearing north 89 deg. 54 min., east 2,310 links; thence generally north-easterly along the western boundary of said allotment, bearing north 41 deg. 50 min., east to a point opposite the south-western boundary of allotment 3; thence generally north-westerly for 2,666 links along the south-west boundary of allotment 3; thence generally north-easterly along the north-west boundary of allotment 3 to the southern boundary of allotment 15; thence westerly along the southern boundary to the south-west corner of allotment 15; thence northerly along the western boundary to the north-west corner of allotment 15, being the point of commencement.

Shire of Strathfieldsaye.

All that part of the Parish of Sandhurst which is within the municipal district of the Shire.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the municipal district of the Shire of Rodney and the above-mentioned parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye and Waranga on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the 1st day of August, 1952.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF SOUTH BARWON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicate to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And, whereas the Council of the Shire of South Barwon has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a street and described hereunder shall be a public highway with the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

KITEROA-STREET.

All that piece of land commencing at the south-west angle of lot 8 on plan of subdivision No. 20793, lodged in the Office of Titles; thence bearing east 310 feet to the

south-west angle of lot 7 on plan of subdivision No. 20793; thence bearing south 50 feet; thence bearing west 310 feet; and thence bearing north 50 feet to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION OF EAST LODDON WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PURSUANT to the provisions of Part II. of the *Weights and Measures Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the Borough of Inglewood and the Shires of Bet Bet, East Loddon, Gordon, Korong, and Wycheproof to be a "Union" for the purposes of the said Act under the title of the "East Loddon Weights and Measures Union"; and do fix as follows the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such Union under the said Act shall be borne by the several municipalities, that is to say:—

Borough of Inglewood	..	3½ per centum.
Shire of Bet Bet	..	11½ per centum.
Shire of East Loddon	..	10½ per centum.
Shire of Gordon	..	23½ per centum.
Shire of Korong	..	17½ per centum.
Shire of Wycheproof	..	33½ per centum.

And, further, I do fix two as the number of managers which each Council in the said Union shall elect.

And whereas by virtue of the said enactment Monday, the twenty-first day of April, 1952, is appointed to be observed as a holiday in all banks:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council expedient that Monday, the twenty-first day of April, 1952, should not be a bank holiday throughout Victoria for the observance of the anniversary of the birthday of Her Majesty:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1928*, do by this my Proclamation declare that Monday, the twenty-first day of April, 1952, shall not be a bank holiday throughout Victoria for the observance of the anniversary of the birthday of Her Majesty, and appoint Monday, the ninth day of June, 1952, to be a bank holiday throughout the said State for such observance.

And whereas it has been made to appear to me expedient that Monday, the twenty-first day of April, 1952, should not be a holiday throughout Victoria for the observance of the anniversary of the birthday of Her Majesty:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in sub-section (3) of section 67 of the *Public Service Act 1946*, do by this my Proclamation declare that Monday, the twenty-first day of April, 1952, shall not be a public holiday throughout Victoria for the observance of the anniversary of the birthday of Her Majesty, and appoint Monday, the ninth day of June, 1952, to be a public holiday throughout the said State for such observance.

or
 - (iii) English A and groups of such subjects in technical schools as may from time to time be prescribed by the Director,
or
 - (iv) English A and such departmental certificates or subjects as may from time to time be prescribed by the Director,
or
 - (v) English A and Drawing Teacher's Primary Certificate,
or
 - (vi) the Singing Teacher's Primary Certificate,
and
Theory of Music, Grade V.,

Practical Music, Grade VI., in piano or organ or violin or solo singing as conducted by the Australian Music Examinations Board,

 - (xii) a course of study or research regarded by the Director as equivalent to any one of the courses mentioned in this paragraph;
- (d) (i) have passed in the theory, principles, history, and practice of education as prescribed for the first year of the course for the Bachelor of Education at the University of Melbourne,

- (ii) have passed in the Education Department's examination in Education for First Class Honours and have satisfied any additional requirements in Education that may be prescribed,

- (iii) have qualified under clause 1 (c) (viii).

5. In the case of teachers who are discharged servicemen within the meaning of the *Discharged Servicemen's Preference Act 1943* there may be a limitation of the prescribed examinations under clause

1 above to such subjects, standards, and service as may be deemed to be essential to the efficient performance of the duties involved in classification in Honours."

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, preferably by non-negotiable cheque payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the service may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for _____" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedule the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set

out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The contractor must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods, which shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.

6. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purpose of this contract, the Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the supply.

8. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In the event of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as provided in clause 8.

10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after the delivery of the goods, the account to be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The rates and the quantities quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedule. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case, he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as provided in clause 8.

13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 15 and 16 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as provided in clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

14. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department excepting Departments of the Commonwealth, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee in accordance with clause 16, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only, which accompanies the order, must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note must not be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as is provided in clause 13.

16. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred thereby will be deducted as provided in clause 8.

17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing on the consignment note, an intimation to that effect failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount thereof to be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

18. The contractor is not at liberty to transfer his contract under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. Should it be found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract and forfeit the security money.

19. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works through the Board of Land and Works, or by the State Rivers and Water Supply, Forests, and Electricity Commissioners, or the Country Roads Board, or for the Railways Department, or for supplies for Technical, High, or Higher Elementary Schools, or for connexions and fittings for Drills and Batteries, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 152 of the *Customs Act* 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice, in writing, from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

The foregoing provision shall not apply where the contract is for definite quantities of imported goods to be delivered at stated times, as stipulated in the schedule, and any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer rate of exchange affecting the goods included in such contract shall be to the accounts of the Government; adjustments to be based on the F.O.B. and C.I.F. prices of the goods, respectively, and the Telegraphic Transfer rate ruling at the time of delivery of the goods.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

CITY OF FITZROY.

BY-LAW No. 102.

A By-law of the City of Fitzroy made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and for the purpose of prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles standing in any street or road or part thereof specified in the By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, and of every other Act or

power enabling them on that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, "Council" means the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy. "Driver" includes the person in charge of the vehicle. "Vehicle" includes every conveyance capable of being propelled, pushed, or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power.

3. No person between 7 o'clock p.m. and 12 o'clock midnight shall without reasonable cause or excuse (the proof whereof shall be upon such person) leave or allow to remain a vehicle (other than a tram car) in that portion of St. George's-road both east and west side, between Holden-street and the Merri Creek bridge.

4. Every person who shall authorize or purport to authorize any act or thing contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall also be guilty of an offence hereunder.

5. The owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicle left standing in any street or road shall give information to any constable of Police or officer of the Council with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle) which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or vehicle standing in such street in contravention of any By-law.

CITY OF OAKLEIGH.

BY-LAW No. 100.

A By-law and Rules and Regulations of the City of Oakleigh, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1946* and the *Police Offences Act 1923*, and numbered 100, for the purpose of regulating traffic within the municipal district and for other lawful purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and the *Police Offences Act 1928* and all other powers thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Oakleigh order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

- (a) the words "Motor car" mean a motor car within the meaning of section 3 of the *Motor Car Act 1928*;
- (b) the word "Vehicle" includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power, and includes any cycle, motor cycle, and motor car.

2. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, no vehicle shall be driven and no animal shall be ridden, driven, or led at any time on any day or night—

- (a) in an easterly direction along that part of Portman-street between Hanover-street and the western boundary extended southerly of the property which at the time of coming into operation of this By-law is known as number nine (9) Portman-street, Oakleigh, in the City of Oakleigh;
- (b) in a northerly direction along that part of Eaton-street between Portman-street and Atherton-road in the City of Oakleigh;
- (c) in a southerly direction along any part of Station-street between Atherton-road and Portman-street in the City of Oakleigh;
- (d) in a westerly direction along any part of Chester-street between Hanover-street and Portman-street in the City of Oakleigh.

REGULATION No. 11.

Regulation No. 11, made under section No. 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, for the care, protection, and management of Public Reserves within the Shire of Lillydale.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale do hereby make the following Regulation:—

- All previous Regulations passed by the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Lillydale relating to the care, protection, and management of Public Reserves within the Shire of Lillydale are hereby repealed.
- This Regulation shall have effect in and be applicable to every Public Reserve within the Shire of Lillydale owned by or vested in the Lillydale Shire Council.
- The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
- The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserves on such day or days as any Reserves may be set apart for any form of games, sports, fêtes, or amusements shall be such sum or sums as the Committee of Management duly appointed by the Lillydale Shire Council shall determine.
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No society, club, picnic party or other combined body shall use the Reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the Reserves or pollute any water thereon, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.
- No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the Reserves, or roll or throw any stones or other missiles thereon, or commit any nuisance, or leave in the Reserves any bottles, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter.
- No person shall camp or shall erect any dwelling on the Reserves.
- No person shall light any fire in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

11. No person, except workmen employed in the Reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog, unless led by a cord or chain, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management; and all dogs, goats, and poultry found wandering in the Reserves shall be liable to be destroyed.

13. No person shall place in the Reserves any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

14. No person shall engage in any game or sport or dancing on the Reserves on Sunday without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only on the strict condition that no intoxicating liquors shall be brought to or consumed on the Reserves on that day.

15. No person shall erect any booth or other structure on the Reserves for the purpose of offering for sale any article or for the purpose of playing any game or amusement, or shall hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and shall pay such fees for so doing as the Committee of Management shall from time to time determine.

16. No person shall play any unlawful game or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserves.

17. Any person offending against this Regulation shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
