Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 545.

SPOUTING, RIDGING, DOWNPIPE, SQUARE-PIPE, OR FITTINGS MANUFACTURED FROM GALVANIZED IRON:

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 545.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 495 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - “Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
 - “Length” means, in relation to spouting, ridging, downpipe, and square-pipe manufactured from galvanized iron, a length of 6 feet.

Maximum Prices.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which spouting, ridging, downpipe, square-pipe, or fittings manufactured from galvanized iron may be sold, by retail, to be—
 - (a) in respect of sales for delivery within the metropolitan area, the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order;
 - (b) in respect of sales outside the metropolitan area, the prices specified in the Schedule to this Order, plus the cost actually incurred in respect of and properly attributable to the transport of such spouting, ridging, downpipe, square-pipe, or fittings to the retailer's place of business.

(2) I fix and declare the maximum rates which may be charged for the cartage of spouting, ridging, downpipe, square-pipe, or fittings manufactured from galvanized iron, from any retailer's place of business to the place of delivery to the purchaser to be current standard Victorian Road Transport Associations rates.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which spouting, ridging, downpipe, square-pipe, or fittings manufactured from galvanized iron, specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause, may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 546.

LINSEED OIL.—SALES BY RETAIL.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 546.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 519 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—
 - “Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne.
 - “Oz.” means ounces of fluid measure.

Maximum Prices.

4. (1) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which linseed oil may be sold by retail within the Metropolitan Area to be the prices specified in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (2) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which linseed oil may be sold by retail in any part of Victoria which lies beyond a radius of 20 miles but within a radius of 100 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, to be the prices specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
- (3) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which linseed oil may be sold by retail in any part of Victoria which lies beyond a radius of 100 miles but within a radius of 200 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, to be the prices specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.
- (4) I fix and declare the maximum prices at which linseed oil may be sold by retail in any part of Victoria which lies beyond a radius of 200 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, to be the prices specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice in Writing.

5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum prices at which linseed oil specified in a notice in writing given in pursuance of this clause may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 547.

THE SERVICE OF RETREADING OR RECAPPING OF TYRES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 547.

Definition.

2. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Tyre means a tyre intended for use, or capable of being used in connexion with a motor vehicle;

“Motor Vehicle” means a motor or automotive vehicle of any type or description, and (without limiting the generality thereof) includes (i) any motor cycle, motor car, motor truck or motor tractor, and (ii) any motor cycle side-car, caravan, trailer, semi-trailer, or float capable or being adapted for use with any of the vehicles previously mentioned.

Maximum Rates.

3. I fix and declare the maximum rate at which the service of retreading or recapping any tyre of the type and size set out in the Schedule to this Order may be supplied to be the appropriate rate specified in that Schedule.

Exhibition of Price Lists.

4. Every person who supplies or carries on the service of retreading or recapping tyres, the maximum rates for which are fixed by or under the provisions of this Order shall exhibit and keep exhibited in a prominent position in his place of business, or, if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, and in such a manner to be easily legible to persons contemplating availing themselves of such service, particulars of the maximum rates fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the supply by him of such service.

Delivery of Invoices.

5. Every person who supplies the service of retreading or recapping any tyre shall deliver with the supply of such service an invoice or docket specifying the following particulars:—

- (a) Date of supply of that service;
- (b) name and address of the supplier;
- (c) number, size and description of tyres;
- (d) the rate per unit charged for each type and size of tyre retreaded or recapped;

and shall keep and preserve a duplicate or copy of such invoice or docket.

Differences in Rates to be Observed.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a retreader or recapper of any tyre has customarily allowed any difference in rates—

- (a) to any person or to persons included in any class of persons;
- (b) in respect of the servicing of certain quantities; or
- (c) in respect of the servicing under certain conditions,

the maximum rates fixed by or under this Order in respect of recapping or retreading tyres shall, in the case of service to any such person or persons, or of such quantities or under such conditions, be reduced by the allowance of that difference.

Fixation of Maximum Rates by Notice in Writing.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum rates at which the service of retreading or recapping of tyres specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause, may be supplied by any person to whom such notice is given to be such rates as are fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 548.
DRUGS AND CHEMICALS.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 548.

Application.

2. This Order shall apply to the goods specified in the Schedule hereto.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Prevailing price” means, in relation to the sale of specified goods by any person on any terms and conditions, the price at which that person sold substantially identical goods on the first day of May, 1953, upon terms and conditions substantially identical with the first-mentioned terms and conditions, or if no such sale was made by that person on that date, then the expression shall mean the price at which on the date last preceding the first May, 1953, that person sold substantially identical specified goods upon same terms and conditions substantially identical with the first-mentioned terms and conditions.

“Specified goods” means the goods specified in the Schedule hereto.

Maximum Price.

4. I hereby fix and declare the maximum price at which any specified goods may be sold by any person to be the prevailing price.

Maximum Prices for Goods not Previously Sold.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any person may sell any specified goods, which are not substantially identical with any goods which he sold on or prior to the first day of May, 1953, to be the cost of the goods to that person: Provided that on application by any person the maximum price at which those goods may be sold shall be such price as is fixed by notice by the Prices Commissioner in writing to that person.

Fixation of Maximum Price by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any specified goods may be sold by any person to whom a notice in pursuance of this clause is given to be such price as is fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

THE SCHEDULE.

SPECIFIED GOODS.

Drugs and chemicals whether or not packed or sold under any brand, trade or proprietary name of not less than the standard prescribed by any one or more of the following, viz.:—

- (1) The British Pharmacopoeia as in force for the time being in Victoria;
- (2) The latest edition for the time being of:—
 - (a) The British Pharmacopoeia Codex;
 - (b) The United States Pharmacopoeia;
 - (c) The Australian Pharmaceutical Formulary;
 - (d) The Extra Pharmacopoeia (Martindale);
 but not including the following drugs and chemicals:—
 - (i) drugs and chemicals intended to be used solely for veterinary purposes;
 - (ii) medical gases;
 - (iii) olive oil;
 - (iv) all ethicals other than insulin.
