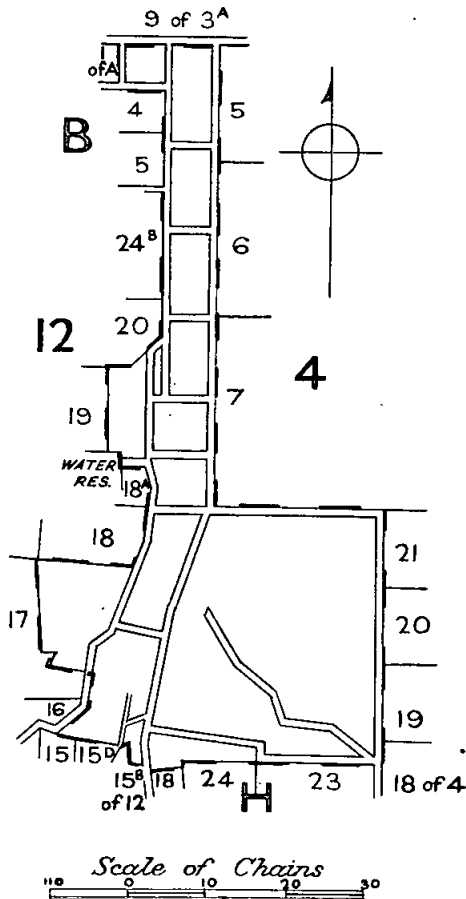

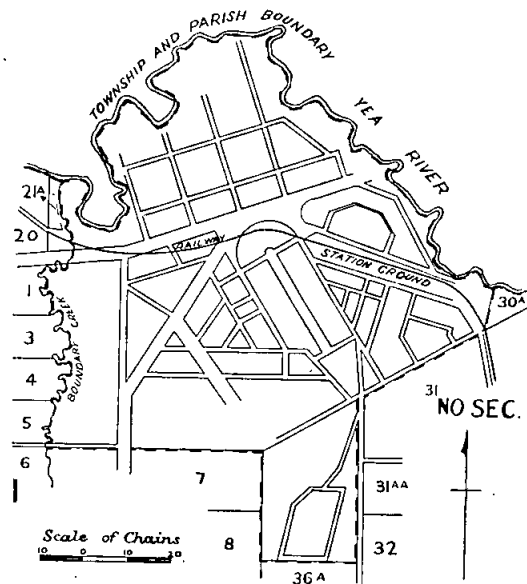

THE MELBOURNE HARBOUR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.  
REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of section 37 of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

1. The Superannuation Regulations 1927-1950 are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations."

2. From and after the date of these Regulations coming into operation the Principal Regulations are amended as follows:—

- (i) Regulation 1 of the Principal Regulations is amended by deleting the figures 1950 and substituting therefor the figures 1953.
- (ii) Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations is amended by deleting the definition of "employee" and substituting therefor the following definition:—

"Employee" means—

(a) Any person who, prior to the twenty-ninth day of August, 1953, being duly qualified had become a contributor under these Regulations.

(b) Any person who, after the twenty-eighth day of May, 1953, shall have completed three years' (or in any special cases approved by the Commissioners six calendar months') continuous regular employment in the service and was at the time of the commencement of such employment under the age of 57 years and who within three calendar months next after the completion of such three years' regular employment, or of such approval by the Commissioners as the case may be, shall lodge with the Commissioners a notice in the form in the Third Schedule to these Regulations but shall not include any person who having completed two years' continuous regular employment in the service prior to the twenty-ninth day of May, 1953, failed to lodge a notice in the form in the Third Schedule within three calendar months next after the completion of such employment.

3. Regulation 14 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting the words—"date of coming into operation of these Regulations" and substituting therefor the words "first day of January One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight."

4. Regulation 25 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting the words "date of coming into operation of these Regulations" and substituting therefor the words "first day of January One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight."

5. After Regulation 39A of the Principal Regulations include the following new Regulation 39B:—

"39B. (i) To every person receiving under these Regulations in respect of the period commencing on the twenty-ninth day of May, 1953, and ending on the nineteenth day of August, 1954, or any portion thereof—

(a) a pension (not being a widow's pension) not being a pension of or exceeding Six hundred and twenty-four pounds per annum; or

(b) a widow's pension not being a pension of or exceeding Three hundred and twelve pounds per annum;

there shall also be paid, in respect of such period or portion thereof, an amount additional to such pension at the rate of one-sixth of the annual rate of such pension.

Provided that the annual rate of the aggregate of such pension and such additional amount shall not exceed Three hundred and twelve pounds per annum in the case of a widow's pension and Six hundred and twenty-four pounds in the case of a pension other than a widow's pension.

(ii) Every additional amount so paid shall be made out of the Harbor Trust Fund and shall be borne wholly by the Commissioners."

6. Regulation 42 of the Principal Regulation is hereby amended by deleting the words "two years'" wheresoever therein occurring and substituting therefor the words "three years'".

7. These Regulations shall come into operation from and after the twenty-ninth day of May, 1953.

**Town and Country Planning Acts.****OCEAN ROAD PLANNING SCHEME.****INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER No. 2.**

*Portion of Anglesea and Airey's Inlet (Shire of Barrabool).*

**WHEREAS** by virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Town and Country Planning Board (hereinafter referred to as the "Responsible Authority"), having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order:—

1. The development of all lands referred to in the Schedule, and the erection, construction, and carrying out of any buildings, roads, or other works on any of the said land, is hereby prohibited.

2. Any person may apply to the Responsible Authority for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works during the operation of this Order.

3. Any application for permission to develop, subdivide, or otherwise use any land, or erect or construct any buildings, roads, or other works, may be granted by the Responsible Authority, subject to such conditions as are specified in the permit, or may be refused.

4. Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up or alter any building, road, or other works, and if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee and/or occupier, in accordance with the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Acts.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. This Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme, in accordance with the Town and Country Planning Acts, or until this Interim Development Order is revoked by the Governor in Council.

“(b) The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, grant to a pupil attending a registered secondary or junior secondary school, an allowance not exceeding £39 in any calendar year for his conveyance to and from school, provided that—

- (i) the place of residence of the pupil is not less than 3 miles from the school attended;
- (ii) there is not within 3 miles of his place of residence a State school or State educational centre providing the required standard of education; and

(iii) no allowance shall be granted to any pupil in attendance at a junior secondary school after he has completed the third year of the course prescribed in district high schools or junior technical schools."

2. Rescind clause 4 and substitute the following clause:—

"4. (a) The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, provide the full cost of conveying a group or groups of pupils to a district high school, a higher elementary school, a central school, central classes, a girls' secondary school, or a technical school by means of an approved transport service, provided that all pupils so conveyed shall attend the nearest centre of State secondary education providing the required standard of education.

(b) Where arrangements have been made for the establishment of a transport service under sub-clause (a) of this clause, the Director shall, on receipt of written applications for the necessary approval, permit pupils attending a registered secondary or junior secondary school to travel by this transport service, provided that—

(i) pupils so conveyed reside at least 3 miles from the school attended and attend the nearest centre of secondary education providing the required standard of education;

(ii) pupils attending junior secondary schools shall not be permitted to travel by the transport service after they have completed the third year of the course prescribed in district high schools or junior technical schools.

(c) Pupils who reside less than 3 miles from the school attended shall not be conveyed under the provisions of sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause unless there is accommodation for them on the vehicle used for the transport service."

## REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the *Parking of Vehicles Act 1953*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. In these Regulations:—
  - "Act" means the *Parking of Vehicles Act 1953*;
  - "Council" means the Council of the municipality of the City of Melbourne.
2. The person who detects any parking infringement shall at the time of detecting such parking infringement attach to the vehicle a notice headed "City of Melbourne" or "Victoria Police", as the case may be, and containing the words "Parking Infringement Reported". Such notice shall be placed on the vehicle in a position which would be conspicuous to the driver.
3. The notice to accompany or to be written on any summons for a parking infringement, pursuant to section 4 (2) of the Act, shall be in or to the like effect of the form contained in the First Schedule to these Regulations.
4. When a defendant elects not to defend a charge for a parking infringement, he may forward to the officer named in the said notice for the purpose, a notice of election in or to the like effect of the form contained in the First Schedule to these Regulations.
5. A certificate signed, or purporting to be signed, by the Officer in Charge of the Motor Registration Branch or his deputy, pursuant to section 5 of the Act, shall be in or to the like effect of the form contained in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

*Parking of Vehicles Act 1953.*  
NOTICE TO THE DEFENDANT.

TAKE NOTICE that the defendant in this summons may in writing deliver (by post or otherwise) to \_\_\_\_\_ not later than 7 days before the return date stated in such summons, a notice stating that he ELECTS NOT TO APPEAR to defend the charge.



*Instructions.*—If the defendant ELECTS NOT TO APPEAR TO DEFEND the charge he should complete the Form of Election below, detach and forward it to the officer named for the purpose, so as to reach him not later than 7 days before the return date of the summons.

The following extracts from the Act are quoted for the information and guidance of the defendant:—

"3. (1) When any parking infringement occurs in relation to any vehicle the person who at the time of the occurrence of the infringement is the owner of the vehicle shall by virtue of this section be and be deemed to be guilty of an offence against the by-law rule or regulation concerned in all respects as if he were the actual offender guilty of the infringement unless the court is satisfied that the vehicle was a stolen vehicle or a vehicle illegally taken or used.

(2) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall affect the liability of the actual offender, but where the full amount of any penalty has been paid by the actual offender or owner in relation to any parking infringement no further penalty shall be imposed on or recovered from the owner or actual offender in relation thereto.

(3) (a) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this section no owner of the vehicle shall by virtue of this section be guilty of an offence if—

(i) before or within fourteen days after the issue of a summons in respect of the parking infringement concerned he supplies in a sworn statement in writing to the informant the name and address of the person who was in charge of the vehicle at the relevant time; or

(ii) he satisfies the court that he did not know and could not with reasonable diligence have ascertained such name or address.

(b) Any statement purporting to be made under sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (a) of this sub-section if produced in any proceedings against the person named therein and in respect of the parking infringement concerned shall be prima facie evidence that such person was in charge of the vehicle at all relevant times relating to the infringement.

4. (2) Any summons for a parking infringement whether served by post or served personally may be accompanied by or have written thereon—

(a) a notice in the prescribed form advising the defendant that he may, in writing delivered (by post or otherwise) to the person specified therein and not later than a date specified therein, elect not to appear to defend the charge; and

(b) a sworn statement of the informant shortly describing the facts of the alleged infringement.

(3) If an election in writing as aforesaid is received by the person specified in the notice as aforesaid before the date so specified in the notice then notwithstanding anything in the Justices Acts or any other Act a stipendiary magistrate in chambers on reading copies of such summons election and sworn statement and without hearing any oral evidence except evidence (if any) tendered as to prior convictions of which prior notice has been given to the defendant may convict and impose a penalty on the defendant.

(4) If no such election is received by the person specified in the notice as aforesaid before the date so specified the information shall proceed in the usual manner."

A By-law of the Shire of Omeo, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 13, for the prohibiting or regulating the deposit of and removal or destruction of refuse or rubbish within the Shire of Omeo.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and of every other power thereunto enabling them on that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Omeo, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction,

make the following By-law, and order as follows:—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, shall be and are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. No person shall do or permit to be done any of the following matters at any refuse tip or incinerator under the control of the Council of the Shire of Omeo:—

- (a) Trespass on any part of such area.
- (b) Deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish except as directed by the Council's Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas.
- (c) Obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any person lawfully using such area.
- (d) Neglect or refuse to obey the lawful directions of the Council's Engineer or other officer or employee in charge of any such areas.
- (e) Deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, factory waste, or any other material which, in the opinion of the Council's Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas is inflammable or subject to spontaneous combustion, or liable to ignite, or if ignited cause smoke or fumes.
