WHEREAS by section 64 of the *Education Act* 1928 it is provided that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare any schools to be district high schools: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the under-mentioned school to be a district high school, from and inclusive of the ninth day of March, 1954, that is to say:—

YARRAWONGA HIGHER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.

### CLOSE SEASON FOR STUBBLE QUAIL.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my Proclamation remove the period of the close season set opposite the name of the under-mentioned bird in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act* 1928 by Proclamation dated the third day of March 1953 and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fourth day of March, 1953, and prescribe instead of such period the period from the first day of August in each year to the last day preceding the first

Saturday in May next following (both days inclusive) which period shall be set opposite the name of the said bird in the said Schedule.

### BIRD REFERRED TO ABOVE.

Quail Stubble (*Coturnix pectoralis*).

I do further direct that this Proclamation shall come into operation after the expiration of a period of two days from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

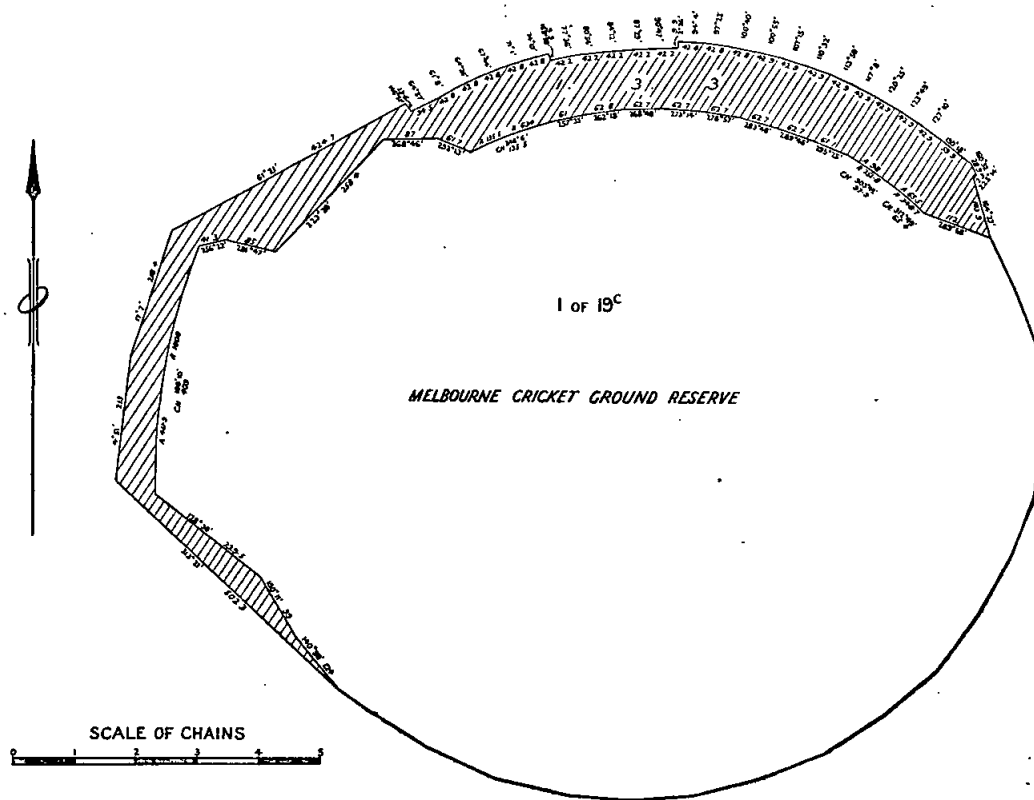
## MELBOURNE CRICKET GROUNDS ACTS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the  
Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor in the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive  
Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in sub-section (1) of section 3 of the  
*Melbourne Cricket Ground Act 1951* do by this my Proclamation revoke and make null and void the Order in  
Council of the ninth day of June One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three by which certain land in the  
City of Melbourne, Parish of Melbourne North was permanently reserved as a site for public park and also the  
Crown grant bearing date the thirteenth day of June One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three in respect of  
such public park to the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors and Citizens of the City  
of Melbourne (now the Lord Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Melbourne), so far only as relates to  
an area of one acre three roods and three perches as indicated by hachure on the plan herewith, such area being  
required for additional accommodation at the Melbourne Cricket Ground.

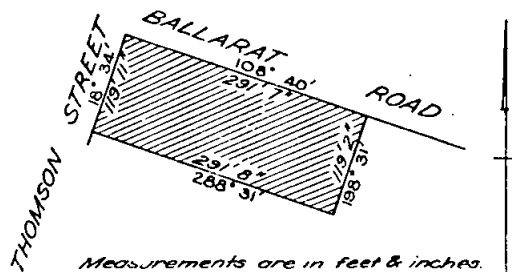

CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES (ADVISORY COUNCIL)  
REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the *Co-operation Act 1953* and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

*Citation.*

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Co-operative Societies (Advisory Council) Regulations, and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

*Interpretation.*

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Act” means the *Co-operation Act 1953*.

Expressions used have the same meaning as those ascribed to them by the *Co-operation Act 1953*.

“Council” means the Co-operative Societies Advisory Council constituted under the said Act.

*Quorum.*

3. A quorum of the council shall consist of a number of members being not less than half the full number of members for the time being.

*Meetings.*

4. (I.) The council shall hold meetings at such places and on such days and at such hours as the registrar from time to time appoints. Provided that a meeting shall be called by the registrar at the request of the other members of the Council.

(II.) At every meeting of the council the chairman, or in his absence a member chosen by the members present to be chairman of the meeting, shall preside, and the decision of the majority of the members present upon any matter shall be the decision of the council upon that matter except that in the event of an equality of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote.

*Minutes.*

5. At every meeting of the council minutes shall be taken and recorded in the minute-book by the chairman of the meeting or some person appointed by him.

*Confirmation of Minutes.*

6. The minutes of every meeting shall be read and confirmed at the next meeting. Upon the confirmation of the minutes they shall be signed by the chairman of the meeting. Any minutes purporting to be so signed shall be prima facie evidence of the matters therein stated.

*Fees for Members of Council.*

7. (I.) The amount of the fee to be paid, pursuant to sub-section (9) of section 93 of the Act, to each member of the council (other than the chairman) shall be One hundred pounds per annum as from the operation of these Regulations.

(II.) Such fee shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and shall be apportionable in respect of time.

*Travelling Allowances.*

8. The travelling allowances to be paid to members of the council in respect of travelling in the discharge of their duties as such members shall be at the rate and subject to the conditions at present prescribed by the Regulations under the Public Service Acts for officers of the Public Service (other than permanent heads) in receipt of salaries exceeding £900 a year.

#### BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law of the City of Nunawading, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 31, for controlling, managing, and preserving commons and public Reserves of which the management is vested in the Council for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, and persons using or entering in or upon places of public resort or recreation, for regulating the conduct of persons using or being in or upon the same, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Nunawading orders as follows:—

1. Each of the Reserves shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset on each week day except Good Friday or Christmas Day and except on

such days as it may be by the Council set apart for any sporting event, show, fête or holiday amusement on any of which latter days a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six pence may be charged and taken for the admission to such Reserve of any person.

2. (a) Each of the said Reserves shall be open to the public on Sundays between the hours of 1 o'clock in the afternoon and 5.30 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of any recreation which does not involve the playing of a game or sport between two opposing teams.

(b) Each of the said Reserves shall be open to the public on Good Friday and Christmas Day between sunrise and sunset for the purpose of any recreation which does not involve the playing of any game or sport.

3. The Council may collect and receive from any club or association using any Reserve or any part thereof, such charges as may be mutually agreed.

4. No person except the members of the Council, the town clerk, engineer, and employees of the Council on duty, shall enter any part of any Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

5. No person shall damage any building or the furniture or fittings thereof in any of the Reserves.

6. No person shall interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds or borders or climb, jump or get upon or over any of the fences or gates or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures, or roll or throw stones or other missiles or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel or banana peel or any refuse or rubbish whatever or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures.

7. No person shall carry firearms in or through the Reserves or shoot, snare or destroy any birds or game therein unless by authority of the Council.

8. No person shall sell or offer for sale within the Reserves any article of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Council.

9. No person shall light a fire in any of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

10. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserves shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or laid out for the growing of plants or for plantations of trees or shrubs.

11. No person shall bring into or consume in any Reserve any intoxicating liquor.

12. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation shall engage in or play upon, occupy or use the Reserves or any part thereof, without the permission, in writing, of the Council.

13. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, lacrosse, baseball, hockey, tennis, or any other like game in any Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Council, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve.

14. No person other than players or officials or competitors at any sports gathering duly authorized as aforesaid, shall enter or remain within or upon the playing arena in such lands during the progress of any cricket, football, tennis, bowls, or lacrosse match, or sports gathering, nor interrupt nor interfere with any employee of the Council or Management Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.

15. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket, football, tennis, bowls or lacrosse match or sports gathering in such lands when such crossing or trespassing would cause undue interference with the progress of a match or sports gathering.

16. Where any area in such lands has been set apart as a children's playground and swings and other appliances have been provided, the following rules shall apply:—

(a) No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter upon or remain on such area or use any of the swings or other appliances therein, provided, however, that this condition shall not apply to parents or other persons in charge of children who shall be at liberty to enter or remain on such area to watch over children who are in their charge.

(b) Every person being lawfully on such area shall obey the directions of any officer of the Council or of any Constable of Police in respect of his or her conduct therein.

(c) The Council and/or Management Committee shall not be responsible for any accident occurring on any portion of such area or arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances therein.

(d) Children's playgrounds shall not be open for use after the hour of sunset.

17. (a) No person except labourers or workmen employed on the Reserves shall ride or drive any horse or any carriage, cart or other vehicle through the Reserves without the permission of the Council, and no person shall ride any bicycle in the Reserves except on the track set apart for cycling.

(b) No person shall park or leave any motor car or other vehicle in any Reserve except at such places and at such times as are provided for that purpose by the Council.

18. No person shall carry on the trade, business, calling, or occupation of a bookmaker in any of the Reserves and every club, association or person renting or having been granted the use of the ground shall, if so required by the Council, enforce the provisions of the *Sports Betting Suppression Act 1901*, or any statutory modification thereof for the prohibition of betting thereon.

19. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency within any of the Reserves or any building therein.

20. No person shall remain in any of the Reserves at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.

21. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths in or on any structure or erection in any of the Reserves.

22. No horses or cattle shall be allowed in any of the Reserves without the authority of the Council.

23. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog unless led by a cord or chain.

24. Goats and all fowls, ducks, geese, and other poultry found within the Reserves will be destroyed and the owner shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done.

25. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner or creating or taking part in any disturbance or committing any act of indecency in any of the Reserves or refusing to obey those authorized by the Council or by the club, association or person renting or having been granted the use of the ground for the time being to keep order shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to a prosecution for an offence against these By-laws.

26. Upon application to the Council any club, association, society or person may be granted the exclusive use of any or all of the Reserves or any well defined part thereof for the holding of cricket or football matches, shows, sports, fêtes, bicycle races, or other amusements and may charge for admission thereto of persons subject to the provisions of this By-law and shall pay to the Council or its authorized officer such charges as the Council may from time to time fix.

27. *Definitions.*—"Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Nunawading. "The Reserves" shall mean each and every piece of land provided and set apart by the Council for the use and enjoyment of the residents as pleasure grounds, places of public resort or public recreation.

28. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default offend against this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

29. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Nunawading.

30. By-law No. 26 of the Shire of Nunawading shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
