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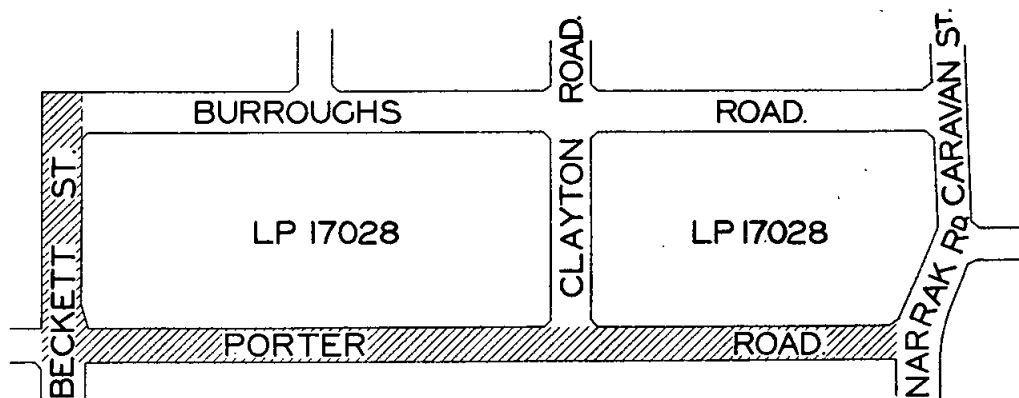

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Camberwell has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved for roads within the said City, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all those pieces of land, being part of Elgar's Crown special survey, Parish of Boroondara, County of Bourke, known as Beckett-street and Porters-road, Balwyn, shown on plan of subdivision No. 17028, lodged in the Office of Titles, reserved for roads and indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.

EXTENSION OF THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 5 TO PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of section 5 of the said Act to that portion of the Shire of Alexandra as described in the Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at the most southerly angle of allotment 15, Parish of Thornton, County of Anglesey; thence north-westerly by the south-western boundaries of that allotment, a line connecting those boundaries and a line in continuation thereof across the Goulburn River to the southern boundary of allotment 11B, Parish of Eildon; thence north-easterly by the last-mentioned boundary to the most easterly angle of that allotment; thence north-westerly by the north-eastern boundaries of allotments 11B and 11A and a line connecting those boundaries to the most northerly angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north-easterly by a line to the most easterly angle of allotment 9; thence north-westerly by the north-eastern boundary of said allotment 9 to the most northerly angle thereof; thence northerly by a line to the most easterly angle of allotment 8B; thence north-westerly by the south-western boundary of a road to a point in line with the north-western boundary of allotment 6A; thence north-easterly and south-easterly by a line the north-western and north-eastern boundaries of allotment 6A to the most westerly angle of allotment 5A; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundaries of allotments 5A and 2 and a line connecting those boundaries to the most northerly angle of the last-mentioned allotment, all in the said Parish of Eildon; thence south-easterly by a line across the Goulburn River to the north-western angle of allotment 2, Parish of Thornton aforesaid; thence generally easterly by the northern boundary of said allotment 2 and a line to the most northerly angle of allotment 3; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of said allotment 3 to the most easterly angle of that allotment; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 3 and 5 and a line connecting those boundaries to the most southerly angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of allotment 6 to the most easterly angle of that allotment; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12, and 15, and lines connecting those boundaries to the point of commencement.

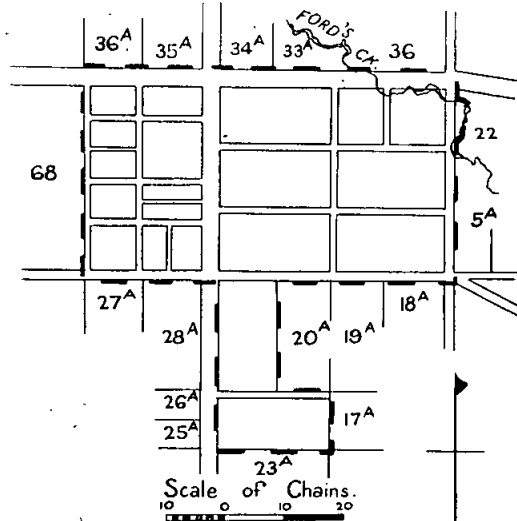

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933*, do by this notice rescind the Proclamation dated 4th February, 1861, defining the boundaries of certain areas of land as Towns in so far as it refers to the Town of Mansfield (see *Government Gazette 1861*, page 285), the Proclamation dated 25th March, 1867, defining the boundaries of a certain area of land as an extension of the Town of Mansfield (see *Government Gazette 1867*, page 634), and the Proclamation dated 18th September, 1923, defining the boundaries of a certain area of land as the Township of Mansfield, adjoining the Town of Mansfield (see *Government Gazette 1923*, page 2577), and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township, under the designation of Mansfield, the area of land in the Parish of Mansfield, County of Delatite, within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(M.35⁽²⁾ (C.89895).

Police Regulation Act 1946.
POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION No. 38 OF THE POLICE CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

THE Police Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1946*, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

1. The Determination No. 6 of the Police Classification Board of 19th September, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th September, 1947, as amended, is hereby revoked and the following Determination is substituted in its stead:—

Travelling and Incidental Expenses.

2. In this Determination unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Member of the Police Force” means any person (whether male or female) employed in the police force of Victoria, and includes any Constable, First Constable, Senior Constable, Sergeant, Inspector, Chief Inspector, Superintendent, or Inspecting Superintendent.

“Officer” means any Inspecting Superintendent, Superintendent, Chief Inspector, or Inspector of the police force of Victoria.

“Police Force” means the police force of Victoria.

3. Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular to include the plural and the plural to include the singular, unless the contrary as to gender or number is expressly provided.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Determination, members of the police force shall be entitled to travelling expenses under the scale and conditions following:—

(1) Members of the police force travelling on duty to and from and whilst at capital cities other than Melbourne shall be entitled by way of reimbursement to the following scale of expenses:—

- (a) For each day less than one week—45s. a day.
- (b) For each week, but not more than four weeks—40s. a day.
- (c) Upon the expiration of the fourth week, but for not more than eight weeks—35s. a day.
- (d) Where the visit extends beyond eight weeks, after such eighth week—30s. a day.
- (e) Members of the Criminal Investigation Branch or other branch of the police force when engaged on interchange duty in another State of the Commonwealth shall be paid 40s. a day during the period when so engaged.

Provided that where the period of absence is less than a complete day, or includes a portion of a day, the member shall be allowed in respect of either period an amount of the appropriate daily rate calculated in the proportion of the number of hours in the part of the day for which the claim is made to twenty-four hours.

(2) Where members of the police force travel on duty to and from and whilst at Canberra, the rates prescribed in sub-clauses (a), (b), (c), and (d) of clause 1 hereof shall be increased in each case by the sum of 5s.

(3) Members of the police force travelling on duty elsewhere shall be entitled, by way of reimbursement, to the following scale of expenses:—

If an Officer—

- (a) For not less than five hours and not exceeding eight hours and a meal is purchased away from his home or usual residence—
 - (i) for breakfast purchased—4s.;
 - (ii) for lunch purchased—4s.;
 - (iii) for dinner purchased—7s.

- (b) For over eight hours and not exceeding twelve hours and one or two meals is or are purchased away from his home or usual residence—
 - (i) for breakfast purchased—4s.;
 - (ii) for lunch purchased—4s.;
 - (iii) for dinner purchased—7s.
- (c) For over twelve hours and not exceeding twenty-four hours—26s. 3d.
- (d) For one night, if he is required to pay for a bed—20s.
- (e) After the first night and up to one week inclusive he shall be paid for each full day—35s.; for part of a day—1s. 9d. an hour.
- (f) After one week in one place, and up to four weeks, he shall be paid for each full day—30s.; for part of a day—1s. 9d. an hour.
- (g) After four weeks in one place, he shall be paid for each full day—25s.

If Not an Officer—

- (4) (a) For not less than five hours and not exceeding eight hours and a meal is purchased away from his home or usual residence—
 - (i) for breakfast purchased—4s.;
 - (ii) for lunch purchased—4s.;
 - (iii) for dinner purchased—5s.
- (b) For over eight hours and not exceeding twelve hours, and one or two meals is or are purchased away from his home or usual residence—
 - (i) for breakfast purchased—4s.;
 - (ii) for lunch purchased—4s.;
 - (iii) for dinner purchased—5s.
- (c) For over twelve hours and not exceeding twenty-four hours—22s. 6d.
- (d) For one night, if he is required to pay for a bed—17s.
- (e) After the first night and up to one week inclusive, he shall be paid for each full day—30s.; for part of a day—1s. 6d. an hour.
- (f) After one week in one place, and up to four weeks, he shall be paid for each full day—27s. 6d.; for part of a day—1s. 6d. an hour.
- (g) After four weeks in one place, he shall be paid for each full day—23s. 6d.

Provided that in no case shall the total allowance payable under paragraph 4, clauses 3 and 4, for any period of twenty-four hours exceed the full daily rate.

- (5) (a) Subject to the provisions of sub-clause (c) of this provision, travelling expenses of members of the police force, their wives and children, and reasonable cost of removing furniture and effects shall be allowed when such members are transferred from one station or district to another station or district. In cases of transfer of members of the police force or their furniture and effects to and from country districts, or from one country district to another (if the cost of removal is paid for or to be borne by the Government), the railways shall be utilized wherever such facilities are available.
- (b) Members of the police force shall not be allowed transfer expenses under sub-clause (a) of this provision if, at their own request, they are transferred to a station and their travelling expenses have been paid within three years of appointment thereto, and such members must not use railway requisitions: Provided, however, that where there are special circumstances connected with any transfer the Chief Commissioner of Police may, after considering all the facts, allow transfer expenses.

- (c) In the case of members of the police force who own motor cars and transport themselves and families by car when on transfer, such members may claim the equivalent of first class rail fares, or the mileage rate, whichever amount is the least cost to the Government: Provided, however, that where a member of the police force is travelling to a station where he will be performing motor car duties, or is travelling from a station where he has been performing motor car duties, he shall be allowed the mileage rates.
- (6) When an officer of the police force is supplied, free of cost, with sleeping accommodation in respect of a journey made by rail, there shall be deducted from any expenses payable to him the sum of 20s. in respect of each night when such accommodation is provided and when a sub-officer, first constable, or constable is so provided with sleeping accommodation there shall be deducted from any expenses payable to him, the sum of 17s. in respect of each night when such accommodation is provided.
5. When a member of the police force travels by air, boat, rail, or other facility on which food and sleeping accommodation or either of them are provided and charged for in the fare, he shall not be entitled to any of the expenses hereinbefore prescribed but shall be entitled during such travel to receive an allowance of 5s. per day or any part thereof.
6. When a member of the police force attends any Court or inquiry of a similar nature, in an official capacity, and cannot reasonably return to his station for his midday meal, he shall be paid, by way of reimbursement, a meal allowance of 4s.
7. (1) (a) When a member of the police force is required to remain on duty later than 8 a.m., and thereby extends his usual or prescribed hours of duty by at least two hours, he shall be paid, by way of reimbursement, a meal allowance of 5s.
- (b) When a member of the police force is required to remain on duty later than 1.30 p.m., and thereby extends his usual or prescribed hours of duty by at least two hours, he shall be paid, by way of reimbursement, a meal allowance of 5s.
- (c) When a member of the police force is required to remain on duty later than 6.30 p.m., and thereby extends his usual or prescribed hours of duty by at least two hours, he shall be paid, by way of reimbursement, a meal allowance of 5s.
- (2) When a member of the police force is required to commence duty at least two hours before his usual or prescribed starting time, and is thereby required to work for a consecutive period covering two or more meal hours, she shall be paid, by way of reimbursement, a meal allowance of 5s.
8. (1) In any case where a married member of the police force who maintains his family, satisfies the Chief Commissioner of Police that he has made reasonable efforts to obtain housing accommodation for himself and his family at or near where he is stationed or employed and has failed to do so and is therefore required to live away from the place where his family is so maintained, he shall be entitled to receive an allowance of £3 per week during the time he is so required to live away from his family and is unable to secure such accommodation.
- (2) A member of the police force will not be entitled to claim the living-away allowance under clause (1) hereof in respect of any period for which travelling expenses are payable under paragraph 4 hereof.
9. In all cases where travelling expenses for absence on duty are claimed, the hours of duty must be continuous before allowances become payable.
10. Members of the police force stationed in Melbourne and suburbs who are withdrawn from their stations or divisions for duty within the metropolitan area shall not be entitled to claim travelling expenses under this Determination unless such duty entails travelling a distance of more than 15 miles from headquarters of such members.

11. Members of the police force stationed within the urban and suburban areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong who are withdrawn from their stations for duty within such urban and suburban areas, shall not be entitled to claim travelling expenses under this Determination, unless such duty entails travelling a distance of more than 15 miles radius from headquarters of such members.

12. Members of the police force attached to motor car and motor cycle patrols shall not be entitled to claim travelling expenses under this Determination whilst performing patrol duty, unless such duty entails their being absent from their headquarters for at least nine hours.

13. For the purpose of this Determination, the term "metropolitan area" shall be deemed to include all police stations and places within a radius of 13 miles of the post office situated at the corner of Bourke and Elizabeth streets, Melbourne.

14. The boundaries of the suburban areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong shall be defined by the Chief Commissioner of Police, who may at any time and from time to time alter or vary such boundaries as he thinks proper.

15. Where any member of the police force stationed within the metropolitan area or within the urban or suburban areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, or Geelong, who has been withdrawn from his station or place of employment for any special or emergency duty within such metropolitan area or urban or suburban areas is thereby required to work for a consecutive period of five hours, and by so doing has incurred reasonable out-of-pocket expenses he shall be reimbursed such expenses or any portion thereof which is not payable under any of the preceding provisions of this Determination.

16. Under this Determination the day shall be reckoned to commence at 6 a.m., and end at midnight, and the night to commence at 12 midnight and end at 6 a.m., but, if unavoidable circumstances necessitate an earlier departure than 6 a.m., the day shall be reckoned as commencing from such starting time, while, should circumstances prevent a return to station until after midnight, the day shall be reckoned as ending at the hour of such arrival on return to station. The daily rates under sub-clauses (e) and (f) of clauses (3) and (4) of paragraph 4 of this Determination shall be considered to begin from 6 a.m. of the day following the only or last night claim, and any period thereafter short of the complete 24 hours shall be charged at the hourly rate. In any claim at the hourly rate a period of half an hour or over may be reckoned as an hour, but no claim shall be allowed for any period less than half an hour.

17. In no circumstances shall travelling expenses be paid to any member of the police force doing duty at his own station.

18. Members of the police force who claim for an absence of five hours or more extending past midnight cannot also claim for the night.

19. (1) When in the opinion of the Chief Commissioner of Police special circumstances exist for which provision is not herein made, he may authorize the payment of such allowance as is considered reasonable under the circumstances.

(2) When the actual and necessary expenses incurred by members of the police force exceed the rates herein provided, an additional sum by way of reimbursement may be granted by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

20. (1) Any travelling expense claim shall be submitted on Form 46 issued by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

(2) Any claim made for a meal allowance or under paragraph 15 of this Determination shall be submitted to the Chief Commissioner of Police on "Form L2A" together with a report supporting such claim.

21. Travelling expense claims shall be forwarded to the officer in charge of the district fortnightly, and the periods for which they are rendered shall be alternate with the pay periods. Claims must be submitted as soon as the period for which they are rendered is completed, and the officer in charge of the district shall transmit them so that they reach the office of the Chief Commissioner of Police not later than the Wednesday preceding each pay-day.

22. A member of the police force when required to travel in the performance of his duty shall be entitled to travel first class except when the duty being performed is the escorting of a prisoner.

23. When the duty to be performed by a member of the police force is of such a nature that it is reasonable to believe he will be detained for a period of seven days or more away from his station or place of employment, he may receive, where practicable, a reasonable advance of travelling expenses up to an amount not exceeding five pounds (£5).

24. Where a member of the police force is stationed and residing in a different part of the State from which he intends to make his permanent home on retirement from the police force, he shall before retiring on account of age or ill-health, be provided with free first class rail fare for himself, his wife, and dependent family for the purpose of taking up residence at his proposed permanent home. Provided however, if such a member uses his own motor car for such purposes for himself and his family, he shall be paid the equivalent of the first class rail fares or mileage rates whichever amount is the lesser for such journey. In addition he shall be entitled to have his furniture and effects transported to such place at the expense of the Government. The Chief Commissioner of Police shall arrange such transport, and where practicable railway facilities shall be used for the purpose.

25. (1) Members of the police force who use their own motor cars, motor cycles with side-cars, motor cycles, or bicycles, on police duty, shall be allowed to claim for such hire in accordance with the following scale:—

(2) The above-mentioned scale shall be varied from time to time to comply with any scale of rates determined by the Motor Transport Committee established by the Government.

(3) In every claim made under this paragraph in respect of the use of a motor car there shall be inserted the make and horse-power of such car as shown on the certificate of registration thereof.

(4) In the case of sub-districts specified by the Chief Commissioner of Police to be motor cycle sub-districts, members who use their own motor cars or motor cycles with side-cars on police duty shall be allowed to claim for such travelling as is within their motor cycle duties, only the rate per mile prescribed for motor cycles.

26. When any doubt exists concerning the meaning or effects of any provision contained in this Determination the member of the police force concerned, the Chief Commissioner of Police, or the Police Association may, upon application in writing, require the Police Classification Board to interpret such provision. Upon receipt of such an application the Board shall issue its interpretation and may, if it sees fit, for that purpose notify in writing all the parties concerned and determine the matter after hearing such parties.

27. This Determination shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1952.

POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION NO. 39 OF THE POLICE CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

THE Police Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1946*, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

1. The Determination No. 12 of the Police Classification Board of the 27th August, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 1st September, 1948, is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By renumbering paragraph 30 to read "30. (1)" and inserting thereafter the following new sub-paragraph:—

"(2) Any member of the Force who, under the provisions of the *Commonwealth National Service Act 1951*, is required to render service with the Citizen Forces, and who, while so serving, sustains injury or contracts illness necessitating his absence from duty beyond the period of leave granted by the Chief Commissioner of Police under the provisions of the *Police Regulations*, may be granted leave on the following terms:—

(i) If compensation is not paid to the member of the Force by the Department of Defence in respect of such absence, the leave may be granted as sick leave.

(ii) If compensation is paid and is equal to or exceeds the amount of pay which the member would have received had he been granted sick leave, the leave shall be granted without pay.

(iii) If compensation is paid and is less than the amount of pay which the member would have received had he been granted sick leave, he may be paid an amount equal to the difference, and his sick leave credit reduced as if he had been granted sick leave for such number of days as is appropriate to the amount of the difference."

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the City of Brunswick (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority") having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order.

1. The development of all land referred to in the Schedule and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads or other works on any of the said land is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up or alter any building, road or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Acts.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7. Schedule of land affected:—All that piece of land commencing at a point which is the intersection of the east building line of Barry-street with the south building line of Collier-street; and thence easterly along southern building line of Collier-street to a point 100 feet west of western building line of Fallon-street; thence southerly a distance of 104 feet or thereabouts to the production of the southern building line of a right-of-way; thence westerly along the said line and the southern building line of the right-of-way to the eastern building line of Barry-street, then northerly along the eastern building line of Barry-street to the point of commencement.

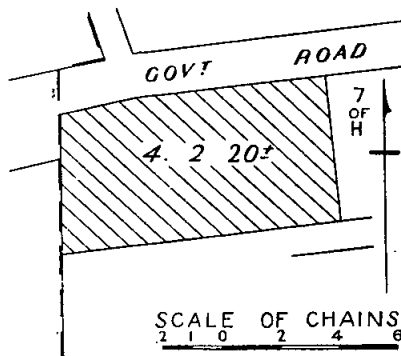

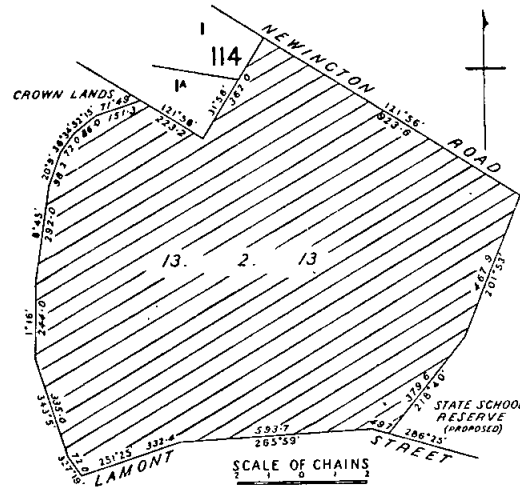

THE BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD ELECTRIC LIGHTING
ORDER No. 181, 1924.—AMENDMENT TO TARIFF.

WHEREAS on the 17th day of April, 1924, the Council of the municipality of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Arnaud (hereinafter called “the undertakers”) was granted an Order in Council under the *Electric Light and Power Act 1915*, cited as the Borough of St. Arnaud Electric Lighting Order No. 181, 1924 (hereinafter called “the said Order”) authorizing the undertakers to supply electricity within the municipal district of the Borough of St. Arnaud: And whereas by an Order dated the 31st August, 1948, the Governor in Council did approve of an alternative method of charging for electricity supplied: And whereas the undertakers have made application to have an amendment made to the Fourth Schedule annexed to the said Order: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, acting pursuant to the provisions of section 13 of the *Electric Light and Power Act 1928*, doth hereby vary the charges which may be charged by substituting the following charges for those set forth in section 4 of the Fourth Schedule, that is to say:—

Section 4.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by a fixed periodical or service charge, and a further charge according to the amount of energy supplied, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For energy supplied for normal residential use for lighting, cooking, heating, or power—

A service charge of 1s. 7d. per month for every assessable* room which does not exceed 350 square feet in

floor area, plus 1s. 7d. per month for every 350 square feet of floor area, or odd fraction thereof, of every assessable room in such premises where such floor area exceeds 350 square feet (but the service charge in respect of any one room shall not exceed 4s. per month), and, in addition, for any amount of energy supplied, 4d. per unit, but (subject to the minimum monthly charge provided for in section 3 of this Schedule) the amount chargeable to any consumer under this method shall not be higher than a sum calculated at the rate of 1s. per unit used in any month.

* Assessable room.—An assessable room is any room (whether lighted by electricity or not, and other than those exempted below) used or erected for use as a dining-room, kitchen, bedroom, dressing-room, sun room, ballroom, lounge, servery, library, billiard-room, sleep-out, laboratory, dispensary, gymnasium, or the like, or any enclosed verandah or vestibule used for such purpose. The following are normally exempt in assessing service charges:—Passages, pantries, lobbies, bathrooms, lavatories, cellars, entrance halls, porches, garages, private workshops, sculleries, and washhouses where not combined with kitchens, verandahs, and vestibules, unless such verandahs, when enclosed, are used for the purposes stated above.

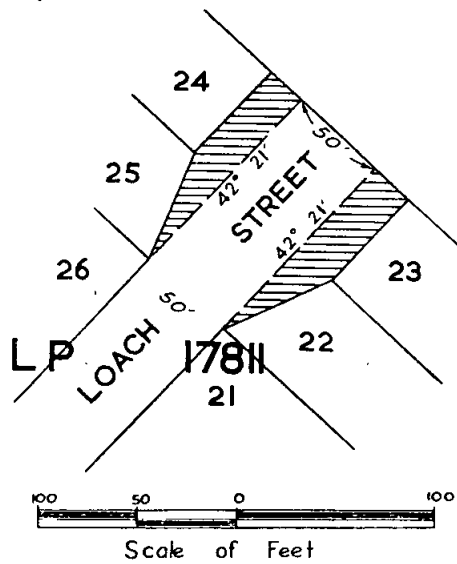

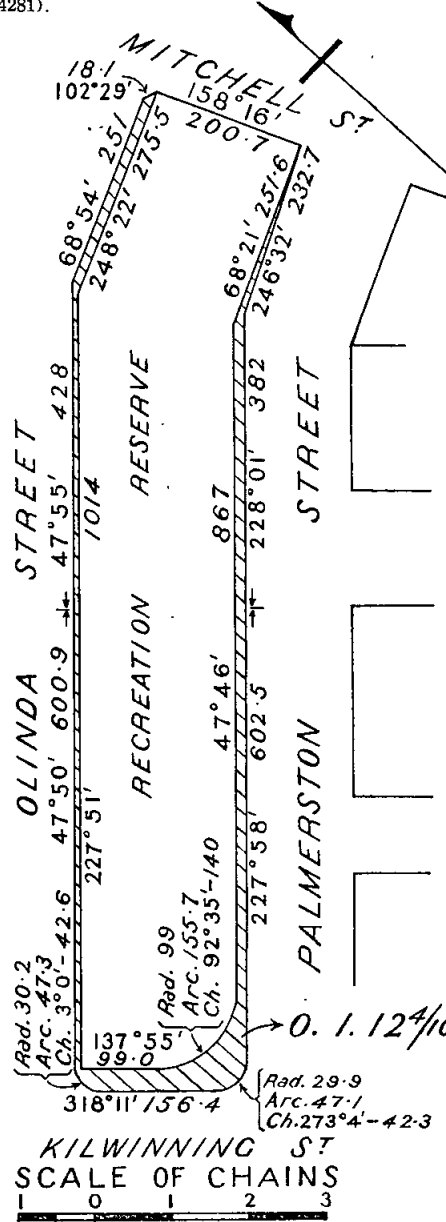
