#### Female Improvers.

Two female improvers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 175s. 9d. per week of 40 hours.

### JUVENILE WORKERS.

Two juvenile workers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 175s. 9d. per week of 40 hours.

Note.—A juvenile worker is a female person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or an improver) employed in bag-making at machining, cutting, turning, folding, breaking-off, or
