No. 5683. "An Act to make provision for the Redivision of the State of Victoria into Electoral Districts for the Legislative Assembly, and for other purposes."

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT GUNBOWER STATE FOREST IN THE PARISHES OF GUNBOWER, GUNBOWER WEST AND COHUNA, COUNTY OF GUNBOWER.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the ninth day of December 1926 and published in the Government Gazette

of the fifteenth day of December 1926 respecting a Sanctuary for native game in the Parishes of Gunbower, Gunbower West and Cohuna and direct that the part of Victoria hereinafter described shall be a locality in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act* 1928.

PART OF VICTORIA ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Part of Victoria Above Referred to.

Parishes of Gunbower, Gunbower West, and Cohuna, County of Gunbower: Commencing at the junction of the Murray River and Deep Creek; bounded thence by the southern bank of that creek bearing north-westerly to a point in line with the east boundary of allotment 31 of section 8, Parish of Gunbower; thence by a line and the east boundary of said allotment 31 bearing north 0 deg. 3 min. west to the north-east angle thereof; thence by the State Forest boundary bearing westerly and north-westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 54 section VIII., Parish of Gunbower West; thence by lines bearing north 88 deg. 16 min. west 649 links, north 10 deg. 37 min. west 3,870 links, north 39 deg. 39 min. east 572 links, and north 66 deg. 45 min. east 3,620 links to the eastern angle of allotment 56a, section VIII., Parish of Gunbower West; thence by the State Forest boundary bearing north-westerly to the south angle of allotment 75a of section D, Parish of Cohuna, by a line bearing south 32 deg. 31 min. I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that the trades usually carried on or in connexion with the manufacture of the substances named hereunder and in or in connexion with the preparation of pesticides including fungicides insecticides and weed-killers containing such substances may, unless preventive measures are adopted, be dangerous to the health of persons employed therein, do now by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1928 hereby declare such trades to be dangerous trades within the meaning of the said to be dangerous trades within the meaning of the said

The substances referred to in the Proclamation are-Diethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate or its isomers, whether known as such or as parathion, niram, E605, phosfone, paraphos or by any other trade

Dimethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate or its isomers, whether known as such or by any other trade

name.
Tetraethylpyrophosphate, whether known as such or as T.E.P.P. or by any other trade name.
Hexaethyltetraphosphate, whether known as such or as H.E.T.P., hexone, demite, hetraphos, or by any other trade name.
Dinitroorthocresol, whether known as such or as D.N.O.C., or by any other trade name.
Dinitrooresol, whether known as such or as D.N.C., or by any other trade name.
Bis (bis dimethylamine) phosphonus anhydride or pyrophosphoryloctamethyltetraamide whether known as such or as Pestox III, or by any other trade name.

YARRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1953.

THE Yarram Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Yarram Urban District.

MARINE BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS FOR THE LICENSING OF "HIRE AND DRIVE YOURSELF" MOTOR BOATS AND "ROWING BOATS."

N pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the Marine Acts and all other powers it in that behalf enabling the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:-

- 1. Short Title.-These Regulations may be cited as the "Hire and Drive Yourself Motor Boat and Rowing Boat Regulations 1953."
- 2. Commencement.—These Regulations shall take effect on and from the first day of July, 1953.
- 3. Definition.—In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
 - "Board" means the Marine Board of Victoria.
 - "Hire and Drive Yourself Motor Boat" means any boat intended to be propelled by power other than oars which islet out for hire or valuable consideration.
 - "Rowing Boat" means any boat intended to be propelled by oars which is let out for hire or valuable consideration.
 - Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed to include the feminine and the singular to include the plural and the plural the singular and unless the contrary intention appears words and expressions in these Regulations shall have the same respective meanings as in the Marine
- 4. Licence Fees.—Every application for any licence to be granted under these Regulations shall be accompanied by the amount of the appropriate fee as prescribed by Schedule I. hereto
- 5. Licences.-Every licence issued by the Board in respect of any Hire and Drive Yourself Motor Boat or any Rowing Boat shall be in the Forms respectively prescribed in Schedules II. and III. hereto, and shall contain a provision that the boat referred to in the licence may be used in any area or areas of the port specified in such licence.

 6. Refusal of Licence.—The granting of any licence under these
- Regulations shall be in the sole discretion of the Board.
- 7. Suspension or Cancellation of Licence.-The Board may in its discretion suspend or cancel any licence issued under these Regulations whereupon the owner of the boat in respect of which such licence was issued shall forthwith remove or cause to be removed from such boat any marks implying that it is licensed by the Board.
- 8. Return of Suspended or Cancelled Licence.-Any licence which has been suspended or cancelled shall be delivered by the holder to any officer of police, or of the Board, on demand being made therefor.
- 9. Licence Lost or Destroyed.-When any licence issued by the Board has been lost or destroyed, and satisfactory proof of such loss or destruction has been furnished, a duplicate may be issued on payment of a fee of Five shillings (5s.). A statutory declaration as to such loss or destruction must be made by the applicant, and forwarded to the Secretary of the Board, Kurrajong House, 175 Collins-street, Melbourne, C.1.
- 10. Boats to be Licensed.-No boat in Victoria outside the Port of Melbourne, as defined in the Second Schedule of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928, or outside the Port of Geelong, as defined in the First Schedule (Part I.) of the Geelong Harbor Trust Act 1928, shall in any waters be let out for hire or valuable consideration unless such boat be duly licensed by the Board in accordance with these Regulations for such purposes.
- 11. Duration of Licence.—A licence issued in respect of any boat whether a Hire and Drive Yourself Motor Boat or a Rowing Boat shall, unless sooner suspended or cancelled by the Board, continue in force from the date of issue of the same until the 30th day of September then next, and no longer.
- 12. Application for Licence.—Any person desiring to obtain a licence under these Regulations for any boat shall make application to the Secretary to the Board, Kurrajong House, 175 Collins-street, Melbourne, C.1, on the form appropriate thereto as prescribed in Schedules IV. and V. to these Regulations, as the case may be.

- 13. Inspection of Boat before Issue of Licence.—Before any boat may be licensed, the same must be inspected by such officer or person as the Board may appoint for the purpose, and such officer or person shall, if he considers such boat suitable for the purpose of being let out for hire or valuable consideration within a specified area and properly equipped therefor, give his certificate accordingly in the form appropriate thereto as provided in Schedules VI. and VII. to these Regulations, as the case may require; but such officer or person shall not give the prescribed certificate in respect of a boat, unless he is satisfied that such boat has sufficient stability and freeboard when loaded to carry such number of persons as he may determine as safe, which number shall be set out on the face of the certificate and represents the maximum number of persons which may lawfully be carried on such boat.
- 14. Inspection of Boat from Time to Time.—Any officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose may from time to time, inspect any boat licensed under these Regulations, and shall be afforded every facility by the owner or person in charge to make such inspection.
- 15. Number of Passengers—How Determined.—Before being licensed every boat shall be measured by an officer of the Board or person appointed for the purpose, and the number of adults which the said boat may carry shall be determined as follows:—

Hire and Drive Yourself Motor Boats and Rowing Boats shall be permitted to carry adults in the proportion of one to each eighteen (18) inches of seating accommodation furnished, provided that such seating accommodation shall be clear of all interference with the proper working of the boat and in the case of boats propelled by mechanical power shall not be in closer proximity to the engine thereof than in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer or person may be safe and proper.

For the purpose of this Regulation two (2) children under twelve (12) years of age shall be reckoned as equal to one (1) adult.

16. Particulars to be Painted on Boat.—Each boat licensed under these Regulations shall be assigned a number by the Secretary to the Board, which number the owner of such boat shall cause to be painted upon the bows thereof in figures not less than four (4) inches in height, the number to be preceded by the letters M.B., of similar measurement.

On the inside of the stern, subject to the exception hereinafter contained, there shall be painted in letters or figures of not less than two (2) inches in height the maximum number of persons such boat is licensed to carry. Provided that where the number of persons which may be carried cannot be conveniently painted on the inside of the stern, then in lieu thereof the licence issued by the Board shall be put up by the owner or person in charge in some conspicuous part of the boat where it will be visible.

The particulars herein required shall not be altered during the currency of any licence except with the sanction of the Board, duly applied for and obtained.

- 17. Particulars—How to be Painted.—All letters or figures required to be painted shall be painted in white paint on a dark ground, or in black paint on a light ground.
- 18. Certificate of Officer.—No licence in respect of any boat shall be issued until a certificate appropriate thereto as prescribed in Schedules VI. and VII. to these Regulations, as the case may require, has been forwarded to the Board by the proper officer, that the requirements of these Regulations have been fully complied with.
- . 19. Condition of Boats.—No owner or person having charge of any boat shall permit such boat to be let out for hire or valuable consideration unless such boat is in good order and condition in respect of hull and machinery and unless such boat is properly fitted or equipped in every respect as required by these Regulations.
- 20. Equipment.—No boat shall be licensed under these Regulations unless such boat is furnished to the satisfaction of the certifying officer with the equipments appropriate thereto as set out hereunder, that is to say:—
 - (a) A "Hire and Drive Yourself Motor Boat" must be furnished with an approved life belt for every person licensed to be carried on board, a chemical fire extinguisher of approved type, suitable pair of oars with rowlocks with safety attachment for same and a suitable anchor and cable.

- (b) Rowing Boats must be furnished with a suitable anchor and cable, suitable oars and rowlocks with safety attachment.
- (c) All boats licensed under these Regulations must carry apparatus necessary for the proper exhibition of lights between sunset and sunrise in accordance with the requirements of Article 7 of the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" for the time being in force under the provisions of section 127 of the Marine Act 1928.
- 21. Equipment to be Stamped.—The equipment prescribed by these Regulations to be carried by each boat must be permanently marked with the registered number assigned to such boat by the Secretary to the Board.
- 22. Buoyancy.—No Hire and Drive Yourself Motor Boat shall be licensed unless such boat is provided with internal buoyancy fittings equal to 25 per cent. in excess of the weight of the propelling machinery and all equipment of a non-buoyant nature either in the form of muntz metal or copper casings or enclosed water-tight air spaces. Sealed oil drums secured in position to the boat, will, according to their capacity nevertheless be accepted as portion or the whole of the buoyancy fittings required, provided they are painted or otherwise prevented from rusting and are readily removable for periodical inspection and testing.

Air cases not exceeding thirty-nine inches (39 in.) in length shall be constructed of muntz metal or copper of not less than seventeen ounces (17 oz.) to the superficial foot, those exceeding thirty-nine inches (39 in.) in length shall be constructed of similar metals of not less than eighteen ounces (18 oz.) to the superficial foot.

Any air case exceeding twenty-four inches (24 in.) in length constructed of seventeen ounces (17 oz.) metal shall be supported by a diaphragm in the middle of its length.

All joints of air cases must be rolled back joints and soldered.

- 23. Care of Boats Let Out.—The person or persons to whom a boat licensed under these Regulations is let out for hire or valuable consideration shall not allow—
 - (a) such boat to carry more persons than is permitted by the licence issued in respect thereof;
 - (b) any prescribed equipment to be improperly used or handled;
 or
 - (c) such boat to proceed beyond the area specified in the said licence,

while such boat is in his charge or during the currency of the agreement or arrangement by which he has the use of such boat.

- 24. Change of Ownership.—Upon the change of ownership of any boat licensed under these Regulations the person whose name appears on the licence as owner shall forthwith forward the licence to the Secretary of the Board and advise him in writing of the change of ownership and the name and address of the person who has become the owner of the boat. A licence shall be deemed to be cancelled upon any change of ownership of the boat in respect of which it was issued and shall immediately cease to have any force or effect.
- 25. Unlicensed Boats.—The owner of a boat in respect of which there is not in force a current licence under these Regulations shall not permit to appear on such boat any of the particulars referred to in clause 16 of these Regulations nor any marks which imply that the boat is licensed under these Regulations.
- 26. Production of Licence.—A licence issued in respect of any boat under these Regulations shall be produced by the owner or person in charge thereof to any officer of police, or the Board, or to any one hiring or intending to hire such boat.
- 27. Offences.—Every person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of a breach thereof and be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds (except in cases of continuing offences when the penalty shall not exceed the sum of Ten pounds for every day after notice of the offence has been affixed.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE USE OF CERTAIN PESTICIDES.

W HEREAS the use of certain substances is necessary for the destruction of pests. And whereas such substances may be used in various processes or occupations and whilst so used may endanger or impair the health of persons engaged in such processes or occupations or of other persons: And whereas it is necessary to safeguard the public health and the health of persons engaged in the said processes and occupations: And whereas it is provided amongst other things by section 95 of the Health Act 1928 as re-enacted by section 10 of the Health Act 1941 that the Governor in Council may make regulations safeguarding the public health and the health of persons engaged in such processes and occupations as are likely to endanger or impair health: Now therefore by virtue of and pursuant to such powers and all other powers enabling him in that behalf the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say)—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Use of Pesticides Regulations 1953, and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. In these Regulations, unless \cdot inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—
 - "Pesticide" means any of the substances appearing in column one of the First Schedule to these Regulations and any substance containing any of such substances and which is used or capable of being used as an insecticide, fungicide or weed killer.
- 3. (1) An employer of any employee who is engaged in the use of any pesticide shall provide such employee, whilst he is so engaged, with the protective clothing and equipment prescribed in column two of the First Schedule to these Regulations, and such person shall, whilst so engaged, wear and use the clothing and equipment prescribed in the said column.
- (2) No employer shall permit or cause any employee to use any pesticide unless such employee is supplied with the protective clothing and equipment set out in column two and the drugs set out in column three of the First Schedule to these Regulations.
- (3) No person being an employee shall use or being an employer shall permit or cause an employee to use any pesticide unless there is provided by the employer and readily available at a convenient place a card of advice in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
- 4. No employer shall permit or cause an employee to engage in the use of any pesticide until such time as the employee concerned has the necessary knowledge to recognize the signs and symptoms of poisoning or illness which may be caused by the said pesticide and which signs and symptoms are set out in the Third Schedule to these Regulations.
- 5. An employer of any employee who is engaged in the use of any pesticide shall require the employee concerned to make himself properly acquainted with the safety directions appearing on the label attached to the container of such pesticide.

- 6. An employer of any employee who is engaged in the use of any pesticide shall provide or cause to be provided for the use of each employee so engaged an adequate supply of running water or where this is not practicable separate clearly marked containers supplied daily with fresh water for washing—
 - (a) his clothing, boots, gloves, hood; and
 - (b) face, hands, and such other parts of the person as may require washing.
- 7. Every person who has been engaged in the use of any pesticide shall upon ceasing work each day remove the said protective clothes from his person and wash them thoroughly or cause them to be so washed.
- 8. (1) When directed by the Chief Health Officer of the Department of Health, any employer who employs any person in the use of any pesticide shall at his own expense cause such employee to undergo periodical medical examination by a legally qualified medical practitioner at such intervals of time as the said Chief Health Officer may in his discretion direct.
- (2) The medical practitioner who makes any medical examination pursuant to these Regulations shall immediately forward a report of the result of such examination in the form of the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations to the said Health Officer. The particulars appearing in Part I. of such form shall be filled in by the employer or his agent.
- 9. Every person in respect of whom an employer is required by the preceding Regulation to direct such person to present himself for a medical examination shall submit himself to such examination in accordance with the requirements of these Regulations.
- 10. Every person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

CARD OF ADVICE TO MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS.

Poisoning by Organic Phosphorous Pesticides.

Materials.

Organic tetra- and pyro-phosphates (marketed under such trade names as Hexone, H.E.T.P., Demite, Tetraphos, Tephos) and organic thiophosphates (marketed as E605, Paraphos, Phosfone Parathion). While all these materials are highly toxic, the thiophosphates appear to be the most troublesome.

Symptoms.

Treatment.

Poisoning can occur by inhalation, by ingestion or by absorption through the skin. Evidence of poisoning has occurred after handling or packing the concentrated materials, after spraying with diluted solutions and dusts, and after handling recently sprayed fruit.

Symptoms are giddiness, headache, tightness of the chest, blurred vision, pin-point pupils, sweating, nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, abdominal cramps, convulsions, semi-coma and coma. Greatly increased salivary and bronchial secretion is common, simulating severe pulmonary edema.

Give relatively large doses of atropine (1/60-1/130 gr.) preferably subcutaneously, at once and every hour as required up to a total of 3/10 gr. or until pupils dilate. The patient should be watched carefully for a 24 or 48 hour period during which it may be necessary to give additional atropine or maintain a balance between its effects and the toxic effects of the poison It is the concensus of medical opinion in America that the administration of atropine should be courageously continued when the patient remains in a definitely toxic condition due to muscarinic action of the poison.

Postural drainage and assiration may be necessary if signs of pulmonary

Postural drainage and aspiration may be necessary if signs of pulmonary congestion are present. The administration of oxygen may be required. Do not use morphine.

Use of Pesticides Regulations 1953. THIRD SCHEDULE.

Signs and symptoms of poisoning by substances set out in First Schedule.

Poisoning can occur through inhalation, by ingestion or by absorption through the skin.

Symptoms are giddiness, headache, tightness in chest, blurred vision, pin-point pupils, sweating, nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, abdominal cramps, convulsions, semi-coma and coma. Greatly increased salivary and bronchial secretion are common.

Persons already suffering from headache, or a "cold" or bronchitis, or gastric upset should not engage in spraying operations with these substances since the symptoms of these conditions may mask the early symptoms of poisoning by these substances, or render the effects of them more severe.

EXTRACT FROM THE "INSECTICIDES REGULATIONS 1951."

- 3. (1) No person shall sell any insecticide consisting of or containing any one or more of the following substances:—
 - (a) diethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate or its isomers whether known as such or as Parathion, Niram, E605, Phosfone, Paraphos or by any other name;
 - (b) dimethylparanitrophenylthiophosphate or its isomers whether known as such or by any other name;
 - (c) tetraethylpyrophosphate, whether known as such or as T.E.P.P., Tephos or by any other name;
 - (d) hexaethyltetraphosphate, whether known as such or as H.E.T.P., Hexone, Demite, Hetraphos or by any other name

unless such insecticide is contained in a package bearing a label on which are printed in accordance with the directions contained in the Schedule hereto the particulars set forth in the said Schedule.

- (2) No person shall sell any such insecticide—
 - (a) (if it is in the form of a liquid or emulsion) in a package containing less than 1 pint;
 - (b) (if it is in the form of a dust or powder) in a package containing less than 4 lb.;

Do not breathe vapour, spray, mist or dust. Wear protective waterproof clothing, rubber gloves and face mask when making up spray liquid or spraying, and when handling or using dust.

The face mask should be of the chemical cartridge type with canister of charcoal and filter pad. Wash clothing and gloves daily. Wash hands, arms and face thoroughly with soap and water before eating or smoking. Do not eat or smoke during spraying or dusting. Wash out and destroy empty containers.

ANTIDOTE.—Secure on a doctor's prescription an emergency supply of six atropine tablets (1/100 grain) for each person, and keep them handy on the job. The early symptoms may be nausea, headache, giddiness, blurred vision, contraction of the pupils of the eyes, vomiting. On the first appearance of any of these symptoms, immediately cease work and call a doctor. While awaiting him take one atropine tablet each quarter hour for one hour and then one every half hour for another hour.

To comply with Food and Drug Regulations and to protect pickers, do not spray within three weeks of harvesting.

IMPORTANT.—Repeated mild effects may be very dangerous. If affected at all avoid further contact until medical approval has been given.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE MANUFACTURE OF CERTAIN SUBSTANCES USED IN THE PREPARATION OF INSECTICIDES, FUNGICIDES, PESTICIDES, OR WEED KILLERS, AND TO THE PREPARATION OF INSECTICIDES. FUNGICIDES, PESTICIDES, OR WEED KILLERS CONTAINING SUCH SUBSTANCES.

W HEREAS the manufacture of certain chemicals used in the preparation of certain insecticides, fungicides, pesticides, or weed killers may be dangerous to the health of persons engaged in such manufacture or of other persons: And whereas the preparation of certain insecticides, fungicides, pesticides or weed killers in the form of liquids, dusts, or powders containing any or all of such chemicals may be dangerous to the health of persons engaged in preparing such insecticides, fungicides, pesticides, or weed killers, or of other persons: And whereas it is provided amongst other things by section 95 of the Health Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 10 of the Health Act 1941, that the Governor in Council may make Regulations safeguarding the public health and the health of persons engaged in dangerous trades, or in such occupations and processes as are likely to endanger or impair health: And whereas the manufacture and preparation of insecticides, fungicides, pesticides, or weed killers have been declared Dangerous Trades within the meaning of section 95 of the Health Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 10 of the Health Act 1941: And whereas the processes or occupations in these trades are likely to endanger or impair health: Now therefore, by virtue of and pursuant to such powers and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Pesticide (Manufacture and Preparation) Regulations 1953, and shall come into operation upon publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—
 - "Approved" means approved in writing by the Commission.
 - "Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.
 - "Pesticide" means any of the substances appearing in the First Schedule to these Regulations, and any substance containing any of such substances and which is used or capable of being used as an insecticide fungicide or weed killer.
 - "Manufacture" as used in relation to a pesticide means the making of the chemical substance which is the actual destructive agent.
 - "Preparation" as used in relation to a pesticide means the making up of solution, suspension, emulsion, dust, or powder containing the chemical substance which is the actual destructive agent or the packing of such or of the chemical substance which is the actual destructive agent for sale, and "Prepare" shall have a corresponding interpretation.
 - "Isolated", in relation to plant apparatus or process, means separated by distance or partition in such a way that only persons engaged with, on, or in the particular plant, apparatus, or process will normally be in the vicinity of such plant or apparatus or the place where the process is carried on.

- 3. No person shall manufacture or prepare any pesticide-
 - (a) except in such premises as are registered under the provisions of Division 2 of Part V. of the Health Act 1928 as amended;
 - (b) unless such measures and requirements to safeguard the health of persons engaged therein, as set out in the Second Schedule to these Regulations, are provided and maintained; and
 - (c) unless warning notices as set out in paragraph 7 of the Second Schedule to these Regulations are displayed in positions satisfactory to the Chief Health Officer at such premises.
- .4. No person shall engage in or permit or cause an employee to engage in the manufacture handling or preparation of any pesticide unless the person so engaged is supplied with the protective clothing and equipment prescribed in paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
- 5. Every person who is engaged in the manufacture, handling or preparation of any pesticide shall wear the protective clothing and equipment set out in paragraph, 5 of the Second Schedule hereto: Provided however that the wearing of a mask shall not be required when the person concerned is engaged in filling of containers with the prepared solution suspension emulsion dust or powder containing the active agent when an adequate hood and adequate exhaust ventilation have been installed and are used in the process.
- 6. (1) The employer of any employee who is engaged in such occupations in connexion with the manufacture or preparation of any pesticide specified by the Chief Health Officer of the Department of Health shall at his own expense cause such employee to undergo periodical medical examinations by a legally qualified medical practitioner at such intervals of time as the said Health Officer may in his discretion direct.
- (2) The medical practitioner who makes any such medical examination shall immediately forward a report of the result of the said examination in the form of the Third Schedule to these Regulations to the said Health Officer.
- (3) The particulars appearing in Part I. of the form prescribed in the said Third Schedule shall be filled in by the employer or his agent. The results of the medical examination shall be set out in Part II. of the form prescribed in the said Third Schedule which shall be signed in the space provided by the medical practitioner making the examination.
- 7. Every person whose employer is required by the preceding Regulation to cause him to undergo a medical examination shall submit himself to such examination at the time and place appointed by the said employer.
- 8. Where any employee engaged in the manufacture or preparation of any pesticide is physically affected or made ill by the pesticide concerned his employer shall immediately report such affection or illness to the Commission.
- 9. Notwithstanding the provisions of these Regulations the Commission may as a result of any application to it in writing exempt any person from carrying out such of the provisions of these Regulations as it thinks fit. If any such exemption is so made it shall be on such terms as are determined by the Commission and contained in the exemption. The Commission may at any time withdraw or vary any exemption so granted by it pursuant to this Regulation.
- 10. Every person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

Dinitroorthocresol, whether known as such or as D.N.O.C. or by any other trade name.

Dinitroorthocresol, whether known as such or as D.N.O.C. or by any other name.

Bis (bis dimethylamine) phosphonus anhydride or pyrophosphorylocta-methyltetraamide whether known as such or as Pestox III., or by any other trade name.

Pesticide (Manufacture and Preparation) Regulations 1953. SECOND SCHEDULE.

Measures and Requirements to Safeguard the Health of Persons Engaged in Manufacture or Preparation of any Pesticide.

- 1. (a) The plant in which the pesticide is manufactured shall be isolated from other plants, and if enclosed shall be in a building separate from other buildings in which other processes whatever are or may be carried on, or in a part of a building adequately isolated from other parts of the building in which other processes whatever are carried on.
- (b) The plant in which the pesticide is prepared shall be isolated from other plants, and if enclosed shall be in a building separate from other buildings in which other processes whatever are or may be carried on, or in a part of a building adequately isolated from other parts of the building in which other processes whatever are or may be carried on.
- 2. (a) The apparatus used in the manufacture of the pesticide shall be of such a nature and of such material as to prevent any toxic gas, vapour, tume, mist, liquid, dust or smoke used or produced in the manufacturing operations escaping into the atmosphere in amounts harmful to the persons engaged in the manufacturing operations or to other persons.

(b) The apparatus for the preparation of the pesticide shall be of such material and of such construction and so equipped with hood or hoods and suction exhaust ventilation that the escape of vapour, mist, dust or powder in harmful quantities into the breathing zone of the operators or of other persons is effectually prevented.

- 3. Washing facilities shall be provided and shall be so located that a person contaminated with any toxic liquid can immediately flush the skin with an adequate supply of running water.
- 4. Suitable and adequate facilities for all persons affected by the foregoing Regulations shall be provided for washing and showering and locker accommodation for clothes
- 5. The clothing and equipment referred to in Regulations 4 and 5 shall be as follows:

Protective clothing consisting of waterproof overalls, gloves, boots and hood of rubber or other suitable material and full-face respirator (or goggles and respirator) of approved type.

- 6. Food and drink shall not be kept in or partaken of in the building or in the vicinity of the plant in which pesticides are manufactured or prepared.
 - 7. The warning notice referred to in Regulation 3 shall be as follows:-DANGER.

The substance being manufactured here is dangerous, it may cause fatal effects if swallowed, inhaled as vapour, spray, mist, dust or powder or absorbed through the skin.

Exercise extreme care in all processes.

Do not allow contact with the skin. If accidentally spilled on skin, immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water, or bicarbonate of soda and water. Do not breathe vapours, spray, mist or dust. Wear protective waterproof clothing and gloves, boots and hood of rubber or other suitable protective material. Wear full-face respirator or goggles and nose and mouth respirator wherever there is the slightest danger of inhaling the toxic vapour, spray or mist.

Wash clothing and gloves daily.

Wash hands, arms, face thoroughly with soap and water before eating or smoking.

Do not eat or smoke whilst at work.

Early symptoms of the effects may be giddiness, pin-point pupils, headache. Later, nausea, abdominal cramps, vomiting, diarrhoea, muscular twitching, coma, convulsions, pulmonary oedema may

At first sign of any of these symptoms appearing report to the First Aid Station at once and call a medical practitioner. Do not resume work until approval to do so has been given by a medical practitioner.

(The word "Danger" shall be printed in red in block letters of 78 points. The remainder of the notice shall be printed in block capitals of not less than 18 points.)

First Aid.—A First Aid Station shall be provided and supplied with the following minimum equipment:—

- (a) Atropine tablets (gr. 1/100) 100.
- (b) Syringe and needle for subcutaneous injections.
- (c) Sterile water.
- '(d) Cylinder containing oxygen or a mixture of oxygen 95 per cent. and carbon dioxide 5 per cent. with mask for administration during artificial respiration.
- (e) Blankets.
- (f) A card of instructions as to first aid treatment which shall include the following:—

FIRST AID TREATMENT FOR POISONING BY ORGANIC PHOSPHORUS COMPOUNDS.

Call a medical practitioner at once in all cases of suspected poisoning or illness caused by such compounds.

Inhalation.—Remove patient from contaminated atmosphere keep him under continuous observation. Do not wait for visit of doctor—if symptoms include blurred vision or pin-point pupils, give two tablets of atropine at once.

Skin Contact.—Immediately remove contaminated clothing and scrub skin with soap and water for fifteen minutes. Do not wait for doctor. If symptoms include blurred vision or pin-point pupils, give two tablets of atropine at once.

Swallowing.—Make patient vomit by giving warm salty water or soapy water. Do not wait for doctor. If symptoms include blurred vision or pin-point pupils give two tablets of atropine at once.

Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious patient. If patient is unconscious, give the two tablets dissolved in a few cubic centimeters of water by subcutaneous injection.

(g) A card of advice to medical practitioners which shall contain the following:—

Poisoning by Organic Phosphorus Pesticides.

Materials.—Organic tetra-andpyro-phosphates (marketed under such trade names as Hexone, H.E.T.P., Demite, Tetraphos, Tephos) and organic thiophosphates (marketed as E605, Paraphos, Phosfone, Parathion). While all these materials are highly toxic, the thiophosphates appear to be the most troublesome.

Symptoms.—Poisoning can occur by inhalation, by ingestion or by absorption through the skin. Evidence of poisoning has occurred after handling or packing the concentrated materials, after spraying with diluted solutions and dusts, and after handling recently sprayed fruit.

Symptoms are giddiness, headache, tightness of the chest, blurred vision, pin-point pupils, sweating, nausea, vomiting, diarrhoea, abdominal cramps, convulsions, semi-coma and coma. Greatly increased salivary and bronchial secretion is common, simulating severe pulmonary oedema.

Treatment.—Give relatively large doses of atropine (1/60—1/20 gr.) preferably subject processes.

Treatment.—Give relatively large doses of atropine (1/60-1/30 gr.) preferably subcutaneously, at once and every hour as required up to a total of 3/10 gr. or until pupils dilate. The patient should be watched carefully for a 24 or 48-hour period during which it may be necessary to give additional atropine to maintain a balance between its effects and the toxic effects of the poison. It is the concensus of medical opinion in America that the administration of atropine should be courageously continued when the patient remains in a definitely toxic condition due to muscarinic action of the poison.

Postural drainage and aspiration may be necessary if signs of pulmonary congestion are present. The administration of oxygen may be required.

Do not use morphine.

- 9. A person trained in First Aid and instructed in the first aid measures to be adopted in cases of poisoning or illness caused by pesticides shall be available.
- 10. The containers into which the substance which is the actual destructive agent (as distinct from preparations of it) is packed shall be securely sealed so as to prevent the escape of liquid or vapour, and it of glass or earthenware shall be enclosed in a larger container made of metal, the space between the two containers being filled with suitable absorptive material.
- $\,$ 11. All containers in which such destructive agents are packed shall be labelled with a warning notice containing the following:—

"Poisonous"
"Not to be taken"
Safety Directions
Warning.

The contents are extremely dangerous and may be fatal if swallowed, inhaled as vapour, or absorbed through the skin.

Exercise extreme care in handling.

- Do not allow contact with the skin. If accidentally spilled on skin immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water and report to First Aid Station and call a medical practitioner.
- When handling, transporting or emptying, wear protective waterproof clothing and gloves, boots, and hood of rubber or other suitable protective material; carry full-face respirator or nose and mouth respirator with goggles of an approved type.
- When empty wash out thoroughly with alkali and water, and do not use as a container for anything else.
- (The word "Poisonous" shall be printed in Red in Block letters of 48 points. The words "Not to be taken" shall be printed in Red in Block letters of 24 points. The remainder of the notice in Black capitals of 6 points.)
- 12. (1) Waterproof protective clothing, gloves, boots, or hood which become contaminated shall be at once cleansed by washing in an adequate quantity of water.
- (2) Ordinary clothing which has been accidentally contaminated shall be immediately removed and subsequently thoroughly washed with soap and water. The skin shall be washed with an adequate quantity of soap and water, and the person shall report to the First Aid Station and call a medical practitioner.

WORKERS COMPENSATION (RETURN OF WORKERS COMPENSATION BUSINESS) REGULATIONS 1953.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Workers Compensation Acts and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the dvice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Workers Compensation (Return of Workers Compensation Business) Citation and Regulations 1953" and shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

2. (1) The return required by Section 75 of the Workers Compensation Act 1951 as re-enacted by Section 12 of Return of the Workers Compensation Act 1963 to be furnished to the Government Statist shall be in the form of Form 14, Form 15, Form 16 and Form 17 of the forms appended to these regulations, and there shall be annexed to such return a statement showing the method by which premiums shown therein are assessed in relation to wages paid to workers.

(2) The said return shall be furnished to the Government Statist after the thirtieth day of June and before the first day of October in each year for the period of twelve months ending on the said thirtieth day of June.







Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD TRADE BOARD.

Notes (i).—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria as follows:-

- (a) Clauses 1 to 17, inclusive, apply to the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and the Orders in Council thereunder, and such portion of the Shires of Doncaster and Templestowe (other than the township of Warrandyte) as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Chelsea, Geelong, Geelong West, Mildura, Mordialloc, Warrandbool, and of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; the township of Merbein; the township of Kangaroo Flat in the Shires of Marong and of Strathfieldsaye; the township of Spring Gully, in the Shire of Strathfieldsaye; such portion of the Shire of Broadmeadows as is south of Somerton-road; the Shire of Dandenong; the Doutta Galla Riding of the Shire of Keilor, and such portion of the Maribyrnong Riding of the Said Shire as is within 3 miles of the Sh. Alban's Post Office; the Shire of Mulgrave; such portions of the Shire of South Barwon and of the Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio as are within a radius of 5 miles of the Geelong Post Office; and portions of the Shire of Werribee as are within a radius of 3 miles of the Altona Post Office; and such portions of the Shire of Mildura as are within a radius of 1 mile of the Red Cliffs Post Office and the Irymple Post Office, respectively.
- (b) Clause 1 and clauses 18 to 32, inclusive, apply to the whole of the State outside and excepting those parts enumerated
- (ii) On 31st May, 1938, the Bread Board, the Country Bread Board, and the Provincial Bread Board were deprived of the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates of payment for bread making or baking", and such power was conferred exclusively on the Bread Trade Board.
 - (iii) The Board has prescribed a form of apprenticeship indenture.
- (iv) Breadmaking and baking were proclaimed on 12th December, 1938, as Apprenticeship Trades under the Apprenticeship Act 1928 for the Metropolitan District.

Full particulars of the apprenticeship regulations for these trades may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Apprenticeship Commission, 103 Russell-street, Melbourne. (Price 3d.)

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of breadmaking or baking" has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That, as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1953, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

3. That the number of hours to be worked on each day (including the time spent at the doughmaking necessary for such day's work) shall be :-

OVERTIME.

- 4. (a) That any employee (other than an apprentice) who works either-
 - (i) for any time in excess of the number of hours fixed in clause 3; or alternatively (ii) during any week for any time in excess of 40 hours;

shall be paid for such extra time at the wages rate of double time.

(b) Any apprentice who works for any time in excess of seven hours on an ordinary night or nine hours on any other night shall be paid by the employer for such extra time at the rate of time and a half, calculated on the same rate of pay as the employer may for the time being be obliged to pay to journeymen employed by him in the same trade. Provided, however, that any apprentice during the last year of his apprenticeship may be required to work up to ten hours on a night other than an ordinary night at ordinary rate of pay.

WEEKLY HOURS.

5. That the number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 40.

TIME RATE.

6. (a) That any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid, for time worked up to 20 hours, at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of 33 per centum.

For time worked beyond the 20 hours aforesaid, he shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding the rate prescribed by this Determination for an ordinary week's work, together with any overtime rate which is applicable.

(b) In addition to any other rate to which he is entitled, any person employed for not more than 20 hours in any one week shall be paid, in respect of each night he is employed, fares from the Trades Hall, Melbourne, to his place of employment and return to the Trades Hall, Melbourne, by the cheapest means of regular rail, tram, or bus service available to him at the times of beginning or ending work as the case may be.

This shall include the fare charged by any available all-night service to employees travelling outside the times of ordinary services.

Provided that this sub-clause shall apply only to work done within the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Orders in Council thereunder.

SPECIAL RATES FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

- 7. (a) That payment for all work done on New Year's Day, Australia Day, Anzac Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, shall be at the rate of double time; but, if by Act of Parliament or Proclamation, any other day be substituted for any of the above named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
- (b) When two or more holidays as provided for in sub-clause (a) hereof occur in any one week, an employee shall be paid a full week's wages in addition to any penalty rates to which he may be entitled in such week; provided that any employee covered by this sub-clause who loses time during such week without the approval of his employer, shall be paid pro-rata for the work performed by him in such week.

Union REPRESENTATIVE.

8. That the Secretary or the Assistant Secretary of the Operative Bakers' Union of Victoria shall have the right of entry to any bakehouse during the hours when such bakehouse is in use, shall be permitted to inspect the time-book and conditions relating to the persons employed therein, and interview employees where breaches or suspected breaches of this Determination are occurring or suspected of occurring.

DEFINITIONS.

- 9. (a) "Foreman" shall mean a person in charge of a bakehouse. No person shall be classed as a foreman unless he is a tradesman, and is present during substantially the whole of the working hours.
- (b) "Double day" shall mean a day on which bread is baked to supply all the employer's customers for two days so as to obviate the necessity for any work being done on the following day.

 (c) "Treble day" shall mean a day on which bread is baked to supply all the employer's customers for three or more days so as to obviate the necessity for any work being done on the following two days.
 - (d) The making of bread shall be deemed to mean each of the following acts:-

 - (i) The dividing of bread dough;
 (ii) The weighing of bread dough;
 (iii) The kneading or moulding of bread dough;
 (iv) The placing of bread dough in boxes or tins or on trays.
 - (e) The baking of bread shall be deemed to mean-
 - (i) the setting of dough in the oven;(ii) the withdrawal of bread from the oven.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY.

- 10. (a) The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946 and any amendments which may be made thereto from time to time.
- (b) Where a public holiday mentioned in clause 7 occurs during any period of an annua I holiday taken by an employee, the period of the holiday shall be increased by one day in respect of that public holiday.

SICK LEAVE.

- 11. (a) Any employee who, having had at least three months' service with the same employer, is absent from duty as a result of personal ill-health or accident shall be entitled to sick pay as follows:—
 - (i) During the first year—3½ hours' ordinary pay for each complete month of service.
 (ii) During any subsequent year of service—40 hours' ordinary pay.

Provided that, in either case, such employee produces or forwards, within 48 hours of the commencement of such absence, evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such

(b) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall, provided an employee remains in the service of the one employer, or any successor of such employer, be cumulative from year to year. For the purposes of this sub-clause, service prior to the 1st June, 1949, shall be disregarded.

REST PERIODS.

12. That, on double and treble days, employees shall be allowed two rest periods of ten minutes each which shall be counted as part of time worked. One of such rest periods shall be taken before the meal interval, and the other rest period shall be taken after the meal interval.

MEAL INTERVAL.

13. That a meal interval of not more than thirty minutes shall be allowed after the completion of not less than 21 hours' work and not more than 5 hours' work.

CONTINUITY OF WORK.

14. The work of each employee (except a doughmaker) on each day or shift, shall be continuous with the customary break

LAUNDERING AND/OR MAINTENANCE OF WORKING CLOTHES.

15. An employee who works for more than 20 hours in any week for the same employer shall be paid an allowance of 4s. per week towards the cost of laundering and/or maintenance of working clothes; provided an employee who works for less than 20 hours in any week shall be paid 9d. for each night he is employed, with a maximum of 4s. per week.

CHANGING ROOMS, LOCKERS, AND WASHING FACILITIES.

16. Suitable changing rooms, lockers, and washing facilities, including hot and cold showers, shall be provided by the employer where there are more than two employees.

LIMITATION OF HOURS OF ENPLOYMENT.

17. No person shall be employed at breadmaking or baking, as defined in clause 9 hereof, outside the hours specified hereunder, viz.:-

20. That the number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 40.

TIME RATE.

21. That any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid, for time worked up to 20 hours, at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of 33 per centum.

For time worked beyond the 20 hours aforesaid, he shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding the prescribed by this Determination for an ordinary week's work.

Union Representative.

22. That the Secretary or the Assistant Secretary of the Operative Bakers' Union of Victoria shall have the right of entry to any bakehouse during the hours when such bakehouse is in use, shall be permitted to inspect the time-book and conditions relating to the persons employed therein, and interview employees where breaches or suspected breaches of this Determination are occurring or suspected of occurring.

SUNDAY WORK.

23. The Board determines, pursuant to the provisions of section 9, Act 4461, that, where a public holiday occurs upon a Tuesday, bread may be made or baked on the preceding Sunday after the hour of 8 p.m.

SPECIAL RATES FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

- 24. (a) That double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on New Year's Day, Australia Day, Anzac Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but, if by Act of Parliament or Proclamation, any other day be substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
- (b) When two or more holidays as provided for in sub-clause (a) hereof occur in any one week, an employee shall be paid a full week's wages in addition to any penalty rates to which he may be entitled in such week; provided that any employee covered by this sub-clause who loses time during such week without the approval of his employer, shall be paid pro rata for the work performed by him in such week.

Annual Holiday.

- 25. (a) The annual holiday shall be as prescribed by the provisions of the Factories and Shops (Annual Holidays) Act 1946 and any amendment which may be made thereto from time to time.
- (b) Where a public holiday mentioned in clause 24 occurs during any period of an annual holiday taken by an employee, the period of the holiday shall be increased by one day in respect of that public holiday.

SICK LEAVE.

- 26. (a) Any employee who, having had at least three months' service with the same employer, is absent from duty as a result of personal ill-health or accident, shall be entitled to sick pay as follows:—
 - (i) During the first year— $3\frac{1}{3}$ hours' ordinary pay for each complete month of service.
- (ii) During any subsequent year of service-40 hours' ordinary pay. Provided that, in either case, such employee produces or forwards within 48 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such
- (b) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year such portion as is not taken shall, provided an employee remains in the service of the one employer, or any successor of such employer, be cumulative from year to year. For the purposes of this sub-clause, service prior to the 1st June, 1949, shall be disregarded.

LIMITATION OF HOURS.

- 27. (a) No bread of any kind shall be made or baked for trade or sale whether in the form of loaves, rolls, or any other form in any area to which Parts 2 and 3 of the Determination of the Bread Carters Board apply between the hour of twelve noon on the day immediately preceding every Wednesday other than any such Wednesday which occurs in any week in which any public holiday occurs on some other day or days and six o'clock in the evening of such Wednesday.

 (b) No bread of any kind shall be made or baked for trade or sale, whether in the form of loaves, rolls, or any other form in any area to which Parts 2 and 3 of the Determination of the Bread Carters Board apply, between the hour of twelve noon on the day immediately preceding any Saturday being a holiday prescribed by the said Determination and the hour of eleven o'clock in the evening of the following Sunday.
- (c) No bread of any kind shall be made or baked for trade or sale, whether in the form of loaves, rolls, or any other form in any area to which Parts 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the Determination of the Bread Carters Board apply between the hour of twelve noon on the day immediately preceding any holiday prescribed by section 212 of the Factories and Shops Act and the hour of six o'clock in the evening on such holiday.

MEAL INTERVAL.

28. That a meal interval of not more than thirty minutes shall be allowed after the completion of not less than 2½ hours' work and not more than 5 hours' work.

CONTINUITY OF WORK.

29. The work of each employee (except a doughmaker) on each day or shift, shall be continuous with the customary break for a meal.

LAUNDERING AND/OR MAINTENANCE OF WORKING CLOTHES.

30. An employee who works for more than 20 hours in any week for the same employer, shall be paid an allowance of 4s. per week towards the cost of laundering and/or maintenance of working clothes, provided an employee who works for less than 20 hours in any week shall be paid 9d. for each night he is employed, with a maximum of 4s. per week.

CHANGING ROOMS, LOCKERS, AND WASHING FACILITIES.

31. Suitable changing rooms, lockers, and washing facilities, including hot and cold showers, shall be provided by the employer where there are more than two employees.

DEFINITION.

32. "Foreman" shall mean a person in charge of a bakehouse. No person shall be classed as a foreman unless he is a tradesman, and is present during substantially the whole of the working hours.

Section 15 (1) (c) indicates that the midwife had completed the prescribed course of training and passed the prescribed examination.

Section 16 indicates that the midwife has been fully or partly trained and registered in any part of the world and who has undergone such supplementary training and passed such examinations as the Board directs; and has in the aggregate undergone training and passed examinations substantially equivalent to that prescribed under the Midwives Act, Victoria.
