Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 602.

WIRE NETTING, FENCING WIRE, BALING WIRE, BARBED WIRE—
AUSTRALIAN MANUFACTURE.—SALES BY RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 602.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 514 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. "Point of Delivery" means, in relation to the sale of wire netting, fencing wire, baling wire, and barbed wire, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such wire netting, fencing wire, baling wire, or barbed wire to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased such wire netting, fencing wire, baling wire, and barbed wire.

"Cwt." means hundredweight avoirdupois.

Maximum Prices.—Sales by Retail.

4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which wire netting, fencing wire, baling wire, or barbed wire may be sold by retail to be the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order, plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of such wire netting, fencing wire, baling wire, and barbed wire, from the point of delivery to the retailer's place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which wire netting, fencing wire, baling wire, or barbed wire specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such prices as are fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 603.

SPOUTING, RIDGING, DOWNPIPE, SQUARE-PIPE, OR FITTINGS,
MANUFACTURED FROM GALVANIZED IRON.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 603.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 545 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - "Metropolitan Area" means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
 - "Length" means, in relation to spouting, ridging, downpipe, and square-pipe manufactured from galvanized iron, a length of 6 feet or 8 feet.

Maximum Prices.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which spouting, ridging, downpipe, square-pipe, or fittings manufactured from galvanized iron may be sold, by retail, to be—

(a) in respect of sales for delivery within the Metropolitan Area, the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order;

(b) in respect of sales outside the Metropolitan Area, the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order, plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of such spouting, ridging, downpipe, square-pipe, or fittings to the retailer's place of business.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum rates which may be charged for the cartage of spouting, ridging, downpipe, square-pipe, or fittings manufactured from galvanized iron, from any retailer's place of business to the place of delivery to the purchaser to be current standard Victorian Road Transport Association rates.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which spouting, ridging, downpipe, square-pipe, or fittings manufactured from galvanized iron, specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause, may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 604.

ONIONS.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 604.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 584 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“One ton” means 2,240 lb. weight.

“Primary wholesaler” in relation to the sale of onions means a person who sells by wholesale onions which have been purchased in Victoria or elsewhere and which he resells to a secondary wholesaler.

“Secondary wholesaler” means, in relation to any sale of onions, a person who purchases onions from a primary wholesaler for the purpose of resale.

“Retail Trader” means in relation to the sale of onions a person who purchases onions and sells such onions by retail.

“Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.

“Point of delivery” means, in relation to the sale of onions, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges in conveying such onions to his place of business passed to the seller from the person from whom he purchased them.

Maximum Prices.—Sales by Wholesale Merchants.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by wholesale to be—

- (1) By primary wholesaler—
 - (a) In respect of brown onions, £63 per ton.
 - (b) In respect of white onions, £63 per ton.
- (2) By secondary wholesaler—
 - (a) In respect of brown onions—
 - (i) where the seller delivers the onions to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market, £64 17s. 6d. per ton;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the onions into the buyer's shop, £65 10s. per ton.
 - (b) In respect of white onions—
 - (i) where the seller delivers the onions to the purchaser at the seller's store or at the Victoria Market, £64 17s. 6d. per ton;
 - (ii) where the seller delivers the onions into the buyer's shop, £65 10s. per ton.

Maximum Prices.—Sales by Retail.

5. (1) I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by retail in the metropolitan area to be as follows:—

- (a) In respect of brown onions, 8d. per lb.
- (b) In respect of white onions, 8d. per lb.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum price at which onions may be sold by retail outside the metropolitan area to be the price fixed in the foregoing provisions of this Order for such sale in the metropolitan area, plus the charges properly incurred in transporting such onions from the point of delivery to the retailer to such retailer's shop or place of business, but in no case shall such maximum price exceed the following:—

- (a) In respect of brown onions, 8½d. per 1 lb.
- (b) In respect of white onions, 8½d. per 1 lb.

Exhibition of Price Tickets.

6. (1) Every person who has for sale by retail any onions, the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall attach to or display with those onions a ticket or label setting forth his selling price thereof.

(2) Any ticket or label required by sub-clause (1) of this clause to be attached to or displayed with any onions shall be in such a form as to be easily legible to any person inspecting or viewing those onions and so as to be properly associated with such onions.

Delivery of Invoices.

7. Any person who sells by wholesale any onions shall deliver with such onions an invoice or docket containing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name and address of seller;
- (ii) name and address of purchaser;
- (iii) the date of sale;
- (iv) the point of delivery to the purchaser, the weight of the onions sold, number of bags, and price per unit of such onions; and
- (v) total price of such onions.

Records.

8. Any person who sells any onions shall keep and preserve any invoice or docket received by him in relation to such onions and shall keep a record in respect of the purchase of such onions showing—

- (i) The name and address of supplier;
- (ii) the date of the invoice or docket received by him in relation to such onions;

- (iii) the quantity purchased and the price thereof;
- (iv) the point of delivery; and
- (v) transport costs properly attributable to the transport of such onions from the point of delivery to his place of business.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

9. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which onions which are specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
