PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 384.
SEED POTATOES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 384.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 296 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
- "Approved seed potatoes" means potatoes approved as suitable for seed by a duly authorized officer of the State Department of Agriculture.
- "Certified seed potatoes" means potatoes accepted by a duly authorized officer of the State Department of Agriculture as certified seed potatoes.
- "Primary wholesaler" in relation to the sale of seed potatoes, means a person who purchases seed potatoes for the purpose of resale to another wholesaler whose normal business is to sell seed potatoes by wholesale.
- "Secondary wholesaler" in relation to the sale of seed potatoes, means a person who purchases seed potatoes from a primary wholesaler for the purpose of resale.
- "By wholesale" means and refers to a sale of seed potatoes in . lots of one bag or more.
- "Ton" means a long ton of 2,240 lb. or a quantity of fifteen bags of seed potatoes each containing not less than 149 lb. weight.
- "Lb." means, pound avoirdupois or pounds avoirdupois as the
- "Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
- "Point of delivery" means, in relation to the sale of seed potatoes, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such seed potatoes to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased them.

"Cost of transport" means, in relation to the transport of seed potatoes, cost of transport by rail (or, if rail transport is not available, any other service which may be available), but does not include any cost of transport which is not recorded on an invoice delivered by the seller, or in the case of sales by retail on an invoice delivered to the retail seller.

by retail on an invoice delivered to the retail seller.
"Potato Marketing Board" means the Potato Marketing Board constituted under the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 of the State of Victoria.

Sales by Growers.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by growers to be— $\,$
 - (1) In respect of approved seed potatoes-
 - (a) at the point of production, £34 10s. per ton;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £34 10s. per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.
 - (2) In respect of certified seed potatoes-
 - (a) at the point of production, £37 10s. per ton;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £37 10s. per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.
 - (3) In respect of seed potatoes other than approved or certified seed potatoes—
 - (a) at the point of production, £33 10s. per ton;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £33 10s. per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.

Sales by the Potato Marketing Board.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed may be sold by the Potato Marketing Board to be—
 - (1) In respect of approved seed potatoes-
 - (a) at the point of production, £35 10s. per ton;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £35 10s. per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.
 - (2) In respect of certified seed potatoes-
 - (a) at the point of production, £38 10s. per ton;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £38 10s. per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.
 - (3) In respect of seed potatoes other than approved or certified seed potatoes—
 - (a) at the point of production, £33 10s. per ton;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £33 10s, per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.
- 6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by wholesale to be as follows:—
 - (1) By primary wholesaler, Cowper-street-
 - (a) In respect of approved seed potatoes, the sum of the following:—
 - (i) The purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £35 10s. per ton, whichever is the lesser;
 - (ii) cost of rail transport from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business to Cowperstreet railway siding.
 - (b) In respect of certified seed potatoes, the sum of the following:—
 - (i) The purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £38 10s. per ton, whichever is the lesser;
 - (ii) cost of rail transport from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business to Cowperstreet railway siding.

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- (c) In respect of seed potatoes other than approved or certified seed potatoes, the sum of the following:-
 - (i) The purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £33 10s. per ton, whichever is the lesser;
 - (ii) cost of rail transport from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business to Cowperstreet railway siding.
- (2) By secondary wholesaler-
 - (a) In respect of approved seed potatoes-
 - (i) where the seller delivers the approved seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store, £37 17s. 6d. per ton;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the approved seed potatoes into the buyer's shop, £38 10s. per ton.
 - (b) In respect of certified seed potatoes-
 - (i) where the seller delivers the certified seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store, £40 17s. 6d. per ton;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the certified seed potatoes into the buyer's shop, £41 10s. per ton.
 - (c) In respect of seed potatoes other than approved or certified seed potatoes-
 - (i) where the seller delivers the seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store, £35 17s. 6d. per ton;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the seed potatoes into the buyer's shop, £36 10s. per ton.

Sales by Retail.

- 7. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be-
 - (a) in respect of approved seed potatoes— $5\frac{1}{2}d$. per lb.
 - (b) in respect of certified seed potatoes—6d. per lb.
 - (c) in respect of seed potatoes—5d. per lb.
- (2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by retail outside the Metropolitan Area to be the prices fixed in the foregoing provisions of this Order for such sales in the Metropolitan Area, plus the charges properly incurred in transporting such seed potatoes from the point of delivery to the retailer to such retailer's shop or place of business, but in no case shall such maximum price exceed-
 - (a) in respect of approved seed potatoes—6d. per lb. (b) in respect of certified seed potatoes— $6\frac{1}{2}$ d. per lb.

 - (c) in respect of seed potatoes— $5\frac{1}{2}d$. per lb.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

- 8. (1) Any person who sells or has for sale by retail seed potatoes shall attach to or display with those seed potatoes a ticket or label setting forth the maximum retail selling price fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those seed notatoes.
- (2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any seed potatoes shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those seed potatoes and so as to be properly associated with such seed potatoes.

Delivery of Invoices.

- 9. Any person who sells by wholesale seed potatoes shall deliver with such seed potatoes an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:-
 - (a) Name and address of seller;
 - (b) name and address of purchaser;
 - (c) date of sale:
 - (d) the point of delivery to the purchaser, the weight of the seed potatoes sold. number of bags, and price per unit of such seed potatoes; and
 - (e) total price of such seed potatoes.

Records.

- 10. Any person who sells any seed potatoes shall keep and preserve any invoice or docket received by him in relation to such seed potatoes, and shall keep a record in respect of the purchase of such seed potatoes showing—
 - (a) the name and address of supplier;
 - (b) the date of the invoice or docket received by him in relation to such seed potatoes;
 - (c) the quantity purchased and the price thereof;
 - (d) the point of delivery; and
 - (c) transport costs properly attributable to the transport of such seed potatoes from the point of delivery to his place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any seed potatoes specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 385.

HONEY IN BULK.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 385.

Maximum Prices-Sales Other Than by Retail.

- 2. I fix and declare the maximum price at which honey in bulk may be sold other than by retail to be— $\,$
 - 10d. per lb., plus, where the seller of that honey has delivered that honey to the purchaser at some place other than the seller's place of business, the lesser of—
 - (a) the cost actually incurred by the seller in and properly attributable to the transport of such honey from the seller's place of business to the place of delivery to the purchaser; or
 - (b) the amount of 1d. per lb.

Provided that no amount shall be added for such cost of transport unless the amount is properly recorded and preserved in the books of the seller.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

3. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any honey specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 386.

Revocation.

1927

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 214 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
 - "Calcium Carbide" means Calcium Carbide manufactured in Tasmania.
 - "Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
 - "Point of Delivery" means, in relation to the sale of Calcium Carbide, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such Calcium Carbide to his place of business passed to the buyer from the person from whom he purchased the said Calcium Carbide.
 - "Ton" means 2,240 pounds avoirdupois.

Maximum Price.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which Calcium Carbide may be sold in Victoria to be-
 - (a) In respect to sales for delivery into store or free on rails. Metropolitan Area:-

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 387.

MEAT.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 387.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 349 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
 - "Prevailing price" means, in relation to the sale of meat of any class or cut by any person, on any terms and conditions, the price at which that person sold meat of that class or cut on the 16th day of September, 1948, upon substantially the same terms and conditions, or if no sale of meat of that class or cut was made by that person upon that date on substantially the same terms and conditions, then the last preceding date upon which a sale was made by that person of meat of that class or cut upon substantially the same terms and conditions.
 - "Prevailing margin of gross profit" means, in relation to the sale by any person of meat of any class or cut, on any terms and conditions, the actual amount in money of gross profit obtained by that person upon the sale of meat of that class or cut on the 16th day of September, 1948, upon substantially the same terms and conditions, or if no sale of meat of such class or cut was made by that person upon such date upon substantially the same terms and conditions, then the last preceding date upon which a sale of meat of that class or cut was made by that person upon substantially the same terms and conditions.
 - "Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the principal Post Office, Melbourne.
 - "Geelong" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 10 miles from the principal Post Office, Geelong.
 - "Ballarat" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 10 miles from the principal Post Office, Ballarat.
 - "Beef" means all meat of a bovine animal weighing more than 200 lb. per carcass dressed weight.
- 4. In this Order reference to the weight of any meat shall be construed as a reference to the dressed weight of that meat.

Sales by Wholesale (Schedules).

- 5. (1) Subject to sub-clause 2 of this clause, I fix and declare the maximum price at which the classes of meat specified in the First and Second Schedules to this Order may be sold by wholesale in Victoria to be the prices specified in those Schedules.
- (2) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which meat for which a delivered price is fixed for sales by wholesale may be sold by wholesale other than at a delivered price to be such delivered price less an amount calculated at the rate of \(\frac{1}{4}\)d. per pound for every 25 miles or part thereof by which the purchaser's premises are distant from the seller's premises.

Other Sales by Wholesale.

- 6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which meat of any class may be sold by any person by wholesale in Victoria, where a maximum price is not fixed for such sale by clause 5 of this Order, to be—
 - (a) the prevailing price for the sale of that class of meat by that person, or
 - (b) the cost to such person of such meat, plus the prevailing margin of gross profit for sales of meat of that class by that person,

whichever is the lesser.

7. I declare that where a person (in this clause referred to as "the agent") purchases live stock as agent, or purported agent, for another person (in this clause referred to as "the principal") and processes or treats the live stock and delivers meat resulting from the processing or treatment to the principal, the carrying out of the agency (or purported agency) and the performance of the other services by the agent shall, for the purposes of Part 2 of the *Prices Regulation Act* 1948 and this Order, be deemed to be a sale by wholesale of the meat so delivered by the agent to the principal at a price equal to the sum of the amounts paid or payable by the principal to the agent in respect of the agency and services (including the price paid by the agent for the live stock purchased by him).

Sales by Retail.

- 8. I fix and declare the maximum price at which meat of the classes or cuts specified in the Third Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Victoria to be the prices specified therein. Provided that the prices so specified for sales outside the metropolitan area shall—
 - (a) where delivery is made to a purchaser's premises which are not within the boundary of any town or city, and which are at a distance greater than 1 mile from the seller's premises; and
 - (b) the delivery charge is separately recorded on a docket delivered in relation to the meat,

be subject in each case to the addition of a delivery charge of 1d. per pound.

Other Sales by Retail.

- 9. I fix and declare the maximum price at which meat of any class or cut may be sold by any person by retail in Victoria, where a maximum price is not fixed for such sale by clause 8 of this Order, to be—
 - (a) the prevailing price for the sale of that class or cut of meat by that person, or
 - (b) the cost to such person of such meat, plus the prevailing margin of gross profit for sales of meat of that class or cut by that person,

whichever is the lesser.

General.

- 10. For the purpose of this Order, if a person operates more than one place of business he shall in respect of each place of business be deemed to be a separate seller.
- 11. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a seller of any meat has customarily allowed any difference in price—
 - (a) to any person or to persons included in any class of persons;or
 - (b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of meat,

the maximum price fixed by or under this Order in respect of that meat shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons or of such quantities, be reduced by the allowance of that difference:

Provided that in the case of any sale by retail it shall not be necessary to make any such allowance to a greater extent than One halfpenny per pound.

12. For the purpose of this Order, where any business, in the carrying on of which any class or cut of meat is sold, or the assets of that business are transferred (by sale or otherwise) after the date of this Order and the transferee carries on such business at the same place of business, then notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which meat of such class or cut may be sold by the transferee in respect of such place of business to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of that class or cut of meat by the transferor in respect of such place of business.

- 13. Every person who sells by wholesale any meat for which a maximum price is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall deliver with that meat an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—
 - (a) His name and place of business;
 - (b) the name and address of the purchaser of that meat;
 - (c) the date of the sale of that meat;
 - (d) the class of that meat described according to the classes of meat specified in the Schedules to this Order;
 - (e) the number in each lot of those classes of meat sold;
 - (f) in the case of any class of meat for which a maximum price is expressed in this Order or the Schedules thereto to be fixed by the reference to weight—the total weight of each lot of those classes of meat sold;
 - (g) the price per pound, per dozen, or per unit, as the case may be, at which each lot of those classes of meat is sold.

Notice in Writing.

- 14. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order—
 - (a) I declare the maximum price at which meat of any class or cut specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
 - (b) All notices given in pursuance of any Prices Regulation Order revoked by clause 2 of this Order (other than notices which fix a retail price for any class or cut of meat specified in the Third Schedule to this Order greater than the price specified therein) which are in force at the commencement of this Order shall be deemed to be given under this Order.

Exhibition of Price Lists.

- 15. (1) Every trader who sells or has for sale any meat the maximum price for which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall exhibit and keep exhibited in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business and in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order of all the classes or cuts of meat which that trader sells or has for sale.
- (2) For the purpose of the last preceding sub-clause the amount added for delivery in pursuance of the foregoing provisions of this Order shall not be deemed to be part of the maximum price, but where any such charge is permitted in relation to the sale of meat by any person under those provisions the following shall be endorsed in clear printer's type at the foot of the notice referred to in the last preceding sub-clause:—
 - "The prices referred to in this list are subject to the addition of One penny per pound in each case where delivery is made to a purchaser's premises outside this town (or city) and which are distant more than 1 mile from these premises."
- 16. Every person who sells by retail other than for cash payment at time of sale any meat for which a maximum price is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall deliver within seven (7) days of the date of such sale an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—
 - (a) His name and place of business;
 - (b) the name and address of the purchaser of that meat;
 - (c) the date of sale of that meat;
 - (d) the class or cut, of that meat;
 - (e) the weight of that meat;
 - (f) the price per pound or per unit of that meat, as the case may be, at which that meat is sold;
 - (g) the total price charged for that meat.
