DETERMINATION OF A WAGES BOARD ADJUSTED PURSUANT TO SECTION 21 OF THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1934 (No. 4275).

SPECIAL RATES.

- 3. In addition to the wages prescribed in clause 2 hereof the following special rates and allowances shall be paid:-
- In addition to the wages prescribed in clause 2 hereof the following special rates and allowances shall be paid:—

 (a) Leading hands in charge of not less than three and not more than ten employees, including apprentices, 9s. per week extra; more than ten and not more than twenty employees, including apprentices, 18s. per week extra; more than twenty employees, including apprentices, 27s. per week extra.

 (b) Working in wet places, 14d. per hour extra. Working in confined spaces, 3d. per hour extra.

 (c) Working for more than one hour in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to between 115 and 130 degrees Fahrenheit, 14d. per hour extra; in places where the temperature exceeds 130 degrees Fahrenheit, and per hour extra. Where work continues for more than two hours in temperatures exceeding 130 degrees Fahrenheit, employees shall also be entitled to twenty minutes' rest after every two hours' work without deduction of pay. The temperature shall be decided by the foreman of the work after consultation with the employees who claim the extra rate.

 (d) Dirty work, i.e., work which a foreman and workman shall agree is of an unusually dirty or offensive nature, 14d, per hour extra.

 (e) Compensation to the extent of the damage sustained shall be made for work in which clothing or tools are damaged or destroyed by the use of soids.

 (f) Where more than one of the disabilities entitling a workman to extra rates exist on the same job. the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, viz., the highest for the disabilities so prevailing.

The percentages for junior females relate to the female basic wage, but in all other cases relate to the male basic wage. Females and unapprenticed male juniors may be employed on piece-work subject to clause 17 hereof.

Clauses, other than clauses 2, 3 and 4, of the said Determination shall remain in force.

The total wage shall be calculated to the nearest 6d., any broken part of 6d. in the result not exceeding 3d. to be disregarded.
