Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 435.

TOBACCO, CIGARETTES, AND CIGARETTE PAPERS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 435.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 396 is hereby revoked.

Definition and Interpretation.

- 3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears-
 - (a) "Area No. 1" means all that area of Victoria comprised within a radius of 50 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
 - (b) "Area No. 2" means all that area of Victoria not included in Area No. 1.

Maximum Prices—Tobacco, Cigarettes, and Cigarette Papers.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind or brand of tobacco, cigarettes, or cigarette papers specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail to be—
 - (a) In Area No. 1, the prices specified in that Schedule; and
 - (b) in Area No. 2, the prices specified in that Schedule, provided that in respect of packs of tobacco containing 2 ounces or more, an amount of One halfpenny may be added to the said price.

Maximum Prices—Tobacco and Cigarettes not Specified in the Schedule.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any kind or brand of tobacco and cigarettes not specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold by retail in Victoria to be—
 - (a) in respect of tobacco-1s. 1d. per oz.;
 - (b) in respect of cigarettes-1d. each.

Exhibition of Price List.

6. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail in Victoria any kind or brand of tobacco, cigarettes, or cigarette papers, the maximum retail selling price of which is fixed under the Prices Regulation Acts, shall exhibit and keep exhibited in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, a notice or notices setting forth the maximum retail prices fixed by this Order for the sale by him by retail of such tobacco, cigarettes, or cigarette papers. Such notice or notices shall be exhibited in such a place or places in the trader's place of business and be prepared in such a manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at the trader's place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which any tobacco, cigarettes, or cigarette papers specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by retail in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Regulation Acts. PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 436.

BOARD AND LODGING.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 436.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 2426, as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 2486, made under the Commonwealth National Security (Prices) Regulations is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

- 3. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-
 - "Board and lodging" means-
 - (a) board;
 - (b) lodging; or
 - (c) board and lodging;
 - "Prescribed date" means, in relation to the supply by any person of any kind of board and lodging, the First day of January, 1951, or if substantially the same kind of board and lodging was not supplied by that person on that date, the last preceding date upon which substantially the same kind of board and lodging was supplied by that person;
 - "Prevailing rate" means, in relation to the supply of any kind of board and lodging by any person, the rate at which substantially the same kind of board and lodging was supplied by that person on the prescribed date.

Maximum Rate—Board and lodging of a kind supplied on the prescribed date.

4. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply any board and lodging of substantially the same kind as board and lodging supplied by that person on the prescribed date to be the prevailing rate for the supply of that kind of board and lodging by that person.

Maximum rates—Board and lodging of a kind different from that supplied on the prescribed date.

- 5. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which any person may supply board and lodging—
 - (a) where on the prescribed date that person did not supply any board and lodging; or
 - (b) which is not of substantially the same kind as board and lodging supplied by that person on the prescribed date—

to be such rate as, after application by that person, is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person or, until such rate has been fixed by notice as aforesaid, the following rates—

- (i) in respect of any kind of full board and lodging, including the supply of not less than 21 meals weekly—the rate of
 42s. per week, or 6s. per day;
- (ii) in respect of any kind of lodging with any meals—the rate of 17s. 6d. per week, or 2s. 6d. per day plus 1s. 3d. for each meal; and
- (iii) in respect of any kind of lodging—the rate of 17s. 6d. per week, or 2s. 6d. per day.

Transfer of business or assets thereof-Transferees' Maximum rates.

6. If any boarding house, lodging house or hotel business or the assets thereof are sold or otherwise transferred after the first day of January, 1951, and the transferee carries on such business, or carries on a boarding house, lodging house or hotel on the same premises, then, notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum rate at which the transferee may supply board and lodging of any kind, to be the maximum rate fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the supply of that kind of board and lodging by the transferor.

5

Fixation of Maximum Rates by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, I declare that the maximum rate at which any kind of board and lodging specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such rate as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Exhibition of Maximum Rates.

- 8. (1) Every person who supplies any board and lodging shall exhibit and keep exhibited in a prominent position on the premises in which such board and lodging is supplied, a notice setting forth particulars of the maximum rates fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the supply by him of any kind of board and lodging.
- (2) Any such notice shall be exhibited and kept exhibited in such a manner and shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person being supplied with board and lodging on those premises or to any person contemplating being so supplied.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, where the maximum rate for the supply by any person of any kind of board and lodging has been fixed by notice in writing given or deemed to have been given under the provisions of this Order, that person shall exhibit and keep exhibited that notice in writing or a true copy thereof in such a manner as to be easily legible to any person being supplied with board and lodging on the premises to which the notice in writing relates or to any person contemplating being so supplied.

This clause shall not apply to any person who accommodates no more than four boarders or lodgers.

9. All Notices in Writing issued prior to the making of this Order which fix or purport to fix rates for the supply of any kind of board and lodging and which have not been specifically revoked prior to the date on which this Order takes effect, shall be deemed to have been given under the provisions of this Order.

 - than 20 ounces; "20-oz. tin" means any tin holding 20 ounces or more but less than 30 ounces;
 - "30-oz, tin" means any tin holding 30 ounces or more but less than 4 pounds;
 - "4-lb, tin" means any tin holding 4 pounds or more but less than 6½ pounds;
 - "6½-lb. tin" means any tin holding 6½ pounds or more but less
 - than 7 pounds;
 "7-lb. tin" means any tin holding 7 pounds or more.

Maximum Prices.

3. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which canned fruits of any of the descriptions specified in the Schedule to this Order may be sold to wholesalers or to retailers to be the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Provided that in respect of all sales where payment by the purchaser is made within seven days of the receipt of the invoice, a discount of 5 per cent. shall be allowed from the maximum prices specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Delivery of Invoice.

- 4. Any person who sells any canned fruits of any of the descriptions specified in the Schedule to this Order shall deliver with such canned fruit an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—
 - (i) Name and address of the seller;
 - (ii) Name and address of the purchaser;
 - (iii) Date of sale;
 - (iv) The quantity and description of the canned fruit contained in the sale;
 - (v) Price per unit charged;
 - (vi) Total price charged; and
 - (vii) That if payment is made within seven days, a discount of 5 per cent. is allowable.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which canned fruit, a maximum price for the sale of which is fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order and which is specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause, may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

 - (b) where such tea was sold in packages exceeding 14 lb. net weight, such packages being unopened original packages . . 3s. 24d. per lb.

- (c) where such tea was sold in packages exceeding 14 lb. net weight, such packages not being unopened original packages . . . 3s. 44d. per lb.
- "Second Grade Tea" means any tea other than First grade tea.
- "The Metropolitan Area" means that area enclosed in the circumference of a circle having as its centre the General Post Office, Spencer-street, Melbourne, and having a radius of 25 miles therefrom.

APPRENTICESHIP.

5. (a) Youths shall not be engaged in the following occupations except under indentures of apprenticeship for the periods and subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed:—

Patternmaking, electrical fitting, engineering fitting and turning, first and second class engineering machining, first-class welding, engineering blacksmithing, jobbing moulding and/or coremaking, sheet metal (first-class bench work) motor mechanic.

(b) In the trades immediately hereinafter mentioned the proportion of apprentices which may be taken by any employer shall be as follows:—

Mechanical engineering-one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.

mechanical engineering—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen. Electrical mechanic—one apprentice for every 2, or fraction of 3, tradesmen. Patternmaking—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen. Smithing—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen. Moulding—one apprentice for every 2, or fraction of 2, tradesmen.

- (c) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and in ascertaining such proportion, an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.
 - (i) The period of apprenticeship shall be as follows:-
 - If the apprentice when articled is under the age of 17 years, five years; if over the age of 17 years, four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.
 - (ii) An employer especially qualified to teach apprentices may, with the consent of the Secretary for Labour, or of the State Apprenticeship Commission, employ a greater proportion of apprentices to tradesmen than hereinbefore specified.
 - (iii) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and, if apprenticed, such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship.
 - (iv) Until further order, any contract of apprenticeship hereafter made may contain the following provision:-
 - If through lack of orders or through financial difficulties, the employer is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice, and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may with the concurrence of the apprentice and his guardian be suspended for a period agreed upon, or if no such agreement is arrived at, may be cancelled by the employer. The onus of proof of circumstances justifying such cancellation shall be on the employer. employer.

This clause shall not apply to apprenticeship controlled by the State Apprenticeship Commission, but such Commission shall be free to adopt such schemes for suspension or cancellation of indentures as it may deem reasonable.

The sum of 4s. per week shall be added to the above rates in the case of apprentice patternmakers.

The total wages of apprentices shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

An employee who is under 21 years of age on the expiration of his apprenticeship and thereafter works as a minor in the occupation to which he has been apprenticed shall be paid at not less than the adult rate prescribed for that classification.

- (vi) The ordinary hours of employment of apprentices shall be the same in each workshop as those of journeymen in the trade the apprentice is learning.
- . (vii) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be liable to work overtime unless he so desires.
- (viii) No apprentice shall work under any system of payment by results.
- (ix) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his 22nd birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.
- (x) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in the Determination for the trade, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served.
- (xi) No employer shall, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device, receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.
- (xii) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.
- (xiii) Apprentices shall be entitled to annual leave and sick leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 10x and 14x of this Determination respectively.

- (vi) Waiting Time.—An employee who is required to attend for work and is kept waiting to commence work by instructions of the employer or his representative, shall be paid at his ordinary rate of pay for the time he is so kept waiting.

Where the existing indentures are inconsistent with indentures herein prescribed the existing indentures shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.

Time Served in any Group to Count.

- (i) (i) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Determination the time served by an apprentice or improver in any occupation for which a classification is prescribed by this Determination in any group of this Determination shall be counted as experience for the purpose of apprenticeship indentures or the continuance of improvership, both as regards wages and the term to be served in respect of the continuation of the employment of such apprentice or improver in the occupation covered by such classification.

Prohibition of Employment of Males over Seventeen Years Entering any Section of the Industry.

(c) No male (other than one to be employed at order cutting) who is over the age of seventeen years shall enter any section of the industry for which provision is made in this Determination for compulsory apprenticeship according to the Schedule referred to in the indenture of apprenticeship prescribed by this Determination.

Female Improvers over Eighteen Years of Age may be Employed.

(d) Any female without previous experience who has attained the age of eighteen years may be employed in any section of the industry as an improver, and shall be paid at least the minimum rate prescribed by this Determination for a female of

Persons Eligible for Apprenticeship.

(e) All apprentices shall be indentured in accordance with the form of indenture prescribed by the Board on the 23rd May, 1950, provided that the said person may serve an employer as a probationer for a period not exceeding three months. During the said three months, he or she shall be paid at least the minimum rates prescribed by this Determination for the first six months of apprenticeship. If the probationer becomes indentured, his or her indentures shall be taken to have commenced from the commencement-of the period of probation.

Indenture Completed.

'(f) It shall be the duty of the employer to see that the form of indenture of any apprentice is duly completed and to deliver to the apprentice a complete original copy thereof.

Completion of Apprenticeship.

(g) In the event of the employer to whom an apprentice is bound ceasing to carry on business, such apprentice may be bound to another employer for the remainder of the term to be served, provided that if such apprentice be over the age of seventeen years at the time of the original employer ceasing to carry on business, such apprentice may complete the time to be served as an improver.

Apprentices in any Group of the Industry already Bound.

(h) Within three months of the commencement of this Determination every employer shall, in respect of male or female apprentices already indentured, be bound to observe the full terms of the indentures prescribed by this Determination as to the term of apprenticeship, hours, wages, overtime, and all other conditions. Where the existing indentures are inconsistent with indentures herein prescribed, the existing indentures shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.

Time Served in any Group to Count.

- (i) (i) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Determination the time served by an apprentice or improver in any occupation for which a classification is prescribed by this Determination in any group of this Determination shall be counted as experience for the purpose of apprenticeship indentures or the continuance of improvership, both as regards wages and the term to be served in respect of the continuation of the employment of such apprentice or improver in the occupation covered by such classification.
- '(ii) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Determination, any person who, at the date of the coming into force of this Determination, is employed in the industry and whose engagement or continued employment as an improver is by this Determination forbidden shall be entitled to be employed and shall be paid the scale of wages prescribed for an apprentice or improver of like experience.

Prohibition of Employment of New Male and Female Improvers in Group A.

(j) After the commencement of this Determination no male or female in Group A shall-

(i) be engaged to work as an improver in any such section of the industry; or (ii) be transferred from one section to another such section to work there as an improver; or (iii) be employed as an improver in any such section.

TRADESMEN IN LARGE POWER HOUSES.

Tradesmen and/or welders, and their assistants employed in large operating power houses (i.e., power houses developing more than 8,000 kilowatts), other than those not on the regular staff, engaged on new construction work, shall be paid 6s. per week extra, and other unapprenticed juniors 3s. per week extra; such amount shall be deemed to include all special rates prescribed in clause 4.

This allowance shall continue to be payable to tradesmen attached to the staffs of such power houses while carrying out repairs or maintenance in rotary convertor sub-stations which are in regular operation.

Provided that an employee detailed to act as leading hand in charge of two other adult employees working away from power station or workshop (one of whom is of the same classification as himself) shall be paid 6s. per week extra.

FEMALES AND UNAPPRENTICED MALE JUNIORS.

3. (a) Subject to the exceptions hereinaiter provided, the minimum rates of wage for adult and junior females employed in manufacturing and assembling of small parts of electrical and other machinery and appliances, and in core making, in which females were employed on the 15th May, 1935, and for unapprenticed male juniors employed in occupations for which apprenticeship is not provided by this Determination, shall be as follows:—

BUILDERS' LABOURERS BOARD.

Clause 1 of Part I., and Clause 1 of Part II. of the Determination published in Government Gazette No. 504 of the 20th June, 1952, shall be replaced by the following Clauses:—

PART 1.

This part applies only in respect of the employment of persons on the construction renovation repair alteration or demolition of buildings performed on the site thereof, and in particular it shall have no application to employment by an employer in any industry where the work performed by the employee is subsidiary or auxiliary to the chief and principal purpose and business of such industry.

1. (a) For skilled builders' labourers-7s. per hour.

For ordinary builders' labourers-6s. 9d. per hour.

(Note.—To the above amounts must be added any allowance payable in accordance with clause 6 of this

- (b) "Builders' labourer—skilled" means an employee engaged upon the work of steel and/or aluminium alloy structural erector (on steel and/or aluminium alloy frame buildings) or engaged in the erection of prefabricated aluminium alloy buildings, gear hand, rigger, pile driver, tackle hand, gantry hand, or crane hand, dogman, scaffolder, powder monkey, drainer, demolisher, jack hammerman, winch or hoist driver or mixer driver, steel and/or bar bender bending to plan or pattern.
- (c) "Builders' Labourer-ordinary" means an employee engaged under this Determination in occupations other than those set out in sub-clause (b) of this clause.

Definition.

(d) "Federation" means the Australian Builders' Labourers' Federation.

PART II.

This Part applies to the employment of persons employed as builders' labourers in mixed industry as defined in clause 12 of

Provided that where an employee is engaged on work other than "maintenance" as defined in clause 12 of this Part, the above-stated wage rates shall be increased by an additional amount at the rate of 2s. 6d. per week when so employed. (b) An employee whose employment is terminated by the employer within six months of his employment for any cause other than for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty or misconduct, shall on such termination be entitled to be paid for such work performed by him an additional amount at the rate of 3s. per week.
