ADDITION TO THE BENALLA AND DISTRICT WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Weights and Measures Acts, it is amongst other things enacted that at the request of the Councils of all the municipalities concerned, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any municipality specified in such Proclamation shall be added to and form part of a Union:

And whereas the Borough of Benalla and the Shires of Benalla, Tungamah and Violet Town do constitute a Union under the title of the "Benalla and District Weights and Measures Union" for the purposes of the Weights and Measures Acts:

And whereas the Councils of each of the said municipalities and the Council of the Shire of Cobram have requested that the Shire of Cobram should be added to and form part of the said Union:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that, as from the seventh day of December, 1953, the Shire of Cobram shall be added to and form part of the said Union, and do fix as follows the apportionment among the municipalities of the Union (as reconstituted by this Proclamation) of the expenses devolving on the Union under the said Acts:—

Borough of Benalla 37 per centum. Shire of Benalla .. 22 per centum. Shire of Cobram .. 20 per centum. Shire of Tungamah .. 13 per centum. . . Shire of Violet Town 8 per centum.



those portions of the Twenty-first Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the Shires of Gordon and Rochester;
those portions of the Twenty-second Fire Control Region comprised by the municipal districts of the City of Shepparton, the Borough of Echuca and the Shires of Cobram, Deakin, Numurkah, Rodney, Shepparton, Tungamah and Waranga; and the Twenty-third Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Boroughs of Benalla and Wangaratta and the Shires of Benalla, Oxley, Rutherglen, Wangaratta and Yarrawonga.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LITTLE LAKE BULOKE RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any Public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands reserved for Public purposes in the Parish of Witchipool as indicated by red colour on plan W/4.9.53, attached to Lands Department Correspondence Rs.2802, and known as the "Little Lake Buloke Recreation Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve":—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, excepting on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for picnics, sports, races, cricket, or football matches, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for admission of every adult person to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs, embankments, out-houses, buildings, or fences within the Reserve.
- 4. No fires shall be lighted in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- $\,$ 5. No person shall deposit rubbish of any description on the Reserve.
- 6. No person shall leave bottles or tins on the Reserve, and the Committee of Management may take proceedings against any person breaking bottles on the Reserve.
- 7. No person, other than the person who holds annually the right to graze the Reserve, shall bring into or put therein any cattle, sheep, or other animals except as provided in clause 8.
- 8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, excepting that it be controlled by a chain or cord.
- 9. No person shall erect any building, booth, or other structure, on the Reserve without first obtaining the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 10. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first having been obtained, and then only subject to payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

- 11. Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for, or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof, with the consent of the Committee of Management:—
 - (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or abusive language.
 - (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- 12. Applications for the use of the Reserve shall be made to the Committee of Management, and such Committee may make demand and receive the following focci.
 - Holding Picnics.—Sunday Schools and Day Schools, for day, £1 1s. (the fee will be refunded subject to the Committee of Management being satisfied that the Reserve has been left clean and free of rubbish, including bottles, glass, and empty tins).
 - For sport or other amusements, a fee of £1 1s. per day will be made.
- 13. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any persons, club, or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.2802.)

Prices Regulation Acts.

PRICES REGULATION ORDER No. 600.

MILK-GEELONG AREA.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Regulation Acts, I, John Francis Waldron, Prices Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Regulation Order No. 600.

Revocation.

2. Prices Regulation Order No. 530 is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

- 3. (1) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears:-
 - "By retail" or "by wholesale" means in relation to any sale of milk in the Geelong area, that such sale is a sale by retail or by wholesale as the case may be, but is not a sale by semi-wholesale.
 - " By semi-wholesale" means, in relation to the sale of any milk in the Geelong area: $\,$
 - (a) that such milk is sold by a retailer to a person to whom the retailer has, on the day of the sale, sold a quantity of milk (including that comprised in such first mentioned sale) exceeding 2 gallons; or
 - (b) is a sale to a person who conducts a shop where milk is sold separately from any milk round.

- "Geelong area" means all that area of Victoria comprised in the Boroughs of Geelong, Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell and Queenscliff, and the Shires of Barrabool, Pellarine, Corio and South Barwon.
- "Treatment" includes the pasteurization, cooling, chilling, refrigerating of milk and "treated" has a corresponding meaning.
- (2). For the purpose of this Order, where any post office, or principal post office of any place, is situated within the Geelong area but less than 3 miles from any boundary line thereof, then all places within 3 miles of that post office or principal post office, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be within the Geelong area.

Maximum Prices-Geelong Area.

- 4. I fix and declare the maximum prices at which milk may be sold for delivery in the Geelong area, including any cost of delivery to the purchaser, to be—
 - (a) in respect of sales by wholesale—3s. 4½d. per gallon;
 - (b) in respect of sales by semi-wholesale-
 - (1) loose-5s. 0ld. per gallon
 - (2) in bottles 5s. 44d. per gallon.
 - (c) in respect of sales by retail-

Provided that the maximum price for milk supplied to persons having milk delivered to them regularly in retail quantities of 1 quart or more per day shell be computed on a weekly basis by multiplying the total quartage delivered during such week by the maximum price per quart fixed by this sub-paragraph.

Maximum Prices-Treatment Depots.

- 5. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold to any person (other than a retailer) for treatment in the Geelong area to be the maximum price for the sale of that milk by wholesale in that area.
- 6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold by wholesale by any person who has purchased that milk and treated that milk in the Geelong area to be the maximum price fixed for the sale of that milk by wholesale in that area plus an amount computed at the rate of 3d. per gallon.

Fixation of Maximum Price by Notice-

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I fix and declare the maximum price at which milk may be sold in the Geelong area by any person to whom a notice in pursuance of this clause is given to be the price fixed by the Prices Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
