DETERMINATION OF THE INDUSTRIAL APPEALS COURT.

IN THE INDUSTRIAL APPEALS COURT:

IN THE MATTER of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928-1941*,

AND

IN THE MATTER of a Determination made by the Radio Announcers Board and dated the 25th day of November, 1952,

AND

IN THE MATTER of Appeals against the said Determination.

Before the Industrial Appeals Court (Judge Gamble, K. H. Boykett, Esq., and J. V. Stout, Esq.).

Monday the 1st day of June, 1953.

Having heard the abovementioned Appeals, on the 2nd day of February, 1953, and on this day this Court doth order and determine :—

1. That clause 2 of the said Determination be amended and shall read as follows :—

2. That two new clauses as numbered and set out hereunder be inserted in the said Determination :—

Clause No. 16.—The conditions of the Determination shall apply only to all announcers whose wages do not exceed £3 per week above the wages prescribed for Class I. announcers.

Clause No. 17.—For the purpose of this Determination announcers are defined as follows :—

“Announcer” means an employee who is engaged making announcements, speaking, and/or describing an event or events into a microphone for purposes of broadcasting or recording and in duties ordinarily associated with such work.

“Announcer Class I.” means an employee who, in addition to announcing the time of day, playing of records, and/or controlling transcriptions and/or making announcements, including reading of news, stock reports, or sporting results, is required to carry out “Specialty work” or to “ad lib” when required by the employer.

“Announcer Class II.” means an employee not coming within the definition of “Announcer Class I.”, but who is employed on the announcing of the time of day, playing of records and/or controlling transcriptions and/or making announcements, including reading of news, stock reports, or sporting results, but does not include other “specialty work” or to “ad lib” for more than one minute at any one time.

3. That clauses No. 16 and No. 17 of the said Determination be re-numbered to read Nos. 18 and 19, respectively.

4. That this Determination of the Industrial Appeals Court come into force and be operative as from the 1st January, 1953.
