EXEMPTION REGARDING DEER IN VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the
Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice
of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pur-
suance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other
powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my
Proclamation vary the Proclamation made the sixth day
of March, 1944, and published in the *Government Gazette*
of the eighth day of March, 1944, by deleting Locality 2,
The Shire of Grenville, from such Proclamation.

day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand
nine hundred and fifty-four, and in the third year
of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

PROCLAMATION

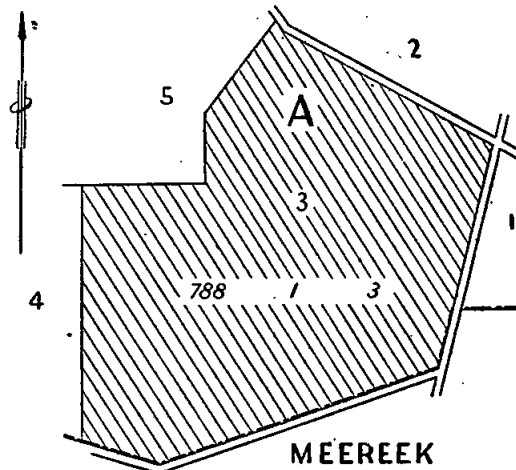
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the
Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice
of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pur-
suance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other
powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this my
Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereinafter
described shall be a locality in which from the first day
of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days

inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person
to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third
Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*.

Any owner of any land who, after the publication of a copy of this Order, contravenes any of the provisions contained herein, shall, when directed by notice in writing, remove, pull down, take up, or alter any building, road, or other works, and if any owner fails to do so within the time specified by the notice, the Responsible Authority may carry out all or any of such works, and recover all expenses incurred, after due notice has been given to the owner, lessee, and/or occupier in accordance with the provisions of the Town and Country Planning Acts.

5. None of the provisions of this Order shall prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purpose for which it was lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. Subject to the requirements of section 3 (6) of the *Town and Country (Metropolitan Area) Act 1949* (No. 5404), and unless revoked by the Governor in Council this Order shall remain in operation until the approval of the planning scheme.

7. AMENDMENT OF AND ADDITION TO THE REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE UNDER-MENTIONED RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISHES OF NEPEAN, WANNAEUE, AND KANGERONG, KNOWN AS THE "RYE," "TOOTGAROOK," "ROSEBUD," AND "DROMANA" FORESHORE RESERVES.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind Regulations numbers 4 and 14 of the Regulations made by it on the 16th January, 1947, in respect of the under-mentioned Reserves, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations (to be similarly numbered), and doth also make the following additional Regulation (to be numbered 20), in respect of the said Reserves:—

1. Such portion of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parish of Nepean as is indicated by red colour on plan marked R.13/3/23 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.3565, and known as the "Rye Foreshore Reserve."

2. Such portion of the Foreshore Reserve in the Parish of Wannaeue as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked W.9/7/26 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.4291, and known as "Tootgarook Foreshore Reserve."

3. Such portion of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parish of Wannaeue as is indicated by red colour on plan marked A.11/2/1937 with Lands Department correspondence Rs.3351, and known as the "Rosebud Foreshore and Recreation Reserve."

4. (a) The remaining portion of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 2nd June, 1891, as a site for Public Park in the Town of Dromana and Parish of Kangerong.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.—(Corres. Rs.3565.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF "MEREDITH PARK" AT LAKE COLAC.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928 as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land in the Parish of Ondit permanently reserved as a site for Watering purposes by Order in Council dated the 23rd March, 1874, and of the land in the Parish of Irrewarra temporarily reserved as a site for Public purposes by Order in Council dated the 25th November, 1953, both of which areas are together known as "Meredith Park" (hereinafter referred to as the "Park"):

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public at all times free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twenty-six (26) in any one year, as any portion of the Park exclusive of the beach may be set aside for purposes consistent with the reservation and with the consent of the Committee of Management.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage or interfere in any way with the trees, shrubs, or grass in the Park, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except with the written consent of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall in any way injure any of the buildings fences or seats in the Park, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, bottles, rubbish, or any other litter on any part of the Park, except in receptacles which may be provided for the purpose.
5. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Park or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.
6. No person shall remove from the Park any gravel, stone, sand, or loam.
7. No person shall remove any wood or other material which may be in or around the Park without the written consent of the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall put or graze in the Park any cattle, horses, sheep, or any other animals without the written consent of the Committee of Management.
9. No person shall camp in or on the Park, nor erect thereon any structure, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the written permission of the Committee of Management.
10. No person shall discharge firearms in the Park.
11. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Park.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by

section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).—(Rs.2673.)
