# WAHGUNYAH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR, 1952.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 60,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Shire Hall, Rutherglen.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the Acts Interpretation Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind the Regulations mentioned in the First Schedule hereto and doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

#### Short Title.

- These Regulations may be cited as the "General Apprenticeship Regulations."
  - 2. These Regulations are divided into Parts as follows:-
    - Part I.—Apprentices and Improvers Employed at Date of Proclamation.
    - Part II.-Employment on Probation for Apprenticeship.
    - Part III.-Indentures of Apprenticeship.
    - Part IV.—Attendance at Classes for Instruction.
    - Part V.--Completion of Apprenticeship.

#### Interpretation.

- 3. In these Regulations-
  - "Acts" means the Apprenticeship Acts.
  - "Probationer" means an applicant for apprenticeship employed on probation.
  - "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

# PART I.—APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS EMPLOYED AT DATE OF PROCLAMATION.

# Notice to be Given of Persons Employed.

4. Within one month after any trade is proclaimed to be an apprenticeship trade, every employer in such trade shall give notice to the Registrar in the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto of the particulars of the employment of every apprentice or improver employed by him immediately before such proclamation and of the number of journeymen employed by him at such time.

5. Before any person becomes an apprentice or probationer in an apprenticeship trade, he shall make application to the Secretary in the form contained in the Third Schedule hereto for a Certificate of Qualification to enter into apprenticeship in such trade.

# Certificate of Qualification to Enter into Apprenticeship.

- 6. A Certificate of Qualification in the form contained in the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be issued by the Commission to any person who has been approved by the Commission as having the preparatory educational and age qualifications prescribed for entry into apprenticeship in apprenticeship trades; provided that in the case of any applicant who, in the opinion of the Commission, has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualification prescribed, the Commission may issue a Certificate of Qualification containing such conditions as the Commission thinks fit and, if the Commission is satisfied that the applicant falls to comply with such conditions, it may cancel the certificate and require the applicant to return it to the Commission.
- 7. Every Certificate of Qualification to enter into apprenticeship may be signed on behalf of the Commission by the Secretary.

# All Probationers and Apprentices to Hold Certificate.

8. No apprentice or probationer shall be employed in any apprenticeship trade unless he has been granted a Certificate of Qualification to enter into apprenticeship in such trade.

### Notice to be Given of Employment on Probation.

9. Every employer shall, within fourteen days from the date of commencement of the employment by him of any probationer in any apprenticeship trade, give notice of such employment to the Secretary in the form contained in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

# PART III .-- INDENTURES OF APPRENTICESHIP.

#### Form of Register.

10. The register of apprenticeship to be kept by the Registrar shall be in the form contained in the Sixth Schedule hereto.

#### Form of Indenture of Apprenticeship.

11. All indentures of apprenticeship entered into in relation to any apprenticeship trade shall be in the form contained in the Seventh Schedule hereto, with such modifications thereof or additions thereto as may, having regard to the requirements of any particular trade, from time to time be prescribed; provided that where the Commission has permitted an applicant for apprenticeship to enter an apprenticeship course for less than the full term prescribed for such trade, the indentures of apprenticeship shall be so modified as to show clearly the term for which the apprentice is bound to serve the employer.

# Indentures to be in Triplicate and Registered.

12. Every such indenture shall be prepared in triplicate and, when executed, one part thereof shall be retained by the employer and one part thereof by the parent or guardian or, where the parent or guardian is not joined as a party thereto, or where the apprentice attains the age of twenty-one years during the period of the apprenticeship, by the apprentice; the remaining part thereof shall be deposited by the employer with the Registrar within thirty days of the date of execution thereof and shall thereupon be registered and retained by him on behalf of the Commission.

# Reduced Term of Apprenticeship.

13. Where an apprentice enters, with the Commission's permission, into indentures to serve as an apprentice for less than the full term prescribed for the trade in which he is apprenticed, he shall, upon completion of his service in accordance with the indentures, be deemed to have served for the full term so prescribed.

# Consent to Execution by Employer and Apprentice Only.

14. In cases where the Commission has consented to the execution of the indentures of apprenticeship by the employer and the apprentice only, the Secretary shall endorse on each part of the said indentures a memorandum of such consent in the form contained in the Eighth Schedule hereto.

#### Assignment of Indentures.

15. Where the Commission has ordered or approved of the assignment of indentures of apprenticeship from one employer to another, such assignment shall be in the form contained in the Ninth Schedule hereto and shall, in the case of the first assignment, be endorsed upon all parts of the indentures and, in the case of any subsequent assignment, may be engrossed upon separate forms, and one copy of such assignment shall be securely annexed to each part of the said indentures; provided that if in any case the first employer refuses or neglects to execute the assignment in the form prescribed by this Regulation, the Commission, upon proof satisfactory to it of such refusal or neglect, may authorize the Registrar to execute such assignment for and on behalf of such employer and such assignment when executed by the Registrar pursuant to this Regulation shall be deemed to be of like force as if it had been executed by the said employer.

# Registration of Assignments.

16. Within thirty days of the date of execution of any such assignment, all parts of the original indentures of apprenticeship, together with the assignments relating to each such part, shall be forwarded to the Registrar for registration by him of such assignment, and each part of the indentures of apprenticeship, together with the assignment relating to the same shall, upon such registration being made, be returned by him to the custody of the party entitled thereto.

#### Registration of Cancellation of Indentures.

17. Upon the cancellation of any indentures of apprenticeship by the order or with the approval of the Commission, such cancellation shall be entered in the register of apprenticeship and the employer and the parent or guardian or the apprentice shall forthwith forward their respective parts of such indentures to the Registrar, who shall endorse a memorandum of such cancellation thereon and retain them.

# Penalties for Breach of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

- 18. If any apprentice commits a breach of any covenant of his indentures of apprenticeship, the Commission may impose on him a fine not exceeding £1 for a first breach and not exceeding £2 for a second or any subsequent breach.
- 19. The employer of any apprentice who has been fined by the Commission under the provisions of Regulation 18 shall, when notified in writing by the Commission of such fine, deduct the amount of such fine from the wages of the apprentice and pay the same to the Commission within fourteen days of such deduction.

#### PART IV .-- ATTENDANCE AT CLASSES FOR INSTRUCTION.

Notice to Attend Classes to be Given to Apprentice.

20. Subject to Regulation 23, the Commission shall give notice in writing in the form contained in the Tenth Schedule hereto to each apprentice or probationer in any apprenticeship trade of the school or schools at which, and the periods for which, he is required to attend day or evening classes for instruction.

# Apprentice to Attend Prescribed Classes.

- 21. Every apprentice or probationer in any apprenticeship trade shall attend the classes for instruction in the subjects of his apprenticeship course at such place or places and during such periods, while the classes are open for instruction, as the Commission directs by notice in writing in accordance with Regulation 20; provided that the number of evenings on which such apprentice or probationer shall be required to attend such classes shall not exceed two in any one week.
- 22. Every apprentice or probationer who has been notified to attend classes as directed—
  - (i) shall attend punctually at the time appointed for the commencement thereof and shall not without the permission of the instructor leave the same before the appointed time for leaving;
  - (ii) shall be diligent and behave in a decorous manner while in the school or class;
  - (iii) shall not destroy and shall take care of any material or equipment provided for his use in the school or class;
  - (iv) shall in each term attend at least 80 per cent. of the day classes and of the evening classes prescribed for his apprenticeship course.

### Correspondence Courses.

- 23. Where attendance at technical school classes by any apprentice or probationer is, in the opinion of the Commission, impracticable, he shall undertake a correspondence course for instruction in the subjects of his apprenticeship course in such manner as the Commission directs in writing in the form contained in the Eleventh Schedule hereto.
- 24. Every apprentice or probationer who has been notified to undertake a correspondence course shall in each year of such course complete, or make a bona fide attempt to complete, at least 80 per cent. of the test papers forwarded to him for completion and shall duly return the same to the correspondence school from which he received them.

# Notice to be Given to Employer for Apprentice to Attend Classes.

25. Subject to Regulation 27, the Commission shall give notice in writing in the form contained in the Twelfth Schedule hereto to the employer of each apprentice or probationer of the school or schools at which, and the periods for which, the apprentice or probationer is required to attend day or evening classes for instruction.

# Employer to Permit Apprentice to Attend Classes.

26. (a) Every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form prescribed by Regulation 25 shall, while the classes are open for instruction, permit his apprentices and probationers to attend for instruction at the school or schools and for the periods specified in such notice,

- (b) Any such employer shall not cause or permit any apprentice or probationer who is employed by him to perform work for such employer during the periods when such apprentice or probationer is required to attend classes for instruction in accordance with the Acts or any Regulation made thereunder.
- 27. (a) Where attendance at technical school classes by any apprentice or probationer is, in the opinion of the Commission, impracticable, every employer who has been given notice in writing in the form contained in the Thirteenth Schedule hereto shall permit such apprentice or probationer to perform the theoretical and/or practical work of, or incidental to, the correspondence course, during ordinary working hours and without deduction from his wages for not more than eight hours in any week, as the Commission may direct.
- (b) Any such employer shall permit such apprentice or probationer to perform such work on the employer's premises or at such other place, under supervision, as the Commission may direct in the said notice.

Apprentice or Probationer shall Submit Himself for Examination.

28. Every apprentice or probationer attending the aforesaid classes or undertaking a correspondence course shall submit himself for examination in the subjects of his apprenticeship course at the places and times determined by the authority conducting the said classes or correspondence course, as the case may be.

Apprentice or Probationer to Provide Books, Materials, &c.

29. Every apprentice or probationer shall, at his own cost and expense, provide himself with the necessary books, drawing instruments and materials required at the classes for instruction, or to enable him to undertake a correspondence course, unless otherwise provided by the school authorities or other bodies.

#### Penalties for Non-attendance, Misbehaviour, &c.

- 30. If any apprentice or probationer fails to comply with any of the provisions of Regulations 21-24, the Commission may impose on him a fine not exceeding £1 for a first offence and not exceeding £2 for a second or any subsequent offence.
- 31. The employer of any apprentice or probationer who has been fined by the Commission under the provisions of Regulation 30 shall, when notified in writing by the Commission of such fine, deduct the amount of such fine from the wages of the apprentice or probationer any pay the same to the Commission within fourteen days of such deduction.

# PART V.—COMPLETION OF APPRENTICESHIP.

# Report on Apprentice to be Furnished by Employer.

32. Every employer shall, within fourteen days of the date of completion of the term of apprenticeship of every apprentice in his employment, forward to the Secretary a report on each such apprentice in accordance with the form contained in the Fourteenth Schedule hereto.

#### Form of Final Certificate.

33. The final certificate required by the Acts to be issued to an apprentice, when he has completed the term of apprenticeship provided for in his indentures and has attained the standards of education and trade experience prescribed for his apprenticeship course, shall be in the form contained in the Fifteenth Schedule hereto.

The employer, for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns, doth hereby covenant with the apprentice and the parent or guardian and with each of them severally that he will—

- (a) Take, receive, and accept the apprentice as his apprentice for the balance now remaining of a period of years from the day of 19, being the date since which the apprentice has served as an applicant for apprenticeship on probation.
- (b) By the best means in his power cause the apprentice to be taught and instructed in the trade of including such processes therein as may from time to time be prescribed by Regulations made under the provisions of the Apprenticeship Acts and in all things appertaining or incidental thereto.
- (c) (i) Pay to the apprentice, so long as he shall observe and faithfully perform the terms and conditions hereof and the duties imposed upon him by or under the said Acts, wages at such rates as may for the time being be prescribed by Regulations made under the said Acts in respect of the aforesaid trade.
  - (ii) Pay to the apprentice such further rates for overtime worked, for shift work and for proficiency as may be prescribed by the said Regulations; provided however that the apprentice shall not be entitled to be paid in any year of his apprenticeship course any such increased rates for proficiency unless he has attained in the next preceding year the standard of proficiency similarly prescribed.
  - (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.
- (d) On completion of the term herein named hand over to the apprentice this indenture with a certificate endorsed thereon that the said term has been served.
- (e) If from any cause whatsoever he is unable to provide sufficient work in the aforesaid trade for the apprentice, transfer the apprentice, subject to the approval of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria (hereinafter called "the Commission"), for a period not exceeding that indicated by the Commission at the time of giving its said approval, to some other employer or employers engaged in or carrying on the said trade and during such period remain responsible for the due performance of all obligations imposed upon him by or under this Indenture.
- (f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools or plant, other than wilful damage or damage due to carelessness.

And the Apprentice and the Parent or Guardian do hereby covenant with the Employer that the Apprentice during the said term will—

- (a) Well and honestly serve the employer as his apprentice and accept training and instruction in the aforesaid trade, including such processes therein as may from time to time be prescribed by Regulations as aforesaid and in all things appertaining or incidental thereto, for the term aforesaid and at all times obey the lawful commands of the employer or his representatives.
- (b) Not commit or permit or be accessory to any waste, damage, or other injury to the property or goods of the employer.
- (c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient and proper manner.

And it is hereby further agreed between the parties hereto:-

1. That the apprentice shall receive the same proportionate benefits (if any) as regards sick pay and payment for holidays provided for journeymen employed in the aforesaid trade by any competent industrial authority or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the Commonwealth Concilation and Arbitration Act 1904-1951 as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to journeymen's minimum rates of pay provided by any such authority or in any such agreement for such trade.

- 2. That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work, and other matters as are provided for journeymen employed in the aforesaid trade by any competent industrial authority or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1951, or, where such allowances are expressed as a proportion of the minimum rates of wages provided for journeymen as aforesaid, the apprentice shall be paid the same proportion of the minimum rates of wages prescribed for apprentices.
- 3. That where the employer is temporarily unable to provide sufficient work to keep the apprentice fully employed during any ordinary working week or month, he may, with the consent of the Commission, employ the apprentice in such week or month for such less time as the Commission, on the application of the employer, determines, at wages proportionate to those which he is required under the provisions of this indenture to pay to the apprentice when employed during the whole of any ordinary working week or month.
- 4. That in the event of the employer being unable, owing to lack of orders or through financial difficulties, to find employment and training for the apprentice or to arrange for the transfer of the apprentice to another employer as provided for under the Acts, the Commission may, on application made in that behalf by the employer, and after satisfying itself that the circumstances justify such action, arrange for the suspension of this indenture for such period as it determines, or for the cancellation of the indenture.
- 5. That the employer may, when the apprentice is absent from work without the consent of the employer, deduct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time lost.
- an amount proportionate to the time lost.

  6. That in computing any year's service hereunder, only such service as has been given to the employer upon not less than the ordinary working days prescribed for journeymen in the aforesaid trade by any competent industrial authority or in any industrial agreement made pursuant to the Commonwealth Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1951 shall be regarded; provided, however, that any time lost by reason of sickness for which time the apprentice is entitled to full pay or on account of attendance at classes for instruction prescribed by the Commission shall be deemed service in accordance with this Agreement; provided further, that where the apprentice is required under the provisions of paragraph 3 hereof to work for less than full time in any ordinary working week or month or that where this Indenture is suspended for any period by the Commission under the provisions of paragraph 4 hereof, the total period of time not served by the apprentice by reason of either of the above-mentioned provisions shall, at the option of the apprentice, be included in the term of his apprenticeship or be added to the term of his apprenticeship. In the event of such period being added to the term of his apprenticeship, the apprentice shall be paid during such period at the wages rates prescribed in respect of the last year of his apprenticeship.

  7. That the parent or guardian shall be bound hereby until the
- 7. That the parent or guardian shall be bound hereby until the apprentice attains the age of 21 years or the sooner expiration of the currency hereof and no longer.

That any question or difference arising between the employer and the apprentice touching this Indenture or anything contained herein or the construction or operation thereof or any rights, duties, or liabilities of the employer or the apprentice thereunder shall be determined by the Commission.



- A By-law of the Shire of Charlton, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and Health Acts, and numbered 19, for—

  - (a) Prescribing residential areas within the boundaries:

     (b) Regulating and/or prohibiting the keeping of cattle, birds, and poultry in or on premises. within a radius of one hundred (100) chains from the Charlton Post Office.
     (c) Regulating and/or prohibiting the erection of abattoirs. slaughter-houses. slaughter-yards.

  - (c) Regulating and/or prohibiting the erection of abattoirs, slaughter-houses, slaughter-yards, knackers' yards, and piggeries;
     (d) (i) Regulating the use of private property-situate at the junction of roads or streets:

     for growing of trees, shrubs, or hedges, abutting on any such street or road or within
     10 feet therefrom.

     (ii) Requiring the appropriate or looping of trees
    - (ii) Requiring the removal or lopping of trees, shrubs, or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the Local Government Act 1946) from or on private-property so situate where such trees, shrubs:

or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of such street or road.

(iii) Requiring the reduction to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. of any portion of a fence within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads; and or roads; and

- (iv) Authorizing the Council at the expense of the owner (the amount of which expense may be recovered by the Council in a court of petty sessions as a civil debt recoverable. summarily)-
  - (a) To remove or lop trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being on private-property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by-or under this By-law.
  - (b) To reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under this: By-law.
- IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Local Government Acts. Health Acts, and of every other-power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Charlton for the-purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within their jurisdiction order as follows:—
- 1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law shall be and are hereby repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into force and operation immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette of Victoria.
- 3. The areas described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as residential areas.
- 4. No person shall, within any of the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, use any land or erect oradapt for use or use any building for the purpose of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or publicamusement.
- 5. No person shall, within the boundaries of the Township of Charlton, use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purpose of any dangerous and/or offensive trade within the meaning of the Health
- 6. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, any person may use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building in any such residential area for the purpose of a school or private boarding house or church, or may use any dwelling house for the purpose of carrying on the practice of the profession or business of a barrister, solicitor, medical practitioner, dentist, teacher, accountant, architect surveyer murse or masser provided that architect, surveyor, nurse, or masseur, provided that-

  - (a) no window display is made, or
    (b) no sign with a greater area than 6 square feet is exhibited, or
    (c) no machine or equipment powered by an electric motor of more than half a horse-power rating in tread.
- 7. No person shall in any such residential area erect or adapt for use or use any stable containing more than three stalls or keep on any premises in such prescribed residential area more than five (5) horses.
- 8. No person shall keep more than twenty-five (25) head of poultry on any premises within a radius of one hundred (100) chains of the Charlton Post Office, with the exception of the owner of any premises on which the business of a commercial poultry keeper was carried on before the

coming into operation of this By-law, but such owner will not be permitted to extend the area of his poultry farm, nor erect any buildings, nor make any alterations or additions to any building already erected unless he first submit to the Council a plan of such erection, alteration, or addition, and such erection, alteration, or addition is approved by the Council.

- 9. No person other than the owner of any premises on which the business of a commercial poultry keeper was carried on before the coming into operation of this By-law shall add to or extend any fowlhouse existing at the date of the operation of this By-law which would cause it to exceed one hundred (100) square feet.
- 10. A fowlhouse may be constructed provided such structure conforms to the requirements of clause 3132 of the Uniform Building Regulations and a permit from the building surveyor having been first obtained. Clause 3132 requires that fowlhouses shall—

  - (a) have a height not exceeding 8 feet and a total superficial area not exceeding 100 square feet;
    (b) shall be distant not less than 75 feet from the boundary of the street to which the building

  - has a frontage;
    (c) shall be distant not less than 10 feet from any other street of a greater width than 25 feet;
    (d) shall be distant not less than 5 feet from any other street of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of the street of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
  - (e) shall be distant not less than 40 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land;
    (f) shall be covered and roofed with a material approved by the surveyor.
- 11. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:-
  - "Person" shall include the owner or occupier or
  - person in charge of any premises.

    oultry" means and includes any domestic fowl raised for the tables or for their eggs or feathers, " Poultry and includes cocks, hens, capons, turkeys, chicks, ducks, ducklings, geese, pigeons, and goslings. "Poultry Keeper" shall mean any person who keeps

  - more than 25 head of poultry.

    "Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Council and includes any acting or assisting inspector.
- 12. No person shall, within a radius of 100 chains of the Charlton Post Office, keep or suffer or permit swine to be kept.
- 13. No person shall allow, cause, permit, or suffer ferrets to be kept distant not less than fifty (50) feet from any residence.
- 14. No person shall allow, cause, permit, or suffer any poultry to wander, either at large or under control, in or upon any street, vacant land, or water course within the defined area.
- 15. All premises used, kept, or erected in connexion with the keeping or feeding of any animal or any poultry shall at all times be maintained to the satisfaction of the inspector in a clean and sanitary manner and in a state of good repair.
- 16. No person shall erect or establish abattoirs, slaughterhouses, slaughter-yards, knackers' yards, and piggeries within a radius of 2 miles of the Charlton Post Office.
- within a radius of 2 miles of the Charlton Post Office.

  17. No person shall use any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of any tree, shrub, or hedge abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom, unless for a distance of 20 feet from the corner of such private property each part of such tree, shrub, or hedge is kept at a height not greater than 3 ft. 6 in. above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such tree, shrub, or hedge.
- 18. Where any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads is used contrary to the provisions of clause 17 hereof, the Council of the said Shire of of clause 17 hereof, the Council of the said Shire of Charlton at any time by notice in writing under the hand of an officer of the said shire may require the owner or occupier of such private property within the time specified in such notice to lop all trees, shrubs, or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the Local Government Act 1946) growing contrary to clause 17 hereof on such private property where such trees, shrubs, or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of any such street or road in such manner that each part of such trees, shrubs, or hedges shall be kept at a height not greater than 3 ft. 6 in. above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such trees, shrubs, or hedges. of such trees, shrubs, or hedges.
- 19. No person shall cause or permit a fence to remain on private property at a greater height than 3 ft. 6 in, within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

- 20. Where any fence within 10 feet of the junction of any streets or roads exceeds 3 ft. 6 in. in height contrary to the provisions of clause 19 hereof, the Council of the Shire of Charlton at any time by notice in writing under the hand of an officer of the said shire may require the owner or occupier of the property upon which such fence exists within the time specified in such notice to reduce the fence in height. the fence in height.

  21. Should default be made by any owner or occupier in complying with any notice under this By-law within the time therein limited, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, the said Council may by its Engineer enter upon such private property so situate as aforesaid with a sufficient number of workmen and lop any trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being thereon which are not lopped as required by such notice, and reduce any fence in height as required by such notice, and the expenses incurred by the said Council in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner of such private property to the said Council, and in default of such payment may be recovered by the said Council in a court of petty sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

  22. In this By-law the word "corner" shall mean the
- 22. In this By-law the word "corner" shall mean the point at which the building lines of any private property abutting on the streets or roads at the junction of which such private property is situate meet or if extended would meet, and the words "surface level" shall mean—
  - (a) Where the footway on that side of the street or road which abuts on the private property in question is paved, the level of that part of the paved portion of such footway nearest to the
  - paved portion of such footway nearest to the private property in question.

    (b) If such footway is not paved, but the level of the street or road abutting on such private property has been fixed in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1946, or any previous or subsequent Act of Parliament of a like nature, the level as so fixed of that part of such street or road nearest to the private property in question.

    (c) Otherwise the actual level of that part of the street or road nearest to the private property in question.
  - in question.
- 23. Any contravention of the foregoing sections or subsections of this By-law by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.
- 24. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than One pound for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order is imposed or made on or against such person by any court.
