GRAIN ELEVATORS BOARD. BY-LAW AMENDING BY-LAW No. 16.

THE Grain Elevators Board, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Grain Elevators Acts, hereby, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, makes the following By-law:-

By-Law No. 20.

By-law No. 16 of the Grain Elevators Board is hereby amended as follows:---

After section 30 the following section shall be added:-"30a. No Officer shall furnish to another Officer any

certificate or testimonial relating to his capacity or performance of official duties: Provided that the Chairman may furnish such certificate or testimonial to an Officer who is resigning or retiring from the service of the Board." the end of section 36 the following sub-section

shall be added:-"36 (4). When an Officer is absent from duty on account of a dental disability he may be granted leave of absence for a period not exceeding one week, provided that he furnishes the Chairman with a satisfactory certificate from a legally qualified dentist."

Section 37 shall be deleted and shall be replaced by the following section:-

"37. Where the Chairman is satisfied that the illness of an Officer with at least six months' service is directly attributable to or is aggravated by his service directly attributable to or is aggravated by his service in the war which commenced in the year One thousand nine hundred and fourteen or in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, such Officer may, apart from any sick leave which may be standing to his credit, be credited with special leave with full pay amounting to eight days in respect of each year of service from the 1st July, 1947, to the 30th June, 1951, and with fifteen day's special leave with full pay in respect of each year of service from and inclusive of the 1st July, 1951.

Such special leave shall be cumulative provided that the total of such accumulated leave standing to the credit of an Officer shall not at any time exceed one hundred days."

Section 52 shall be deleted and shall be replaced by the following section:

"52. (1) Subject to this section every Officer in the "52. (1) Subject to this section every Officer in the Board's service who has been employed by the Board for a period or an aggregate period of twenty years shall be entitled to be granted by the Board six months' long-service leave with pay in respect of that period of twenty years' service and one and a half months' long-service leave with pay in respect of each additional period or aggregate period of five years' completed service.

(2) Where—
(3) on account of age or ill-health

(a) on account of age or ill-health
(i) an Officer retires; or
(ii) the services of an Officer are terminated; or

(b) an Officer dies; or (c) the appointment of a female Officer is terminated on account of or in anticipation of marriage—
that Officer shall be entitled or (in the case of death) shall be deemed to have been entitled, to be granted by

the Board-

he Board—
where the completed years of service are not less
than five but are less than twenty, then in respect
of such completed years of service;
where the years of service are more than twenty,
then (in addition to any entitlement under subsection (1) of this section) in respect of such completed years of service (not exceeding four) as exceed the next lower multiple of five—

ceed the next lower multiple of five— long-service leave with pay on the basis of one-twentieth of six months' leave for each such com-

twentieth of six months' leave for each such completed year.

(3) For the purpose of sub-section (1) of this section an Officer on leave of absence without pay or on loan shall be deemed to be in the Board's service during the period of such leave or loan.

(4) An Officer otherwise entitled to long-service leave shall not be entitled thereto if he has resigned or has been dismissed for causes within his control.

(5) In computing the aggregate duration of the service which entitles an Officer to be granted long-service leave—

service leave-

(a) there shall be included as a period of service any period or periods during which such Officer has been absent from duty on recrea-tion leave or on sick leave or on special leave for service with the Defence Forces in connexion with the war against Germany which commenced in the year 1939 or the war against Japan which commenced in the year 1941, or

such other leave as the Board may determine in any particular case;

(b) subject to sub-section (5) (a) of this section there shall be excluded any period of leave of absence without pay or loan or retirement on account of ill-health;

(c) there shall be included as a period of service any period of employment prior to an approved period of leave of absence without pay or loan or retirement on account of illhealth; but

(d) there shall not be included as a period of service any period or periods of service served by an officer;

(i) prior to his having voluntarily left, or having been dismissed for causes within his control from the service of

the Board; or
(ii) prior to his absence from such service

(ii) prior to his absence from such service for any continuous period of five years or more (otherwise than that referred to in sub-clause (5) (a) and/or (5) (a) of this section).

(6) The Board shall have discretion to grant long-service leave so that the operations of the Board will not be unduly affected by the granting of such leave to numbers of Officers at or about the same time.

(1) Where on account of age or ill-health—

(a) an Officer retires; or

(b) his services are terminated; that Officer may, by notice in writing to the Board.

that Officer may, by notice in writing to the Board, elect to take pay in lieu of the whole or any part of the long-service leave to which he is then entitled and the Board shall grant him pay in lieu thereof accordingly.

(8) Where the appointment of any female Officer

is terminated on account of or in anticipation of marriage, she may by notice in writing to the Board elect to take pay in lieu of the whole or any part of long-service leave and the Board on her marriage or in such other special circumstances as the Board in its discretion determines shall grant her pay in lieu thereof accordingly.

discretion determines shall grant her pay in lieu thereof accordingly.

(9) Where an Officer entitled to long-service leave or to pay in lieu thereof dies before or while taking such leave or (as the case may be) before such pay in lieu is paid the Board shall, to the extent that pay in lieu thereof has not already been paid to that Officer, grant pay in lieu of the whole or part of the leave not taken or (as the case may be) grant the grant the pay in lieu to the legal personal representative of the deceased Officer.

(10) For the purpose of this section the services of an Officer shall be deemed to be terminated—

(a) on account of age—if on or after attaining the age of 60 years he ceases to be an Officer otherwise than by dismissal because of

otherwise than by dismissal because of unsatisfactory service;

(b) on account of ill-health—if he produces to the Board satisfactory evidence that his ceasing to be an Officer is due to ill-health which is likely to be permanent and is not due to misconduct or to causes within his own control. control.

control.

(11) Where an Officer is granted long-service leave with pay, such pay shall be computed in the same manner as if he had remained on duty during the period of any such leave.

(12) Where an Officer, or the legal personal representative of any deceased Officer is granted pay in lieu of the whole or part of any long-service leave to which such Officer is or was entitled, the amount of such pay shall be computed in accordance with the following formula:—

Completed years of service Annual Pay. - x -20

(13) "Completed years of service" means the completed years of service of an Officer as computed in accordance with sub-section (5) of this section less any period in respect of which long-service leave or pay in lieu thereof has been granted.

(14) Notwithstanding anything contained in subsections 11, 12, and 13 of this section where the service of an Officer includes a period during which his normal.

sections 11, 12, and 13-of this section where the service of an Officer includes a period during which his normal hours of duty were less than full time the pay to which he is entitled while on long-service leave or the pay in lieu thereof, as the case may be, shall be computed on a proportionate basis.

(15) Where an Officer is absent on long-service leave for more than three months in any year or more

three months continuously the amount recreation leave which he may be granted shall be proportionately reduced:

Provided that where recreation leave in excess of that which an Officer may be granted under this section has been taken, his subsequent recreation leave shall be reduced by the period of such excess."

The above amendments shall take effect as from 17th July, 1951.




