PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 477.

ELECTRICAL STEEL SHEETS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 477.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 412 is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Point of Delivery” means, in relation to the sale of electrical steel sheets, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such electrical steel sheets to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased such electrical steel sheets.

Maximum Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which electrical steel sheets may be sold by retail to be—

The prices specified in the Schedule to this Order plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of such electrical steel sheets from the point of delivery to the retailer's place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which electrical steel sheets specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such prices as are fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PART 2.

(a) Where any steel sheets of a kind set out in Part 1 of this Schedule are insulated, the maximum price at which such sheets may be sold shall be the maximum price at which, under Part 1 of this Schedule, sheets of that description may be sold if they are not insulated, plus the sum of £1 5s. per ton.

(b) Where any steel sheets of a kind set out in Part 1 of this Schedule are pickled and insulated, the maximum price at which such sheets may be sold shall be the maximum price at which, under Part 1 of this Schedule, sheets of that description may be sold if they are not pickled and insulated, plus the sum of £10 10s. per ton.

(c) Where any steel sheets of a kind set out in Part 1 of this Schedule are second quality, the maximum price at which such sheets may be sold shall be the maximum price at which, under Part 1 of this Schedule, first-quality sheets of that description may be sold, less the sum of £2 per ton.

(d) The maximum price at which offcuts from any steel sheets of a kind set out in Part 1 of this Schedule may be sold shall be the maximum price at which, under the provisions of this Order, entire sheets of that kind may be sold less the sum of £10 per ton.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 478.

BRIQUETTES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 478.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 383 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

- (a) "Briquette" means a small brick consisting of compressed brown coal produced by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria;
- (b) "Melbourne Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne;
- (c) "Geelong Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of five miles from the principal post office at Geelong, Victoria, and includes that area comprised within a radius of five miles from the post office at Queenscliff, Victoria;

- (d) "Ballarat Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of five miles from the principal post office at Ballarat, Victoria;
- (e) "Bendigo Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of five miles from the principal post office at Bendigo, Victoria;
- (f) "cwt." means a weight of 112 lb. avoirdupois;
- (g) "ton" means a weight of 2,240 lb. avoirdupois.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail—Specified Areas.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which briquettes may be sold by retail in the areas specified in the Schedule to this Order to be—

- (a) where delivery is made to the purchaser's premises in the area specified—the prices specified opposite such area in the Schedule;
- (b) where delivery is not made to the purchaser's premises in the area specified—the prices specified opposite such area in the Schedule less an amount in each case calculated at the rate of 3d. per cwt.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail—Other Areas.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which briquettes may be sold by retail in areas outside of the areas specified in the Schedule to this Order, to be—

- (a) where delivery is made by the retailer into the purchaser's premises, the sum of—
- (i) the purchase price (after the amount of any rebate has been deducted) paid or payable by the retailer for the briquettes free on rails at Yallourn Briquette Factory; and
 - (ii) the cost of rail freight actually incurred by the retailer in respect of the transport of the briquettes by rail from Yallourn to the railway siding nearest the retailers place of business; plus
 - (iii) in respect of *Sales to Domestic Consumers*, an amount not in excess of £2 13s. per ton weight; or
 - (iv) in respect of *Sales to Consumers other than Domestic Consumers*, an amount not in excess of £1 13s. 10d. per ton weight;
- (b) where delivery is not made to the purchaser's premises—the appropriate price fixed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) of this clause, less an amount calculated at the rate of three pence (3d.) per cwt.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which briquettes specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by retail in Victoria by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

WIRE NETTING, FENCING WIRE, BALING WIRE—AUSTRALIAN
MANUFACTURE—SALES BY RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 479.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 415 as amended by Prices Regulation Order No. 455 is hereby revoked.

Definition.

3. "Point of Delivery" means, in relation to the sale of wire netting, fencing wire, and baling wire, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such wire netting, fencing wire, or baling wire to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased such wire netting, fencing wire, and baling wire.

Maximum Prices—Sales by Retail.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which wire netting, fencing wire, or baling wire may be sold by retail to be the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order, plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of such wire netting, fencing wire, and baling wire, from the point of delivery to the retailer's place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which wire netting, fencing wire, or baling wire specified in a Notice in Writing given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such prices as are fixed by the Commissioner by Notice in Writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 480.

PETROLEUM AND SHALE PRODUCTS—MOTOR SPIRIT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 480.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 402 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Motor Spirit” means a liquid petroleum or shale product normally marketed for use as fuel in internal combustion engines with spark ignition, excluding power kerosene, but including such motor spirit blended with distillate from coal products or with alcohol;

“Metropolitan Area” includes all that area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

Maximum Price.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which motor spirit may be sold by retail to be—

(a) in the Metropolitan Area—Three shillings and six pence halfpenny per gallon;

(b) outside the Metropolitan Area—the sum of the purchase price paid or payable to the wholesale seller plus Three pence three farthings per gallon. Provided that, where the maximum price so calculated results in a price not exactly divisible by One halfpenny the maximum price may be determined at the nearest upward halfpenny.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which motor spirit specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 481.

NEW SEASON'S WASHED POTATOES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. (1) This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 481.
(2) Nothing contained in this Order shall affect the operation of Prices Regulation Order No. 474.

Definitions.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intentions appears—

“Primary Wholesaler” in relation to the sale of new season's washed potatoes means a person who purchases new season's washed potatoes for the purpose of resale to another wholesaler whose normal business is to sell potatoes by wholesale.

“Secondary Wholesaler” in relation to the sale of new season's washed potatoes means a person who purchases new season's washed potatoes from a primary wholesaler for the purpose of resale.

"Ton" means a long ton of 2,240 lb. or a quantity of fifteen bags of new season's washed potatoes each containing not less than 149 lb. weight or 40 cases each containing not less than 56 lb. weight.

"Lb." means pound avoirdupois or pounds avoirdupois as the case requires.

"Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

"Point of Delivery" means in relation to the sale of new season's washed potatoes, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such new season's washed potatoes to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased them.

Sales by Growers.

3. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which new season's washed potatoes may be sold by growers to be £45 per ton or £1 2s. 6d. per case.

Sales by Primary Wholesalers.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which new season's washed potatoes may be sold by primary wholesalers to secondary wholesalers to be £46 per ton.

(2) Nothing in either clause 5 or 6 of this Order shall apply to sales by primary wholesalers to secondary wholesalers.

Sales by Wholesale—Metropolitan Area.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which new season's washed potatoes may be sold by wholesale in the Metropolitan Area to be—

(a) where the seller delivers the new season's washed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market, £47 12s. 6d. per ton;

(b) where the seller delivers the new season's washed potatoes into the buyer's shop, £48 5s. per ton.

Sales by Wholesale Outside Metropolitan Area.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which new season's washed potatoes may be sold by wholesale other than in the Metropolitan Area to be—

(1) where such new season's washed potatoes have been purchased in the Metropolitan Area the sum of the following:—

(a) Purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £46 per ton, whichever is the lesser;

(b) Cost of rail transport from Cowper-street railway siding to the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises or place of business;

(c) A margin—

(i) where the seller delivers the new season's washed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business, of £1 12s. 6d. per ton; or

(ii) where the seller delivers the new season's washed potatoes into the buyer's shop, of £2 5s. per ton.

(2) where such new season's washed potatoes have been purchased outside the Metropolitan Area, the sum of the following:—

(a) An amount calculated at the rate of £46 per ton less the usual cost of transporting such potatoes by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises to Cowper-street railway siding, plus the usual cost of transporting such new season's washed potatoes by rail from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises to the railway station or siding nearest the purchaser's premises or place of business;

(b) a margin—

(i) where the seller delivers the new season's washed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business, of £1 12s. 6d. per ton; or

(ii) where the seller delivers the new season's washed potatoes into the buyer's shop, of £2 5s. per ton.

Sales by the Case.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which new season's washed potatoes may be sold by the case in Victoria to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of 56 lb. of new season's washed potatoes or the maximum price so fixed for the sale of the weight of new season's washed potatoes actually contained in the case, whichever is the lesser.

Sales by the Bag.

8. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which new season's washed potatoes may be sold by the bag in Victoria to be the maximum price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order for the sale of 149 lb. of new season's washed potatoes or the maximum price so fixed for the sale of the weight of new season's washed potatoes actually contained in the bag, whichever is the lesser.

Maximum Price—Sales by Retail.

9. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which new season's washed potatoes may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be six pence per lb.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which new season's washed potatoes may be sold by retail outside the Metropolitan Area to be the price fixed in the foregoing provisions of this Order for such sale in the Metropolitan Area, plus the charges properly incurred in transporting such new season's washed potatoes from the point of purchase by the retailer to such retailer's shop or place of business, but in no case shall such maximum price exceed six pence half-penny per lb.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

10. (1) Any person who sells or has for sale by retail new season's washed potatoes shall attach to or display, with those new season's washed potatoes, a ticket or label setting forth the maximum retail selling price fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those new season's washed potatoes.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any new season's washed potatoes shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those new season's washed potatoes and so as to be properly associated with such new season's washed potatoes.

Delivery of Invoices.

11. Any person who sells by wholesale new season's washed potatoes shall deliver with such new season's washed potatoes an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (a) Name and address of seller;
- (b) Name and address of purchaser;
- (c) Date of Sale;
- (d) The point of delivery to the purchaser, the weight of the new season's washed potatoes sold, number of bags or cases, as the case may be, and the price per unit of such new season's washed potatoes; and
- (e) Total price of such new season's washed potatoes.

Records.

12. Any person who sells any new season's washed potatoes shall keep and preserve any invoice or docket received by him in relation to such new season's washed potatoes and shall keep a record in respect of the purchase of such new season's washed potatoes showing—

- (a) the name and address of supplier;
- (b) the date of the invoice or docket received by him in relation to such new season's washed potatoes;
- (c) the quantity purchased and the price thereof;
- (d) the point of delivery; and
- (e) transport costs properly attributable to the transport of such new season's washed potatoes from the point of delivery to his place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

13. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any new season's washed potatoes specified in a Notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 482.

SEED POTATOES.

I IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 482.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 450 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Approved seed potatoes” means potatoes approved as suitable for seed by a duly authorized officer of the State Department of Agriculture.

“Certified seed potatoes” means potatoes accepted by a duly authorized officer of the State Department of Agriculture as certified seed potatoes.

“Primary wholesaler” in relation to the sale of seed potatoes means a person who purchases seed potatoes for the purpose of resale to another wholesaler whose normal business is to sell seed potatoes by wholesale.

“Secondary wholesaler” in relation to the sale of seed potatoes means a person who purchases seed potatoes from a primary wholesaler for the purpose of resale.

“By wholesale” means and refers to a sale of seed potatoes in lots of one bag or more.

“Ton” means a long ton of 2,240 lb. or a quantity of fifteen bags of seed potatoes each containing not less than 149 lb. weight.

“Lb.” means pound avoirdupois or pounds avoirdupois as the case requires.

“Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

“Point of delivery” means, in relation to the sale of seed potatoes, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such seed potatoes to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased them.

“Cost of transport” means, in relation to the transport of seed potatoes, cost of transport by rail (or, if rail transport is not available, any other service which may be available), but does not include any cost of transport which is not recorded on an invoice delivered by the seller, or in the case of sales by retail, on an invoice delivered to the retail seller.

“Potato Marketing Board” means the Potato Marketing Board constituted under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* of the State of Victoria.

Sales by Growers.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by growers to be—

- (1) in respect of approved seed potatoes—

(a) at the point of production, £24 per ton;

(b) at places other than the point of production, £24 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale;

- (2) in respect of certified seed potatoes—

(a) at the point of production, £27 per ton;

(b) at places other than the point of production, £27 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale;

- (3) in respect of seed potatoes other than approved or certified seed potatoes—

(a) at the point of production, £23 per ton;

(b) at places other than the point of production, £23 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.

Sales by the Potato Marketing Board.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by the Potato Marketing Board to be—

- (1) in respect of approved seed potatoes—
 - (a) at the point of production, £25 per ton ;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £25 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale ;
- (2) in respect of certified seed potatoes—
 - (a) at the point of production, £28 per ton ;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £28 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale ;
- (3) in respect of seed potatoes other than approved or certified seed potatoes—
 - (a) at the point of production, £23 per ton ;
 - (b) at places other than the point of production, £23 per ton, plus properly incurred cost of transport from the point of production to the place of sale.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by wholesale to be as follows :—

- (1) By primary wholesaler, Cowper-street :—
 - (a) in respect of approved seed potatoes, the sum of the following :—
 - (i) The purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £25 per ton, whichever is the lesser ;
 - (ii) Cost of rail transport from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business to Cowper-street railway siding.
 - (b) In respect of certified seed potatoes, the sum of the following :—
 - (i) The purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £28 per ton, whichever is the lesser ;
 - (ii) Cost of rail transport from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business to Cowper-street railway siding.
 - (c) In respect of seed potatoes other than approved or certified seed potatoes, the sum of the following :—
 - (i) The purchase price paid or payable or an amount calculated at the rate of £23 per ton, whichever is the lesser ;
 - (ii) Cost of rail transport from the railway station or siding nearest the seller's premises or place of business to Cowper-street railway siding.
- (2) By secondary wholesaler :—
 - (a) In respect of approved seed potatoes—
 - (i) where the seller delivers the approved seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store, £26 10s. per ton ;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the approved seed potatoes into the buyer's shop, £27 2s. 6d. per ton.
 - (b) In respect of certified seed potatoes—
 - (i) where the seller delivers the certified seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store, £29 10s. per ton ;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the certified seed potatoes into the buyer's shop, £30 2s. 6d. per ton.
 - (c) In respect of seed potatoes other than approved or certified seed potatoes—
 - (i) where the seller delivers the seed potatoes to the purchaser at the seller's store, £24 10s. per ton ;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the seed potatoes into the buyer's shop, £25 2s. 6d. per ton.

Sales by Retail.

7. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area to be—

- (a) in respect of approved seed potatoes—4d. per lb. ;
- (b) in respect of certified seed potatoes—4½d. per lb. ;
- (c) in respect of seed potatoes—3½d. per lb.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which seed potatoes may be sold by retail outside the Metropolitan Area to be the prices fixed in the foregoing provisions of this Order for such sales in the Metropolitan Area, plus the charges properly incurred in transporting such seed potatoes from the point of delivery to the retailer to such retailer's shop or place of business, but in no case shall such maximum price exceed—

- (a) in respect of approved seed potatoes—4½d. per lb. ;
- (b) in respect of certified seed potatoes—5d. per lb. ;
- (c) in respect of seed potatoes—4d. per lb.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

8. (1) Any person who sells or has for sale by retail seed potatoes shall attach to or display with those seed potatoes a ticket or label setting forth the maximum retail selling price fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those seed potatoes.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any seed potatoes shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those seed potatoes and so as to be properly associated with such seed potatoes.

Delivery of Invoices.

9. Any person who sells by wholesale seed potatoes shall deliver with such seed potatoes an invoice or docket containing the following particulars :—

- (a) Name and address of seller.
- (b) Name and address of purchaser ;
- (c) Date of sale ;
- (d) The point of delivery to the purchaser, the weight of the seed potatoes sold, number of bags, and price per unit of such seed potatoes ; and
- (e) Total price of such seed potatoes.

Records.

10. Any person who sells any seed potatoes shall keep and preserve any invoice or docket received by him in relation to such seed potatoes, and shall keep a record in respect of the purchase of such seed potatoes showing—

- (a) the name and address of supplier ;
- (b) the date of the invoice or docket received by him in relation to such seed potatoes ;
- (c) the quantity purchased and the price thereof ;
- (d) the point of delivery ; and
- (e) transport costs properly attributable to the transport of such seed potatoes from the point of delivery to his place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any seed potatoes specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
