PROCLAMATION

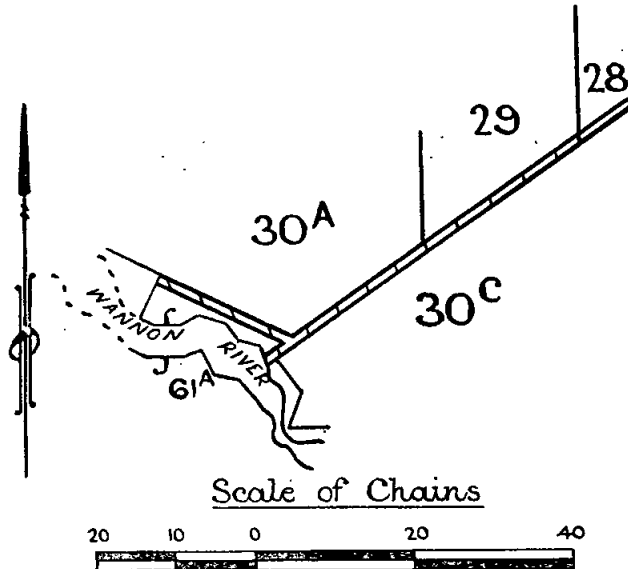

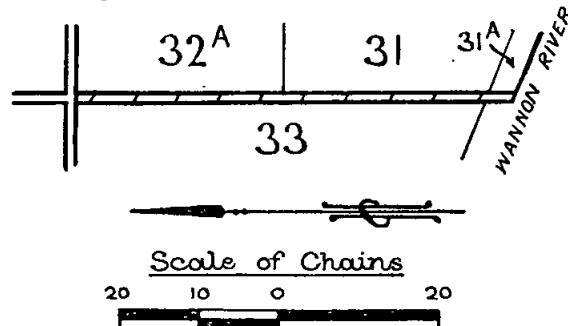

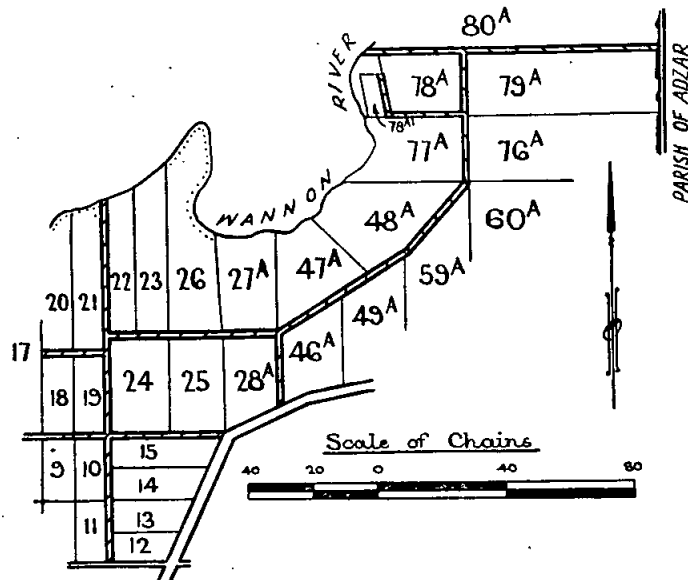
Parish of Moutajup, County of Dundas, being the roads indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(M.421⁽²⁾) (D.3144).



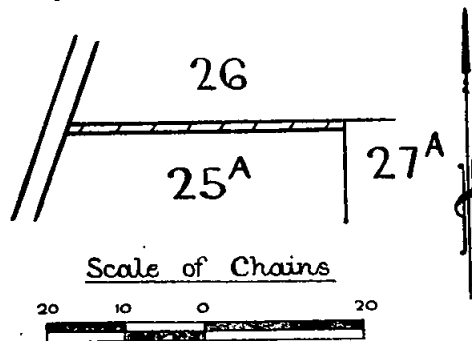
Parish of Moutajup, County of Dundas, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(M.421⁽²⁾) (D.3144).



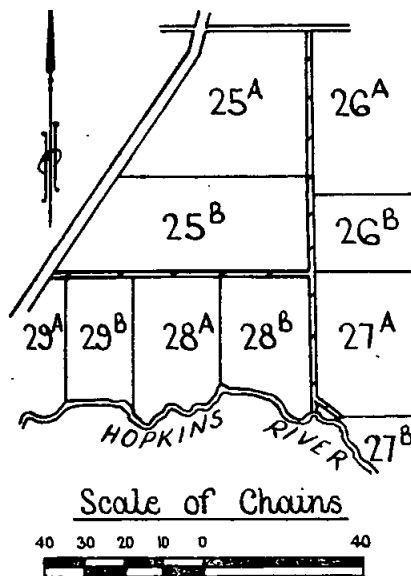
Parish of Dunkeld, County of Villiers, being the roads indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(D.142⁽¹⁾) (D.3144).

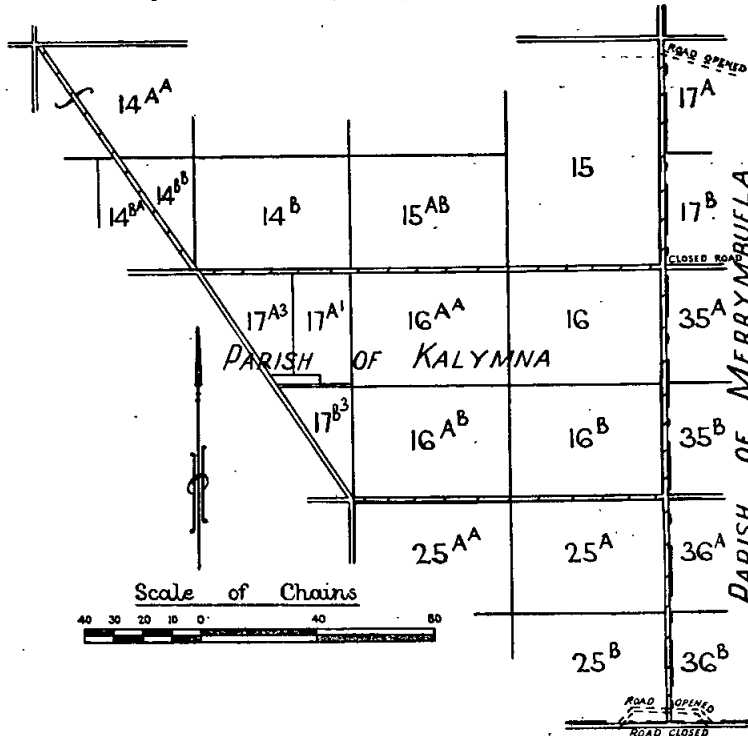

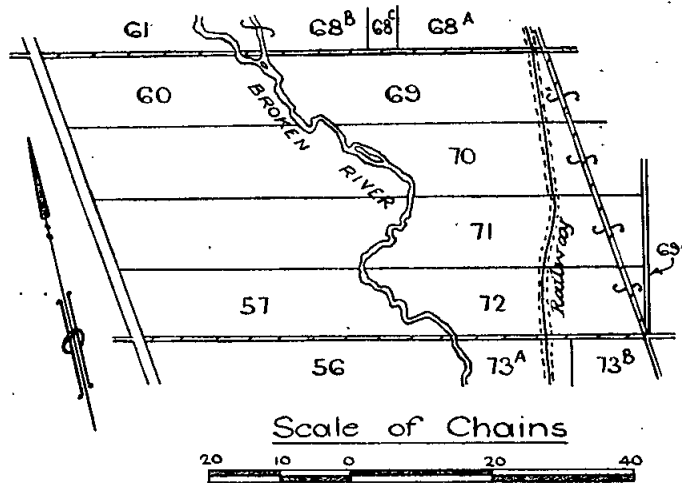

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 900 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1946* provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town), extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas the operation of the said Regulations was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of Morwell by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th January, 1946:

And whereas the operation of the said Regulations was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th September, 1948:

And whereas the Councils of the Shires of Morwell and Tambo have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to further parts of the municipal districts of such municipalities:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1946* to those parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Morwell to which the operation of the Regulations has not previously been extended, and to those parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Tambo described hereunder:—

- (1) All that piece of land commencing at Maringa Creek on the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 5A, Parish of Colquhoun; thence northerly along said boundary to the angle in the road in Crown allotment 103; thence easterly along the southern boundaries of Crown allotments 103, 102A, and 102B; thence northerly to the southern corner of Crown allotment 101H; thence north-easterly along the boundary of Crown allotment 101H to a point on the eastern side of the Princes Highway; thence north-westerly along the boundary of Crown allotment 90 to the western corner of said Crown allotment; thence north-easterly and easterly along the northern boundaries of Crown allotments 90, 85A, and 85 to a point on the western coast of the north arm opposite said northern boundary of Crown allotment 85; thence southerly, south-westerly, and westerly along the coast lines of the north arm and Maringa Creek to the commencing point, but excluding the Township of Kalimna; and
- (2) all that piece of land commencing at a point on the eastern coast of the north arm opposite the north-west corner of Crown allotment 5, section A, Parish of Colquhoun; thence north-easterly along the northern boundaries of Crown allotments 5, 4, 3, and 1, section A, to the north-east corner of Crown allotment 1, section A; thence in a straight line across Crown allotment 124 to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 126; thence generally easterly along the northern boundaries of Crown allotments 126 and 30A in the Parish of Colquhoun, and the northern boundaries of Crown allotments 31, 37, and 38 in the Township of Cunninghame, to a point on the western boundary of Crown allotment 17 opposite said northern boundaries; thence in a clockwise direction around the boundaries of the Township of Cunninghame to the coastline of Cunninghame Arm; thence south-westerly along the coastline of Cunninghame Arm to the North Arm; thence generally north-easterly and northerly along the coastline of the North Arm to the commencing point, but excluding the Township of Lakes Entrance;
- (3) all that land in the Township of Bruthen, commencing on the bank of the Tambo River at the south-east corner of Crown allotment J; thence north-westerly along the western boundaries of Crown allotments 1 and 24; thence north-easterly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 24 to the south-west corner of Crown allotment 25A; thence north-westerly along the western

boundary of Crown allotment 25A; thence north-easterly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 25A produced to the western boundary of Crown allotment 27; thence northerly along the western boundary of Crown allotment 27 to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 27; thence north-easterly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 27; thence north-westerly along the western boundary of Crown allotment 27A to the north-west corner of said allotment; thence north-easterly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 27A to the south-west corner of Crown allotment 27B; thence northerly along the western boundary of Crown allotment 27B; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Crown allotment 27B; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 27B to a point opposite the northern boundary of section A; thence easterly along the northern boundary of section A to the north-east corner of Crown allotment 15, section A; thence southerly and south-westerly along the eastern boundaries of Crown allotments 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 34, 35, 36, 37, and 38, section A, and Crown allotments 24A¹ and 24A to the south-east corner of Crown allotment 24A; thence in a straight line to the Tambo River at the most southern point of Crown allotment 30; thence generally westerly along the bank of the Tambo River to the commencing point, but excluding the Township of Bruthen.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the above-mentioned parts of the municipal districts of the Shires of Morwell and Tambo on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 shall come into operation therein on the 13th day of November, 1952.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY—BOROUGH OF RINGWOOD.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1946* (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way, to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Ringwood has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the Borough, be so declared to be a public highway: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land described hereunder, being part of Crown allotment 20A, Parish of Ringwood, County of Mornington, shown as Leonard-street on plan of subdivision No. 11019, lodged at the Office of Titles, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

LEONARD-STREET.

Commencing at a point on the north side of Maroondah Highway, 740 ft. 3 in. north-easterly from the eastern intersection of the Government road shown as Rupert-street on lodged plan No. 11019; thence bounded by a line bearing 314 deg. 14 min. for a distance of 142 ft. 4½ in.; thence bearing 332 deg. 58 min. for a distance of 74 ft. 1 in.; thence bearing 314 deg. 14 min. for a distance of 849 ft. 10 in.; thence bearing 84 deg. 16 min. for a distance of 65 ft. 4 in.; thence bearing 134 deg. 14 min. for a distance of 811 ft. 0 in.; thence bearing 152 deg. 58 min. for a distance of 74 feet; thence bearing 134 deg. 14 min. for a distance of 134 feet back to the northerly building line of Maroondah Highway; thence south-westerly along the northern building line of Maroondah Highway for a distance of 50 feet to the commencing point.

NAGAMBIE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1952.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Two shillings (2s.) per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is fixed at (10,000) ten thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Acts has been commenced by the Council of the Shire of Mansfield (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), which hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all lands referred to in the Schedule, and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said lands, is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any building, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and, if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of section 12, sub-section 3, of the Act.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

7. Schedule of land affected:—All that piece of land within the Township of Jamieson and Parish of Jamieson commencing at a point on the Goulburn River where the south-east boundary of allotment 3 of section A abuts thereon; bounded thence north-easterly by the said allotment and a line to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section C; thence south-easterly and northerly by allotment 10A of section C to a point in line with the north side of the road forming the south boundaries of sections 17 and 16; thence south-easterly by a line and the north side of the said road, southerly by the east side of the road forming the western boundaries of sections 14 and 13, and westerly by the south side of the road forming the north boundaries of allotments 10c and 10b of section H, and south-westerly and southerly by the west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and a line to the north boundary of allotment 2 of section 5; thence westerly by that allotment, allotment 1, and a line bearing N. 77 deg. 5 min. W. to the Goulburn River aforesaid; and thence northerly by that river to the point of commencement.

EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD REGULATIONS
AMENDED.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Marketing of Primary Products Acts, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board, doth hereby amend the Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board Regulations 1941 made on the 13th May, 1941, as amended on the 16th July, 1946, the 5th September, 1950, the 13th September, 1950, and the 9th October, 1951, as follows (that is to say):—

In Regulation 2 there shall be added the following definition:—

“ ‘ Preserved eggs ’ mean eggs which have been subjected to any preservative treatment other than artificial cooling.”

In Regulation 19, paragraph (iii) shall be deleted and the following paragraph substituted in lieu thereof:—

“ (iii) Payments to producers in respect of eggs delivered to the Board shall be made by cheque, or in such cases as the Board directs, by cash. If made by cheque, the cheque shall be signed by the Secretary or other officer authorized by the Board.”

Regulation 43 and Form 6 of the Schedule shall be deleted and the following Regulation substituted in lieu thereof:—

“ 43. Every producer owning or controlling or having upon his premises more than 40 adult female domesticated fowls shall register such flock with the Board, and every producer who, by reason of the purchase or other acquisition by him, becomes the owner or controller of, or permits to be held upon his premises more than 40 adult female domesticated fowls shall, by notice in writing, inform the Board of such purchase or other acquisition within fourteen days thereof; and every producer who, by reason of the sale or other disposition by him, ceases to be the owner or controller of, or to have upon his premises more than 40 adult female domesticated fowls shall, by notice in writing, inform the Board of such sale or other disposition within fourteen days thereof.”

Regulation 45 shall be deleted and the following Regulation substituted in lieu thereof:—

“ 45. No person shall without the consent of the Board place or cause to be placed any eggs in any cold storage premises nor subject any eggs to any preservative treatment.

Provided that nothing in these Regulations shall prevent a person or owner of any eggs preserving a quantity of eggs not exceeding 30 dozen for his own domestic requirements.”

In Regulation 47, after paragraph (d) there shall be added the following additional paragraph:—

“ (e) No person shall without the consent of the Board by any process of manufacture or otherwise convert eggs into whole egg pulp or separate whites from the yolks thereof.”

Regulation 48 shall be deleted and the following sub-heading and Regulations substituted in lieu thereof:—

“ RETAILERS’ RETURNS.

48. The records required to be kept, in accordance with section 8 of the *Marketing of Primary Products (Egg and Egg Pulp) Act 1951*, by any person who sells or who offers to sell eggs by retail, shall be in or to the effect of Form 6 of the Schedule.

49. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds (£50).”

Resolution for Declaration of a Main Road under the

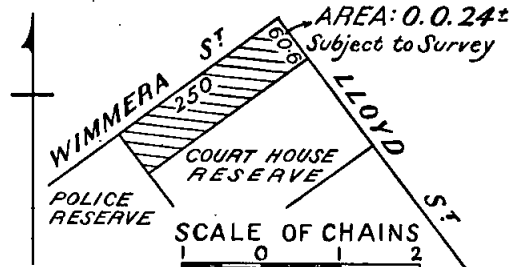

BY-LAW No. 83.

A By-law of the City of Collingwood, made under sections 197 and 769 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 83, for the care, protection, and management of public reserves, of which the management is vested in the council, and also lands, grounds, tree reserves, ornamental plantations, and other places within the

municipal district purchased or provided by the council and used as pleasure grounds, gardens, or places of public resort or recreation.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Collingwood, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

That By-law of the City of Collingwood, No. 54, shall be and is hereby repealed.

No persons shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in any of the said public reserves, lands, grounds, tree reserves, ornamental plantations, and other places, or throw stones or any missile, or commit any nuisance or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, paper, or any litter.

Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing in any of the said public reserves, lands, grounds, tree reserves, or ornamental plantations or other places any act of indecency shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the council or by a constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

No person shall play cricket or football or engage in any athletic sports in the public reserve, lands, grounds, tree reserves, ornamental plantations or other places without the permission, in writing, of the council first being obtained.

No person shall camp in the public reserves, lands, grounds, tree reserves, ornamental plantations and other places, nor erect therein any building or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles without the permission, in writing, of the council first being obtained.

No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the council shall ride or drive any bicycle, motor car, or other vehicle in any of the said public reserves, lands, grounds, tree reserves, ornamental plantations, or other places.

Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary hereto, shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
