



THE Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the Land Act 1928 as amended by section 2 of the Land Act 1933 do by this my Proclamation revoke the Order dated 30th July 1853 fixing the site for a Township at Beechworth, on the Spring Creek, May Day Hills (see Government Guzette 1853 page 1073) and rescind the Proclamation dated 23rd March 1896 defining a certain area of land as the Township of Beechworth (see Government Guzette 1896 page 1634) and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim as a Township distinguished by the name of Beechworth the area of land in the Parish of Beechworth, County of Bogong within the boundaries indicated by conventional township sign on the plan hereunder.—(B.348(3) (B.349(1), 12) (C.94029).





By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the

Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such publication become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Maryborough has requested that the land hereinafted mentioned, reserved for a street within the said Borough, be so declared to be a public highway: Now, therefore, I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, declare that all that piece of land reserved for a street, being part of Crown allotment 1, section 3, Town and Parish of Maryborough, and being the land indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

BAG LIMIT FOR TROUT TAKEN FROM LAKE LEARMONTH AND ANY WATERS FLOWING THEREINTO (EXCEPT MORTON'S CUTTING).





THE GOROKE ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDER No. 264, 1950—AMENDMENT TO TARIFF.

WHEREAS on the 28th day of March, 1950, the Goroke Freezing and Trading Company Proprietary Limited was granted an Order in Council, under the Electric Light and Power Act 1928, cited as the Goroke Electric Lighting Order No. 264, 1950 (hereinafter called "the said Order") authorizing the said Goroke Freezing and Trading Company Proprietary Limited to supply electricity within an area comprising all that land within a circle having a radius of 1 mile, with its centre at the Post Office at Goroke, for a period of ten years, commencing on the 28th day of March, 1950: And whereas, in pursuance of a deed of assignment dated the 28th day of April, 1953, between the Goroke Freezing and Trading Company Proprietary Limited and Leland Claude Smith, the

Governor in Council, on the 19th day of May, 1953, approved of the transfer of the powers, duties, and liabilities under the said Order to the aforesaid Leland Claude Smith: And whereas the aforesaid Leland Claude Smith has made application to have an amendment made to the Fourth Schedule annexed to the said Order to vary the rates therein set forth as the charges which may be charged for electricity supplied: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, acting pursuant to the provisions of section 13 of the Electric Light and Power Act 1928, doth hereby vary the charges which may be charged for electricity supplied, as set forth in the said Order, by substituting the following sections for section 1 and section 3 of the Fourth Schedule, that is to say:-

#### SECTION 1.

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him, they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For electricity supplied for lighting purposes-

One shilling and six pence (1s. 6d.) per kilowatt-hour.

For electricity supplied for purposes other than lighting-

Nine pence (9d.) per kilowatt-hour.

#### SECTION 3.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of Nine shillings (9s.) per month irrespective of whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes. Such minimum charge shall be exclusive of meter rent.

# METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD (CONTRIBUTIONS) REGULATIONS, 1953.

HEREAS by the Fire Brigades Acts it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make regulations for all or any of the purposes set forth in the said Acts: And whereas by section 40 of the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is further enacted that all regulations as to the metropolitan district shall be prepared by the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board and submitted to the Minister for approval prior to being made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Regulations set forth hereunder were prepared by the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board and submitted to the Minister for his approval: And whereas such Regulations have been approved by the Minister: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Fire Brigades Acts, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board (Contributions) Regulations 1953" and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- 2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the subject matter or context—
  - (a) "Act" means the Fire Brigades Act 1928, and any Act amending the same.
    - "Owner" in relation to any property means any person having an insurable interest therein.
    - "The Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board for the time being and shall also mean and include any other officer or person appointed by the Board for the purpose of discharging the duties and exercising the powers of the Secretary, and includes any person for the time being acting as or de facto exercising the powers of the Secretary of the Board.
  - (b) The Acts Interpretation Act 1928 as amended by any subsequent Act or Acts shall be deemed to apply to these Regulations as though these Regulations were an Act of the Parliament of Victoria.
- 3. Every insurance company insuring from fire property within the metropolitan district shall apply for registration by the Board in manner hereinafter appearing.
- 4. (a) Where the insurance company is a corporate body incorporated outside of Victoria it shall in writing nominate and appoint an agent or representative resident in or, if corporate, incorporated in Victoria who shall apply as aforesaid for registration of such insurance company by the Board.
- (b) Where the insurance company is unincorporated and the person constituting such company is not resident in Victoria, he shall in writing under his hand nominate and appoint an agent or representative resident in or, if corporate, incorporated in Victoria who shall apply for registration of such unincorporated insurance company by the Board as aforesaid.

- 5. (a) Application for registration pursuant to Regulation 3 hereof shall be made in the form or to the effect set forth in the First Schedule hereto and pursuant to Regulation 4 hereof shall be made in the form or to the effect set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (b) To every application for registration there shall be annexed a statutory declaration made by the applicant, or where the applicant is incorporated, its secretary or other proper officer verifying the contents of such application.
- (c) If the Board is satisfied that the application has been duly made or that any irregularity in the form of application as hereinbefore provided is not material, it shall register the insurance company in a Register of Insurance Companies which shall be maintained by the Board for the purpose, and where such application is made by an agent or representative nominated or appointed pursuant to Regulation 4 hereof shall record the name and particulars of such agent or representative, but otherwise it shall refuse to register such company.
- (d) Every insurance company and in the case of an insurance company incorporated or resident outside of Victoria the agent or representative thereof shall notify the Board of any change in the particulars in the application for registration and the Board may accordingly amend the particulars in the Register and the Certificate of Registration shall if required be returned to the Board for amendment.
- (e) Any insurance company ceasing to insure from fire property within the metropolitan district may apply to be deregistered and the Board if satisfied that such company has so ceased to insure from fire property within the metropolitan district shall cancel the said registration and the Certificate of Registration shall be returned to the Board and cancelled accordingly.
- (f) A certificate signed by the Secretary as to any matter appearing on the Register shall be sufficient evidence thereof and the registration of any insurance company shall be sufficient evidence that such company insures from fire property within the metropolitan district.
- 6. The Secretary shall issue to each insurance company or to the agent or representative of each insurance company which has been registered by the Board as aforesaid a Certificate of Registration in the appropriate form set forth in the Third Schedule hereto. Such certificate shall be displayed at the place of business or registered office of the insurance company, agent or representative during the ordinary hours of business.
- 7. The Board by notice in writing signed by the Secretary may require the owner of any property situated within the metropolitan district to furnish to it particulars of any contract of insurance entered into in respect to that property, and without affecting the generality of the foregoing such particulars shall include—
  - (a) The full name and address of the insurer.
  - (b) The period in respect of which the contract of insurance will continue in operation, and
  - (c) The premium paid in respect of such contract.

Default by any such owner to furnish such particulars within fourteen days from the service of such notice shall constitute a breach of these Regulations.

- 8. (a) Where an insurance company (whether or not registered under these Regulations) fails to pay any sum payable by it pursuant to the Act within fourteen days after demand therefor has been made, the Board may serve upon the owner of any property situated within the metropolitan district which is insured by such insurance company against loss or damage by fire notice in writing signed by the Secretary requiring him to pay to the Board so much of the sum payable to it as aforesaid or of the balance of such sum as shall not exceed the amount of the premium payable to the said company by such owner on the issue or renewal of any fire policy on such property.
- (b) Upon the service of such notice as aforesaid the sum shown therein as being payable to the Board shall become so payable by the person upon whom the notice is served immediately upon the premium referred to in paragraph (a) hereof becoming payable and such sum shall be paid to the Board by such person within fourteen days of becoming payable as aforesaid.

- (c) Any person paying any sum payable in the first instance by an insurance company may deduct such sum from any premium or premiums then or thereafter payable by him to such insurance company or may recover such sum from such insurance company which shall be and be deemed to be liable to pay such sum on demand.
- 9. (a) The expenses and charges made by the Board in the circumstances set forth in section 49 or in section 68 of the Act shall not exceed those hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

- (b) The expenses and charges made by the Board shall in no case exceed one-fifth of the actual value of the house, building or property, saved from destruction or damage by fire.
- (c) The owner of any uninsured house or building or of any uninsured personal property therein who has contributed towards the estimated expenditure which may be necessary to be incurred by the Board in the execution of the Act during the financial year in which a fire in or of such house, building or personal property occurs such sum as the Board in all the circumstances deems reasonable shall not be required to pay the expenses and charges set forth in paragraph (a) hereof.
- Any notice or demand required by these Regulations to be given or served upon any person may be given or served—
  - (a) by delivering it to such person or if such person be a company to the manager or secretary thereof, or
  - (b) by leaving it at the last-known place of abode or business of such person or if such person be a company at the registered office or place of business thereof, or
  - (c) by addressing, prepaying and posting it to such person at his last-known place of abode or business or if such person be a company to the registered office or place of business thereof.

- 11. (a) Every insurance company carrying on the business of insuring from fire property within the metropolitan district which continues to carry on the said business after the expiration of three months from the coming into operation of these Regulations without such company being registered as aforesaid shall and the agent or representative of such company shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be guilty of a further offence if after such conviction it continues to carry on the said business without being so registered.
- (b) After the expiration of three months from the coming into operation of these Regulations and without affecting the validity of any contract of insurance, any insurance company or its agent or representative which makes or renews any contract of insurance from fire of any property within the metropolitan district without being registered as aforesaid shall in respect of each such contract or renewal be guilty of an offence.
- (c) It shall be the duty of every agent or representative appearing in the Register as such to ensure compliance by the principal of such agent or representative with these Regulations and every such agent or representative shall be liable to be convicted and be punishable for every offence against these Regulations committed by the principal and shall be liable for all debts due by any insurance company to the Board.
- 12. Nothing in these Regulations shall affect the validity of any contract of insurance or the renewal thereof.
- 13. Every person who does any act forbidden by these Regulations or permits or allows such act to be done or fails to do any act required by these Regulations to be done or neglects or refuses to carry out or comply with any notice or demand given by the Board or by the Secretary pursuant to these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 14. For every breach of or offence against these Regulations not being a breach of or offence against the Act, there shall be imposed a maximum penalty of Five pounds.
- 15. These Regulations shall be deemed to be severable to the intent that the invalidity of any Regulation shall not affect the validity of any other Regulations. Insofar as any Regulation would but for this Regulation have been construed as being in excess of the power to make such Regulation it shall nevertheless be a valid Regulation to the extent to which it is not in excess of the power to make the said Regulation.



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, A MANAGEMENT OF "THE BYADUK PUB RECREATION (CREEK FRONTAGE) RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Township of Byaduk temporarily reserved as sites for Public Recreation by Orders in Council dated the fifteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, the twenty-seventh day of November, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, and the tenth day of February, One thousand fifty-one, and the tenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-three, and known as "The Byaduk Public Recreation (Creek Frontage) Reserve," and herein-after referred to as the "Reserve."

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be divided as follows:-
  - 1st Division-Swimming Pool Area.
  - 2nd Division—Tennis Courts and Tennis Pavilion.
    3rd Division—J. A. Christie Oval.
    4th Division—remainder of the Reserve.
- 2. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
- 3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or
- 4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, lawns, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates in or around the Reserve nor stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, erections, gates, fences, seats, or trees, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 6. No person shall put or bring into the Reserve any dog, cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall camp on the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Divisions of the said Reserve, and no person shall camp on the 4th Division of the said Reserve, without the prior permission of the Committee of Management.
- $8.\,{\rm No}$  person shall erect in the Reserve any structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- No person shall offer for sale within the Reserve any article or articles without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 10. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 12. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any Regulation or notice and fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.
- 13. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut, or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee of Management.
- 14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- 15. Any person committing in the Reserve or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable forthwith to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for or be in possession of a ticket of

membership of any of the clubs playing tennis or swimming or any other game or practising in respect of any sport or game on the said Reserve, or any part thereof, with the consent of the Committee of Management:—

- (a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Walking on the tennis courts at any time unless entitled to use the same as provided in Regulation 18 hereof, and unless wearing rubber-soled footwear without heels.
- (d) Using the swimming pool and adjacent portions of the said Reserve unless properly and decently clad.
- (e) Crossing or trespassing on the playing areas of the tennis club or the J. A. Christie Oval during the progress of any match or practice.
- 16. Public betting in any part or division of the Reserve shall not be permitted without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.
- 17. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.
- 18. No person shall be entitled to play any game or practise or take part in such practise in any division or part of any division of the Reserve unless:—
  - (a) He is a financial member of one of the clubs that have been granted permission, in writing, by the Committee of Management to play or practise, as the case may be, any game on such division or part of such division; or

    (b) He is an invited guest of one of the clubs afore-said or

  - said; or (c) In respect of the 4th Division of the said Reserve he has first obtained permission, in writing, from the Committee of Management so to engage in any sport or game;
    (d) Provided always that no organized or competitive

  - (a) Provided always that no organized or competitive sport or organized practise for any sport or game shall be permitted on any portion of the said Reserve on any Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or Anzac Day;
    (e) Provided further that no intoxicating liquor shall be brought or consumed on any portion of the said Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, first had and obtained obtained.

Provided that any person not otherwise offending against Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the 1st and 2nd Divisions of the Reserve and swim or play tennis thereon, as the case may be, on paying to the club or association for the time being permitted to use the 1st and 2nd Divisions of the said Reserve respectively such amount as swimming or court fee as such club or association shall fix, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management.

19. The 3rd Division of the said Reserve shall be known at all times as the "J. A. Christie Oval."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 7th April, 1870, as a site for Recreative purposes at Darlington, and known as the "Darlington Recreation Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Five (5) shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animal without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- 10. No person shall bet publicly in the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures or Reserve.
- 11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, or erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fête, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum of money which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.487.)
