PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900(2) of the Local Government Act 1946, provides, inter alia, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town), extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the operation of the said Regulations was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of Mansfield by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette of the 16th January, 1946:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Mansfield has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a further part of the municipal district of such municipality, and the Council of the Shire of Newstead has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal district of such municipality. municipality:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1946, to those parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Mansfield and Newstead described hereunder:—

Shire of Mansfield

Commencing at a point on the Goulburn river where the south-east boundary of allotment 3 of section A abuts thereon; bounded thence north-easterly by the said allotment and a line to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section C; thence south-easterly and northerly by allotment 10 of section C to a point in line with the north side of the road forming the south boundaries of sections 17 and 16; thence south-easterly by a line and the north side of the said road, southerly by the east side of the road forming the western boundaries of sections 14 and 13, and westerly by the south side of the road forming the north boundaries of allotments 10c and 10o of section H and south-westerly and southerly by the west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line to the north boundary of allotment 2 of section 5; thence westerly by that allotment, allotment 1 and a line bearing N. 77 deg. 5 min. W., to the Goulburn river aforesaid; and thence northerly by that river to the point of commencement. Commencing at a point on the Goulburn river where the

(a) Commencing at the south-west angle of the Parish of Castlemaine and running due north along the western boundary of sections 2A and 6 to the north-west angle of

section 6; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the Shire of Newstead to the north-east angle of section 4a; thence southerly and westerly along the north bound-ary of section 9a to its north-west angle; thence south along the east boundaries of sections 7c, 8a, and 12a to the south-east angle of 12a; thence due west along the south boundary of the Parish of Castlemaine to the commencing point

(b) The whole of the Township of Newstead, in the Parish of Strangways, and also allotments 1 and 2, section C, Parish of Strangways.

(c) The whole of the Township of Guildford, Parish of Guildford.

(d) The whole of the Township of Fryerstown, Parish of Fryers.

(e) Commencing on the Loddon river at the most westerly point of the Township of Vaughan; thence northeasterly and easterly along the boundary of the said township to the south-west angle of allotment 12 of section 11; thence easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 13a; thence south-easterly along the eastern boundary of 13a to Fryers creek, from that creek still in a south-easterly direction to the north-east angle of allotment 14a of section 10a, Parish of Fryers; thence south along to the eastern boundary to the south-east angle; thence south-easterly across the amusement park and the Loddon river to the north-east angle of allotment 12 of 10a; thence south to its south-east angle; thence westerly to the eastern tip of allotment 19 of section 9a; thence south-westerly and northerly along boundaries of allotment 19 westerly and northerly along boundaries of allotment 19 to its north-west angle; thence westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 5 of 18; thence due north along its west boundary to the Loddon river; thence north-westerly along the said river to the commencing point.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Mansfield and Newstead on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the 4th day of October, 1952.



REGULATIONS RELATING TO FOODS, DRUGS, SUBSTANCES, AND METHODS OF ANALYSIS.

NDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to sav:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1952 (No. 2) shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 and any Regulations amending the same, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. Regulation 12 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the insertion of the following statement at the end of sub-regulation (1) "except that liquid glucose, honey, and similar saccharin substances may be held in galvanized iron drums of not less than 10-gallon capacity without contravention of this Regulation."
- 3. Sub-regulation (4) of Regulation 11 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "(4) No person shall pack or cause to be packed any food containing artificial flavouring in any package the wrapper or label of which indicates or implies by any expression pictorial design or device the presence of fruit, and no person shall sell any food so packed."
- 4. Regulation 13 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the insertion after the expression "1/200th grain of arsenic (calculated as As_2O_3) or" of the expression "2/7th grain of zinc (calculated as Zn) or."
- 5. Paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (8) of Regulation No. 26 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "(a) Sausage meat is meat which has been minced and mixed with one or more of the following:—Herbs, seasoning, salt, sugar, spices, saltpetre, wholesome farinaceous substances. The sausage meat shall contain not more than 6 parts per centum of starch and not less than 75 parts per centum of meat (when determined by the prescribed method). The meat so determined shall contain not more than thirty-three and one-third parts per centum of fat."
- 6. Paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 52 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "(1) (a) Fruit jelly crystals and fruit jelly tablets are preparations of gelatine, sugar, lactic, citric, or tartaric acid and flavourings, such flavourings being wholly and directly derived from sound fruits, and with or without prescribed colouring. Declaration of the presence of colouring is not required."
- 7. Regulation 76 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by the deletion of paragraph (c) from subregulation (10).
- 8. Sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 77 of the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby repealed.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Amending Infectious Diseases Regulations 1952 and shall come into force on publication in the Government Gazettė.
 - 2. In Regulation 5 of the Infectious Diseases Regulations 1941-
 - (a) The interpretation of "Child attending School" is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "Child attending school" includes a child who is attending a Pre-school centre and a child required by the *Education Act* 1928 to attend a school.
 - (b) The interpretation of "School" is likewise repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "School" includes Pre-school centre, State school, and any school within the meaning of Part VI. of the Education Act 1928.
- 3. Immediately after Regulation 35 of the Infectious Diseases Regulations 1941 there shall be inserted the following heading and Regulation:—

ACUTE RHEUMATISM.

- 35A. The provisions of Sub-Regulation 2 of Regulation 29 of these regulations shall not apply to the infectious disease known as Acute Rheumatism.
- 4. Immediately after Regulation 39 of the Infectious Diseases Regulations 1941 there shall be inserted the following headings and Regulations:—

CHOREA.

39A. The provisions of Sub-Regulation 2 of Regulation 29 of these regulations shall not apply to the infectious disease known as Chorea.

DENGUE FEVER.

39B. The provisions of Sub-Regulation 2 of Regulation 29 of these regulations shall not apply to the infectious disease known as Dengue Fever.

DIARRHOEA OF FORTY-EIGHT OR MORE HOURS DURATION IN CHILDREN UNDER TWO YEARS OF AGE.

- 39c. (1) The Medical Officer of Health shall give to the occupier of every house or part of a house, and the person in charge of every orphanage, residential nursery, or similar institution or other premises, where there is a child under two years of age suffering from diarrhoea of forty-eight or more hours duration, such instructions as he considers necessary to prevent the spread of infection.
- 39c. (2) Every such occupier and person in charge shall carry out all such instructions.
- 5. Immediately after Regulation 41 of the Infectious Diseases Regulations 1941 there shall be inserted the following headings and Regulations:—

FILARIASIS.

41a. The provisions of Sub-Regulation 2 of Regulation 29 of these regulations shall not apply to the infectious disease known as Filariasis.

HOMOLOGOUS SERUM JAUNDICE.

- 41B. The provisions of Sub-Regulation 2 of Regulation 29 of these regulations shall not apply to the infectious disease known as Homologous Serum Jaundice.
- 6. Immediately after Regulation 42 of the Infectious Diseases Regulations 1941 there shall be inserted the following heading and Regulation:—

INFECTIVE HEPATITIS.

- 42A. The provisions of Sub-Regulation 2 of Regulation 29 of these regulations shall not apply to the infectious disease known as Infective Hepatitis.
- 7. Immediately after Regulation 54 of the Infectious Diseases Regulations 1941 there shall be inserted the following heading and Regulation:—

Whooping Cough.

- 54A. The Council shall cause every person suffering from Whooping Cough to be isolated and detained in isolation until the Medical Officer of Health is satisfied that such person is no longer liable to convey infection.
- 8. The First Schedule of the Infectious Diseases Regulations 1941 is hereby deleted and the following First Schedule is inserted in its place:—

FIRST SCHEDULE.

EXCLUSION OF PATIENTS AND CONTACTS FROM SCHOOL.

Citation.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Co-operative Housing Societies (General) Regulations No. 7.

Amalgamation.

2. Every Certificate of Incorporation of an amalgamated society under the Co-operative Housing Societies Acts shall be in the form or to the effect of Form No. 36 in the Schedule to these Regulations.

Government Directors.

3. A person appointed a director of any society pursuant to section 35 sub-section (2) of the Co-operative Housing Societies Act 1944 if such person is not an officer of the Public Service may be paid a fee not exceeding £2 2s. with respect to each meeting of the Board which he attends or with respect to his attendance at any general meeting of the society.

Registration of Special Resolution—Not Being a Resolution Changing the Name of a Society.

- 4. (1) Every application for registration of any special resolution other than a resolution by which the name of a society is changed shall be made in duplicate in the form or to the effect of Form No. 37 in the Schedule to these Regulations.
- (2) Every such application shall be accompanied by a copy of the notice convening the meeting at which the special resolution was passed.
- (3) Where the special resolution is a resolution altering the rules of the society the application shall also be accompanied by two copies of the altered rule or of the new rule (as the case may be) together with the consent of the society's equitable mortgagee to the alteration of the rules.
- (4) Upon registration of the special resolution, the registrar shall return one copy of the application to the society with an acknowledgment of registration as provided therein.
- (5) Where the special resolution is a resolution altering the rules of the society the registrar, upon being satisfied that the alteration is not contrary to the Acts or the Regulations and that the rules as altered are suitable and sufficient for the purposes of the society, shall register and certify the alteration by endorsing on the two copies of the altered rule, or the new rule (as the case may be), lodged as aforesaid a certificate in the following form:—

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 399.

GROCERIES-RETAIL-VICTORIA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 399.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 310, as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 330, 351, and 375, is hereby revoked.

Definition and Interpretation.

- 3. (i) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
 - (a) "The Metropolitan Area" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office at Melbourne.
 - (b) "Country Area No. 1" means all that area of Victoria beyond a radius of 25 miles but within a radius of 75 miles from the General Post Office at Melbourne.
 - (c) "Country Area No. 2" means all that area of Victoria beyond a radius of 75 miles but within a radius of 125 miles from the General Post Office at Melbourne.
 - (d) "Country Area No. 3" means all that area of Victoria beyond a radius of 125 miles but within a radius of 175 miles from the General Post Office at Melbourne.
 - (e) "Country Area No. 4" means all that area of Victoria beyond a radius of 175 miles from the General Post Office at Melbourne.
- (ii) For the purpose of this Order, unless the contrary intention appears:—
 - (a) Where any container (such as a jar, tin, packet, or bottle) is in the Schedule of this Order designated by reference to its capacity (in weight or otherwise), the reference to such container shall be deemed to include a reference to other containers of the same capacity.

(b) Reference in the Schedule to this Order to any container by means of the expression "bottle," "tin," or any similar expression, or the expression "large," "small," or any similar expression shall be deemed to be a reference to the container customarily so described at the commencement of this Order.

Maximum Prices-Specified Goods-Sales in Metropolitan Area.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which goods of any of the descriptions specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be the price specified in that Schedule.

Maximum Prices—Specified Goods—Sales Outside Metropolitan Area.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which goods of any of the descriptions specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Victoria, other than in the Metropolitan Area, to be the price specified in such Schedule plus the amount of freight (if any) calculated to the nearest upward half-penny, incurred by the seller in and properly attributed to the conveying of the goods to his place of business, and which is clearly recorded in his books of account or records.

Provided, however, that--

- (a) no amount shall be added for freight in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph in respect of any goods the net weight of which is less than 2 oz.; and
- (b) the amount added for freight, in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph, shall not exceed—
 - (i) in respect of goods sold within Country Area No. 1—
 1d. per lb. for bottled goods and ½d. per lb. for goods other than bottled;
 - (ii) in respect of goods sold within Country Area No. 2—
 1½d. per lb. for bottled goods and ¾d. per lb. for goods other than bottled;
 - (iii) in respect of goods sold within Country Area No. 3—
 2d. per lb. for bottled goods and 1d. per lb. for goods other than bottled;
 - (iv) in respect of goods sold within Country Area No. 4— 2½d. per lb. for bottled goods and 1½d. per lb. for goods other than bottled.

Unspecified Goods or New Brands or Sizes.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any goods which are similar to goods specified in the Schedule to this Order but differ from those goods in respect of the size of the container or the quantity contained therein, or are merely different brands or different varieties of those goods, may be sold by retail to be the maximum price fixed by or under the provisions of Prices Regulation Order No. 1015, made under the corresponding previous Commonwealth Regulations for the sale of those goods.

Exhibition of Price List.

7. Every retailer who sells or has for sale by retail in Victoria any of the goods specified in the Schedule to this Order, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, and in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those goods.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any goods, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order and which are specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause, may be sold in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts. I. John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:- ...

### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 400.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 133, as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 142, is hereby revoked.

### Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears-
  - "Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne. "Geelong Area" means all that area comprised within a radius

  - of 20 miles from the principal post office at Geelong.
    "Zone 1" means all that area (excepting the Metropolitan Area and the Geelong Area) comprised within a radius 50 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
  - "Zone 2" means all that area (excepting the Geelong Area) comprised within a radius not less than 50 miles and not more than 100 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
  - "Zone 3" means all that area comprised within a radius of not less than 100 miles and not more than 150 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

- "Zone 4" means all that area of Victoria comprised outside a radius of 150 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
- "Covering Capacity" means, in relation to cement roofing tiles, that such cement roofing tiles shall cover the specified area of roof after having been interlocked and set in position on such roof.
- "Natural Gray" means, in relation to cement roofing tiles, that no colouring pigment has been added to those cement roofing tiles during manufacture.
- "Colour Blends (other than green)" means, in relation to cement roofing tiles, that such cement roofing tiles have been coloured by the addition of pigment other than green, during manufacture.
- "Green Tiles" means, in relation to cement roofing tiles, that such cement roofing tiles have been coloured by the addition of green pigment during manufacture.
- "Lb." means a weight of 1 pound avoirdupois.
- "Slaters' and Tilers' Measurement" means, in relation to cement roofing tiles, the net square measurement of the roof, with 1 square foot extra for every lineal foot of eaves, hips, valleys, gutters, and gables.

#### Fixation of Maximum Prices and Rates.

- 4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which Natural Gray, Colour Blend (other than green) on green cement tiles may be sold in any of the areas specified in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order to be the price specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite to such area.
- (2) I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any service specified in the Second Schedule to this Order may be supplied in any of the areas specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order to be the rate specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite to such area and, in applying the rates set out in such Schedule. Slaters' and Tilers' Measurement shall be used to calculate the area required to be covered.
- (3) I fix and declare the maximum rate at which the service of cartage of any cement tiles for which a maximum price is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order may be supplied to the purchaser by the seller of those cement tiles to be the rate set out in the Third Schedule to this Order, which is appropriate to the distance for which the tiles are carted.

Prohibition of the Sale of Cement Roofing Tiles or Supply of any Service in connexion therewith before Application for Price or Rate.

5. No person shall sell any cement roofing tiles for the sale of which a maximum price is not fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, or supply any service in connexion with the sale of such cement tiles, for the supply of which a maximum rate is not fixed by those provisions, unless and until he has made a written request to the Commissioner to fix the maximum price at which such cement tiles may be sold or the maximum rate at which such service may be supplied, and the Commissioner has fixed the maximum price or the maximum rate accordingly.

### Delivery of Invoices.

- 6. Any person who sells any cement roofing tiles, or supplies any service in connexion therewith shall deliver with those cement tiles or on completion of the service in connexion therewith an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—
  - (a) The name and address of the seller or supplier;
  - (b) the name and address of the purchaser;
  - (c) the address at which those cement tiles are delivered or at which the service in connexion therewith is supplied;
  - (d) the date of the sale of those cement tiles or the supply of such service;
  - (e) a full description of those cement tiles, including colour and size;
  - (f) the quantity of each colour and size of cement tiles sold or used;
  - (g) full particulars of any service supplied in connexion with the fixing of cement tiles, including total measurements charged for and the rate at which such measurements are charged;

(h) full particulars of any service of cartage supplied in connexion with the sale and/or supply of cement tiles, including the rate at which such service is supplied and the total amount charged therefor.

## Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice-Associations.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price or rate at which any cement tile specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause or any service in connexion with the sale of those cement tiles so specified may be sold or supplied by any body or association of persons or member of any such body or association of persons to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that body or association.

### Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice-Specified Persons.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price or rate at which any cement tiles specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause or any service in connexion with the sale of those cement tiles so specified may be sold or supplied by any person to whom such a notice is given to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

CLOTHING, GARMENTS, APPAREL, AND DRAPERY-SALES BY RETAIL.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 401.

#### Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 236, as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 258, 270, 281, 292, 298, and 371, is hereby revoked.

### Definitions and Interpretations.

- 3. In this Order and the Schedules thereto, unless the contrary intention appears—
  - "Allowance for freight, packing, and insurance" means, in relation to the sale of any specified goods, the appropriate percentage of the cost of those goods as is specified in the Second Schedule to this Order according to the relation between the point of delivery to the retail trader, of those goods and the situation of the retail trader's place of business, or in the case of blankets, travelling rugs, bunny rugs, and bush rugs, an amount equal to twice this percentage so specified.
  - "Cost" means, in relation to the sale of any specified goods by a retail trader—
    - (a) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from a wholesaler or manufacturer in the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—
      - (i) the purchase price paid or payable by the retail trader for those goods after the deduction of any trade discount, but before the deduction of any cash discount, and
      - (ii) sales tax thereon (if any);
    - (b) in respect of specified goods purchased by a retail trader from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia and purchased from other than a retail trader in the country of export, the aggregate of—
      - (i) the purchase price paid or payable after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of any cash discount,
      - (ii) inland carriage charges,
      - (iii) outside packing charges,
      - (iv) overseas office or forwarding agent's commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 3% per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount, but before deduction of cash discount),
      - (v) bill of lading and shipping charges,
      - (vi) insurance and freight paid (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates),

- (vii) exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rates, and in the case of bank fees threeeighths of 1 per cent.),
- (viii) duty and primage paid,
- (ix) wharfage and stacking charges paid,
- (x) harbor dues and Stevedoring Commission levy paid,
- (xi) Customs entry and Customs agent's charges paid (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge thereon),
- (xii) cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of current standard Master Carriers' rates).
- "Manufacturer" means any person who, by his own labour or that of his employees, or by handing out the work to any other person, manufactures, or causes to be manufactured, any specified goods.
- "Point of Delivery" means, in relation to the sale of any specified goods by a retail trader, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying those specified goods to his store passed to that retail trader from the person from whom the retail trader purchased such goods.
- "Retail Trader" means a person who purchases any specified goods in a manufactured state and re-sells or offers for sale such goods by retail.
- "Specified Goods" means any of the goods specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
- "Wholesaler" means a person who purchases or imports any specified goods in a manufactured state and re-sells such goods by wholesale.
- "G.P.O." means General Post Office.
- "P.O." means Post Office.

### Maximum Retail Prices.

- 4. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of any Order issued prior to this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which any specified goods may be sold by a retail trader to be—
  - (a) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from a wholesaler in the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—
    - (i) the cost thereof,
    - (ii) the percentage margin of such cost as specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order and
    - (iii) allowance for freight, packing, and insurance (if any);
  - (b) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from the manufacturer of those goods in the Commonwealth of Australia the sum of—
    - (i) the cost thereof,
    - (ii) the percentage margin of such cost as specified in the third column of the First Schedule to this Order, and
    - (iii) allowance for freight, packing, and insurance (if any): Provided that no allowance for freight, packing, and insurance may be included in any maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph in any case where the point of delivery is within a radius of 50 miles from the retail trader's place of business;

- (c) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia, the sum of—
  - (i) the cost thereof,
  - (ii) the percentage margin of such cost as specified in the third column of the First Schedule to this Order:
- (d) in respect of specified goods purchased by the retail trader from a source other than those set out in sub-paragraphs
   (a), (b), or (c) hereof the sum of—
  - (i) the cost thereof, and
  - (ii) allowance for freight, packing, and insurance (if any).
- - (a) does not exceed 5s. and is not an exact number of halfpence—such price shall be computed to the nearest upward half-penny;
  - (b) exceeds 5s. and does not exceed 10s. and is not an exact number of pence—such price shall be computed to the nearest upward penny;
  - (c) exceeds 10s, and does not exceed £1 and is not an even multiple of 3d.—such prices shall be computed to the nearest upward 3d.;
  - (d) exceeds £1 and is not an even multiple of 6d.—such price shall be computed to the nearest upward 6d.

#### Discounts.

- 5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a retail trader who sells specified goods has customarily allowed any difference in price—
  - (a) to any person or to persons included in any class of persons;
  - (b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of specified goods; or
  - (c) in respect of sales of specified goods under certain conditions of sale, or upon certain terms of payment—

the maximum price fixed by or under this Order in respect of those goods shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons or of such quantities or under such conditions or upon such terms of payment, be reduced by the allowance of that difference.

### Records to be Kept of Purchases.

- · 6. Every retail trader who sells or offers for sale specified goods shall keep, in respect of such goods and in addition proper books and accounts required to be kept by him by the Prices Regulation Acts, a book containing the following particulars:—
  - . (a) A full description of those goods;
  - (b) the date of the delivery of those goods into his store;
  - (c) the name and address of the person from whom he purchased those goods;
  - (d) (i) in respect of specified goods purchased from a whole-saler or a manufacturer in the Commonwealth of Australia, the point of delivery and the cost of those goods, or
    - (ii) in respect of specified goods imported from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia by the retail trader—the cost of those goods; and
  - (e) sales tax thereon (if any):

Provided that it shall be deemed to be sufficient compliance with the foregoing provisions of this paragraph if, at the time of such sale or offer for sale, the retail trader has in his possession or control an invoice or docket delivered to him in relation to such goods, together with such documents and papers relating to charges included in cost and containing the particulars specified in sub-paragraphs (a), (c), (d), and (e) of this paragraph.

### Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

- 7. (1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any of the goods covered by this Order and which are specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
- (2) All notices in writing given in pursuance of any Order issued prior to this Order which operate to fix a lower maximum price for the sale by any person by retail of any of the goods covered by this Order than the maximum price fixed by the provisions of this Order and which are in force at the commencement of this Order shall be deemed to have been given under this Order.

PETROLEUM AND SHALE PRODUCTS-MOTOR SPIRIT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices. Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 402.

### Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 321 is hereby revoked.

#### Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
  - "Motor Spirit" means a liquid petroleum or shale product normally marketed for use as fuel in internal combustion engines with spark ignition, excluding power kerosene, but including such motor spirit blended with distillate from coal products or with alcohol.
    "Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a
  - "Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
- Maximum Price.
  4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which motor spirit may be sold by retail to be—

 (a) in the Metropolitan Area—Three shillings and five pence half-penny per gallon;

(b) outside the Metropolitan Area—the sum of the purchase price paid or payable to the wholesale seller plus Three pence three farthings per gallon: Provided that where the maximum price so calculated results in a price not exactly divisible by One half-penny, the maximum price may be determined at the nearest upward half-penny.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which motor spirit specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 403.

### Application.

- 2. Nothing in this Order shall apply to-
  - (a) garments made to the special measurements and for the personal use of an individual;
  - (b) knitted garments;(c) men's youths' or bo
  - (c) men's, youths', or boys' shirts and pyjamas and woven underwear;
  - (d) headwear of all descriptions;
  - (e) footwear of all descriptions;
  - (f) handkerchiefs and neckwear of all descriptions;
  - (g) foundation and surgical garments and brassieres.

### Revocation.

3. Prices Regulation Order No. 90, as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 276 and 372 is hereby revoked.

### Definitions.

- 4. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
  - "Landed Cost" means, in relation to the sale by any person of any goods imported from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia and purchased from other than a retail trader in the country of export, the aggregate of—
    - (i) the purchase price paid or payable after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount;
    - (ii) inland carriage charges;
    - (iii) outside package charges;
    - (iv) overseas office or forwarding agent's commission not in excess of 32 per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount;
    - (v) bill of lading and shipping charges;
    - (vi) insurance and freight paid (but not in excess of current sea freight rates);
    - (vii) exchange and bank fees not in excess of mail steamer sight draft rates, and in the case of bank fees three-eighths of one per cent.;

- (viii) duty and primage paid;
- (ix) wharfage and stacking charges paid;
- (x) harbor dues and Stevedoring Industry Commission levy paid:
- (xi) Customs entry and Customs agent's charges paid (but not including any charges for costing or any percentage surcharge on cost);
- (xii) cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of current standard Master Carriers' rates); and
- (xiii) sales tax where paid.
- "Maker-up" means, in relation to the supply of any service of manufacturing or partially manufacturing any ready-made garment, a person who manufactures or partially manufactures such garment from material furnished to him by some other person for such purpose, whether or not any linings or trimmings for such garment are supplied by the maker-up.
- "Manufacturer" means, in relation to the sale of any readymade garment, a person who manufactures that garment from his own material, linings, and trimmings.
- "Material" means, in relation to any ready-made garment, the material or materials used in the manufacture of that garment, other than material or materials used for linings, trimmings, or facings.
- "Quantity of linings and trimmings used" means, in relation to any ready-made garment, the number of units or number of pounds weight (according to the customary method of quantity or measurement adopted) of linings and trimmings owned by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, as the case may be, and used by that manufacturer, semimanufacturer or maker-up in the manufacture or partial manufacture of that garment.
- "Quantity of material used" means, in relation to any readymade garment, the quantity of material used in the manufacture of that garment.
- "Ready-made garment" means—
  (a) men's, youths', boys', women's, maids', girls', infants', and babies' outerwear garments of all descriptions;
  - (b) women's, maids', girls', infants', and babies' underwear garments and night attire and beachwear of all descriptions.
- "Retail trader" or "retailer" means, in relation to any material, linings, and trimmings, a person who purchases that material or those linings and trimmings and sells those goods by retail.
- "Semi-manufacturer" means, in relation to the sale of any ready-made garment, a person who owns the material from which that garment is manufactured and who furnishes that material, whether or not with any linings or trimmings, to a maker-up for manufacture or partial manufacture of that garment.
- "Supply "emeans, in relation to any service of manufacturing or partially manufacturing any ready-made garment by a maker-up, the supply of any declared service or services or the sale of any declared goods, or the sale of any declared goods and the supplys of any declared service or services, in relation to such garment by that maker-up.
- "Value" means, in relation to any material, linings, or trimmings
  - (a) in respect of material, linings, or trimmings, manufactured in the Commonwealth of Australia and purchased by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, as the case may be, from the manufacturer of that material or those linings and trimmings—the purchase price paid or payable therefor plus 11 per centum thereof;
  - (b) in respect of material, linings, or trimmings imported from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia by the manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, as the case may be-the landed cost thereof plus 2½ per centum;

- (c) in respect of material, linings, or trimmings purchased by a manufacturer, or semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, as the case may be, from a wholesale merchant in the Commonwealth of Australia—the purchase price paid or payable therefor;
- (d) in respect of material, linings, or trimmings purchased by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or makerup, as the case may be, from a retail trader or any source not elsewhere mentioned—
  - (i) where an amount is specified by the Prices Commissioner in relation to such material, linings, or trimmings and notified in writing to that manufacturer, semimanufacturer, or maker-up, then such amount;
  - (ii) in any other case, the purchase price paid or payable therefor, less 25 per centum thereof.

"Wholesale merchant" or "wholesaler" means-

- (a) in respect of the sale of any ready-made garment, a person who purchases that garment from a manufacturer or semi-manufacturer and sells that garment by wholesale; or
- (b) in respect of any material or linings or trimmings, a person who purchases such material, linings, or trimmings and sells such goods by wholesale.

### Specified Records to be Kept.

- 5. (1) Any manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or maker-up who manufactures or partially manufactures or causes to be manufactured or partially manufactured any ready-made garment, shall keep, in addition to records required to be kept by law or for his own purpose a cost form in relation to that garment in the form specified in the First Schedule to this Order and supporting records in relation thereto as specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
- (2) In respect of the cost form and supporting records kept in pursuance of sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph—
  - (a) one such cost form, together with supporting records, shall be kept for each garment manufactured or partially manufactured. Provided that if two or more garments are manufactured or partially manufactured together and are lined or trimmed in like manner or are otherwise substantially identical and substantially the same amount of work is performed in respect of each garment, then it shall be sufficient if only one such cost form and supporting records thereof are kept in respect of the total number of the garments so manufactured or partially manufactured:
  - (b) the cost forms shall be numbered consecutively from No. 1 onwards.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Manufacturers and Semi-Manufacturers.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which a manufacturer or semi-manufacturer may sell any ready-made garment to be—

- (a) in the case of a manufacturer not coming within the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph or in the case of a semi-manufacturer, the sum of—
  - (i) the ex-factory cost of that garment as required to be recorded in the cost form in relation to that garment kept by the manufacturer or semimanufacturer, as the case may be, pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Order; and
  - (ii) the percentage of such ex-factory cost as specified in Part 1 of the Third Schedule to this Order; or
- (b) in the case of a manufacturer who buys material from a person, firm or company, manufactures or partly manufactures such material and sells the completed or partlycompleted garment or garments manufactured from such material to the person, firm, or company from whom such material was purchased, the sum of—
  - the ex-factory cost of that garment as required to be recorded in the cost form in relation to that garment kept by the manufacturer, pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Order; and
  - (ii) seven and a half per centum of such ex-factory cost.

### Maximum Rates-Makers-up.

- 7. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which a maker-up may supply the service of manufacturing or partially manufacturing any ready-made garment to be the sum of—
  - (a) the ex-factory cost of that service as required to be recorded in the cost form in relation to that garment kept by the maker-up pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 5 of this Order; and
  - (b) twelve and a half per centum of such ex-factory cost.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Wholesale Merchants.

- . 8. I fix and declare the maximum price at which a wholesale merchant may sell any ready-made garment to be the sum of—
  - (a) the purchase price paid or payable, after the deduction of any trade discount but before deduction of any cash discount, for that garment by such person; and
  - (b) the percentage of such purchase price as is specified in Part 2 of the Third Schedule to this Order,

Invoice or Docket to be Delivered.

- 9. Any person who sells any ready-made garment other than by retail shall issue to the purchaser of such garment at the time of sale an invoice or docket indicating whether such person is the manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or wholesaler of the garment and specifying the following particulars:—
  - (i) The seller's name and address;
  - (ii) the date on which the sale was made;
  - (iii) a description of the garment as to quality, style, and type:
  - (iv) the quantity sold and the price charged therefor.

#### Discounts.

- 10. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where a manufacturer, or semi-manufacturer, or wholesaler of any readymade garment has customarily allowed, in relation to sales, any difference in price—
  - (a) to any person, or to any person included in any class of persons;
  - (b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of ready-made garments; or
  - (c) in respect of sales under certain conditions of sale, or upon certain terms of payment,

the maximum prices fixed by or under this Order in respect of that ready-made garment shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons, or of such quantities, or under such conditions, or upon such terms of payment, be reduced by the allowance of such difference.

(2) In every case, whether any such difference in price has been customarily allowed or not, where payment for any ready-made garment is made within 30 days from the date of delivery, such a reduction shall be made and shall not be less than 2½ per centum of the purchase price.

Application for Maximum Price in Certain Cases.

- 11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, a manufacturer or semi-manufacturer shall not sell any ready-made garment which is made from material, linings, or trimmings which have been purchased by him in a mixed parcel or lot, or with other goods, for an undivided price, unless and until that manufacturer or semi-manufacturer has made a written request to the Prices Commissioner to fix the maximum price at which that garment may be sold and the Prices Commissioner has fixed the maximum price accordingly.
  - Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.
- 12. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any ready-made garment may be sold or the maximum rate at which the service of making-up any ready-made garment may be supplied by any person to whom a notice in pursuance of this paragraph is given to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

### Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 404.

### Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 91 as amended by Prices Regulation Orders Nos. 275 and 373 is hereby revoked.

### Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
  - "Aids to manufacture" means, in relation to any specified garment, any buttons, sewing cottons, linings, interlinings, tabs, or girdles used in the manufacture of such garment. "Landed cost" means the aggregate of—
    - (i) the purchase price paid or payable after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount;
    - (ii) inland carriage charges;
    - (iii) outside packing charges;
    - (iv) overseas office or forwarding agents' commission actually incurred (but not in excess of 32 per centum of the gross invoice price of the goods after deduction of trade discount but before deduction of cash discount);
    - (v) bill of lading and shipping charges;
    - (vi) insurance and freight paid (but not in excess of current standard sea freight rates);
    - (vii) exchange and bank fees actually incurred (but not in the case of exchange in excess of mail steamer sight draft rates, and in the case of bank fees three-eighths of 1 per cent.);
    - (viii) duty and primage paid;
    - (ix) wharfage and stacking charges paid;
    - (x) harbour dues stevedoring commission levy paid;
    - (xi) customs entry and customs agent's charges paid (but

       not including any charges for costing or any
       percentage surcharge on cost);
    - (xii) cartage actually incurred in transporting goods from wharf to store or from wharf to bond only (but not in excess of current standard Master Carriers' Rates); and
    - (xiii) sales tax where paid.
  - "Maker-up" means, in relation to the supply of any service or manufacturing or partially manufacturing any specified garment, a person who manufactures or partially manufactures that garment from material furnished to him by some other person for such purpose, whether or not any aids to manufacture for such garment are supplied by that maker-up.
  - "Manufacturer" means, in relation to the sale of any specified garment, a person who manufactures that garment from his own material and aids to manufacture.
  - "Material" means, in relation to any specified garment, the material or materials used in the manufacture of that garment other than aids to manufacture.
  - "Rate" includes remuneration.

- "Retail trader" or "retailer" means, in relation to any material or aids to manufacture, a person who purchases that material or those aids to manufacture and sells those goods by retail.
- "Semi-manufacturer" means, in relation to the sale of any specified garment, a person who owns the material from which that garment is manufactured and who furnishes that material, whether or not with any aids to manufacture, to a maker-up for manufacture or partial manufacture of that garment.
- "Specified garment" means any men's, youths', or boys', shirts, pyjamas, underpants made from woven material, or flannel undershirts, and includes all aids to manufacture.
- "Supply" means, in relation to any service of manufacturing or partially manufacturing any specified garment by a maker-up, the supply of any declared service or services or the sale of any declared goods and the supply of any declared service or services in relation to such garment by that maker-up.
- "Value" means, in relation to any material or aids to manufacture—
  - (a) in respect of material or aids to manufacture manufactured in the Commonwealth of Australia and purchased by a manufacturer, semi-manu-

- facturer, or maker-up, as the case may be, from the manufacturer of that material or those aids to manufacture, the purchase price paid or payable therefor plus 1½ per centum;
- (b) in respect of material, linings, or trimmings imported from a source outside the Commonwealth of Australia by the manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, as the case may be, the landed cost thereof plus 2½ per centum;

- (c) in respect of material or aids to manufacture purchased by a manufacturer, or semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, as the case may be, from a wholesale merchant in the Commonwealth of Australia, the purchase price paid or payable therefor:
- (d) in respect of material or aids to manufacture purchased by a manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, as the case may be, from a retail trader or any source not elsewhere mentioned—
  - (i) where an amount is specified by the Prices Commissioner in relation to such material or such aids to manufacture and notified in writing to that manufacturer, semimanufacturer, or maker-up, then such amount:
  - (ii) in any other case, the purchase price paid or payable therefor less 25 per centum thereof.

"Wholesale merchant" or "wholesaler" means-

- (a) in respect of the sale of any specified garment, a person who purchases that garment from a manufacturer or semi-manufacturer and sells that garment by wholesale; or
- (b) in respect of any material or aids to manufacture, a person who purchases such material or such aids to manufacture and sells those goods by wholesale.

### Specified Records to be Kept.

- 4. (1) Any manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or maker-up, who manufactures or partially manufactures or causes to be manufactured or partially manufactured any specified garment, shall keep, in addition to records required to be kept by law or for his own purpose, a cost form in relation to that garment in the form specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (2) In respect of the cost form kept in pursuance of sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph—
  - (a) one such cost form shall be kept for each garment manufactured or partially manufactured. Provided that if two or more garments are manufactured or partially manufactured together and are substantially identical and substantially the same amount of work is performed in respect of each garment, then it shall be sufficient if only one such cost form is kept in respect of the total number of garments so manufactured or partially manufactured; and
  - (b) the cost forms shall be numbered consecutively from No.-1 onwards. ·

Maximum Prices-Sales by Manufacturers and Semi-Manufacturers.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which a manufacturer or a semi-manufacturer may sell any specified garment to be—
  - (a) in the case of a manufacturer not coming within the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph or in the case of a semi-manufacturer, the sum of—
    - (i) the factory cost of that garment as required to be recorded in the cost form in relation to that garment kept by the manufacturer or semimanufacturer, as the case may be, pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 4 of this Order, and
    - (ii) the percentage of such factory cost as specified in Part 1 of the Second Schedule to this Order; or
  - (b) in the case of a manufacturer who buys material from a person, firm, or company, and manufactures or partly manufactures such material, and sells the completed or

partly-completed garment or garments, manufactured from such material, to the person, firm, or company from whom such material was purchased—the sum of—

- (i) the factory cost of that garment as required to be recorded in the cost form in relation to that garment kept by the manufacturer, pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 4 of this Order, and
- (ii) five per centum of such factory cost.

### Maximum Rates-Makers-up.

- 6. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which a maker-up may supply the service of manufacturing or partially manufacturing any specified garment to be the sum of—
  - (a) the factory cost of that garment as required to be recorded in the cost form kept by that maker-up pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 4 of this Order; and
  - (b) fifteen per centum of such factory cost.

### Maximum Prices-Sales by Wholesale Merchants.

- 7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which a wholesale merchant may sell any specified garment to be the sum of—
  - (a) the purchase price paid or payable, after deduction of any trade discount but before the deduction of any cash discount, for that garment by such person; and
  - (b) the percentage of such purchase price as is specified in Part 2 of the Second Schedule to this Order.

### Invoice or Docket to be Delivered.

- 8. Any person who sells any specified garment other than by retail shall issue to the purchaser of such garment at the time of sale an invoice or docket indicating whether such person is the manufacturer, semi-manufacturer, or wholesaler of the garment and specifying the following particulars:—
  - (i) The seller's name and address;
  - (ii) the date on which the sale was made;
  - (iii) a description of the garment as to quality, style, and type;
  - (iv) the quantity sold and the price charged therefor.

### Discounts.

- 9. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where a manufacturer, or semi-manufacturer, or wholesaler of any specified garment has customarily allowed, in relation to sales, any difference in price—
  - (a) to any person or to any person included in any class of persons;
  - (b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of garments; or
  - (c) in respect of sales under certain conditions of sale, or upon certain terms of payment—

the maximum prices fixed by or under this Order in respect of that specified garment shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons, or of such quantities, or under such conditions, or upon such terms of payment, be reduced by the allowance of such difference.

(2) In every case, whether any difference in price has been customarily allowed or not, where payment for any specified garment is made within 30 days from the date of delivery, such a reduction shall be made and shall not be less than 2½ per centum of the purchase price.

### Application for Maximum Price in Certain Cases.

10. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, a manufacturer or semi-manufacturer shall not sell any specified garment which is made from material or aids to manufacture which have been purchased by him in a mixed parcel or lot with other goods for an undivided price unless and until that manufacturer or semi-manufacturer has made a written request to the Prices Commissioner to fix the maximum price at which that garment may be sold and the Prices Commissioner has fixed the maximum price accordingly.

### Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any specified garment may be sold or the maximum rate at which the service of making-up any specified garment may be supplied by any person to whom a notice in pursuance of this paragraph is given to be such price or rate as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

### MILK BOARD ACTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of June, 1952.

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria. -

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Milk Board Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby approve of the following Determination of milk prices by the Milk Board, such Determination to take effect from 16th June 1952. 16th June, 1952:-

### Determination.

- 1. The price which shall be paid by the Board to dairy farmers for milk for sale or distribution in Milk Districts shall be as follows:—
  - A. For milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agent named in Schedule I. hereto-3s. 3td. per gallon.
  - B. For milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agent named in Schedule II. hereto-3s. 31d. per gallon.
  - C. For milk supplied to any of the Board's Authorized Agents named in Schedule III. hereto—3s. 5d. per gallon.
  - D. For milk supplied to any of the Board's Authorized Agents other than those named in the Schedules hereto—3s. 6d. per gallon.

Provided that, for milk supplied to the Board's Authorized Agents other than the Authorized Agents named in Schedules I. and II. hereto, the Board shall be entitled to deduct from the said price, such sum per gallon as may be determined by the Board from time to time, in respect of the transport of such milk.

- 2. Minimum price payable to dairymen (in the case of sales other than sales by retail) for milk for sale or distribution in Milk Districts-
  - (i) By dairymen (other than the owners of milk shops and owners of house trade dairies)
    - (a) For pasteurized bottled milk (at the dairy premises of the vendor)-Half pints—4s, 5id, per gallon. Pints—4s, 1id, per gallon,
    - (b) For pasteurized bottled milk (delivered to the premises of the purchaser)— Half pints—4s. 6d. per gallon. Pints—4s. 2d. per gallon.
    - (c) For bulk milk-3s, 8åd, per gallon.
  - (ii) By prescribed charitable institutions-
    - (a) For bottled milk delivered—4s. 7d. per gallon.
    - (b) For bulk milk delivered-4s. 4d. per gallon.
  - (iii) By owners of milk shops and owners of house trade dairies and by any other persons-
    - (a) For bottled milk delivered-Half pints-5s. 4d. per gallon. Pints-5s. per gallon.
    - (b) For bulk milk delivered-4s. 7d. per gallon.

### Maximum Retail Prices.

3. (a) The maximum prices at which milk may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan and Bendigo Milk Districts shall be as follows:—

For sales of-Bulk. In Sealed Bottles. à pint .. 5d. per à pint 5åd. per à pint 1 pint .. 8åd. per pint 9d. per pint 1 quart or more 1s. 4åd. per quart 1s. 5åd. per quart

Provided that the charge for milk supplied to persons having milk delivered to them regularly in retail quantities of one quart or more per day shall be computed on a weekly basis by multiplying the total quartage delivered during such week by the price per quart.
