WHEREAS by section 64 of the Education Act 1928, it is provided that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare certain schools to be high schools: And whereas, by a Proclamation dated the 28th day of July, 1953, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the 5th day of August, 1953, the Albion High School was declared to be a high school as from and inclusive of the 1st day of January, 1954: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Education Act 1928 and all other powers thereunto enabling, do by this my Proclamation hereby revoke the aforesaid declaration of the Albion High School made on the 28th day of July, 1953, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the 5th day of August, 1953, and in lieu thereof declare the Sunshine High School to be a high school for the purposes of the Education Act 1928, from and inclusive of the 1st day of January, 1954.


PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1946 (No. 5203), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land in the municipal district of the City of Moorabbin, being part of the land shown on plan of subdivision, No. 972, lodged in the Office of Titles, and being the balance of the land described in certificate of title, volume 1745, folio 348930, and being the land indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—



The plaster shall have a minimum compressive strength of not less than 300 lb. per sq. in. two hours after casting. The reinforcement shall be 6 in. by 6 in. 11-gauge galvanized steel mesh.

- (a) shall be solid and not less than 21 in. in thickness;
- (b) when positioned shall be tied by means of wires attached to the reinforcement of abutting walls and the junctions scrimmed off with plaster;

(c) shall have bottom and top plates of 21 in. by 2 in. timber tied to the reinforcement;

- (d) shall be supported on base structures of timber, or of concrete or masonry with damp course, as prescribed in Part VIII. of Chapter 20 of the Regulations;
- (e) shall have a minimum dimension of 21 inches above and at either side of openings; and
- (f) may have openings not exceeding 8 feet in width.

External walls shall be protected by masonry or reinforced concrete veneer complying with the requirements of clause 2608 of the Regulations, with such adaptations as are necessary, or with coverings permissible under clause 2505 thereof fitted to vertical timber battens not less than 2 in. by 1 in. and spaced not more than 2 feet centre "to :centre.

The battens-shall-be nailed to top and bottom plates and secured to Ithe walls with galvanized nails set in when casting.

Where reinforced concrete or masonry veneer is used, the cavity between the veneer and the plaster wall shall be ventilated.

Where it is desired to use reinforced plaster walls beyond the limits prescribed above, computations and details shall be submitted to and the design-approved by the Surveyor.

GOODS (TEXTILE PRODUCTS) REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Part V. of the Goods Act 1928 as amended from time to time, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, to have effect on the first day of August, 1954, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Goods (Textile Products) Regulations."
 - 2. In these Regulations-
 - "the Acts" means the Goods Acts.
 - "trade description" means the trade description which is required by the Acts to be applied to textile products.
 - 3. The trade description shall-
 - (a) be in the form of a principal label or brand;
 - (b) be affixed in as permanent a manner as possible to the textile products or, where affixure to the textile products is impossible, to the principal coverings in which the textile products are contained and in which they are usually sold by wholesale or retail.
- 4. There shall not be included on any label or brand used for the purposes of a trade description any matter additional to the particulars required by the Acts and by these Regulations to be included in the trade description if such additional matter would, by illustration, by wording or by size of lettering, tend to contradict or obscure such particulars.
- 5. The statement required by paragraph (c) of sub-section two of section ninety-one of the *Goods Act* 1928 as inserted by the *Goods (Textile Products) Act* 1953 to be included in a trade description shall, if the textile products contain a greater percentage by weight of wool than of any other fibre, specify the percentage by weight of wool first, otherwise last.
- 6. The trade description applied to textile products which contain loading or weighting substances other than ordinary dressing shall include the word "Loaded" or the word "Weighted."

For the purposes of this Regulation, a dressing used to meet legitimate trade requirements, and which does not contain anything in the nature of adulteration or anything used for the purpose of deceiving as to the quality, substances or nature of the products shall be deemed to be an ordinary dressing.

- 7. The trade description applied to textile products which contain paper shall include a statement that the products contain paper.
- 8. The following goods are hereby declared not to be textile products for the purpose of the Acts:—

Men's and Boys' Wear-

Handkerchiefs; Collars; Braces; Belts; Garter Suspenders; Arm Bands.

Women's and Children's Wear-

Handkerchiefs; Corsets; Brassieres; Belts; Hand-bags; Collars; Neckwear.

Textile Materials commonly used in the manufacture of footwear.

Baby Wear-

Baby Squares of Flannelette, Terry or Muslin; Baby Bibs.

· Household Drapery---

Towels; Towelling; Face Washers; Bath Mats; Mattress Cases; Mattress Covers; Bed Ticking; Ticking; Serviettes; Doileys; Tray Cloths; Centres; Runners; Duchess Sets; Mosquito Netting and covers made therefrom; Butter Muslin and Gauze; Floor Cloths; Dish Cloths; Dusters; Cleaning Cloth; Cleaning Cloths.

Furnishings-

Oil Baize; Window Blinds; Shade Blinds; Sun Blinds; Awnings; Shower Curtains; Underfelt made from waste underlinings; Linoleum; Coir Mats and Matting; Paper Felt (for underlinings).

Canvas Goods-

- 4. Any person who shall by any wilful act or default commit a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall for any such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Twenty pounds, and in the event of
