- No. 5780. "An Act to amend Section One hundred and twenty-six of the *Health Act 1928*."
- No. 5781. "An Act to guarantee the Repayment of certain Moneys proposed to be borrowed for the Purpose of effecting Alterations Additions and Improvements to the Melbourne Cricket Ground, and for other purposes."
- No. 5782. "An Act to amend Section Sixteen of the *Superannuation Act 1928*."
- No. 5783. "An Act to amend the Criminal Law in relation to Wilfully False Promises and Company Frauds."
- No. 5784. "An Act relating to the Constitution and Powers of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Tramways Board."
- No. 5785. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Twenty-one million two hundred and thirteen thousand one hundred and seventy-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and fifty-four and One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five."

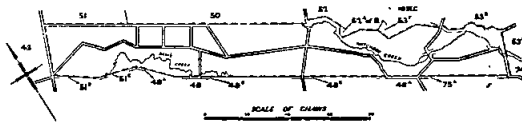

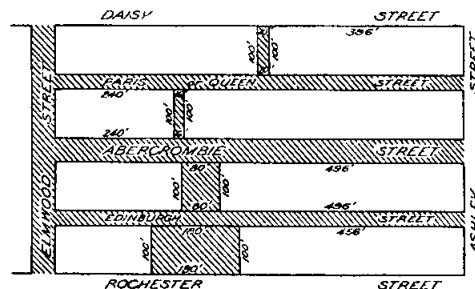
NOTICE OF RESOLUTION UNDER SECTION 40 (4) OF ACT No. 4568.

Prohibiting all fishing in or the taking of fish from the undermentioned waters and any waters which flow either directly or indirectly thereinto and the waters impounded by any weir wall or dam constructed thereon during the period from the first day of May in each year to the last day preceding the first Saturday in September next following both dates inclusive :—

BY-LAW No. 14.

PURSUANT to the *State Electricity Commission (Yallourn Area) Act 1947*, and the Regulations made thereunder by the Governor in Council, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 522, on the 15th day of June, 1949, the Yallourn Town Advisory Council hereby amends By-law No. 14, made the 2nd day of March, 1951, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 18th April, 1951, on the subject matter of prohibiting the leaving (whether unattended or not) of motor cars or other vehicles standing in each street or road or part thereof specified in the By-law, and for requiring the owner or person apparently in control of any motor car or other vehicles left standing (whether unattended or not) in any street or road to give information with respect to any person (other than the said owner or person apparently in control) who is or was the driver of such motor car or vehicle which may lead to the identification of any person who is leaving or who has left such motor car or vehicle in contravention of any By-law:—

1. Paragraph 2 of By-law No. 14 is repealed, and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

2. No person shall between the hours specified in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto leave any motor car or other vehicle (whether unattended or not) in any street or road or part thereof specified in the first column Second Schedule hereto.

2. The First Schedule to By-law No. 14 is amended by adding at the end thereof the following words:—

Fourthly: All that part of Yallourn-road being so much of the west side of Yallourn-road as lies between Parkside and a point in a southerly direction along the west side of Yallourn-road 319 feet distant from the intersection of Yallourn-road and Parkside.

Fifthly: All that part of Parkside being so much of the south side of Parkside as lies between Railway-avenue and a point along the south side of Parkside 850 feet distant from the intersection of Parkside and Railway-avenue.

Sixthly: All that part of Banksia-crescent, being so much of the east side of Banksia-crescent as lies between Fairfield-avenue and Monash-square.

3. The Second Schedule is repealed, and the following Schedule is substituted therefor:—

All that part of Railway-avenue in the Yallourn Town Area, being so much of the west side of Railway-avenue as lies between Broadway and Northway. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "NARRAWONG CAMPING AND RECREATION RESERVE" AND OTHER AREAS.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Town of Narrawong temporarily reserved as a site for Camping and Public Recreation by Order in Council dated the 14th September, 1948, together with that portion of the permanent reservation for Public purposes along the Surry River abutting such land and known as the "Narrawong Camping and Recreation Reserve," and also in respect of that portion of land in the said town fronting the Surry River and Portland Bay as is indicated by red colour on plan marked "N"/1.12.53 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.6212. The said lands are hereinafter together referred to as the "Reserves" and have been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, hereinafter referred to as the "Committee":—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person or organization shall at any time use the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee and upon payment of the prescribed fees.
2. No person in the Reserves shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or commit any act of indecency or offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserves.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserves nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, air gun or any firearm in or upon the Reserves.
6. No person shall erect any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure in the Reserves without the permission of the Committee, and any such tent, booth, stand or building or other structure may be erected only on the site allotted by the Committee.
7. No persons shall, in the Reserves, wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserves, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any member of the Police Force or any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserves or assemble in the Reserves for fêtes, picnics or concerts, or for any purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character without the written permission of the Committee.
9. The Committee shall have power, from time to time, by resolution to fix and regulate the fees to be paid for the use of the Reserves.
10. The Committee may, from time to time, select portions of the Reserves for the parking of cars and vehicles, and all cars and vehicles admitted must be parked in the portions of the Reserves so selected and in such manner as the Committee or an officer appointed by it shall direct.
11. No person shall light a fire in the Reserves, except in a place set apart for that purpose by the Committee, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserves, except by a representative of the Committee and then only in a place set apart for that purpose.
12. A charge, fixed by the Committee, may be made for the admission of any car or vehicle to the Reserves.
13. No competitive organized sport under the jurisdiction of any regular organized body shall be held in the Reserves on Sundays, except with the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
14. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, or otherwise controlled in such a manner as not to be any nuisance or danger to the public.
15. The permission of the Committee must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics or functions of any kind in the Reserves.
16. No person shall disturb the surface, or remove any earth, sand or gravel from the Reserves.

17. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserves for the purpose of any lawful game or sport, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine, the use of grounds so set apart.

18. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves.

19. The Committee shall have power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserves, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserves (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Rs.6212.)

5. (a) Youths shall not be engaged in the following occupations except under indentures of apprenticeship for the periods and subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed:—

Patternmaking, electrical fitting, engineering fitting and turning, first and second class engineering machining, first-class welding, engineering blacksmithing, jobbing moulding and/or coremaking, sheet metal (first-class bench work) motor mechanic.

(b) In the trades immediately hereinafter mentioned the proportion of apprentices which may be taken by any employer shall be as follows:—

- Mechanical engineering—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.
- Electrical fitting—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.
- Electrical mechanic—one apprentice for every 2, or fraction of 2, tradesmen.
- Patternmaking—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.
- Smithing—one apprentice for every 3, or fraction of 3, tradesmen.
- Moulding—one apprentice for every 2, or fraction of 2, tradesmen.

(c) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and in ascertaining such proportion, an employer actually working any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

(i) The period of apprenticeship shall be as follows:—

If the apprentice when articulated is under the age of 17 years, five years; if over the age of 17 years, four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

(ii) An employer especially qualified to teach apprentices may, with the consent of the Secretary for Labour, or of the State Apprenticeship Commission, employ a greater proportion of apprentices to tradesmen than hereinbefore specified.

(iii) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and, if apprenticed, such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship.

(iv) Until further order, any contract of apprenticeship hereafter made may contain the following provision:—

If through lack of orders or through financial difficulties, the employer is unable at any time to find employment and training for an apprentice, and if a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged, the obligations and duties imposed by the indenture may with the concurrence of the apprentice and his guardian be suspended for a period agreed upon, or if no such agreement is arrived at, may be cancelled by the employer. The onus of proof of circumstances justifying such cancellation shall be on the employer.

This clause shall not apply to apprenticeship controlled by the State Apprenticeship Commission, but such Commission shall be free to adopt such schemes for suspension or cancellation of indentures as it may deem reasonable.

- (vii) No apprentice under the age of 18 years shall be liable to work overtime unless he so desires.
- (viii) No apprentice shall work under any system of payment by results.
- (ix) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his 22nd birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.
- (x) The apprentice at the end of the calendar period of any year in which he has actually given service to the master upon less than the ordinary working days prescribed in the Determination for the trade, or in which he has unlawfully absented himself without the master's consent shall, for every day short of the said number of working days, and for every day of such absence, serve one day, and the calendar period of the succeeding year of his service shall not be deemed to begin until the said additional day or days shall have been served.
- (xi) No employer shall, either directly or indirectly, or by any pretence or device, receive from any person or require or permit any person to pay or give any consideration in the nature of a premium or bonus for the taking or binding of any probationer or apprentice.
- (xii) Apprentices attending technical colleges or schools and presenting reports of satisfactory conduct shall be reimbursed all fees paid by them.
- (xiii) Apprentices shall be entitled to annual leave and sick leave in accordance with the provisions of clauses 10A and 14A of this Determination respectively.

- (iv) a covenant by the master to teach and instruct or cause the apprentice to be taught or instructed in the trade to which the apprentice is bound;
- (v) the date at which the apprenticeship is to commence or from which it is to be calculated;
- (vi) all other conditions of apprenticeship.

Cancellation or Suspension of Indenture.

(b) Subject to the approval of the Secretary for Labour, but not otherwise, an indenture of apprenticeship may be suspended or cancelled—

- (i) by mutual consent;
- (ii) if through lack of orders or financial difficulties an employer is unable to find suitable employment for an apprentice and a transfer to another employer cannot be arranged;
- (iii) if, in the opinion of the Secretary for Labour, circumstances exist which render such suspension or cancellation necessary or desirable.

Any covenant in an indenture inconsistent with the provision of this clause shall be null and void and of no force or effect while this Determination remains in force and applies to the parties to the indenture.

Proportion.

(c) The proportion of apprentices who may be taken by an employer shall not exceed one apprentice to every three or fraction of three tradesmen.

For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices, the number of tradesmen shall be deemed to be the average number working during the immediately preceding six months, and in ascertaining such proportion an employer actually working in any workshop shall be deemed to be a tradesman.

A person who is, for a term not exceeding two years taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to journeymen.

An employer may with the consent of the Wages Board and upon satisfying that authority that he has the plant, equipment and staff necessary for the proper tuition of each apprentice concerned take apprentices in excess of the proportion herein prescribed. Until further order apprentices so taken shall not be counted in future calculations of the proportion of apprentices to journeymen authorized by the Determination.

Period of Apprenticeship.

(d) If the apprentice, when indentured, is under the age of seventeen years—five years; if over the age of seventeen—four or five years, at the option of the contracting parties.

Adult Apprentices.

(e) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his 22nd birthday may, by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

Probationary Period.

(f) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and if apprenticed such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. An employer shall within fourteen days of employing a probationer notify the appropriate apprenticeship authorities of the employment of such probationer to any of the trades mentioned herein.

Wages.

(g) The minimum weekly rates of wage for apprentices shall be the under-mentioned percentages of the basic wage, and in addition thereto the war loadings specified, and in all contracts of apprenticeship hereafter made the employer shall covenant to pay wages of not less than such rates.

The total wages of apprentices and improvers shall be calculated to the nearest sixpence, any broken part of sixpence in the result not exceeding threepence to be disregarded.

A person who is, for a term not exceeding two years, taking practical training in a workshop in continuance of a course of training for professional work shall not be taken into account in calculating the proportion of apprentices to journeymen.

Adult Apprentices.

(f) Any apprentice who cannot complete his full term of apprenticeship before reaching his twenty-second birthday may by agreement with his master, serve as an apprentice until he reaches the age of 23 years.

Probationary Period.

(g) Minors may be taken on probation for three months, and if apprenticed such three months shall count as part of their period of apprenticeship. An employer shall within fourteen days of employing a probationer notify the apprenticeship authorities of the employment of such probationer to any of the trades mentioned herein.

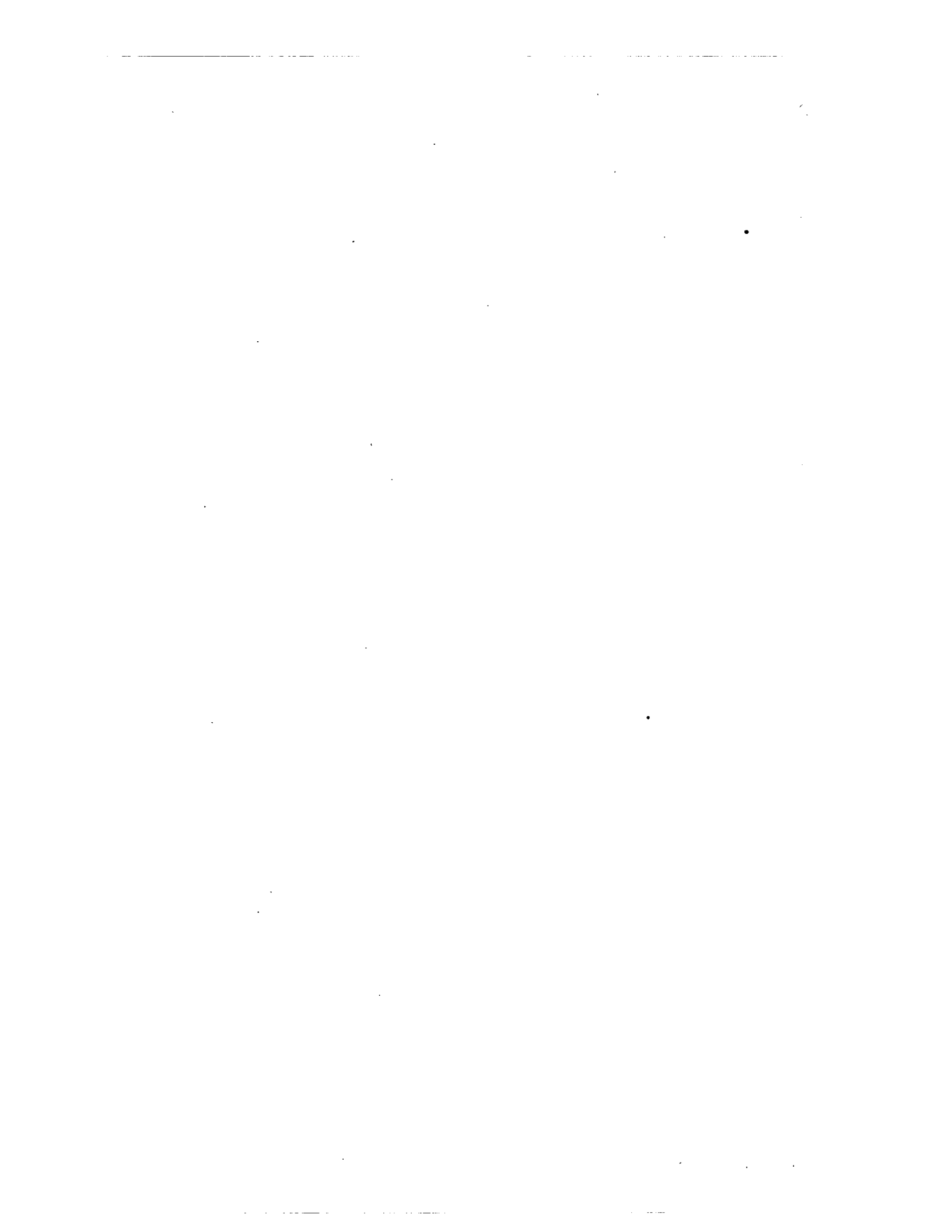

3. (a) Youths entering the trade of a stonemason shall be indentured (if between 15 and 17 years of age) for a period of 5 years; if over 17 years of age, for a period of 4 years.

(b) Youths may be taken on probation for a period not exceeding three months before being apprenticed, and the period of probation shall be treated as part of their term of apprenticeship.

(c) If any employer is unable to fulfil his obligation to an apprentice, he may, with the consent of the Wages Board, transfer the apprentice to another employer, who may take and employ him as an apprentice.

(d) Every apprentice may during the term of his apprenticeship attend at night the classes in masonry or similar subjects (chosen by the employer) provided at a Technical College or School, and the fees actually paid per term shall be refunded by the employer on production of a certificate from the instructor that the apprentice has satisfactorily attended the classes during the school term.

(e) The proportion of apprentices to be employed shall not exceed one apprentice to every three journeymen stonemasons or fraction of three stonemasons receiving not less than the rate for masons.

(f) The minimum rates of wage of an apprentice shall be the following:—
