SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS SEWERAGE FARM, WERRIBEE, AND LITTLE RIVER.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the fourth day of February 1947, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the fifth day of February 1947 respecting the protection of native game at the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Sewerage Farm Werribee and in lieu thereof direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

PARTS OF VICTORIA ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Twenty-four thousand nine hundred acres, more or less. County of Grant, Parishes of Mambourin, Cocoroc, and Murtcaim, commencing at the northern angle of Crown allotment 22A, Town of Werribee, Parish of Mambourin; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of Geelong-road to the western angle of Crown allotment 4, section 16, Parish of Cocoroc; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment to the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 2, section 12, Parish of Cocoroc; thence southerly by the eastern boundary, and westerly by the southern boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment for a distance of 3,802 links; thence southerly by a line bearing south 11 deg. 26½ min. east for a distance of 4,282 links to the northern boundary of a Government road; thence further southerly by a line in continuation of the previous line to the southern boundary of the last-mentioned Government road; thence westerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the south-eastern boundary of Geelong-road; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of Geelong-road across Little River to the western boundary of lot 22 on plan of subdivision No. 7173 lodged in the Office of Titles and being part of Crown section 21, Parish of Murtcaim; thence southerly by the western boundaries of lots 22 and 23 on plan of subdivision No. 7173 aforesaid to the northern boundary of a Government road; thence further southerly by a line in continuation of the previous line

to the northern boundary of lot 30 on the plan of subdivision No. 7173 aforesaid; thence westerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence southerly by the western boundaries of that lot and of lot 29 on the plan of subdivision No. 7173 aforesaid to the northern boundary of Crown section 7, Parish of Murtcaim; thence westerly by the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of 1,951 links; thence southerly by a line bearing south 0 deg. 6 min. west for a distance of 8,046 links; thence easterly by a line bearing north 89 deg. 56 min. east to a line parallel to and 40 chains distant from the high water mark on the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally north-easterly by the last-mentioned line to the western boundary of Chirnsides-road; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said road to the southern boundary of Cozens-road; thence north-easterly by a direct line to the western end of the Weir on No. 1 Lagoon; thence easterly by the Weir footbridge and easterly and north-easterly by the southern and south-eastern banks of No. 1 Lagoon and a direct line in continuation of the said south-eastern bank to the left bank of Little River; thence generally south-easterly by the said left bank to the high water mark on the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally north-easterly by the said high water mark to the right bank of Werribee River; thence generally northerly by the right bank of Werribee River and a line bearing north 5 deg. 54 min. west to the south-eastern boundary of Crown allotment 1, section A, Parish of Mambourin; thence easterly by the last-mentioned boundary, and northerly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment to the right bank of Werribee River; thence north-westerly by the right bank of Werribee River to the southern boundary of lot 22 on plan of subdivision No. 4509 lodged in the Office of Titles; thence south-westerly and north-westerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the western boundary of Crown portion 1, section 7, Parish of Mambourin; thence westerly by a line across a Government road to the western boundary thereof; thence northerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the eastern angle of Crown allotment 22A, Town of Werribee, Parish of Mambourin; thence north-westerly by the north-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned Crown allotment to the commencing point.

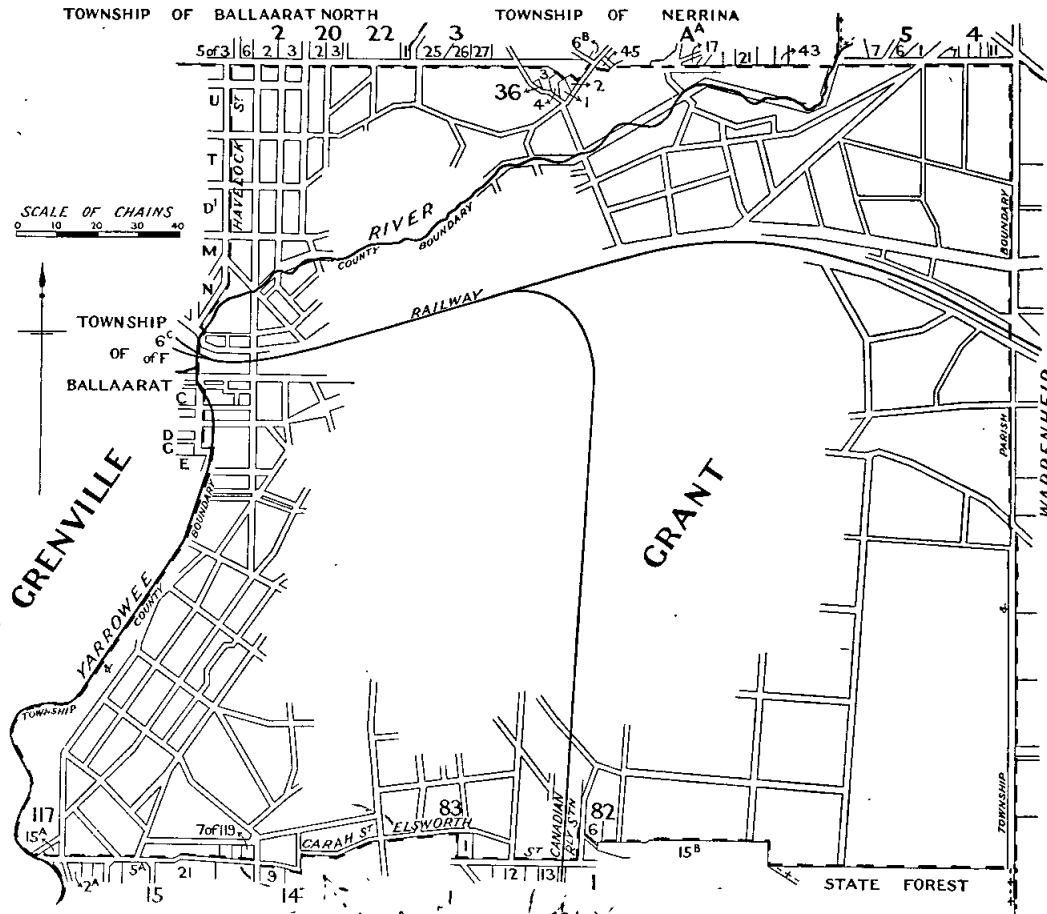

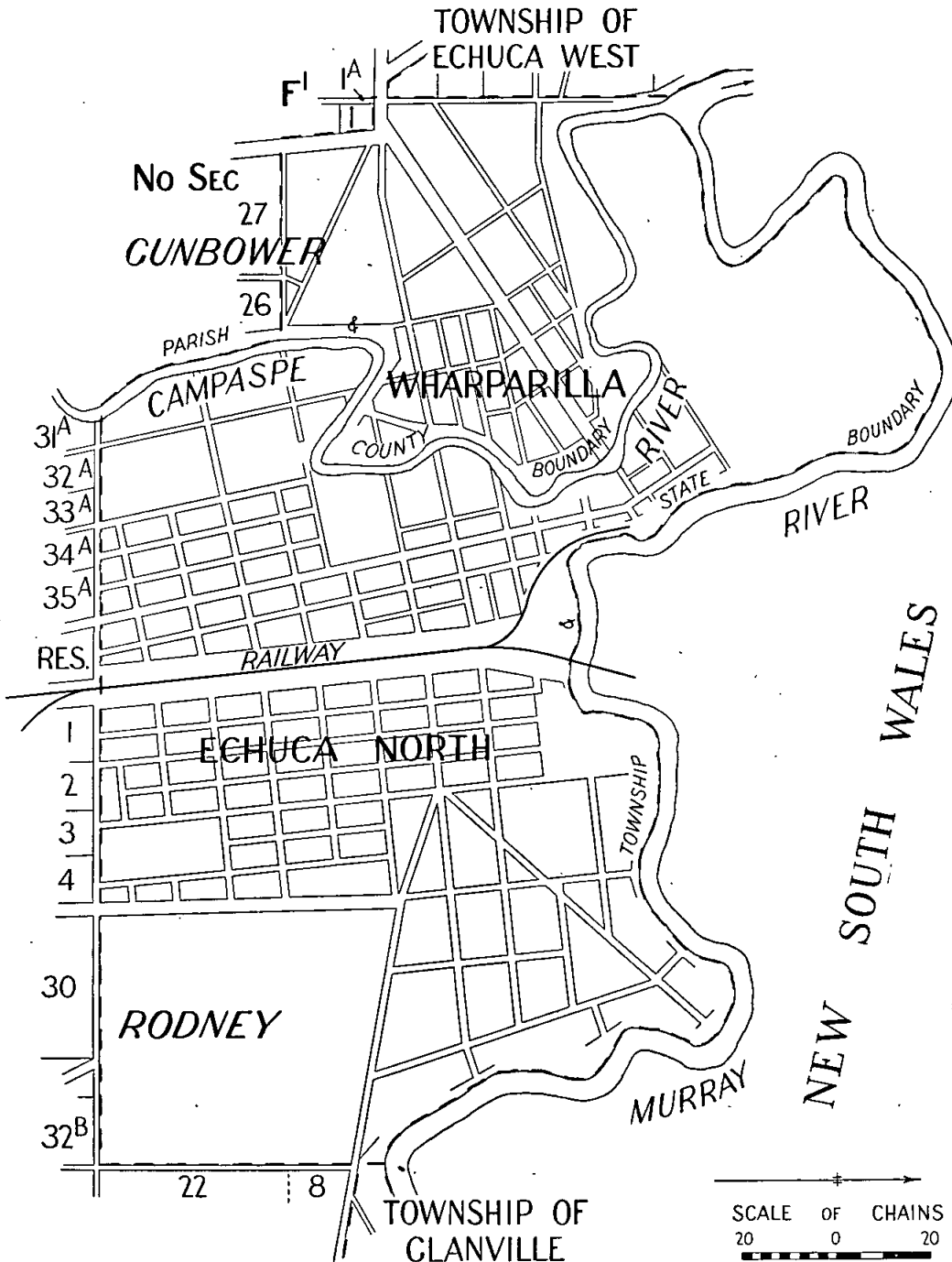

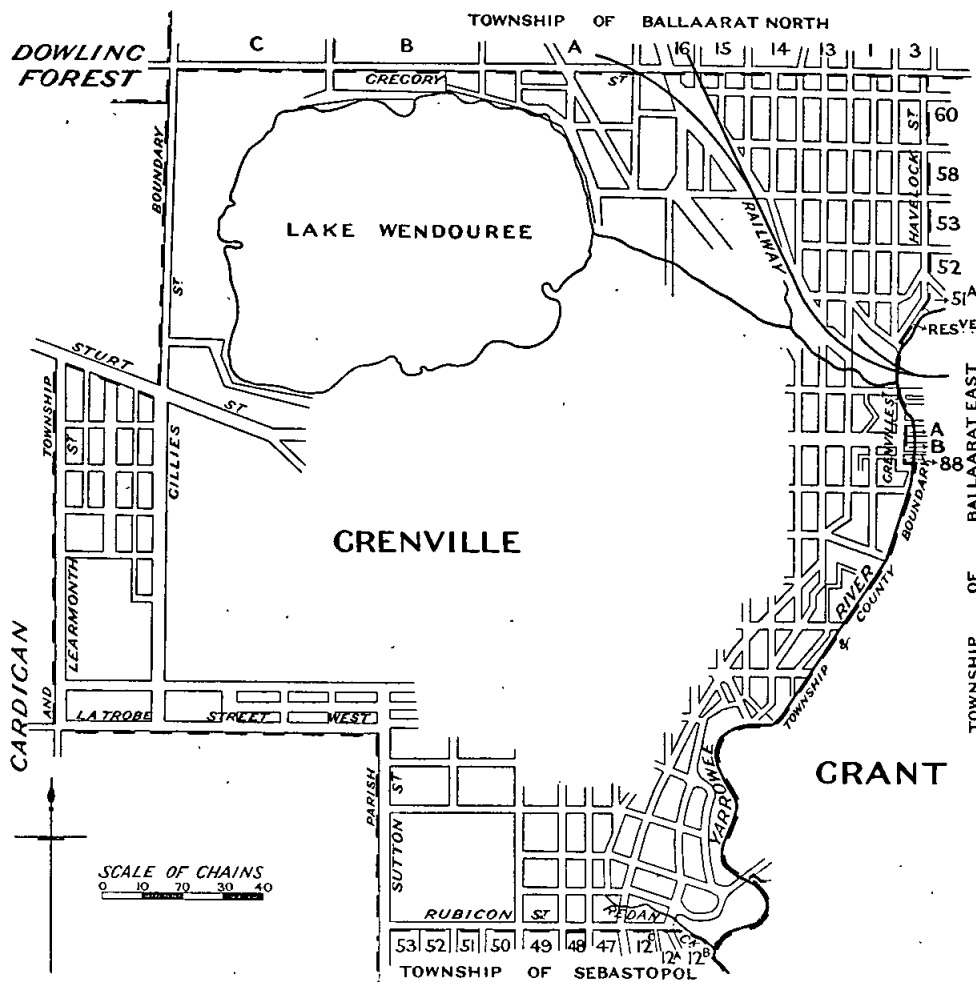

I THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the Land Act 1928 as amended by section 2 of the Land Act 1933 do by this my Proclamation revoke the Order dated 29th July 1852 fixing a site for a Village at Ballaarat on the Yarrowee River, near Yulle's Head Station (see *Government Gazette* 1852 page 801), the Order dated 11th February, 1854, defining the boundary of the Township Reserve of Ballaarat, County of Grenville (see *Government Gazette* 1854 pages 512 and 532) and the Order dated 31st October 1856 defining an extension of the Township Reserve of Ballaarat as notified on 11th February 1854 (see *Government Gazette* 1856 page 1859) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Ballaarat, the area of land in the Parish of Ballaarat, County of Grenville within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(B.128⁽¹³⁾) (C.95336).

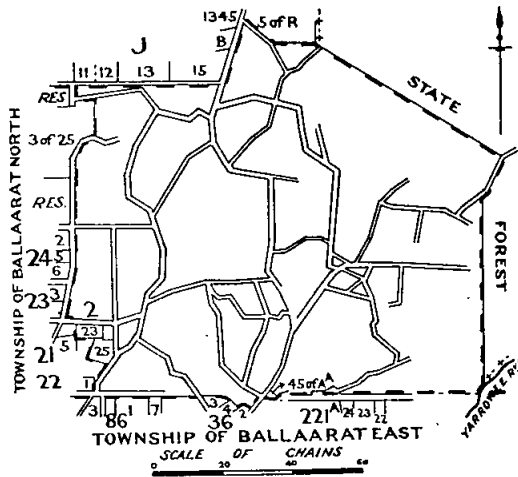

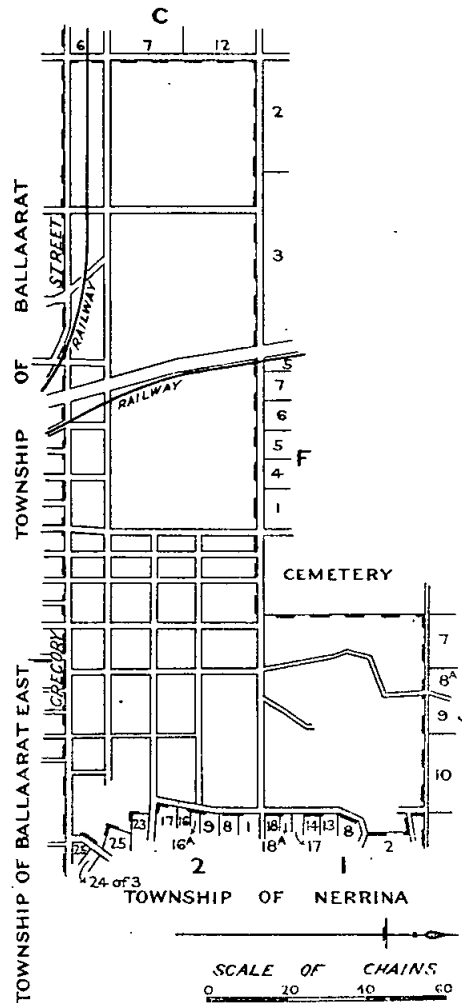

RECONSTITUTION OF A MEAT AREA.

All that part of the Parish of Ringwood within the boundaries of the Shire of Lillydale; all that part of the Parish of Warrandyte within the boundaries of the Shire of Lillydale; all that part of the Parish of Mooroolbark commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 11A at the junction of Lincoln-road and Dorset-road, Croydon, and bounded thence easterly and south-easterly along Lincoln-road and Cambridge-road to the junction of the latter road with the Lillydale-Montrose-road at the eastern angle of allotment 35B; thence southerly by a line to the southern angle of allotment 34E; thence south-easterly and southerly by Sheffield-road to the southern boundary of the parish boundary; thence westerly along that boundary to Dorset-road and thence northerly by Dorset-road to the commencing point.

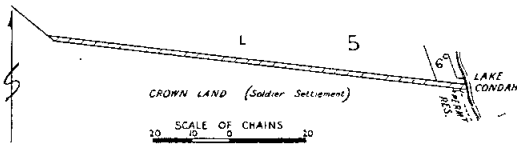

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter, and the long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the authorized officer of the Department requiring the supply. The cord of firewood consists of 128 cubic feet when stacked. If the firewood be obtained from a State Forest Timber Reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the Forests Commission.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly).

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 5 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase elsewhere or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, provided that the contractor shall be given 48 hours' notice before purchases are made or the wood re-stacked at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Tender Board, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense incurred thereby, if any, will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. Accounts for firewood shall be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made through the Treasury, Melbourne.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

Municipal District or from one part of the country to another, except in or upon those roads, streets, and highways set forth and named in the Schedule hereto.

Regulating the driving of cattle within the Municipal District and prescribing those streets, roads, or highways within the Municipal District in or along which cattle may be driven.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946* and any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Echuca do hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon publication of the notice of the making hereof in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. No person shall drive or cause to be driven into or through any portion of the Municipal District any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, and shipment, or passing from one part of the country to another, save and except on roads or highways hereafter set forth and named, that is to say:—

- (a) When entering the Municipal District by the north-west from the junction of the Murray Valley Highway and the Echuca-Cohuna main road along Luth-street, Campaspe Esplanade, Crossenvale Bridge, and Boundary-road to West-road; thence south to the road on the northern boundary of Crown allotment 54, Parish of Echuca North; thence north-easterly to the railway crossing on the Murray Valley Highway to the municipal saleyards.
- (b) When entering the Municipal District from the south-west by the road passing between Crown allotment 18 on the one hand and Crown allotments 18A and 18B on the other hand, all in the Parish of Wharparilla, to Crossenvale Bridge; and thence by the route to the municipal saleyards described in paragraph (a) hereof.
- (c) When entering the Municipal District from the south-east along the road on the southern boundary of allotments 31 and 32F, Parish of Echuca North, to the Echuca-Kyabram road; thence north to the road on the southern boundary of suburban Crown allotments 5, 6, and 7, Parish of Echuca North; thence west to the Railway Reserve and by that reserve to the municipal saleyards.
- (d) When entering the Municipal District from the east along the Echuca-Nathalia road (also known as Goulburn-road) from the municipal boundary to Bowen-street; thence by Bowen-street south to Service-street; thence by Service-street west to Sturt-street; thence by Sturt-street south to the municipal saleyards.

- (e) When entering the Municipal District from New South Wales across the River Murray Bridge; thence via Sturt-street south to the municipal saleyards.

2. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in Column 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

SHIRE OF BASS.

BY-LAW No. 30.

A By-law of the Shire of Bass, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 30, authorizing the placing on roads, in situations approved by the Municipal Engineer (subject, in the case of State Highways, main roads, and tourist roads, to the further approval of the Country Roads Board) of stands or platforms for milk and cream cans, and prescribing the nature and size, and regulating the use of such stands and platforms.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bass order as follows:—

1. In the interpretation of this By-law—

“Council” means Council of the Shire of Bass.

“Person” includes corporation.

“Road” means any street or road within the municipal district of the Shire of Bass.

Words importing the singular shall be deemed to include the plural.

2. Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, the Council may, by its Engineer or other authorized officer, authorize any person to place upon any road a stand or platform for milk or cream cans.

3. Every such stand or platform shall conform in nature or size to the following requirements:—

Nature of Construction.

- (a) Any stand or platform placed on a road, in pursuance of this By-law, shall be soundly and neatly constructed and finished in a proper and workmanlike manner to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer. The external surfaces of the end walls and outer faces of all posts of every such stand or platform shall be painted white, and such external surfaces shall be kept painted white.

- (b) Drains shall be constructed around or under the stands in such positions as shall be directed by the Shire Engineer. Such drains shall be maintained in a clean and serviceable condition to the satisfaction of the Shire Engineer, or any deputy appointed by him to give directions on this matter.

Size of Stands and Platforms.

- (a) The maximum width of any stand or platform measured in a direction at right angles to the direction of adjacent road formation, shall not exceed 5 feet, except in special circumstances, with the consent of Council.
- (b) The maximum length of any stand or platform, measured in a direction parallel to the direction of the adjacent road formation, shall not exceed 18 feet, except in special circumstances, with consent of Council.
- (c) The height of the floor of any unroofed platform shall not be less than 2 feet nor more than 3 ft. 6 in. above the level of adjacent ground.
- (d) No part of any roofed stand shall be at a height greater than 7 feet above the level of the adjacent ground.

4. Any person desiring to place such a stand or platform upon a road shall first make application to the Council, in the form contained in the Schedule hereto, for written permission (hereinafter called "permit") so to do, and shall obtain such permit.

5. No person shall place or erect or commence to place or erect or cause to be placed or erected or cause to be commenced the placing or erection of any such stand or platform on any road without having first made application to the Council in the form contained in the Schedule hereto for a permit so to do.

6. No person shall place or erect or commence to place or erect or cause to be placed or erected or cause to be commenced the placing or erection of any such stand or platform on any road without having first obtained a permit so to do.

7. On receipt of such application the Council shall refer same to its engineer, and if satisfied that the proposed stand or platform conforms to the specifications hereinbefore contained, the Council, by its authorized officer, shall issue a permit authorizing the placing of the same upon the road, in a situation approved by the engineer, provided, however, that if such road shall be a State highway, main road, tourist road, such authority shall be subject to the further approval of the Country Roads Board.

8. No person to whom a permit has been issued as aforesaid to place a stand or platform upon a road shall erect the same otherwise than in accordance with the terms of such permit and the provisions of this By-law.

9. No person shall use or cause to be used any stand or platform placed upon a road, in pursuance of a permit issued under this By-law for any purpose other than that of holding, loading, or unloading milk and/or cream cans.

10. Any person who erects or causes to be erected a stand or platform in pursuance of a permit issued under this By-law, or by whom or for whose benefit such stand or platform is currently used or maintained shall at all times maintain such stand or platform in a proper state of repair, both as to construction and painting, and the Council may at any time give written notice to such person requiring him to effect repairs as may be deemed necessary by the Council's engineer or other authorized officer.

11. The Council may at any time revoke a permit by giving written notice of revocation to the person to whom the permit for the erection of such stand or platform was issued or to the person by whom or for whose benefit such stand or platform is currently used or maintained.

12. Any person who, having erected a stand or platform in pursuance of a permit issued under the provisions of this By-law, or by whom or for whose benefit such stand or platform is currently used or maintained, fails to comply with the terms of any notice served on him under the foregoing provisions, shall be guilty of an offence.

13. No person shall place or erect or cause to be placed or erected, tram tracks or rails upon a road unless the fact is stated in his application and noted on permit.

In all cases where tram tracks or rails are placed on a road, such tram tracks or rails shall be placed at a natural surface level, but where, in any particular case, this is not practicable, application shall be made to Council to erect tram tracks or rails to be placed at other than natural ground surface. If such application is passed, wing fences shall be placed between the road boundary fences and the end of the tram track or rails. The wing fences shall be erected at a minimum angle of 45 degrees to the centre of the road and shall consist of posts spaced not more than

8 feet apart and two rails, the top of the upper rail shall not be less than 3 feet nor more than 3 ft. 6 in. above the natural surface of the ground. The posts and rails shall be painted white and such surfaces shall be kept painted white.

14. Any person who shall wilfully offend against or commit any breach of the By-law shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is a continuing one, to a further penalty not exceeding £1 per day for each day such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

NEW TYRES AND TUBES—SALES BY RETAIL.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 570.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 447 is hereby revoked insofar as it relates to the sale by retail of rubber tyres and tubes.

Application.

3. This Order shall apply to the sale by retail of new tyres and tubes manufactured in Australia.

Maximum Prices for New Tyres and Tubes Specified in the First Schedule.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any person may sell by retail any new tyre or tube of the type and size specified in the First Schedule to this Order to be the price specified in the said First Schedule for that type and size of tyre or tube.

Provided that, in respect of the sale of any new tyre or tube, where any freight is incurred by the seller in transporting that tyre or tube from the point of purchase to his place of business, and is clearly recorded in the seller's books of accounts or records, the maximum price so specified for that tyre or tube may be increased by the amount of such freight.

Maximum Prices for New Tyres and Tubes Specified in the Second Schedule.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which any person may sell by retail any new tyre or tube of the type and size specified in the Second Schedule to this Order to be the sum of—

- (a) the price specified in the said Second Schedule for that type and size of tyre or tube; and
- (b) Commonwealth Sales Tax, if any.

Provided that, in respect of the sale of any new tyre or tube where any freight is incurred by the seller in transporting that tyre or tube from the point of purchase to his place of business and is clearly recorded in the seller's books of accounts or records, the maximum price so specified for that tyre or tube may be increased by the amount of such freight.

Price Differences to be Observed.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions of this Order, where a seller of any new tyre or tube has customarily allowed any difference in price—

- (a) to any person or to persons included in any class of persons;
- (b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of new tyres or tubes; or
- (c) in respect of sales of new tyres or tubes under certain conditions of sale;

the maximum price fixed by or under this Order in respect of those new tyres or tubes shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons or of such quantities or under such conditions, be reduced by the allowance of that difference.

Fixation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum prices at which new tyres or tubes, specified in a notice given in pursuance of this clause, may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such prices as are fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
