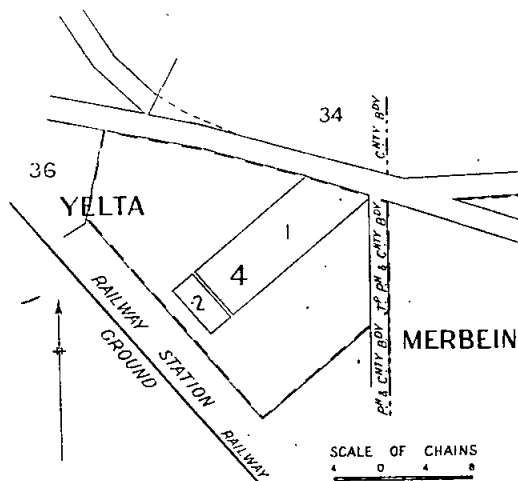

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928* as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933* do by this my Proclamation rescind the Proclamation dated 9th May 1870 defining a certain area of land in the Parish of Yelta as a Town (see *Government Gazette* 1870 page 711) and the Proclamation dated 24th January 1950 defining a certain area of land in the Parish of Yelta as a Township under the designation of Cowanna (see *Government Gazette* 1950 page 742) and do hereby proclaim as a Township under the designation of Yelta the area of land in the Parish of Yelta, County of Millewa within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(C.488(1) (Y.102(3) (C.95264).

Weights and Measures Acts.

PROCLAMATION OF CORANGAMITE WEIGHTS AND
MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Weights and Measures Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at the request of two or more municipalities declare such municipalities to be a Union for the purposes of the said Acts:

Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Weights and Measures Acts do by this my Proclamation declare the Town of Colac, the Borough of Camperdown and the Shires of Colac, Hampden, Heytesbury, Mortlake and Otway to be a Union for the purposes of the said Acts under the title of the "Corangamite

Weights and Measures Union" and do further declare that the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on the Union shall be as follows (that is to say):—

(1) The amount to be contributed by each such municipality shall bear the same proportion to the expenses devolving upon the Union as the number of persons residing in each such municipality bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities in the Union.

(2) The number of persons residing in each such municipality shall be deemed to be the number of persons residing therein as disclosed by the last periodical census conducted by or on behalf of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

(3) The foregoing provisions shall have effect from the first day of October next after the declaration or publication by or on behalf of the Commonwealth of Australia of the result of the periodical census showing the number of persons residing in each such municipality.

Provided that on the constitution of the said Union and until the thirtieth day of September next after the declaration or publication of the result of the census aforesaid, the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving upon the Union shall be as follows (that is to say):—

Town of Colac	17.1 per centum.
Borough of Camperdown	8.3 per centum.
Shire of Colac	19.0 per centum.
Shire of Hampden	21.1 per centum.
Shire of Heytesbury	16.0 per centum.
Shire of Mortlake	8.6 per centum.
Shire of Otway	9.9 per centum.

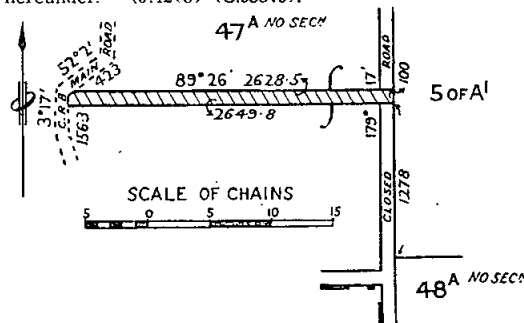

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 79 of the *Marine Act 1928* and all other powers in that behalf enabling, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine as follows:—

That on and after the 1st day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, the pilotage rate from one place to another in Hobsons Bay or Corio Bay, from Hobsons Bay to a Melbourne wharf, or vice versa, from Newport, Footscray, or Yarraville to a Melbourne wharf, or vice versa, or any intermediate distance, for ships towed by steam, steamships, and ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power shall be five-eighths of a penny (½d.) per ton calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage, subject in any case to a minimum charge of Four pounds (£4).

The foregoing ordinance and determination was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held on the third day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three.

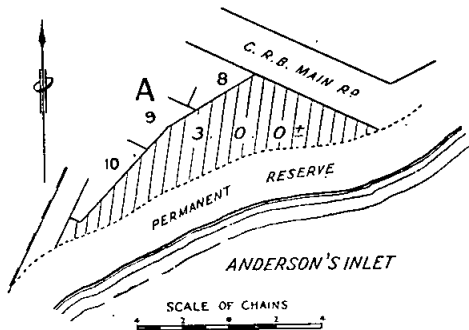

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act 1928* and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XXI.—Scholarships—in the manner following, that is to say:—

1. After clause 29 a new clause 29A as follows shall be inserted:—

“29A (a) A Two Year Diploma bursary shall terminate on the thirty-first day of December of the year next following the year in which the bursary was granted.

(b) A teaching bursary other than a Two Year Diploma bursary shall terminate on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which the bursary was granted.”
2. Clauses 31, 32, and 33 shall be rescinded and the following clauses substituted:—

“31. (a) Every holder of a teaching bursary—

 - (i) shall not later than one year (or such longer period as the Minister may approve in writing) after the termination of the bursary, apply for a studentship in a course of training at a teachers' college or other institution approved for the training of teachers; and
 - (ii) shall, if granted a studentship, thereupon accept it and enter upon and continue, for its full period, the said course of training.

(b) No holder of any such bursary shall relinquish or discontinue his course of study under or in connexion with his bursary without the prior written consent of the Minister.

32. The Minister is authorized to enter into an agreement with any person to whom a teaching bursary is granted and with a surety approved by the Minister in the form or to the like effect set forth in Schedule I.

33. Every person to whom a teaching bursary is granted shall be required as a condition of the granting of such bursary to enter into an agreement with the Minister and a surety approved by the Minister in the appropriate form prescribed by this Regulation.”
3. At the end of paragraph (c) of clause 64, there shall be inserted the following expression:—

“provided however, that a free place shall not be awarded to an officer in a Department where similar facilities are provided, by way of any training scheme or the like, for which he is eligible to apply.”

1. That the student will observe the conditions of tenure of the said bursary as prescribed by the said Regulation or any amendment thereof for the time being in force.

3. That the student will not later than one year (or such longer period as the Minister may approve in writing) after the termination of the said bursary—

- (a) apply for a studentship (under and subject to the provisions of the *Teaching Service Act* 1946 of the said State and the Regulations made thereunder) in a course of training at a teachers' college or other institution approved for the training of teachers; and
- (b) if granted a studentship as aforesaid forthwith accept it and enter upon and continue for its full period the said course of training.

4. That in the event—

- (a) of the cancellation by the Minister of the said bursary on the ground that the student has failed to make satisfactory progress or for any other reason specified in the said Regulation; or
 - (b) of the termination of the said course of training within the period of one year after the commencement thereof for any reason other than death of the student; or
 - (c) of any breach or non-observance of the student of any of the terms of this agreement—
- the student and the surety or one of them will forthwith on demand pay to the Minister a sum equal to the amount of all allowances the benefit of which the student has received during and by virtue of his tenure of the said bursary.

5. That the liability of the surety hereunder shall not be in any way released or discharged by reason of any time or other indulgence which the Minister may in his discretion grant to the student whereby the time or mode of payment of the whole or any portion of the sum mentioned in clause 4 hereof may be extended or altered.

TENDERS will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Friday, 23rd October, 1953, from persons willing to supply the under-mentioned articles, in such quantities as may be ordered by the Victorian Government, during the twelve months commencing on 1st November, 1953:—

The prices tendered must not include sales tax.

Security.—Five per cent. of total amount of tender accepted, but in no case will security of less than £3 be received.

Schedules as above, with full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown and any information afforded to persons tendering.

Should the tenderer be in a position to supply a suitable substitute of Commonwealth production or manufacture in place of any sample exhibited that may be of imported origin, he may tender for such substitute, but must submit with his tender a sample of the article offered.

In all cases the country of origin of the articles tendered must be stated, and the total cost of each item extended in the columns provided.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, preferably by non-negotiable cheque payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board. The amount and designation of the preliminary deposit enclosed must be clearly stated in the tender. Savings Bank deposit book, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within 30 days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either in Commonwealth Treasury Bonds, or approved bank guarantee, fixed deposit receipt, Savings Bank deposit book, or non-negotiable cheque in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of one year, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ————" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.* In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 10 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies

that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.

10. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in Clause 7.

13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. 15. 16. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the

terms of Clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of one year from the date of such disqualification.

By-Law No. 27.

A By-law of the City of Nunawading, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 27, for—

- (a) Prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages.
- (b) Prohibiting or regulating the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land.
- (c) Requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish, the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passage.
2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land.

3. (a) The Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any land, notice in writing, requiring him within a time specified in such notice to remove or destroy any refuse on such land.

- (b) Such owner or occupier shall, within the time limited in such notice, remove or destroy all refuse on such land.

- (c) In this clause the word "Refuse" shall include all refuse and rubbish other than refuse or rubbish, the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Nunawading.

5. Any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or an order by any court.

Resolution for the passing of this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the City of Nunawading on the 17th of August, 1953, and confirmed on the 14th of September, 1953.

CITY OF NUNAWADING.

By-Law No. 30.

A By-law of the City of Nunawading, made under the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 30, for prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles standing in parts of certain streets, appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars, regulating traffic and processions, and repealing By-law No. 8 of the Shire of Blackburn and Mitcham and other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Nunawading order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Cattle" includes every animal of the horse, ass, mule, ox, sheep, goat, and swine species respectively.

"Circus Animal" includes every animal not included in the meaning of the word "Cattle," as above defined, except fowls, geese, turkeys, ducks, pigeons, and other domestic birds of similar species.

"City" means the City of Nunawading.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Nunawading.

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the municipality habitually used by pedestrians and not generally used for vehicular traffic.

"Horse" includes mule and donkey.

"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation of property lines of two or more streets which join at an angle, whether or not such streets cross.

"Motor Car" means any vehicle propelled by steam, gas, oil, electricity, or any mechanical power, and includes motor cycles, but does not include a tram car or tram motor.

"Safety Zone" means a place of refuge for pedestrians established by the Council in any street, in accordance with this By-law.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriageway, lane, thoroughfare, or any other public place within the municipality other than a footway.

"Licensed" means licensed by the Council.

"Rider" means any person in charge of a horse.

"Vehicle" includes any cycle and any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical process, but does not include a tram car or tram motor.

"Public Place" includes and applies to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare, notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare may be formed on private property and also any public park, garden, or reserve.

No. 228.

"Writing" includes printing, lithography, or other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form. Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. No person shall leave a motor car or other vehicle (whether unattended or not), standing in any of the following places in the City of Nunawading:—

- (a) within 30 feet of an intersection;
- (b) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant, horse trough, or any entry by which the public are admitted to a Railway Station;
- (c) in front of a private driveway;
- (d) alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction or within a distance of 15 feet either side of a postal pillar box or a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street when traffic would be obstructed.

Provided that this By-law shall not apply to a fire brigade vehicle standing at or near a fire hydrant or a postal vehicle standing at or near a postal pillar box or to a motor car whilst being supplied with petrol from a petrol pump erected on the kerb or to a petrol waggon whilst engaged in supplying petrol to a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street.

3. No person shall leave (whether unattended or not) a motor car or other vehicle standing in any street or road or part thereof specified in Schedule 1 hereof. Provided always that any person may for the purpose of loading or unloading goods thereon or therefrom leave a motor car or other vehicle in any such street or road or part thereof for not more than 30 minutes.

4. The portions of the streets set out in Schedule 2 hereof are hereby prescribed as standings of Hackney Carriages and Municipal Stage Carriages.

5. The owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicle left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road shall, when requested by an officer of the Council or a member of the Police Force, give to such officer or member of the Police Force information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or has left such motor car or other vehicle so standing in contravention of this By-law.

6. No person shall stop, stand, or leave a vehicle on any street for the primary purpose of displaying an advertisement.

7. No person shall leave a vehicle (other a tram car) on any street otherwise than in such a position that the left or near wheels thereof are parallel with and not more than ten inches from the kerb on the left or near side of such street or at a lesser distance than three feet from any other vehicle. Provided further that this Regulation shall not apply to a vehicle standing in a lawfully constituted parking area.

8. No driver shall in the following streets make a full "U" turn:—

- South-parade, Blackburn, between Blackburn-road and Main-street;
- Mitcham-road, Mitcham, between Whitehorse-road and the Railway;
- Station-street, Mitcham, between Whitehorse-road and the Railway.

9. The driver of a vehicle on any street shall when stopping such vehicle for the purpose of taking up or setting down any goods keep such vehicle as near as practicable to the kerb on the left or near side of such street. Provided that on any street in which there is only one-way traffic the driver may stop such vehicle for such purpose as near as practicable to the kerb on the right or off side.

10. Every driver of a motor car or bicycle upon any street shall within reasonable distance, and before passing any other vehicle, horse, or pedestrian, give audible and sufficient warning of his approach by sounding a horn, bell, or other instrument.

11. No person shall drive any vehicle upon any street, or permit any vehicle to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full uninterrupted view of the street traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle, and no person, while driving any vehicle upon any street shall occupy such a position as will prevent or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid.

12. No person shall ride or lead any horse or other animal, or drive any horse or cattle, or drive or impel any vehicle upon any footway. Provided, however, that a bicycle or motor bicycle may be taken across any footway directly to or from any premises abutting thereon.

13. *Pedestrian Traffic.*—Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to his left hand side of the footway, and shall, when meeting or overtaking any person, pass on the right hand side of such person.

14. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon, whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise.

15. *Street Processions.*—Before any procession of vehicles, motor cars, persons, or animals, or of any combination of vehicles, motor cars, persons, or animals, shall, except for military or funeral purposes, pass or proceed through or along any road, street, or highway within the municipality, at least 21 days' previous notice, in writing, of intention to hold such procession shall be given to the Town Clerk, who shall submit such notice to the Council at its first meeting held subsequent to the receipt thereof by him. The Council shall thereupon deal with such notice, and may, by Resolution—

- (a) appoint the day on which such procession shall be held;
- (b) appoint the hours of the day between which such procession shall be held;
- (c) specify the route along which such procession shall proceed; and
- (d) specify what flags, banners, symbols, signs, or placards (if any) shall be permitted to be carried or exhibited by or in such procession.

Every such procession shall be conducted in such a quiet, orderly, and circumspect manner as to avoid any breach of the peace or undue interference with the traffic on the route so specified. Not more than four persons shall march or proceed abreast in such procession, and all the clauses of this By-law relating to the regulation of traffic shall be observed and complied with by such procession and the persons constituting the same. Every person who takes part in any procession held contrary to the provisions of this By-law or in connexion with which the whole of the terms of any such Resolution of the Council as aforesaid regarding such procession shall be guilty of an offence against the By-law and punishable accordingly.

16. No person shall wear or carry in any street or footway any pin or other article or any implement in such manner as is likely to inflict injury by coming in contact with any other person.

17. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle having less than four wheels any material, article, or thing exceeding 25 feet in length.

18. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle any material, article, or thing which whether forming the whole or part only of the load projects more than two feet outside the line of the wheels or sides of the vehicle.

19. No person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle anything in such a manner that any part of the thing carried touches or comes in contact with the surface of the street.

20. (1) No person shall, in any street, at one and the same time act as driver, or have the sole charge of more than one vehicle drawn by animal power, or of more than two vehicles fastened together or of two vehicles fastened together by a tow line or connexion exceeding 12 feet in length.

(2) No person under fifteen years of age shall in any street act as the driver or have the sole charge of any vehicle (other than a push bicycle) driven within the municipality for business or trade purposes.

21. No person shall at any time between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the afternoon of any day cause interruption or annoyance to passengers upon any street or footway by raising or discharging dust or causing water to flow upon or across such street or footway whether from buildings in process of demolition or otherwise.

22. No person shall litter any street or footway by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

23. No person shall drive along Whitehorse-road between Doncaster East-road, Mitcham, and Middleborough-road, Blackburn; Mitcham-road between Quarry-road and Canterbury-road, Mitcham; Railway-road between Whitehorse-road and Station-street; or Blackburn-road between Railway-road and Walsham-road, Blackburn, any horses, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, or sheep between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and

7 o'clock in the afternoon. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses in saddle or harness or oxen in the yoke.

24. No person shall, except between the hours of 12 o'clock midnight and 7 o'clock in the morning, drive, draw or take, or cause to be driven, drawn, or taken any circus animal on or along any street or road.

25. Clauses 1, 2, 4 to 10 inclusive, 14, 18 to 26 inclusive, and 30 of By-law No. 8 of the Shire of Blackburn and Mitcham are hereby repealed.

26. This By-law shall, except as herein expressly provided, apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Nunawading.

A By-law of the Shire of Avoca, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act* 1946, and numbered 16, for regulating vehicular traffic in High-street, Avoca.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act*, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Avoca, do order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 14/47 is hereby repealed.

2. The words: “High-street” shall mean, for the purpose of and in construction of the said clauses, where it lies between Hart-street and North-street, shall be deemed to consist and treated as consisting of two separate streets running parallel with one another: that portion extending from the buildings on the west side of High-street to the west side of the plantations therein shall be one street, and that portion extending from the buildings on the east side of such street to the east side of the said plantations shall be another street.

3. The words: "Vehicle" in the following clauses, as defined in the Road Traffic Regulations (Country) 1944, includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power, but does not include railway locomotive or other railway rolling stock, or any vehicle for which standing places may be fixed or appointed by the Council of the Shire of Avoca under the powers conferred by any Act other than Act 3590.

4. (a) The two roadways in High-street lying respectively to the east and west of the centre plantations shall, between Hart-street and North-street, each be deemed to constitute a one-way street for any vehicle.

(b) The roadways between the centre plantation blocks shall for vehicular purposes be deemed to be cross streets or roadways in relation to the east and west roadways of High-street.

5. (a) All vehicles in High-street proceeding in a northerly direction between Hart-street and North-street shall travel on the west roadway of High-street.

(b) The driver or person controlling, or person in charge of any vehicle, who ceases to proceed in a northerly direction along High-street, between Hart-street and North-street, shall not allow such vehicle to remain stationary on the east side of roadway in High-street.

(c) All vehicles in High-street proceeding in a southerly direction between North-street and Hart-street, shall travel on the east side of High-street.

(d) The driver or person controlling, or person in charge of any vehicle, who ceases to proceed in a southerly direction along High-street between North-street and Hart-street, shall not allow such vehicle to remain stationary on the west side of roadway in High-street.

6. The driver or person controlling or person in charge of any vehicle or horse on any street shall when stopping such vehicle or horse keep it as near as practicable and parallel to the edge of the carriageway on the left side of such street.

7. No vehicle shall park within thirty (30) feet of any street intersection in High-street as defined by clause 5.

8. Any person who shall offend against any provision of this By-law, shall, on conviction, for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty (20) pounds.

By-Law No. 21.

A. By-law of the Shire of Karkarooc, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1946*, and numbered 21, for the purpose of—

(a) regulating the use of streets, roads, and public places by street hawkers and itinerant traders;

(b) prohibiting or regulating the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, or other vehicles, boxes, baskets, or other receptacles standing or placed on vacant land within certain areas within the municipal district.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1946*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Karkarooc order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context—

"Street" and "road" respectively mean a street or road being a public highway and includes every public highway.

"Public place" means a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*.

"Footway" means every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or public place within any Township within the Shire of Karkarooc generally used by pedestrians and not vehicular traffic.

"Goods" means and includes flowers, fruit, vegetables, fish, meat, poultry, game, footstuffs, merchandise, articles and things of any class or description.

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Karkarooc.

2. No person shall sell or assist in selling or expose or offer for sale any goods in or upon any street, road, footway, or public place within the Shire of Karkarooc unless licensed to do so as hereinafter provided.

3. Any person desiring to sell or to assist in selling or expose or offer for sale any goods on any street, road, or footway, shall make application, in writing, to the Council for a licence to do so and shall state the class of goods he desires to sell or assist in selling or expose or offer for sale and the place or places where he desires to sell or assist in selling or expose or offer for sale.

4. Any licence issued under this By-law shall state the stand or site to be occupied by the licensee and the description of the goods licensed to be sold or exposed or offered for sale.

5. On and after the 1st day of January, 1953, no person shall, without the previous consent in writing of the Council, erect or use on any land within any Township within the Shire of Karkarooc any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefrom, or sell or expose or offer for sale any goods in or from any such tent, structure, or building.

6. No person shall, without the previous consent in writing of the Council, sell or assist in selling or expose or offer for sale any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag, or other receptacle standing or placed on any vacant land (not being Crown land, or land under the care and management of the Shire of Karkarooc or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, within any Township within the said Shire.

7. No person shall without the previous consent, in writing, of the Council sell or assist in selling or expose or offer for sale any goods from any stand, stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, or any other vehicle, box, crate, basket, bag or other receptacle standing or placed on any street, road or footway or any part thereof or on any public place within any Township within the said Shire.

8. Notwithstanding any consent given by the Council under this By-law no person shall in or upon any street, road or footway obstruct or hinder any member of the public in the free and proper use of such street, road or footway.

9. No child (as defined by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*) shall be employed as a street-hawker or itinerant trader nor be permitted to manage or occupy a stand in any street, road or public place.

10. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

11. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Karkarooc.

Resolution for passing this By-law No. 21 was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Karkaroc on the 12th day of August, 1952, and confirmed at a meeting of the Council held on the 9th day of September, 1952.
