## Public Service Acts.

ALTERATION OF DAY APPOINTED FOR PUBLIC  
HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT THE BOROUGH OF  
CAMPERDOWN.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria  
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,  
&c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by a Proclamation issued on the third day of  
February, 1954, and published in the *Government  
Gazette* of the third day of February, 1954, various days  
have been appointed under the provisions of the Public  
Service Acts to be kept as public holidays throughout  
different parts of Victoria for celebrations in connexion  
with the proposed Royal Visit:

And whereas by such Proclamation Friday, the twenty-  
sixth day of February, 1954, has been appointed to be  
kept as a public holiday throughout that part of Victoria  
being the Borough of Camperdown:

And whereas it is made to appear to me expedient that  
such day should not be a public holiday throughout the  
said part of Victoria:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria,  
in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice  
of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the  
powers conferred by the Public Service Acts, do by this  
my Proclamation declare that Friday, the twenty-sixth  
day of February, 1954, shall not be a holiday throughout  
the Borough of Camperdown and appoint Saturday, the  
sixth day of March, 1954, to be a public holiday throughout  
the said Borough of Camperdown.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of  
Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixteenth  
day of February, in the year of our Lord One  
thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, and in the  
third year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen  
Elizabeth II.
