PRICES REGULATION ACTS.
PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 460.
BLACK STEEL SHEETS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 460.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 407 is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
“Point of Delivery” means, in relation to the sale of black steel sheets, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such black steel sheets to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased such black steel sheets.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which black steel sheets may be sold by retail to be:—

The prices specified in the Schedule to this Order plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of such black steel sheets from the point of delivery to the retailer's place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which black steel sheets specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such prices as are fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

The maximum price at which sheets of a length exceeding 8 feet or of a width exceeding 3 feet may be sold shall be:—

The appropriate price fixed under this Order upon a sale of sheets of a like gauge and in a like quantity measuring 8 feet in length and 3 feet in width, plus—

- (a) where the length exceeds 8 feet but does not exceed 9 feet—£1 10s. per ton;
- (b) where the length exceeds 9 feet but does not exceed 10 feet—£2 per ton;
- (c) where the length exceeds 10 feet but does not exceed 12 feet—£3 per ton;
- (d) where the width exceeds 3 feet but does not exceed 3 feet 6 inches—£1 per ton;
- (e) where the width exceeds 3 feet 6 inches but does not exceed 4 feet 6 inches—£1 10s. per ton;
- (f) where the width exceeds 4 feet 6 inches but does not exceed 5 feet—£2 per ton;
- (g) where the width exceeds 5 feet but does not exceed 6 feet—£2 10s. per ton.

PROPORTION OF IMPROVERS.

One improver to every 25 or fraction of 25 workers receiving not less than the hourly rate herein prescribed for "all others".

Temporary workers shall be paid time and a half on the ordinary rates for work done during ordinary working hours. For work done outside those hours they shall receive ordinary overtime rates.

* The War Loading shall not be taken into account in the calculation of overtime and holiday rates.

NOTE.—The Wages Board has determined in accordance with section 25 (1) of the amended *Factories and Shops Act* 1934 that the trade is so unskilful that no person should be taken as an apprentice to the trade.

Clauses, other than clause 2, of the said Determination shall remain in force.
