Females Improvers.

Two female improvers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 182s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

JUVENILE WORKERS.

Two juvenile workers to every six or fraction of six female workers receiving not less than 182s. 6d. per week of 40 hours.

Note.—A juvenile worker is a female person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or an improver) employed in bagmaking at machining, cutting, turning, folding, breaking-off, or flying.
